## Service

This year, Armenia has endured and continues to endure persecution, a pandemic, a multicountry war, illegal use of prohibited weapons, failed attempts at ethnic cleansing, anti-Armenian sentiments and propaganda, and more.

As we adapt to the current situation in Armenia, our **obligation** to our homeland is now **more relevant than ever**. Our mission in 2021 emerges as a pertinent opportunity for every young Armenian in the diaspora.

We plan to fund and carry out **several** reconstruction projects in Armenia and Artsakh in a pursuit to serve the needs of our people during these trying times. The emphasis of our 2021 pilgrimage will be on service and philanthropy.

## Service

Every year, CYMA conducts service projects in efforts to give back to our homeland. We dedicate a week of our trip to these projects.

**Fuller Housing Project:** CYMA has collaborated with this organization for many years to build safe homes for families in need. Our members help by completing part of the construction.

Various Other Projects: Annually, we select a community in need and work to fill a gap for them through our service project. From 2014-2017, we worked on building a **youth center in the village of Tsovinar**. It now serves as a school, recreation center, playground, and a safe space for the community as a whole.
