Important Guidelines that you should know.

BAPTISM: Parents must show the desire to train their child in line with the teachings of the Catholic Church. Godparents must be a Confirmed, Active Catholic and complete a Godparent Affidavit.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION: The Church, in her pastoral concern for persons preparing for marriage, wishes to emphasize the sacred and serious nature of the marriage covenant. As love joins man and woman, so they are bound more closely to God. With this thought in mind, couples should contact their Pastor well in advance of the wedding date (at least four months).

ADULT CATECHUMENATE: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is open for all who would like to inquire into our Catholic Faith. Those interested may call the Church Office anytime for further information. One's presence in the R.C.I.A. in no way obligates a person to join the Church.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: In order to meet the spiritual needs of our sick, we ask that you please keep us informed of those who are ill at home, in the hospital or nursing facility. Please notify the Parish Office. Arrangements can be made for Communion visits to the homes of our homebound parishioners who are unable to attend Mass.

FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS: The parish priest is to be contacted before the family makes any arrangements with the funeral director. Family members are also asked to meet with the priest to prepare for the Funeral liturgy.



REFLECTION FOR THE 6TH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR A

(1st Reading, Acts 8:5-8,14-17; 2nd Reading, 1 Peter 3:15-18; Gospel, Jn.: 14:15-21)

Dear brothers and sisters,

“This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it (Psalm 118:24).”

God, through Jesus Christ, has demonstrated His love for us. Jesus Christ gave His life for us and rose from the dead to give us salvation. St. Paul reminds us, “But God demonstrates His love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Rm. 5:8).” In His love, Jesus Christ made us children of God, heirs to God, sharers, and co-heirs with Him to the Kingdom (Rm. 8:16). The implication of this is we are a chosen people (a chosen race), a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that we may declare the praises of Him who called us out of darkness into His marvelous light (1 Pet. 2:9). These are bestowed on us gratuitously and not on any merits of ours.

There is always an act of reciprocity in love. When anyone receives an act of love, it is still, and rightly so, expected that one shows love in return. One ought to reciprocate with love any act of love shown to one. When one's act of love is treated with disdain or unappreciated, it is usually painful, and the loving party often feels aggrieved. Any one of us can relate to this fact since we have given or received an act of love in one way or another. The scripture goes beyond this reciprocity of love and charges us to love our enemies or those that have not shown us love (Matt. 5:44).

Since Jesus Christ has first shown us love, we have an obligation to reciprocate His love with an act of love too. In the Gospel of today (John 14:15-21), Jesus Christ tells us how to show or express our love to Him. He said to His disciples and indeed to us, “If you love me, you will keep my commandments... Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me.” Love of Christ is expressed through obedience to His will. One could ask, what commandments was Christ talking about? Of course, we know that God gave Moses the Decalogue (The Ten Commandments) for the people of Israel to observe or obey. But Jesus Christ, who is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets, summed up the whole Law and the Prophets in two commandments; “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind... You shall love your neighbor as yourself (Matthew 22:37-40).”

Therefore, when Jesus asks us to keep His commandments to prove our love for Him, He is asking us to keep the commandments of love. He is asking us to show love to God, our neighbors, and all children of God. Jesus Christ wants us to do charitable deeds for the poor, the sick, the depressed, and the dejected in society. He wants us to show kindness to the abandoned, the persecuted, and the most vulnerable of the community bearing in mind the words of Jesus Christ, “whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine; you did for me (Matthew 25:40).”

Always remember that Jesus loves you!

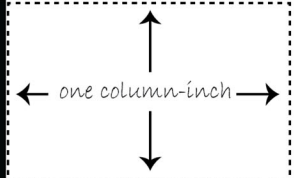
