Important Guidelines that you should know.

BAPTISM: Parents must show the desire to train their child in line with the teachings of the Catholic Church. Godparents must be a Confirmed, Active Catholic and complete a Godparent Affidavit.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION: The Church, in her pastoral concern for persons preparing for marriage, wishes to emphasize the sacred and serious nature of the marriage covenant. As love joins man and woman, so they are bound more closely to God. With this thought in mind, couples should contact their Pastor well in advance of the wedding date (at least four months).

ADULT CATECHUMENATE: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is open for all who would like to inquire into our Catholic Faith. Those interested may call the Church Office anytime for further information. One's presence in the R.C.I.A. in no way obligates a person to join the Church.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: In order to meet the spiritual needs of our sick, we ask that you please keep us informed of those who are ill at home, in the hospital or nursing facility. Please notify the Parish Office. Arrangements can be made for Communion visits to the homes of our homebound parishioners who are unable to attend Mass.

FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS: The parish priest is to be contacted before the family makes any arrangements with the funeral director. Family members are also asked to meet with the priest to prepare for the Funeral liturgy.





(1st Reading, Acts 2:1-11, 2nd Reading, 1 Cor. 12:3-13, Gospel, John 20:19-23) Dear brothers and sisters,

"This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it (Psalm 118:24)." The first reading from the book of the Acts of the Apostles tells us about the Pentecost experience of both the Apostles and the large crowd. In fulfillment of the promise of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles in the most dramatic way. "And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which

parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." The action of the Holy Spirit made the Apostles witness and proclaim the Gospel with enthusiasm, determination, great strength, courage, and conviction. They were no longer afraid to confront the authority of the Pharisees.

The people that gathered there were astounded. They were amazed that they could understand the Apostles' message in their respective languages even though they spoke different languages. They were surprised at the courage and wisdom of the Apostles. They were amazed at the outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles. They marveled at the extraordinary manifestation. But that was the splendor of God. It was the Pentecost experience. It was an experience that projects truth and removes fear. It was an experience that came with divine gifts and blessings. St. Paul reminds us in the second reading that the spiritual gifts of the Holy Spirit are of different kinds. However, they are given for the glory of God, in the service of the Lord, and for the sanctification of the Church.

Prior to the Pentecost experience, the Apostles stayed under lock and key for fear of the Jews, as we read in the Gospel of today. They were afraid to confront the authority and power of the Pharisees. They were afraid to witness. They lacked commitment and resolve. They had little or no faith and did not understand Jesus Christ and His mission. But all this changed after the Pentecost experience. In Baptism and Confirmation, we receive the Holy Spirit and are made temples of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit bestows on us His gifts: WISDOM, UNDERSTANDING, COUNSEL, FORTITUDE, KNOWLEDGE, PIETY, and AWE OF GOD. Our attitude is to follow St Paul's admonition and stir or fan into flame the gifts of God which were given to us through the imposition of hands. We should know that God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but of power, love, and self-control (2 Tim 1: 6-7).

Like the Apostles, we are called to be courageous and convincing witnesses to the Gospel. Pope Francis emphasized this when he said, "In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the people of God have become missionary disciples. All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization. The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized (The Joy of the Gospel, 120)." Today in our homes, parishes, communities, schools, and places of work, we must be living witnesses of Christ in and for the world. We need not be worried or afraid of this great responsibility, for God has filled each of us with His Holy Spirit and bestowed on us His divine gifts.
