The Ministry of Public Health brings aid to survivors of the torrential rains



The Minister of Public Health and the Fight against AIDS, Dr Thaddée Ndikumana, carried out on Monday, December 23, 2019, a descent in the Uwinterekwa and Gasenyi areas in town hall of Bujumbura, areas of victims of torrential rains mixed with landslide.

He granted aid to survivors of Uwinterekwa and Gasenyi grouped at ECOFO Uwinterekwa consisting of 2.5 tonnes of rice, 860 kg of beans, 186 mosquito nets, a complete kitchen kit, cans, soaps, clothes and shoes.

As Dr. Thaddée Ndikumana said, the purpose of the

trip was to inquire into the situation to see the need for emergency assistance. It was also to see that health workers are at work to disinfect the premises in order to avoid possible epidemics.

For the survivors who will fall ill, Minister Dr Thaddée Ndikumana said that the Kamenge district hospital will treat them free of charge and a doctor, an ambulance and other medicines are available for this purpose.

Minister Dr Thaddée Ndikumana asks these survivors to do the hygiene especially that the water and the soaps are available in order to avoid the diseases related to the promiscuity.

He thanked organizations such as the Burundi Red Cross, AJAP, Caritas Burundi, as well as the Ministry of Solidarity who made the aid available and appealed to the other benefactors to continue to help these survivors.

The survivors of Uwinterekwa and Gasenyi were victims of a torrential rain which fell in these places the night of Saturday and last Sunday where more than 14 human lives were lost, more than 40 injured and more than 55 houses completely destroyed.

The workshop is organized with the objective of perfecting us further in the sense of respecting the regularity of the reports and the speed in their production, said the Assistant to the Minister in charge of social affairs and gender.

She said that it is in this context that presentations on certain traditional international human rights instruments will be revised.

Ms. Elisa said that this is also the time to analyze what came out of the last interaction session between Burundi and experts on compassion on the elimination of all forms of discrimination against Human Rights.

It is also an opportunity to assess how it was the last time 4 years ago, especially that Burundi will soon produce in the year 2020, the 7th report. The Burundi delegation will be able to go and defend the Burundi report, concluded the Assistant in charge of Social and Gender Affairs.

The Director General of COGERCO recognizes that cotton production has drastically decreased for years following the significant decrease in the reserves which were allocated to the cultivation of cotton. He explained by way of example that the cultivation of cotton in 1993 extended over 9,800 ha while today the cotton area is only 3,000 ha. Opportunity to ask the state to return to COGERCO its reserves that have been looted and to put in place a law that protects the properties of this company.



Mr. Gustave Majambere said that the company plans to increase cultivable land from year to year to respond to the concern to increase cotton production. He cited other factors that will come into play in increasing cotton production, including good quality fertilizers. The Director General of COGERCO clarified that the Company is working with ISABU and FOMI to set up an economically profitable dose which will be made available to cotton growers so that they can have sufficient production. The Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of the Environment, Agriculture and Livestock, Mr. Ndorimana Emmanuel meanwhile, indicated that the reserves which belonged to COGERCO and which was robbed of it must return to this company, affirming moreover, certain areas have already been returned to COGERCO. He also announced that the relevant Ministry intends to expand cotton cultivation in the provinces of Ruyigi, Cankuzo and Rutana.

Mr. Emmanuel Ndorimana said that the State of Burundi has put in place a national strategy document for revitalizing the cotton sector, which contains many projects in favor of cotton cultivation. He added that cotton growers have a big role to play in the implementation and success of this strategy. And ask them to redouble their efforts so that the cotton sector is economically profitable.

Finally, the Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of the Environment, Agriculture and Livestock gave the Governors of Bubanza and Cibitoke a manual of national strategy for revitalizing the cotton sector so that the projects included in this document are popularized on a large scale.

On the sidelines of the ceremonies, COGERCO granted incentive prices to cotton growers who performed well in relation to production. As an incentive, 20 cotton growers each received a 7 liter can of cottonseed oil and a loincloth, a bonus which, according to the Director General of COGERCO, could encourage other farmers to work much more to increase production.

Reduction in the time required to release goods in Burundi

he Burundian Revenue Office (OBR) presented on Tuesday December 17, 2019 at the Hotel Club du Lac Tanganyika, the national study on the time required for the release of goods. Observation, this time has been significantly reduced!

All the speeches made on this occasion were unanimous: "The OBR is to be congratulated for what it does in the area of business facilitation and trade". The Representative of the World Customs Organization (WCO) said it again and again, "the OBR and its employees shine in the world" in the customs field. He said that "Burundi is among the most active countries internationally and implements several trade facilitation programs, even if it has not yet ratified the

revised Kyoto Convention".

According to the report, the average time for customs clearance and transit of goods from the registration of the manifest in the customs system in Dar-Es-Salam until the physical exit of the cargo at the customs clearance office in Bujumbura has increased from 35 days to 24 days and 7 hours on average. The OBR Commissioner General said that this time could be further reduced "if the planned project to renovate the Kobero substation (notably by building sheds and enlarging the parking lot) is carried out".

TradeMark East Africa (TMEA) Country Director Christian Nibasumba invites the OBR and its national partners to work further on other trade facilitation programs such as lifting non-tariff barriers, among others. He also expressed the wish to see "this study translated into English for easy sharing with Englishspeaking partners".

The members of the Technical Working Group have all received certificates of recognition and merit for this work, which is unanimously praised.

Special anti-corruption brigade hands over seized goods to OBR



The Special Anti-Corruption Brigade handed over 142 loincloths seized in Mparambo in the commune of Rugombo to a fraudster on Tuesday, December 24, 2019, at the Burundian Revenue Office (OBR) post Cibitoke.

As the Commissioner General of the Anti-Corruption Police, Mr. Roger Ndikumana, indicated, these loincloths from the DRC did not have tax stamps. He said that these loincloths were seized thanks to the collaboration of the local police and the population who gave them the information.

He is asking traders to break the fraud because when apprehended, they pay huge fines. Most of them prefer to abandon their goods, he added. If such goods are seized and the owner does not come to pay the taxes and fines, Mr. Roger Ndikumana clarified that the OBR will afterwards auction them off, which constitutes a huge loss for the fraudulent trader. The money from the sale returns to the public treasury.

The special Anti-Corruption Brigade also seized cellphones, ECOFO teaching books, medicines, mosquito nets, blankets and shoes in various corners of Bujumbura.

Medicines and mosquito nets will be handed over to the Ministry of Public Health and Fight against AIDS Control, while textbooks will be given to the Ministry in charge of Education. The other products will be handed over to the OBR.

Mr. Roger Ndikumana said that the Special Anti-Corruption Brigade had problems linked to the lack of sufficient personnel to organize checks on all borders. It also lacks sufficient means of movement to quickly arrive at the places of entry of fraudulent goods or where other crimes related to corruption are committed.

The Burundian Revenue Office (OBR) gives details of the procedure in force in the event of fraud



hen fraudulent or contraband goods are seized, the seizure report is drawn up directly and jointly signed on site by the seizing agent and the offender. The seizure report is drawn up in two copies: one is given to the offender and the other remains in the hands of the seizing agent for classification. The seized goods are transported to the warehouse of the Burundian Revenue Office where they are kept until the offender shows up to find out about the duties and taxes as well as the fines to be paid so that the goods can be returned to him.

The procedures to follow are as follows:

The offender presents his identity and the report to the verifying officer, who then draws up the report of the customs offense. On this report, all duties and taxes as well as the fines due are determined in accordance with section 201 of the Law on Customs Management of the East African Community. Subsequently, the offense report is signed jointly by the checking agent and the offender to take note of the transaction;

Once the report has been drawn up and signed by the verifying agent and the offender, it is sent directly to the Head of Service for analysis and corrections if necessary to issue his opinion;

After the opinion of the Head of Service, the offense report is sent back to the Director for comments and

decision-making at his level;

Then, the offense report is sent to the Commissioner of Customs and Excise for the last decision;

Once the Commissioner's decision confirms the duties and taxes as well as the fine indicated in the offense report, the offender is called to pay;

Subsequently, the offender presents the payment receipt to the secretariat of the Directorate which, after verifying its authenticity, prepares the release of the goods which had been the subject of seizure;

Finally, the offender releases the warehouse manager and the warehouse manager gives him his seized merchandise.

Sometimes the violator refuses the transaction or decides to abandon the seized goods. Here, at the end of the storage period provided for by the Law on Customs Management of the East African Community, these goods are transmitted to the commission in charge of the auction (see section 57 of the aforementioned law - P77). The easily perishable goods are also sold at public auction in accordance with the Service Note "N° / REF: 540/92 / CG / 01/554 / D.N / 2016 of 23/03/2016".

There are cases where the goods which had been seized are prohibited or restricted according to the "second annex" of the Law on Customs Management of the East African Community (see p 226 of the aforementioned law). In these circumstances, these goods are seized and confiscated and will be destroyed if they are prohibited or managed according to the conditions determined by the Commissioner if they are restricted.

INVEST IN BURUNDI: API GIVES SOME OF INCINTIVES REASONS



B urundi is a country with diversified economic potential. Located in the heart of Africa, Burundi enjoys an equatorial climate tempered by altitude (1,700 meters on average in the center, lower on the outskirts). It is also a country in East Africa without access to the sea, but with a large shore on Lake Tanganyika, located in the Great Lakes Region. Its economy is mainly based on agricultural export and livestock. Agricultural production is divided between products for export, such as coffee, tea and cotton, and food crops.

However, Burundi has a GREAT investment potential. The Agency for the Promotion of Investment (API), a Burundian institution responsible for promoting investments, provides, among other things, some information answering why to invest in Burundi.

The main reasons are: the Political and security stability, the strategic geographic position allowing direct access to several neighboring countries, the constantly improving business environment (Doing Business Report: Burundi has been ranked consecutively 3 times among the top 10 reformers in the world), the Freedom of establishment and investment, the Burundi's membership of the ECA Common Market and the COMESA Free Trade Zone, the Cost of labor relatively cheaper compared to countries in the sub-region, the fact that Burundi is eligible for the EU (European Union) "Everything But Arms" Initiative and the AGOA (African Growth Opportunity Act), An attractive and non-discriminatory Investment Code guaranteeing the protection of investors and investments, the Single Window for setting up companies allows the creation of a business in one day for 40,000 Burundian Francs (almost 25 USD), and finally the three other operational windows namely: obtaining the Building Permit, the Property Transfer License and the Single Window for connection to electricity.

In addition, Burundi has a number of comparative advantages such as regional strategic access to Lake Tanganyika, membership in several regional economic communities, notably COMESA and ECA, and the relatively low costs of workforce.

Burundi's economy is dependent on a number of sectors whose development will have an impact on its growth potential in the years to come. There are sectors which are considered as investment priorities such as agriculture, breeding, fishing, processing and manufacturing industry, hospitality and tourism, energy and mining, transport, information and communication technology (ICT), education, buildings and public works.
