## Policy for Reopening School

It is our goal and desire to provide a safe and effective classroom learning environment for the 2020-2021 school year. In order to achieve our goal so that we can continue to provide a quality Christian-based education for your children, we are establishing some guidelines. All of us have a responsibility to fight the effects of the virus and need for everyone to be a part of the solution.

## CTKCA's Responsibility

- Student's temperatures may be checked when they enter the school to start the day. If their temperature is elevated the child will be sent home with their parent or guardian. We will consider an unmedicated temperature of 99.9° or higher a fever. CTKCA will also monitor the self-temperature check logs of each student.
- Students, teachers and administrative staff will use the supplied sanitizer when entering the building in the morning.
- The school will be sprayed with a sanitizing agent before the start of school August 18th.
- Students will be staying in the same classroom at their assigned desk through most if not the entire day.
- We will maintain social distancing while in the classroom and will observe the 50% capacity guidelines.
- Masks will not be required in the classroom unless a teacher needs to do one-on-one instruction.
- Masks may be required when in public spaces.
- The water fountains will be turned off, but students may refill their own water bottles. During lunchtime and recess, we will continue to maintain proper distancing.
- Recess activities will be limited to avoid direct contact and to manage social distancing standards.
   When returning from recess all students and teachers will be asked to wash their hands thoroughly.

## Parent or Guardian's Responsibility

- Monitor your child's temperature and keep them home if they have an unmedicated temperature of 99.9° or higher. This has always been our policy and we are asking you to be diligent in your efforts to support it. We want you to take your child's temperature every day before you leave the house and record it in a form we will provide. We may do random checking of temperatures. Be sure your child has their own personal thermometer in their book bag.
- Do not encourage the child to go to school sick.
- Send the child to school with a mask and educate them, as we will, that these are for the safety of
  others as well as themselves. We expect you to emphasize to your children the importance of washing
  their hands often, maintaining distance from others, including during recess, and coughing or sneezing
  into their elbow or a tissue.
- Should a family member or the student test positive for Covid-19, please notify the school and keep the student home.

## Student's Responsibility

- Take their temperature every morning and record the results.
- Tell someone if they are sick.
- Keep their hands to themselves and not get too close to others.

We believe by working together we can provide a safe, but quality classroom learning environment.
