A Note from the Pastor

Way back in the 1972 Munich Olympic Games, America had an athlete, a distance runner by the name of Dave Wottle. As a youngster he was weak and skinny. His doctor suggested taking up a sport. Dave chose running! He was a 1500 meter runner from Bowling Green College who got progressively better thru college. He loved the 1500 meter run, and hated the 800m. At the 1972 Olympic trials the coaches asked him to run the 800. He ran his least favorite event and tied the world record!

Fast forward to Munich, 1972. Wottle does not qualify for the finals in the 1500m run, but qualifies for the 800m, the run he dislikes. He had no shot to win. He had knee issues and he had just planned his wedding 2 weeks before the Olympics. 2 Kenyans and a Russian were the favorites. If you have never seen this race, you can YouTube it, it is worth the watch! Dave Wotttle is the guy who looks like the weekend runner who aimlessly walked in off the street wearing some weird painter's hat. He ran his race!

The initial pace is fast. Dave is some 20 yards behind the pack, getting crushed. By the end of the first 400m, he has worked his way back into the pack. As they near the 200m mark, Dave the Throttle kicks it in, or so it appears. He admits to thinking he can grab the bronze medal. But he has paced himself enough to run the same speed at the end of the race as the start. He wins the gold, with the favored Russian falling at the finish line. Dave Wottle was not the fastest guy, but he knew who he was, and he knew his pace.

As a Christian, you are running a race. The apostle Paul used the Olympic Games during his life as an analogy to our Christian walk or "run". 1 Corinthians 9:24, "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever."

How are you doing in your strict training? Dave Wottle would not have won gold without strict daily training. We are called to train for our heavenly encounter with Christ. How much time have you spent in your spiritual gym? Our training regiment will be taken into account.

How is your pace? Has Covid-19 caused you to up your spiritual pace? When the pandemic is over, will you slow down your pace to a walk, will you still have enough in the tank to finish strong? We all have different paces we are running at. The key is to keep our pace steady. To continue to train daily, continue to take in the spiritual supplements we need to finish strong: Word, prayer, fellowship, and witness. Then at the end of our race we can proclaim with Paul, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."
