



The Competition

1. Citizens of the Great Barrier Reef Foundation (ABN 77 614 807 564) (“Citizens”) are conducting a competition called Reef Radicals (“the Competition”).
2. These terms and conditions apply to the Competition and by submitting your entry, you agree to be bound by these terms and conditions. Any entry that does not comply with these terms and conditions may be deemed invalid and ineligible to win a prize.
3. The Competition is open from 6am on Monday 8 June 2020 until midnight on Sunday 9 August 2020 (“the Competition Period”) with a final judging occurring between 10 and 23 August 2020. Winners will be announced on 1 September 2020. Any entry received after the expiry of the Competition Period will be deemed invalid. No responsibility is accepted for late, lost, delayed or misdirected entries. Citizens reserves the right to extend the Competition Period at their discretion.

Entry

4. The Competition is open to children in Years 1-8 at the time of entry.
5. The entrant’s parent/guardian must complete the competition entry form on behalf of the entrant. The parent/guardian of the entrant must read and consent to be bound to these Terms & Conditions on behalf of the entrant. Entrants must have the consent of their parent/guardian to enter the competition and Citizens may request written evidence of parental or guardian consent. Any entrant that is unable or unwilling to provide the requested information will not be eligible to win a prize.
6. Entry to the Competition is free.
7. Entrants may enter the Competition only once.
8. By submitting an entry, each entrant warrants to Citizens that:
 - a. They have the permission of their parent or guardian to enter the Competition;
 - b. The details provided with their entry are true and accurate;
 - c. The entrant owns or has the right to submit their entry for this Competition;
 - d. Their entry, and Citizens use of their entry, will not:
 - i. Infringe any person’s copyright or other intellectual property rights;
 - ii. Infringe any person’s privacy rights or applicable privacy laws; or
 - iii. Breach any other laws.

9. Each entrant grants to Citizens a perpetual, non-exclusive royalty-free licence to use, reproduce, publish and communicate their entry, including a right to sublicense to other parties (including posting on Citizens' social media accounts) in any format for the purpose of the Competition and Citizens' marketing and promotional purposes. Other parties include but are not limited to James Cook University and Nickelodeon Australia.
10. Entrants must ensure that all content in their film is their own, or have the rights to use it. It is the sole responsibility of the entrant to secure permission from any third party owners of content included in their film, including footage, music and images. Citizens takes no responsibility for any failure by an entrant to obtain the necessary permissions. Films found to contain unauthorised content will be disqualified.

Judging and Prizes

11. Citizens will judge all valid entries received within the Competition Period and select winners based on:
 - a. Content: clearness and effectiveness of the video in documenting a story about climate change, promoting action and/or offering new solutions that will benefit the Great Barrier Reef.
 - b. Innovation, originality, and impact: telling a climate story in a fresh and unusual way, appealing to a broad and diverse audience and encouraging further thought and action.
 - c. Technical expertise: quality of camera and audio work, effectiveness of editing and strength of script.
12. A panel of experts, appointed at the discretion of Citizens, will select one entry as the first prize winner, and up to 10 other prize winners as judged against the aforementioned criteria.
13. The prizes will consist of:
 - a. 1 x GoPro Hero 8 action camera with underwater housing for the winner
 - b. 3 x 'Virtual Reef Dives' for school classrooms, hosted by GBRMPA's Reef HQ Aquarium in Townsville
 - c. 10 x reef sustainability packs, which include a tote bag, reusable straw, recycling guide magnet, paper stickers and reusable bottle.
 - d. A custom page on the Citizens Atlas showcasing the winning project
14. The Prize Winners will be notified by Monday 31 August 2020. All winners will be notified by email and/or phone as per the details provided with the competition submission. Winners will be publicly announced on Tuesday 1 September 2020 on Citizens' social media accounts.

15. If any event prevents or hinders the Competition or Citizens ability to deliver a prize, Citizens may in their absolute discretion cancel the Competition, select another Prize Winner, or provide a similar prize of equivalent value.
16. Citizens may refuse to award a prize, or seek its recovery, in the event of relevant entrant's fraud, dishonesty, or non-entitlement under, or breach of, these terms and conditions. In the event of a dispute concerning the identity of the person who submits an entry, or the number of entries submitted, only one entry will be accepted per applicant.

Personal Information

17. Each entrant consents to Citizens using any personal information supplied or connected with their entry only for the purposes of the Competition.
