Intro to Dance I: Horton Technique |Spring 2024

- Developed and taught a comprehensive hybrid modern dance course integrating historical lectures with practical movement exercises, covering pivotal figures such as Francois Delsarte, Isadora Duncan, Martha Graham, and Merce Cunningham, among others.
- Assessed student understanding through three written exams and facilitated critical thinking with 10 reflective essays based on film analysis and comparison of distinct dance techniques presented in lectures.
- Culminated the course with a two-part final project, guiding students in creating PowerPoint presentations on influential modern dancers not covered in the syllabus and choreographing a 2-minute dance tribute, incorporating class-taught movement ideas and their research findings on figures like Alvin Ailey and Pina Bausch.

Beginner Hip Hop | Spring 2024

- Developed and instructed a comprehensive hybrid hip-hop dance course blending historical lectures with practical movement sessions, emphasizing the evolution and impact of hip-hop culture.
- Delivered in-depth lectures on foundational figures and elements of hip-hop, including pioneers like DJ Kool Herc, Afrika Bambaataa, and innovators such as Boogaloo Sam and Rennie Harris, alongside the study of significant groups like The Rocksteady Crew.
- Assessed student understanding through three written exams and facilitated critical thinking with 10 reflection essays on hip-hop films, encouraging comparisons between the origins of hip-hop and its contemporary manifestations.
- Guided students in a culminating group project that required a research-based PowerPoint presentation on influential dancers and choreographers not covered in the course, followed by a choreographed dance performance incorporating learned techniques and honoring the researched individuals.

- Guided students in creating a 2-minute dance piece honoring notable figures such as Misty Copeland and Arthur Mitchell, incorporating learned movement concepts and research insights, fostering creativity and a deeper appreciation of dance history.
