He has been singing since childhood alongside his father's gospel group, Bishop Alvin Davis & Company. After high school, ADO furthered his education in vocal performance by attending Xavier University of Louisiana for four years.



During his time in New Orleans he began to focus on his solo career and shared the stage with many great names including: Dru Hill, Travis Porter, Miquel, Melanie Fiona, & Lyfe Jennings.

A PAUSE FOR PURPOSE

At the peak of his career, ADO took a hiatus to focus on his growing family and to care for his parents in the ofthe alobal pandemic. He is now a father of 5, which truly affected his music in more ways than one. His previously Neo-Soul sound adapted has а more inspirational message intentionally target the youth with a call for change and peaceful brotherhood in our communities.



This led to his foundation of ASM CARES, a non-profit focused on creating opportunities for business ownership, providing missing life necessities for those in need, and stimulatina opportunities for creating wealth generational stability within low income communities.



With the rebrand of his music, ADO wanted to make sure he was making an impact on his community that went further than music.



ASM CARES

In it's first year of foundation, ASM CARES, was able to help more than 500 families (in Regions 1 &3 of Southern Louisiana) with school supplies, school shoes, backpacks, and free hot meals. The non-profit also hosted events that offered small local businesses with free radio, tv, & social media promotion, a free community food bank, and a drawing giving away free iPad minis. 


Storytelling is a Powerful Tool for Communication
