

Nodiadau o gymorth i gystadleuwyr

Disgwyliadau y Panel Beirniaid

- i. Mae'r panel o feirniaid yn edrych yn bennaf am syniad cryf sydd wedi ei archwilio yn ddwfn, sy'n teimlo'n wreiddiol a gyda pherthnasedd ar gyfer cynulleidfaoedd Cymraeg arloesol.
- ii. Yn eich cais mae disgwyl i chi fel dramodwyr fod â dealltwriaeth o'ch llais fel awdur, a dangosiad clir mewn-weledol o'ch drama a'r stori yn ei gyfanrwydd.
- iii. Mae gofyn i chi gyfleu eich syniad o fewn 30-45 munud o sgript / neu mae'r opsiwn i chi yrru triniaeth cryf – braslun o hyd at 2,500 gair ac esiamplau o dair golygfa o ddeialog.
- iv. Ystyriwch y tirlun theatrig fel y mae hi yng Nghymru ar hyn o bryd, a gofynnwch i'ch hun be sydd ar goll?
- v. Petai ymgeisydd yn rhoi sgript lawn i fewn, byddai hi'n ddefnyddiol bod cyflwyniad i'r weledigaeth ar ddechrau'r sgript.

Beth yw gofynion creu **Triniaeth** (braslun o hyd at 2,500 o eiriau a 3 golygfa)?

Dyma restr o bethau defnyddiol i chi ystyried.

B. Themâu/u

- i. Beth yw thema/u'r gwaith? Beth yw'r prif themâu?

C. Cefndir a Stori

- i. **Crynodeb o'r stori.** Beth yw'r prif ddigwyddiadau o fewn y ddrama?
- ii. **Cyflwyniad i'r cymeriadau.** Beth mae nhw eisiau neu'n ceisio ei gyflawni? Beth yw'r broblem neu heriau sy'n eu hwynebu? Beth yw'r tensiynau rhwng cymeriadau, neu rhwng cymeriad a'u hamgylchiadau?
- iii. **Cyflwyniad i fyd y ddrama.** Lleoliad. Ble mae'r stori'n digwydd? Cyfnod a daearyddiaeth?
- iv. **Strwythur** – beth yw dechrau, canol a diwedd y ddrama? Beth yw'r pwynt crisis? Beth yw siwrne'r cymeriadau/prif gymeriad? Beth yw uchafbwynt y ddrama?
- v. **Ffurf y darn.** Ai sioe un person ar ffurf monolog ydi'r ddrama? Drama i ddau berson? Sioe gerdd? Yw'r ddrama yn digwydd mewn 'real time'? Ydi'r stori yn cael ei ddweud yn gronolegol, neu ydych chi am neidio'n ôl a blaen mewn amser?
- vi. **Genre** – Comedi? Drama? Ydi hi'n ddrama naturiolaid, neu oes elfennau mwy abswrdd?

- vii. **Cerddoriaeth (os yn berthnasol e.e. sioe gerdd).** A fydd caneuon gwreiddiol yn ran bwysig o'r sioe?

D. Pam y syniad hwn?

- i. Sut ydych chi eisiau effeithio eich cynulleidfa? Beth ydych chi eisiau iddynt deimlo ar ddiwedd y darn? (rhowch eich hunain yn esgidiau'r gynulleidfa)
- ii. Pam y ddrama hon? O ble ddaeth yr ysbrydoliaeth?
- iii. Perthnasedd: pam nawr? Beth sy'n ei wneud yn berthnasol i gynulleidfaedd Cymru heddiw?
- iv. Pwy yw eich cynulleidfa darged? Ystyriwch oedran penodol, os i blant neu bobl ifanc. Neu oes cymunedau penodol y bydda'r ddrama'n apelio ati?
- v. Pam chi? Beth sy'n eich diddori a'ch cyffroi chi am y syniad? Oes rheswm mae chi yw'r person gorau i ddweud y stori neu archwilio'r pwnc yma?

CH. Pwyntiau Ymarferol

- i. Gellid cynnwys efallai ble rhagwelir ei pherfformio - ar lwyfan gonfensiynol neu mewn man arall.
- ii. Hyd y ddrama. A oes egwyl?
- iii. Nifer y cast – o fewn canllawiau'r gystadleuaeth [dim mwy na 5 perfformiwr].

E. Adnoddau / Dylanwadau / Cyfeirnodau

- i. Oes dramâu eraill sy'n debyg o ran naws neu ffurf sydd wedi eich ysbrydoli? Neu raglenni teledu/ffilmiau?
 - ii. Dyfyniadau o straeon newyddion?
 - iii. Ydych chi eisiau cynnwys delweddau sydd yn help i gyfleu teimlad y darn?
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Helpful Notes for Competitors:

Adjudicator's Expectations

- i. The panel of adjudicators is mainly looking for a strong idea that has been explored in depth, feels original, and is relevant for innovative Welsh-speaking audiences.
 - ii. In your application, you are expected, as a playwright, to demonstrate an understanding of your voice as an author and provide a clear visual sense of your play and its story.
 - iii. You must convey your idea within a **30–45-minute script**, or you have the option to submit a **strong treatment** – an outline of up to 2,500 words and examples of three scenes of dialogue.
 - iv. Consider the theatrical landscape as it currently exists in Wales, and ask yourself: what is missing?
 - v. If an applicant submits a full script, it would be useful to include an introduction to the vision at the beginning of the script.
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What are the requirements for creating a Treatment (outline of up to 2,500 words and 3 scenes)?

Here is a list of useful things for you to consider.

[You do not need to have definitive answers to the questions below at this stage. Nor do you need to stick to this order. The information below is just a prompt].

A. General

- i. Include the title of the work and your pseudonym at the top of your work – see the competition guidelines under the wording of the competition: [Playwright's Medal - further information](#) as well as the General Rules and Conditions of the Eisteddfod [General Rules and Conditions](#).

B. Theme(s)

- i. What is/are the theme(s) of the work? What are the main themes?

C. Background and Story

- i. **Summary of the story.** What are the main events within the play?
- ii. **Introduction to the characters.** What do they want or seek to achieve? What is the problem or challenges they face? What are the tensions between characters, or between a character and their circumstances?
- iii. **Introduction to the world of the play.** Setting. Where does the story take place? Time period and geography?
- iv. **Structure** – what is the beginning, middle, and end of the play? What is the crisis point? What is the journey of the characters/main character? What is the climax of the play?
- v. **The form of the piece.** Is the play a one-person show in the form of a monologue? A two-person play? A musical? Does the play happen in 'real time'? Is the story told chronologically, or do you want to jump back and forth in time?
- vi. **Genre** – Comedy? Drama? Is it a naturalistic play, or does it have more absurd elements?

- vii. **Music** (if relevant, e.g., a musical). Will original songs be an important part of the show?

D. Why this idea?

- i. How do you want to affect your audience? What do you want them to feel at the end of the piece? (Put yourself in the audience's shoes)
- ii. Why this play? Where did the inspiration come from?
- iii. Relevance: why now? What makes it relevant to audiences in Wales today?
- iv. Who is your target audience? Consider a specific age group, whether for children or young people. Or are there specific communities the play will appeal to?
- v. Why you? What interests and excites you about the idea? Is there a reason you are the best person to tell this story or explore this subject?

E. Practical Points

- i. You could include where you envisage it being performed – on a conventional stage, or in another space.
- ii. Length of the play. Will there be an interval?
- iii. Number of cast members – within the competition guidelines [no more than 5 performers].

F. Resources / Influences / References

- i. Are there other plays similar in tone or form that have inspired you? Or TV shows/films?
- ii. Quotes from news stories?
- iii. Do you want to include images that help convey the feel of the piece?
