

ENTRIES & SHOW INFORMATION

STALL RESERVATIONS

To reserve stalls please fill out the Split Rock June Stabling google form at splitrockjumpingtour.com

You can adjust your stabling request at any time, as long as stalls are available, by contacting lindsey@splitrockjumpingtour.com. **Final stall counts are due by the closing date of the show. You will be financially responsible for all stalls reserved at the time of the closing date.** Stalls are not transferable and use is limited to horses entered under the trainer's name who rented the stall. Tack stalls may be limited at any time per management's discretion.

Stalls will be \$375 per week.

ENTRIES

All entries must be accompanied by payment of the **\$150 Entry Deposit** for each horse. The deposit will be credited toward the overall account. Deposits will only be refunded before the closing date. All entries received after the closing date will be subject to a **\$50 late fee**.

Feed and bedding can be ordered through Dever independently from the horse show at www.deverinc.com. Paddocks and stall mats are also available through Dever. Please note that feed, bedding, stall mats etc. can **NOT** be split on trainer accounts in the show office.

ENTRIES & SHOW INFORMATION

RV PARKING

RV spaces are handled through the Kentucky Horse Park Campground. Reserve early as space is limited. Please call the campground directly at 859-259-4257 then press "2" when given the option. Ask for the "Split Rock" reservation block.

GOLF CARTS

Golf carts at the Kentucky Horse Park can be rented through Dever at www.deverinc.com

VETERINARY & HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

ALL HEALTH RECORDS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE SHOW OFFICE VIA EQUITRACE

A negative coggins test is required for every horse entering the Kentucky Horse Park property. A health certificate within 30 days is required for horses entering the state of Kentucky and 150 days for Kentucky-based horses. Exhibitors should also be able to provide Flu and Rhino vaccination records per USEF. FEI horses must abide by FEI requirements and log temperatures in the FEIHorse App.

PARKING

Parking at the horse park will be free for the 2025 season.

COMPETITION DETAILS & REQUIREMENTS

Each competition must be conducted in accordance with the FEI rules and the applicable USEF rules. Entry into the competition represents acknowledgement and acceptance, with no appeal, to these competition rules for all classes.

ENTRIES

A separate entry form (online, mailed, emailed) must be filled out for each horse. Each entry must be signed by the owner, rider, trainer, and coach (If applicable) and said signature shall constitute verification that the information contained thereon is accurate to the best of the signer's knowledge and belief.

The **entry deposit of \$150** must be paid at the time of entry submission either by credit card or check. Deposits will be applied to the overall show bill at checkout. However, the deposit will be deemed forfeit if a horse is scratched after the closing date of the horse show.

An open check or credit card must be on file with the show office before back numbers can be issued. The same back number will be assigned for consecutive weeks.

Entries and stalls will be limited. Competitors are encouraged to get their entries in early. Entries received after the show is sold out of stalls, will be placed on a waitlist in order of received entries.

Entries received after the closing date of the show, will be charged a **\$50 late entry fee**.

Under extreme circumstances, show management reserves the right to accept or deny any entry.

Any entry scratched after the closing date, but prior to the Friday preceding the show will forfeit their deposit. Any entry scratched on

the Friday preceding the show or after, will forfeit their deposit AND pay for their stall in full.

Under extreme circumstances and/or with an official veterinarian letter, show management reserves the right to enforce or waive fees.

All horses must pay **an office fee of \$100, facility fee of \$75, \$22 paramedic fee, and \$25 horse ambulance fee**.

There will be no same day adds, but classes may be scratched in the show office prior to the start of the class. Scratching at the in-gate does not scratch the class and the class fee will still be charged.

If a horse shows in a class it was not properly entered in, it will be charged a **\$25 ride, did not enter fee (RDNE)** in addition to the class fee.

Add/Scratches can be completed through the SRJT app until 3PM the day before the class or in the show office until 4PM the day before the class.

NIGHTWATCH

All horses occupying a stall will be required to pay a flat rate **night-watch fee of \$20**. No exceptions. Please provide contact name and cell phone number on the stall.

NON-SHOWING

All horses on the grounds must have a completed entry blank in the show office, including signatures. No exceptions. Non-showing horses must pay a flat rate **\$150 non-showing fee** in addition to any stall fees.

Scratched horses present on the show grounds will be considered non-showing.

MOVE IN/MOVE OUT

Move in for the Hunter Jumper Classic I will be Monday, June 2nd at 12:00PM. Move out for anyone not staying for the second week, will be Monday, June 9th at 8:00AM. Any stalls not vacated at that time, will be charged a **\$50 per horse late departure fee**.

Move in for Hunter Jumper Classic II will be Monday, June 9th at 2:00PM. All horses and equipment must be out of the stalls by Monday, June 16th at 8:00AM. Any stalls not vacated at that time, will be charged a **\$50 per horse late departure fee**.

Anyone planning to arrive early or depart late, must request to do so by emailing the show secretary. All early arrivals, if able to be accommodated, will be charged a **\$50 per horse early arrival fee**.

CHECKOUT

Each show is a separate entity and you must close out your account no later than Sunday each week.

Please look over your statement and report any errors to horse's name, riders, owners, addresses, and association numbers to a show secretary immediately.

Please double check that the payee and payee address listed is correct as they will receive any prize money awarded. A W9 must be completed annually for each payee.

After Sunday, all statements are final and will not be adjusted. Any accounts not closed out on Sunday will be charged a **\$50 late check out fee**.

PRIZE MONEY

Once a W9 has been received, Prize money can either be applied toward the balance due on the

show bill or mailed to the payee once the balance is settled. All unapplied prize money will be mailed to the payee on record within 30 days of the conclusion of the show if a W9 has been received and all outstanding balances are paid. Prize money must be claimed and cashed within 180 days of show.

Foreign competitors without a U.S. tax ID number will be asked to complete a W-8BEN or W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status Form.

ORDER OF GO

All classes in the main jumper ring will have set orders of go. Unless specified, all other classes will be done by check in at the in-gate. Orders of go are produced in accordance with JP112. Orders of go are available at the show office, at the ring, and on the SRJT app. Orders for certain classes may be available at the entrance to the Hospitality tent.

SALUTE

Upon entrance into the arena for each class, all riders must salute the class sponsor (if applicable).

PRIZE CEREMONY

All riders and horses in the main jumper ring receiving ribbons 1st-8th, are required to be present for and participate in the prize ceremonies. This applies to national and FEI classes. Grooms for the top 3 placing horses of each class will accompany the competitor and horse onto the field to be present to hold the horse during the rider podium portion of the ceremony. Please note, for the safety of all horses, competitors, and spectators, plan for an alternate mount if your placing horse is unsuitable to participate in ceremonies and victory gallops.

Top 3 placing hunter horses and riders must be available for award

ceremonies. See specs for special hunter classes regarding riding for ribbons.

LEASH LAW

Dogs must be on a leash and under control at all times. Dog owners who fail to comply with the USEF rules regarding dogs may be subject to penalty, including a **\$100 fine** per incident and/or warning cards will be issued. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dog's behavior.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Golf carts must stay off the horse path. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside, will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm



utility vehicles on the competition grounds. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles when accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent, legal guardian, or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in

violation of this rule will be solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the minor committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including, but not limited to, segways, hoverboards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent, legal guardian, or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

LIABILITY

Under **Kentucky** law, a farm animal activity sponsor, farm animal professional, or other person does not have the duty to eliminate all risks of injury of participation in farm animal activities. Split Rock Jumping Tour, its owners, employees, agents, and sponsors shall not be liable or responsible for loss or damage to any animal, person, or property which occurs for any reason during the show. Each exhibitor holds the SRJT show management, its owners, agents, employees, as well as the USEF blameless for any accident or loss which may occur.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

The rated sections of this competition are official USEF point competitions for USEF National and USEF Zone Horse of the Year Awards Programs. All hunter classes are to be judged on performance and soundness.

Courses will consist of at least eight fences with changes of direction. Fences will simulate obstacles found in the hunt field such as brush, post and rails, walls, in and outs, gates, etc. No bank or water jumps. Handy hunter courses and jumps to simulate those found in trappy hunt country, and may include natural obstacles, a trot fence, and a fence to lead over.

Round 1: To be judged and numerically scored on execution, brilliance, and quality. If handiness assists with or enhances the effectiveness, precision, and execution of the track, then that combination will be scored solely on the individual judge's opinion. Judged over a course of at least 10 obstacles set at 3'. The course may include a gymnastics element(s), and liverpool(s). This class is not jumper nor hunter oriented. According to the judges' opinion, the rider that executes the track with the best style, effectiveness, and overall execution of the tests will win. Judges will be instructed to score as they see fit. In other words, for round one, judges may score the same numerical score for multiple riders. If there are more than 12 with ties, all riders with ties will advance to round two. If 12 exactly with ties, the top 12 will return for the second round.

Round 2: To be judged and numerically scored, according to the judges' opinion, based on which rider executes the track with the best style, effectiveness, and overall execution of the tests. This class is not jumper nor hunter oriented. Top 12 will return, in reverse order of combined score and qualification from the 1st round. This test will be preset within the course and posted in advance of round two. Judged over a shortened course set at 3'. Riders do NOT carry their scores from round one (clean slate), and all placings are based on round two scores. Judges will be required to score rounds as they see fit. Ties will remain ties beyond the top three placings. For example, if a judge, or the combined score of the judges, results in a tie, then there will be additional testing, to be determined by the judges to determine the top three placings. Ribbons will be given to the top 8 and riders must ride for ribbons.







ELIGIBILITY: Open to Professionals, Amateurs, and Juniors. Horse/rider combination qualify by competing in any other rated hunter classes at Split Rock Hunter Jumper I or II. ONE HORSE PER RIDER. If less than 20 riders at 4:00PM on Friday, than two horses per rider allowed.

ORDER OF GO: Order of go for the first round will be randomly drawn. The top 12 will return for the second round in reverse order of score.

ATTIRE: Formal jacket required. Buff breeches and shadbelly, white breeches, and dark or scarlet coat. Hunter colors or official sponsor/team jacket permitted.

SPECIFICATIONS:

Round 1: To be judged and numerically scored on brilliance, quality, movement, jumping style, manners, and way of going. If handiness shows off your horse to the best of her/his ability, then that combination will be scored solely on the individual judge's opinion. Judged over a course of at least 8 obstacles set at 3'5". The top 12 will return for the second round. Up to 5 judges will score each rider with the high and low scores dropped, leaving the average of the middle three scores as the final score/result. Should there be a tie, a designated judge #1 will be that tie breaker. In the instance that judge #1 gives each of the tied riders the same score, judge #2 will be the tie breaker and so on. The top 20 in the first round will receive prize money.

Round 2: To be judged and numerically scored on brilliance, quality, movement, jumping style, manners, and way of going. Top 12 will return, in reverse order of combined score and qualification from the 1st round. Judged over a shortened course set at 3'5". Riders do not carry their scores from round 1 (clean slate), and all placings are based on round 2 scores. Ribbons will be given to the top 8 and riders must ride for ribbons to receive prize money. The top 12 will receive prize money.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to all Juniors and Amateurs. All amateur participants must strongly adhere to all USEF amateur rules and regulations. If there is any question or protest of an amateur's status, management and stewards will look into the matter, and deem said rider as eligible or ineligible (entirely at management's final discretion), prior to the start of the class. Horse/rider combination may qualify by competing in any other rated class at either Split Rock Hunter Jumper I or II. ONE HORSE PER RIDER.

ORDER OF GO: Order of go for the first round will be randomly drawn. If two horses are allowed, a rider that competes two horses will automatically go before (on their first horse) a rider that only competes one horse. For example, if there are eight riders that compete two horses, then those eight riders will make up the first eight riders in the draw on one of their horses. All riders that only compete one horse, will automatically go as late as physically possible in the draw. The top 12 will return for the second round in reverse order of score.

ATTIRE: Formal jacket/attire required. Tan breeches, white breeches, and dark or scarlet coat. Hunter colors or official sponsor/team jacket permitted.

SPECIFICATIONS:

Round 1: To be judged and numerically scored on execution, brilliance, and quality. If handiness assists with or enhances the effectiveness, precision, and execution of the track, then that combination will be scored solely on the individual judge's opinion. Judged over a course of at least 10 obstacles set at 3'6". The course may include a gymnastics element(s), and liverpool(s). This class is not jumper nor hunter oriented. According to the judges' opinion, the rider that executes the track with the best style, effectiveness, and overall execution of the tests will win. Judges will be instructed to score as they see fit. In other words, for round one, judges may score the same numerical score for multiple riders. If there are more than 12 with ties, all riders with ties will advance to round two. If 12 exactly with ties, the top 12 will return for the second round.

Round 2: To be judged and numerically scored, according to the judges' opinion, based on which rider executes the track with the best style, effectiveness, and overall execution of the tests. This class is not jumper nor hunter oriented. Top 12 will return, in reverse order of combined score and qualification from the 1st round. This test will be preset within the course and posted in advance of round two. Judged over a shortened course set at 3'6". Riders do NOT carry their scores from round one (clean slate), and all placings are based on round two scores. Judges will be required to score rounds as they see fit. Ties will remain ties beyond the top three placings. For example, if a judge, or the combined score of the judges, results in a tie, then there will be additional testing, to be determined by the judges to determine the top three placings. Ribbons will be given to the top 8 and riders must ride for ribbons.

Trainers must be present for prize giving ceremonies.

Horses may not cross into the USHJA International Hunter Derby. Horses may not cross enter into multiple sections of the Championship. Riders are limited to four horses.

ORDER OF GO: Order of go for the first round will be randomly drawn. Order of go for second round will be reverse order of scores from the first round. If a jump off is needed, order will be the same from the second round.

ATTIRE: Formal jacket required. Buff breeches and shadbelly, white breeches, and dark or scarlet coat. Hunter colors or official sponsor/team jacket permitted.

SCHOOLING: During the class, all horses must be ridden in official schooling areas. Rider's must wear their horse's competition number.

RIDER MEETING: There will be a rider meeting before the start of the class.

SPECIFICATIONS:

Round 1: Classic Hunter Style Round to be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners, and way of going. Judged over a course of at least 10 obstacles set 3'. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option jumped. Option Fences set at 3'5". Scores will be added to determine the total first round score. The top 20 will return for the Second Round, ties for 20th left unbroken.

Round 2: Handy Hunter Round to be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners, and way of going. Judged over a course of at least 8 obstacles set at 3'. Handiness is worked into the base score. In addition to the base score, Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option jumped. Option Fences set at 3'5". The scores will be combined for the total Second Round score.

Scores from Round 1 and 2 will be added to determine overall winners. Ties for all places other than 1st to be broken by the base score from the Second Round. Ties for 1st will be broken by a Third Round. The top 12 overall are required to ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money. Ribbons will be given to the Top 12 in the first and second round, and top 20 overall.

POINTS AND AWARDS: In order for HOTY bonus points/money to be awarded, rides must complete the USHJA Exhibitor Declaration Form, which must be filled out in the office by the end of the competition. Only one hunter section may be declared. Only Amateur or Junior riders may declare for their applicable Junior/Amateur Owner sections.

Riders entered in Adult Amateur Hunter sections may not compete in any other class in which obstacles exceed 3'5" at the same competition (exception: Equitation, Jumper classes 1.20m and lower, Amateur Owner Hunter classes, and the USHJA International Hunter Derby). Riders competing in the Amateur Owner Hunter sections may compete on one different horse in the Adult Amateur Hunter section.

Horses:

Horses cannot cross enter into 3'3" or 3'6" Amateur Owner Hunter sections at the same competition. Horses may only compete in one age group per competition.

Horse and Rider Combination:

No cross entry restrictions

LOW ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Riders:

Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where the fences exceed 3' (Exception: All Age Group Equitation Classes). Riders who compete in the 3' Adult Amateur Hunter Section may show one horse in the Low Adult Amateur Hunter Section.

Horse and Rider Combination:

Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any classes or section where the fences exceed 2'9" at the same competition. (Exception: All Age Group Equitation)

CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

A Children's Hunter Horse rider may only compete one different horse in the Junior Hunter Sections. Riders entered in Children's Hunter Horse sections may not compete in any other class in which obstacles exceed 3'5" at the same competition (exception: Junior Hunter sections and USHJA International Hunter Derby). A Junior Hunter rider may only compete one different horse in the Children's Hunter Horse section. Riders entered in the Children's Hunter Horse section may only compete on one Children's Hunter Pony at the same competition.

Horses/Ponies:

Horses entered in Children's Hunter classes may not cross enter into Junior Hunter sections at the same competition. Horses may only compete in one age group per competition.

Horse and Rider Combination:

No cross entry restrictions.

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Riders:



WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian (“USEF”) allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and Hunter Jumper Classic I, II, & Junior Hunter Nat Champ (“USEF Event” or “USEF Events”); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the “Agreement”):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers (“Risks”).

WARNING:

Under Kentucky law, a farm animal activity sponsor, farm animal professional, or other person does not have the duty to eliminate all risks of injury of participation in farm animal activities. There are inherent risks of injury that you voluntarily accept if you participate in farm animal activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the “Released Parties” or “Event Organizers”**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature (“Liability”) which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

E. COMPETITION DETAILS & REQUIREMENTS

ORGANIZING COMMITTEE DECISIONS

It is important to understand that interpretations of existing rules and regulations and the invoking of additional rules and regulations to cover unforeseen circumstances are the sole responsibility of the Organizing Committee, with the approval of the Ground Jury, and that all owners, trainers, chefs, competitors, and grooms agree to the acceptance of these interpretations and additional rulings by virtue of your participation. Horse show management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to cancel any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or judges; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule or as competition warrants, or make any changes management deems is in the best interest of the show and its exhibitors.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee.

Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF

Every class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current United States Equestrian rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Reminder: all USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF SafeSport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Each horse will be charged a **USEF fee of \$23 per competition (\$15 Drugs and Medication, \$8 USEF) and \$10 fee for USHJA**. Anyone who is not a member of USHJA will be charged a **\$30 USHJA show pass fee**. Owners, riders, and trainers must be active competing members of the USEF and USHJA, join at the show, or pay the listed show pass fees. Farms, partnerships, etc. owning a horse competing in a USEF licensed competition must be recorded with USEF and one recorded owner of the entity must have a current USHJA competing membership.

Riders showing in classes restricted to junior, amateur, or adult must present their membership card or other documentation indicating their junior or amateur status.

The exhibitor has the ultimate responsibility for proper registration of horse, owner, rider, and trainer with USEF and USHJA and for entering the horse under proper ownership where points are concerned.

All horses competing in any USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prixes are subject to the **\$35 USEF International High Performance fee** in accordance with GR207.

Horses/ponies showing in Junior Hunter, Pony Hunter, or Children's Hunter Pony are required to have a USEF measurement card or arrange to be measured at the show.


Horses must be recorded with USEF annually or in life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards. All horses competing in the USEF licensed hunter/jumper/equitation competitions must be registered with both USEF and USHJA. All horses are required to have a microchip recorded with USEF and USHJA.

FARRIER

No farrier other than the official show farrier will be permitted on the grounds unless pre-approved by the SRJT show management.

SPECIAL HUNTER CLASSES

Judged on performance and soundness with manners and suitability emphasized. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. The top 12 (or 1/2) horses/ponies from the first round will return to jump a second round

in reverse order of their scores in the first round; lowest score going first and highest score going last. In the case of ties, the order of those tied will be drawn. Scores will be averaged from both rounds to determine the winners. In case of tie for first place only, judges will confer to break the tie. All other ties will remain and riders will toss a coin for the ribbons.

SEPARATE TWO-ROUND CLASSIC

For the first round, each competitor will jump one round of approximately 10-12 fences at the required height.

DESIGNATED FIRST-ROUND CLASSIC

A designated class of the division will be the first round of the classic. You must enter the classic prior to competing in the first round class. A horse shown in the second round without being officially entered will incur double the classic entry fee. Scratches are not permitted after the first round class has begun. See schedule for the designated first round class.

COMBINING, DIVIDING, OR CANCELING DIVISIONS, CLASSES, OR CLASSICS

The decision to combine, cancel, or divide classes will be made at the discretion of show management. The update will be reflected on the app and "how many" schedule.

COMBINING/DIVIDING

Once a class, classic, or division has been combined due to insufficient entries, it will not be re-divided for additional entries the day of the class.

A class, classic, or division that has been offered as split may be combined on the day of if scratched entries warrant. Management has the right to run all sections of the class, classic, or division in their entirety before pinning if insufficient entries seem likely.

All classes with prize money that

have over 80 entries will be California Split. All classes without prize money that have over 40 entries will be California Split.

CANCELING

A class, classic, or division that has been canceled due to insufficient entries will not be reinstated for additional entries on the day of the class.

ANIMAL WELFARE

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, its members, directors, and employees, contractors, sponsoring entities and facility harmless for any loss or accident to horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise.

Manual poling or the use of bamboo off-sets is prohibited while on the property. Violators will be subject to penalty with the automatic elimination of the horse involved from the class it is competing in and/or the succeeding class in which it was entered and will forfeit all entry fees for that class. Riders/trainers who, in the opinion of the judges or committee, use a whip or spurs in a cruel or excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the current and/or succeeding class in which the horse/rider is entered and will forfeit all entry fees for that class. All incidents may be reported by the USEF steward and to the USEF for possible further investigation.

FORMAL ATTIRE

Formal attire is required in some classes, including FEI, derbies, and jumper finals. White breeches only for these classes. See class specs for further information.

PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR

It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/-SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parents, guardian, or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with the appropriate safety standards and is properly fitted and in good condition.

ACCIDENTS INVOLVING COMPETITORS

GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until a release is provided. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this rule.

MARTINGALE

1.30M AND BELOW

No martingale restriction when used in a conventional manner.

CLASSES ABOVE 1.30M AND ALL YOUNG HORSE CLASSES

May only use running martingales used in a conventional manner.

IRISH MARTINGALES

permitted in all classes.

DRAW REINS AND GERMAN MARTINGALES

Only allowed when schooling or classes below 1.20m without prize money and are not permitted in age restricted classes. Ponies may

not be ridden by a junior in draw reins or German martingales at any time.

STALLS

Stalls are either permanent in construction with wood walls or temporary with vinyl walls under a tent. The permanent stalls have asphalt flooring and the tent stalls have grass flooring. Permanent stalls are 10'x12' Or 10'x10', and tent stalls are 10'x10'. All stalls have doors.

SHARPS

Anyone found discarding sharps in any other manner than the provided sharps containers will be **fined up to \$250** per instance and held responsible for any fines or expenses incurred by management.

ENTRIES

The last date for substitutions is the Monday before the show. Exhibitors are responsible for the fees of all horses entered by them or their agents.

No balances may be rolled forward to the following week. Failure to checkout will incur a **\$50 late check out fee**. All statements become final at the close of business on Sunday evening for that week. Disputes will not be allowed after this time. Management has permission to close out any outstanding balances with the provided payment information. Trainers will be held financially responsible for any clients who do not submit viable payment in a timely manner, including late fees and splits.

Trainers may split miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon on Friday of the show week. Only items billed by the horse show directly

may be split (i.e. no feed/bedding ordered through Dever). Any disputes regarding splits should be handled between the trainer and their clients. Competition Management will follow the dictations of the trainer regarding all splits.

The prices in this catalog reflect a discount for paying cash, check, or other means not involving a credit card. **All credit card transactions will incur a 3.25% fee** on the total amount paid.

All foreign competitor balances must be paid in cash, check drawn on a U.S. bank, or a credit card using U.S. funds.

Checks returned by the bank and credit card chargebacks will incur a 10% or \$50 penalty, whichever is greater. If not sufficiently paid in 10 days, accounts will be turned over to USEF.

A new W9 form is required for each calendar year. As per FEI regulations, Split Rock Jumping Tour is required to issue all tax forms to the owner, regardless as to whom the prize money is paid. Foreign competitors must include a U.S. tax ID number on their entry form or 30% of their winnings will be withheld as per the U.S. Internal Revenue Service.

SCHOOLING AND WARM UP

The designated schooling arena for the competition will be restricted to only horses warming up to compete in said classes. Horses wishing to school at times other than their designated competition warm up time must use the arena(s) posted for open flattening/schooling. SRJT management reserves the right to change schooling locations and times to best suit the competition arenas due to conditions, weather, and schedule. Hors Concours rounds will not be permitted.

COURTESY CIRCLE

In some instances it may become necessary to restrict the area of the courtesy circle by the mandatory line. If this is implemented it will be clearly marked on the course chart and a corresponding barrier will be erected on the course. A public announcement will also be made.

TIES

All ties in jumper competition will be broken on the basis of time in accordance with the FEI and USEF rules. Hunter and Equitation ties will be left in accordance with the applicable USEF, USHJA, or Zone rules.

EQUITATION

Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they have entered to ride.

There is no penalty for the rider to scratch an equitation class from one horse and add it to another horse. Exhibitors who enter an equitation class on one horse and ride another horse or wear another horse's number, will be charged on both horses.

FEI RULES & REGULATIONS



FEI INSPECTIONS & STABLING

All horses must be on grounds by 12:00PM Wednesday. The FEI inspection will be held at 4:00PM on Wednesday. If necessary, any re-inspections will be held at 7:00AM on Thursday.

FEI FEES FOR HORSES & RIDERS

As approved at the 2006 General Assembly, an annual FEI registration is now mandatory for all riders and horses competing in FEI events. The fee requirement took effect January 1, 2006 and must be renewed annually. All horses and riders must be registered with the FEI before competing in any FEI competition.

FEI HORSE PASSPORTS

Every horse entered for any competition at CSNs or CSI1*/2*s in a foreign country, CSI3*/4*/5*s, CSIOs, Championships, and Regional and Olympic Games whether at home or in foreign countries must have an official, valid, FEI passport or National passport approved by the FEI accompanied by a FEI Recognition Card as means of identification and to establish ownership.

EQUINE INFLUENZA PROTOCOL

All horses participating in FEI events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza according to the following minimum protocol (FEI

Veterinary Regulations Article 1028):

1. An initial primary course of two vaccinations must be given, the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination.
2. The first booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary course. All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the primary course prior to January 1, 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the first booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.
3. The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months. However, for horses competing, the last booster must have been given within 6 months plus 21 days (and not within 7 days) before the arrival at the event.
4. The horse must have received at least the primary course of vaccinations against Equine Influenza.
5. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the horse's arrival at the event.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The FEI requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount. Welfare of the horse must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences. A full copy of the FEI Code of Conduct can be obtained from the Federation Equestre Internationale at HM King Hussein 1 Building, Chemin de la Joliette 8, 1006 Lausanne, Switzer-

land. Telephone: +41 21 310 47 47.

This code is also available in English and French on the FEI's website at www.fei.org.

ALL SECTIONS WILL ADHERE TO FEI RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Split Rock Hunter Jumper will be conducted in accordance with: FEI Statutes (25th Edition, effective November 21, 2023); FEI General Regulations (24th Edition, effective January 1, 2024); FEI Veterinary Regulations (15th Edition, effective January 1, 2024); FEI Rules for Jumping and its Annexes (27th Edition, effective January 1, 2024); FEI Anti-Doping Rules for Equine and Human Athletes (3rd Edition, effective January 1, 2023); and all subsequent revisions to the above Rules and Regulations which will take precedence.

An arbitration procedure is provided for the FEI Statutes and General Regulations as referred above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies must be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.

2. Horses which lose a shoe prior to starting in the initial round of a one round competition with a jump-off will be given a later starting position. In a jump-off, a horse that loses a shoe prior to starting will be given a new starting place three positions later. If the horse in question has not had its shoe replaced by that time, the Ground Jury will decide whether, at its discretion, the horse in question should receive a later starting place or be eliminated (Article 245.5).

3. Ownership information listed in the passport (and therefore registered with the appropriate Federation) is considered correct. If there are any issues with, or corrections to, the address or ownership shown in your horse's passport, you must bring these to the attention of the Show Secretary for a ruling by the Organizing Committee by 5PM of the day prior to the start of the tournament to exempt you from withholding tax.

4. Competitors may carry the logo

of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth. The Chief Steward is responsible for ensuring the FEI Regulations relating to Article 135 are respected by riders before entering the arena. Competitors not complying with Article 135 will not be permitted to enter the arena during competition.

5. In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Chefs d'Equipe and the Ground Jury, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to modify the

show schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Competitors and Officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

6. Competitors are responsible for saluting the Ground Jury and Sponsors upon entering the competitive ring.


