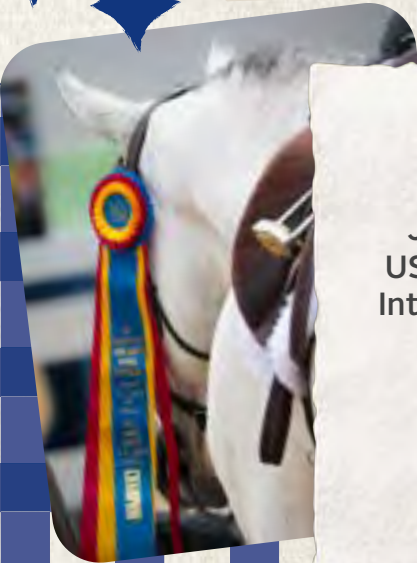

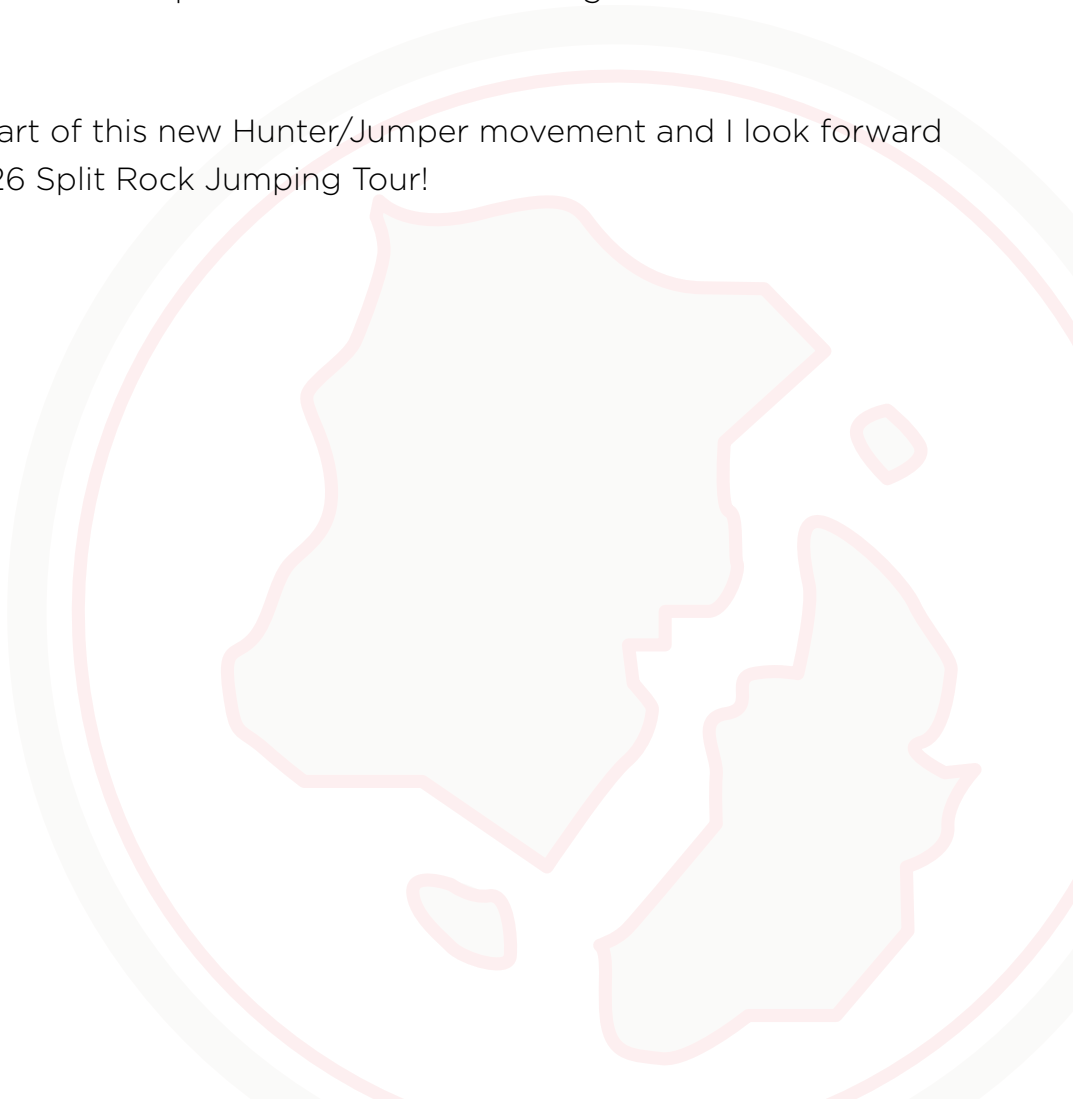

ENTRIES & SHOW INFORMATION

STALL RESERVATIONS

To reserve stalls please fill out the Split Rock June Stabling google form at splitrockjumpingtour.com

You can adjust your stabling request at any time, as long as stalls are available, by contacting jengamboa1@gmail.com. **Final stall counts are due by the closing date of the show. You will be financially responsible for all stalls reserved at the time of the closing date.** Stalls are not transfer-able and use is limited to horses entered under the trainer's name who rented the stall. Tack stalls may be limited at any time per management's discretion.

Stalls will be \$375 per week.

ENTRIES

All entries must be accompanied by payment of the **\$150 Entry Deposit** for each horse. The deposit will be credited toward the overall account. Deposits will only be refunded before the closing date. All entries received after the closing date will be subject to a **\$50 late fee**.

SHIP IN

Ship ins will only be allowed for non-showing horses. All non-showing horses must be entered in the horse show and receive a back number to participate in ticketed warm-ups or ride in general riding arenas. Ship in fees will be waived for this show.

FEED & BEDDING

Feed and bedding can be ordered through Dever independently from the horse show at www.dever-inc.com. Stall mats and paddocks are also available through Dever. Please note that feed, bedding, stall mats etc. can **NOT** be split on trainer accounts in the show o^c e.

RV PARKING

RV spaces are handled through the Kentucky Horse Park Campground. Reserve early as space is limited. Please call the campground directly at 859-259-4257 then press "2" when given the option. Ask for the "Split Rock Spring/Country Heir" reservation block.

Parking at the horse park will be free for the 2026 season.

IMPORTANT REMINDER - All horses must be accompanied by a back number when out of their stalls. All non-showing horses must be entered with the show office.

ARRIVAL TIMES & ENTRY DEADLINES:

Barns open for move in Monday at 2:00PM. Horses may arrive at anytime after the opening of stables, but must be on property and checked in by their appropriate section arrival time.

GLADSTONE CUP:

Must be entered in Jog (max. 2 horses per rider allowed): Monday, June 15 - 4:00PM

Must be on grounds: Tuesday, June 16 - 12:00PM

Check in: Gladstone Jog; Tuesday, June 16 - 2:00PM

Entries Finalized: Tuesday, June 16 - 4:00PM

Commencing twelve (12) hours prior to the start of USHJA Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic until the conclusion of all competition in that class, only the competition rider may ride his entry.

3'3" & 3'6" 16-17 SECTIONS (SMALL & LARGE):

Must be on grounds: Wednesday, June 17 - 7:30AM

Check in: With Stewards at Farrier Stand; Wednesday, June 17 - 12:00PM-5:00PM

Entries Finalized: Wednesday, June 17 - 4:00PM

Only declared junior rider may ride horse: Wednesday, June 17 - 7:30PM until competition end

3'3" & 3'6" 15/UNDER SECTIONS (SMALL & LARGE):

Must be on grounds: Friday, June 19 - 7:30AM

Check in: With Stewards at Farrier Stand; Friday, June 19 - 12:00PM-5:00PM

Entries Finalized: Friday, June 19 - 4:00PM

Only declared junior rider may ride horse: Friday, June 19 - 7:30PM until competition end

No changes to Junior Hunter horse, rider, or section will be allowed after the applicable section entry deadline. No exceptions.

Horses must be present at all times on showgrounds until the conclusion of their section to be eligible for awards. There will be no hacking or hand walking allowed in any competition rings outside of scheduled ticketed warm-up opportunities.

COMPETITION DETAILS & REQUIREMENTS

Each competition must be conducted in accordance with the applicable USEF rules. Entry into the competition represents acknowledgement and acceptance, with no appeal, to these competition rules for all classes.

ENTRIES

A separate entry form (online, mailed, emailed) must be filled out for each horse. Each entry must be signed by the owner, rider, trainer, and coach (If applicable) and said signature shall constitute verification that the information contained thereon is accurate to the best of the signer's knowledge and belief.

The **entry deposit of \$150** must be paid at the time of entry submission either by credit card or check. Deposits will be applied to the overall show bill at checkout. However, the deposit will be deemed forfeit if a horse is scratched after the closing date of the horse show.

An open check or credit card must be on file with the show office before back numbers can be issued. The same back number will be assigned for consecutive weeks.

Management reserves the right to limit tack stalls as necessary.

Entries received after the closing date of the show, will be accepted as space permits until June 1. Entries will only be accepted after June 1 on a case by case basis. All late entries will be charged a **\$50 late entry fee**.

Under extreme circumstances, show management reserves the right to accept or deny any entry.

Any entry scratched after the closing date, but prior to the Friday preceding the show will forfeit their deposit. Any entry scratched on the Friday preceding the show or

after, will forfeit their deposit AND pay for their stall in full.

Under extreme circumstances and/or with an official veterinarian letter, show management reserves the right to enforce or waive fees.

All horses must pay an **office fee of \$100, facility fee of \$75, \$22 paramedic fee, and \$25 horse ambulance fee**.

There will be no same day adds, but classes may be scratched in the show office prior to the start of the class. Scratching at the in-gate does not scratch the class and the class fee will still be charged.

If a horse shows in a class it was not properly entered in, it will be charged a **\$25 ride, did not enter fee (RDNE)** in addition to the class fee.

No adds will be allowed for this competition after 6:00PM on Tuesday, June 17th.

NIGHTWATCH

All horses occupying a stall will be required to pay a flat rate **night-watch fee of \$20**. No exceptions. Please provide contact name and cell phone number on the stall.

NON-SHOWING

All horses on the grounds must have a completed entry blank in the show office, including signatures. No exceptions. Non-showing horses must pay a flat rate **\$150 non-showing fee** in addition to any stall fees.

Scratched horses present on the show grounds will be considered non-showing.

MOVE IN/MOVE OUT

Move in for the Junior Hunter Championships will be Monday, June 15th at 12:00PM. All competi-

ing horses (Junior Hunters & Gladstone) must be on competition grounds a minimum of 12 hours prior to the start day of competition (June 17th).

All horses and equipment must be out of the stalls by Monday, June 22nd at 8:00AM. Any stalls not vacated at that time, will be charged a **\$50 per horse late departure fee**.

Anyone planning to arrive early or depart late, must request to do so by emailing the show secretary. All early arrivals, if able to be accommodated, will be charged a **\$50 per horse early arrival fee**.

CHECKOUT

Each show is a separate entity and you must close out your account no later than Sunday each week.

Please look over your statement and report any errors to horse's name, riders, owners, addresses, and association numbers to a show secretary immediately.

Please double check that the payee and payee address listed is correct as they will receive any prize money awarded. A W9 must be completed annually for each payee.

After Sunday, all statements are final and will not be adjusted. Any accounts not closed out on Sunday will be charged a **\$50 late check out fee**.

PRIZE MONEY

Once a W9 has been received, Prize money can either be applied toward the balance due on the show bill or mailed to the payee once the balance is settled. All unapplied prize money will be mailed to the payee on record within 30 days of the conclusion of the show if a W9 has been

received and all outstanding balances are paid. Prize money must be claimed and cashed within 180 days of show.

Foreign competitors without a U.S. tax ID number will be asked to complete a W-8BEN or W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status Form.

ORDER OF GO

All classes will have an order of go, absolutely no changes can be made to the order of go without the permission of the show committee, no exceptions. Classic round order of go will be done by a random draw. Under Saddle sections will be based on the order of go from the Classic round. Handy round orders of go will be in reverse order of overall standings based on the first two phases. Orders of go are available at the show office, at the ring, and on the SRJT app. Orders for certain classes may be available at the entrance to the Hospitality tent.

PRIZE CEREMONY

All Junior Hunter riders and horses receiving 1st-10th place ribbons for class awards and 1st-20th place for overall section awards are required to be present for and participate in the prize ceremonies.

All Gladstone riders and horses receiving ribbons 1st-12th, are required to be present for and participate in the prize ceremonies. The trainers of the top three riders are also required to be present.

LEASH LAW

Dogs must be on a leash and under control at all times. Dog owners who fail to comply with the USEF rules regarding dogs may be subject to penalty, including a \$100 fine per incident and/or warning cards will be issued. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dog's behavior.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Golf carts must stay off the horse path. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside, will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles when accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent, legal guardian, or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule will be solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the minor committing the offense.

Wheeled

chairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including, but not limited to, segways, hoverboards, and single wheeled scoot-

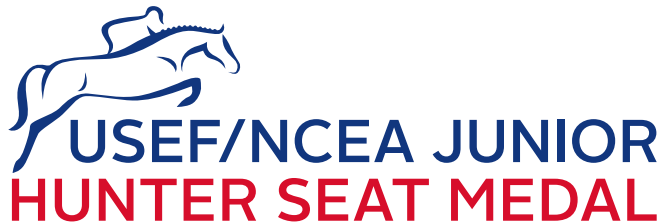
ers is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent, legal guardian, or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

LIABILITY

Under Kentucky law, a farm animal activity sponsor, farm animal professional, or other person does not have the duty to eliminate all risks of injury of participation in farm animal activities. Split Rock Jumping Tour, its



owners, employees, agents, and sponsors shall not be liable or responsible for loss or damage to any animal, person, or property which occurs for any reason during the show. Each exhibitor holds the SRJT show management, its owners, agents, employees, as well as the USEF blameless for any accident or loss which may occur.

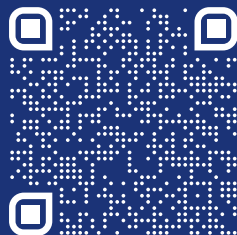

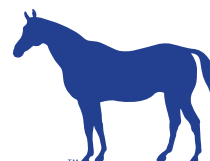
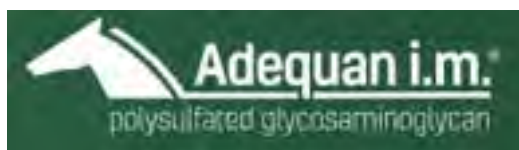

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

- a. The horse must be actively recorded in good standing with the Federation pursuant to GR1102 and GR1108 and registered in good standing with USHJA at the time of qualification and on or before the first day of the Championship continuing through the conclusion of the Championship.
- b. The individual Owner(s) of record of the horse must be an competing member in good standing of the Federation and USHJA at the time of qualification and on or before the first day of the Championship, continuing through the conclusion of the Championship.
- c. Ownership of the horse may change during the qualifying period and up to the close of entries for the Championships, so long as the new owner(s) meets the above requirements.
- d. Ownership records of the horse with USEF and USHJA must match at the time of qualification and on or before the first day of the Championship through the conclusion of the Championship.
- e. The rider of the horse must be an competing member in good standing of the Federation and USHJA at the time of qualification and on or before the first day of the Championship, continuing through the conclusion of the Championship.
- f. The rider of the horse must be a junior rider as defined in GR128 to earn qualifying results and compete at the championships. The junior rider that qualifies the horse may differ from the one that rides the horse at the Championships.
- g. Horses must have a valid microchip in accordance with HU104.
- h. A current USEF measurement card is required for horses that compete in the Small Junior Hunter sections.
 1. Horses that receive a re-measurement after achieving a qualification but before the Championships, are subject to forfeiture of qualification for the Championships in accordance with HU143.2c, if the re-measurement results in the horse being assigned to a different section.
 2. If a horse with no measurement card at the time of qualification later receives a measurement card that results in it being assigned to a different section from the one in which it qualified, it will be subject to forfeiture of qualification for the Championships in accordance with HU143.2c.
 3. Horses that receive a re-measurement may re-qualify in their newly assigned height section.
- i. The Championships may be split into two Championships; East and West Coast. Qualified horses may compete in either Championship but the horse's owners or their agent must declare which championship the horse will be competing in as the horse is only allowed to compete in one championship per year.

QUALIFYING:

a. Junior Hunter 3'3"

1. A 3'3" Junior Hunter qualifies by winning one (1) Champion or one (1) Reserve Champion in a Premier (AA), National (A), or Regional (B) rated Junior Hunter 3'3" section at a competition with a start date from May 1, 2025 - April 30, 2026.
2. A horse will also qualify if it is ranked in the top 10 on the USHJA Zone Horse of the Year Channel I or Channel II ranking list for any of the Junior Hunter 3'3" sections based on results from competitions with a start date from December 1, 2025 - April 30, 2026.
3. A horse will also qualify if it competes in and completes all offered classes (over fences and under saddle) in 3'3" junior hunter sections at five (5) USEF licensed competitions during the Qualifying Period of May 1, 2025-April 30, 2026.

b. Junior Hunter 3'6"

1. A 3'6" Junior Hunter qualifies by winning one (1) Champion or one (1) Reserve Champion in a Premier (AA), National (A), or Regional (B) rated Junior Hunter 3'6" section at a competition with a start date from May 1, 2025 - April 30, 2026.
2. A horse will also qualify if it is ranked in the top 10 on the USHJA Zone Horse of the Year Channel I or Channel II ranking list for any of the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections based on results from competitions with a start date from December 1, 2025 - April 30, 2026.
3. A horse will also qualify if it competes in and completes all offered classes (over fences and under

saddle) in 3'6" junior hunter sections at five (5) USEF licensed competitions during the Qualifying Period of May 1, 2025-April 30, 2026.

c. Horses that are Champions or Reserve Champions in their respective fence height sections at the previous year's Championship may return to compete in that same fence height section without qualifying.

ENTRY RESTRICTIONS:

- a. Each junior rider may show one large and one small entry on both coasts in the same year.
- b. The junior rider may compete at 3'3" or 3'6" but may not compete at both heights in one Championship. The junior rider may compete in the 3'3" at one Championship, and 3'6" at the other championship in the same year (see HU143.7 for additional restrictions).
- c. Riders competing in the 3'3" sections must not have competed at 1.30m or above during the qualifying period and through the conclusion of the Championship.

PHASES:

- a. The Championship will be conducted in three phases: A single Classic Round to count 40%, Under Saddle to count 20%, and a single Handy Hunter Round to count 40%.
- b. To determine the winner, scores will be calculated based on the total of the combination of all three phases after the percentages of each phase have been calculated.
 1. **Classic Round.** The course must include at least ten obstacles, have two changes of direction, and at least one combination. Emphasis will be placed on "brilliance" for this round.
 - i. In the Classic Round each entry will be given a numerical score of 0-100 from each judge based on its performance.
 - ii. The order of go for the Classic Round will be randomized. The order of go may not be changed without the approval of the Show Committee.
 2. **Under Saddle.** To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Horses will be asked to hand gallop one direction. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. The Under Saddle is Judged on performance and soundness. Manners and suitability to be emphasized.
 - i. In the Under Saddle phase, horses will be judged in groups of twelve or fewer. Each entry will be judged and given a score of 01-100 from each judge based on its performance in the group.
 - ii. The order of go for the Under Saddle will either be randomized or created based on the order of go from the Classic Round. The order of go may not be changed without the approval of the Show Committee.
 3. **Handy Hunter.** Obstacles should simulate those found in hunt country. The course will have at least two changes of direction and at least one in and out as well as three of the following: hand gallop a jump, bending line, rollback turn, fence at the end of the ring, open a gate while mounted or trot over one obstacle. Judges will emphasize promptness and tight turns with precedence being given in that order. Handiness is defined as time and ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Hand Gallop is defined as a significant increase in pace without sacrificing performance or style.
 - i. In the Handy Hunter each entry will be given a numerical score of 0-100 from each judge panel based on its performance.
 - ii. The order of go will be created based on scores from the Classic Round, or the combined scores from both the Classic Round and Under Saddle phases. The order of go may not be changed without the approval of the Show Committee.
4. Soundness. All horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion.
5. The same junior rider is required to show an entry in all phases of the Championship but need not be the same one that rode the horse in the qualifying event. If a rider is unable to continue to compete, the rider and/or trainer must request permission for a change of rider from the Show Committee. The decision of the Show Committee is final, binding, and not subject to further appeal of any kind.
6. Riders will be eliminated after two cumulative refusals in the Classic Round and Handy Hunter phases.
7. If a horse/rider combination does not complete a phase or is eliminated from that phase, that horse will receive a score of "0" for that phase but may continue on to compete in the remaining phases of the Championship. A horse with a total score of "0" for a phase is not eligible for an award for that phase but is eligible for an overall award.

JUDGING:

- a. East Coast Championships: It is required that a minimum of three judges officiate each phase simultaneously but independently of each other. It is recommended that a minimum of three panels of two judges officiate the Classic Round and Handy Hunter phases simultaneously but independently of each other, and three individual judges officiate the Under Saddle phase simultaneously but independently of each other. Each judge or panel will give every entry a score for each phase.
- b. West Coast Championships It is required that a minimum of three judges officiate each phase simultaneously but independently of each other. It is recommended that a minimum of two panels of two judges officiate the Classic Round and Handy Hunter phases simultaneously but independently of each other, and two individual judges officiate the Under Saddle phase simultaneously but independently of each other. Each judge or panel will give every entry a score for each phase.
- c. Prior to the Under Saddle and Handy Hunter, each entry's score in the previous phase will be totaled and announced. During the over fences phases, the Open Numerical Scoring System is used. After each entry completes the course, each judge's score for the round is immediately shown or announced. The total overall score for each entry is then calculated as soon as it has completed the last phase.
 1. Ties in the Classic Round, Under Saddle, and Handy Hunter phases will be broken based on the score of the judge that is designated as judge number one for each phase of the Championship, any further ties to be broken by the score of the judge that is designated as judge 2, and further ties to be broken by the score of the judge that is designated as judge 3. If a tie still exists for the overall standings, the score from the Classic Round will break such a tie.

CHAMPIONSHIP SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- a. Arrival Requirements
 1. Horses are required to be stabled on the competition grounds a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start time of the competition day on which the horse is entered to compete. All horses must be checked in with USEF Stewards. Handlers of the horses must provide their back number and stall number to the Stewards at the check-in location. Refer to the prize list for additional details outlining arrival times for each section and check-in locations.
- b. Departure Requirements
 1. Horses must remain stabled on competition grounds through the conclusion of their respective section to be eligible for awards.
- c. All horses must be entered into the competition prior to the deadline provided in the prize list.
- d. No changes can be made to entries after the final deadlines stated in the prize list; this includes the horse, the rider, and the respective section. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure entries are correct and submitted prior to the final deadline.
- e. 12 hours prior to the start time of the competition day in which the horse is entered to compete and continuing until their respective fence height section is completed in its entirety, only the competition rider may ride their entry. These riders must wear their competition number at all times anywhere on the grounds while mounted (HJ106).
- f. Failure to comply with these rules will result in elimination from the competition in its entirety if deemed appropriate by the show committee, which will be compiled of one of the competition's Federation Stewards, a member of the Federation staff, and the competition manager.

ELIGIBILITY:

The Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic may be held at either (or both) the East and West Coast USEF Junior Hunter National Championships. It is open to any Junior rider that has won either a USEF Hunter Seat Medal, ASPCA Maclay, USEF Show Jumping Talent Search, either phase of WIHS Equitation Classic at a National or Premier show, or an Overall WIHS Equitation Classic at a competition with a start date between June 1 of the previous year and May 31 of the championship year. The USHJA, at its discretion, can open qualifying procedures to allow for additional entries to fill this championship, should insufficient entries be received by the deadline. Riders must be an active USHJA Junior members at the time of competition to compete. Past winners of the East Coast or West Coast USHJA Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic or former East Coast or West Coast USHJA Hunterdon Cup Equitation Classic are no longer eligible to compete in either finals.

SPECIFICATIONS:

a. Jog:

1. All horses entered in the USHJA Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic must jog for soundness during the Official Jog prior to the start of the first round in order to compete. The Official Jog must be held within 24 hours of the start of the first round. This jog will be run in a manner similar to an FEI jog.
2. A horse must be officially entered in the class before it will be allowed to jog. All horse entries, including substitutes, must be entered in the class before the show office closes, the day prior to the Official Jog.
3. Proper attire is required. In addition, Juniors are required to wear protective headgear.
4. All horses must be presented at the Official Jog with their competition number and wearing a bridle, including noseband.
5. The judging panel for the Official Jog shall consist of the competition veterinarian and a minimum of one competition judge.
6. The jog surface must be level. Similar to an FEI Veterinary Inspection, horses shall be evaluated going directly away and back from the veterinarian and judge, after which, upon the recommendation of the veterinarian, the participating judge will decide if the horse passes.
7. If a horse does not pass the jog; the exhibitor may request to re-present the horse. The judge(s) may decide to allow the horse to re-present at any time up to one hour prior to the start of the class. The veterinarian and one of the judges from the original panel must be present. In this case, the decision of the participating judge is final and not subject to appeal.

b. Round 1: Classic Hunter Style Round. Riders to show over a classic hunter style course of at least ten (10) jumps. Open numeric scoring system will be used, scores will be announced

c. Round 2: Handy Hunter Round. The top twenty-five (25) riders will return for the Handy Hunter Round in reverse order of scores from Round 1. If there are 30 or fewer riders competing in Round 1, judges must bring back a minimum of the top 15 riders (if available) for the Handy Hunter Round. Riders must have completed Round 1 to be eligible to compete in Round 2. Riders will show over a handy hunter course of at least ten (10) jumps. Handiness and brilliance to be rewarded. Open numeric scoring system will be used, scores to be announced.

d. Round 3: Based on the combined scores from Rounds 1 and 2, the score from round 3 will be cumulative based on scores from Rounds 1 and 2. A minimum of the top six (6) riders will be asked to switch horses and jump a third course.

1. The course will consist of fences 1-8 from Round 2, with no tests included.

2. The fences may not be changed in any way from Round 2 and must be jumped in the original direction.
3. The riders may not be asked to execute anything that they have not already executed on their own horse previously in this competition.
4. Riders will switch as follows: riders one and two, riders three and four, riders five and six, et cetera. The riders will be asked to switch horses in a secured schooling area. Trainer assistance will be allowed.
5. Any tack (including boots) used in Round 2 must be used in Final Round (in the same manner as used in Round 2). No changes to tack (including boots) will be allowed other than switching saddles.
6. Riders will be given 180 seconds to do a brief flat and jump no more than two (2) schooling jumps. A steward will set the two schooling jumps (one 3'3" vertical and one 3'6" ramped oxer), trainers are not allowed to adjust jumps in any manner.
7. A schooling supervisor will oversee the switching of horses and subsequent schooling.
8. Riders will return in reverse order of the combined scores from Rounds 1 and 2 (lower to higher). and Scores will not be announced.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

- a. Fences to be set at 3'6".
- b. Fences shall be numbered in all rounds.
- c. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and course must offer a variety of Classic jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.
- d. A variety of jumps that will nicely challenge the riders are encouraged.
- e. Hunter Seat Equitation Championship Course (First Round)
 1. Course must consist of a minimum of at least ten (10) obstacles, with at least one of each of the following:
 - i. A minimum of 2 obstacles must not have ground lines
 - ii. In and out
 - iii. Bending line
 - iv. Line with an unrelated distance
 - v. Long approach to a single jump
 - vi. Narrow jump (5'6" -8')
 - vii. Option jumps are not allowed in the first round
- f. Handy Hunter Course (Second Round)
 1. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must contain the following elements:
 - i. Tight turns
 - ii. Different tracks
 - iii. Clever options for jump approaches
 - iv. Hand gallop to a jump
 - v. Trot a lowered obstacle (not to exceed 3'0" in height). Trot jump must be after Fence 8.

TACK:

Refer to EQ106.5a in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications.

SCHOOLING:

- a. Horses are required to be stabled on the competition grounds for a minimum of twelve (12) hours before the start of the competition.
- b. Commencing twelve (12) hours before the start of the USHJA Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic competition and continuing until finished competing in the USHJA Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic, only the competition rider may ride his entry. Riders may change horses for the Gladstone Cup only in the case of illness or injury to the declared horse, with verification from the horse show veterinarian and approval from the horse show committee.

- c. Competition Management must provide a ticketed warm up for Gladstone entries only, the day prior to the final. The warmup format must be timed, with a set course, with one rider on course at a time.
- d. Competition Management must provide a specific time for Gladstone entries only to hack in the competition ring.
- e. Competition Management must provide a dedicated schooling area for Gladstone entries only.

JUDGES AND JUDGING PROCEDURES:

- a. See GR1304 for Judging restrictions.
- b. One panel of two (2) "R" or Registered status judges licensed in Hunter/Jumping Seat Equitation are required for each of the USHJA Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic- East and West Coast events. One of the "R" registered judges must be approved by the USHJA Equitation Task Force prior to the final.
- c. Judges will sit together for the duration of the class and provide one (1) numerical score for each competitor in each phase.
- d. Riders to be judged on style and smoothness with an emphasis on hunter style of riding.
- e. The scores from each round will be combined for a final total score for each rider.
- f. The final combined scores from each rider will be used to determine placings.
- g. All ties will be broken using the scores from Round 1.
- h. Two cumulative refusals will incur elimination.
- i. Duplication of scores below the cut o" in R ound 1 is allowed.

AWARDS:

- a. The previous year's winner, if available, will be asked to assist in the presentation of the top twelve (12) ribbons.
- b. Ribbons will be awarded 1st- 12th place with the presentation of awards to be given in reverse order.
- c. The Overall Champion will be presented with a keeper trophy.
- d. Recognition will be given to the Trainer of the Overall Champion.
- e. Recognition will be given for the Best Equitation Horse. To be awarded to the horse deemed by the judges to be the best and most suitable equitation horse competing in the Gladstone Cup.

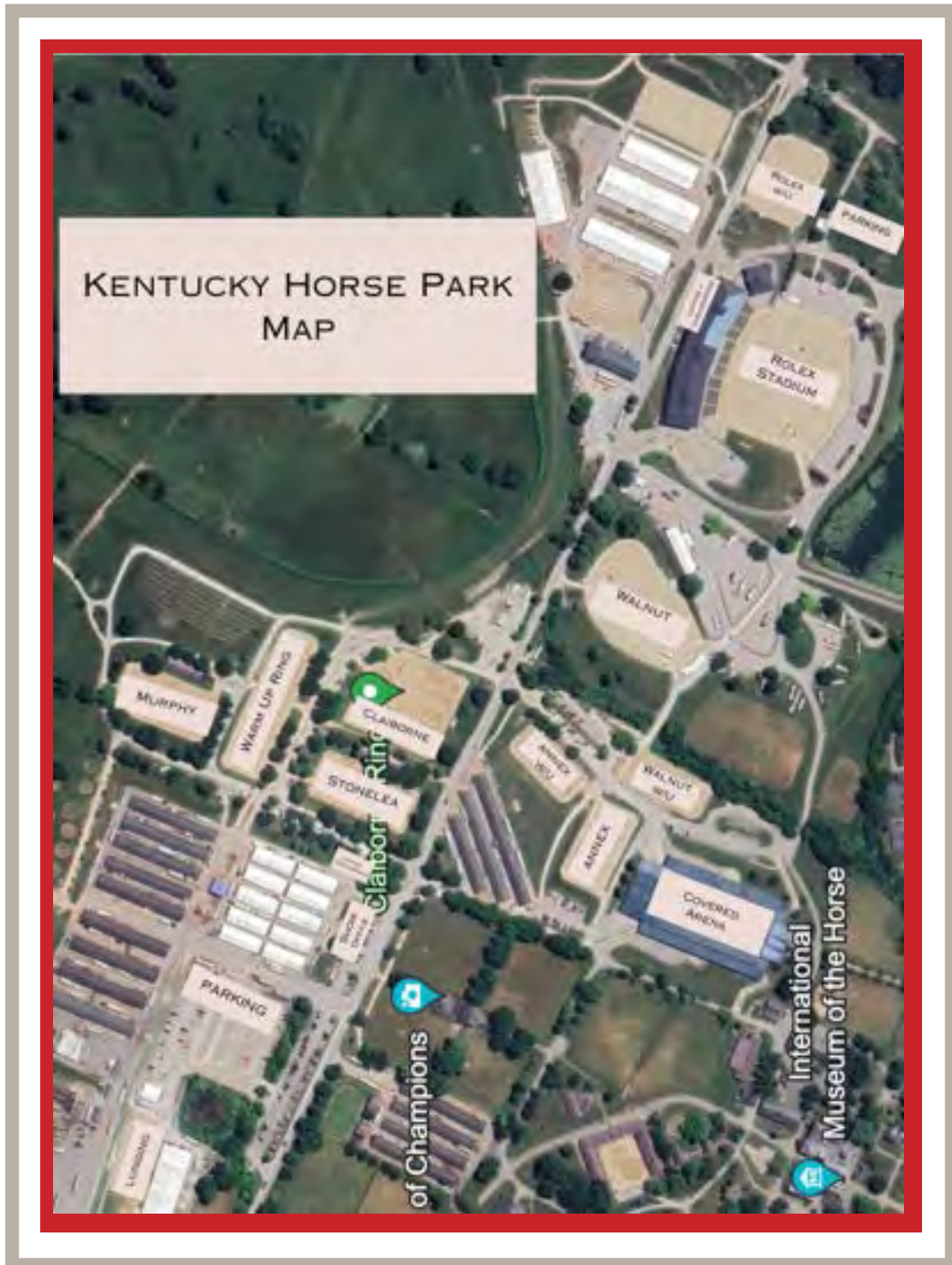

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage

Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USEF

Every class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current United States Equestrian rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Reminder: all USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF SafeSport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Each horse will be charged a **USEF fee of \$25 per competition (\$15 Drugs and Medication, \$10 USEF) and \$10 fee for USHJA**. Anyone who is not a member of USHJA will be charged a **\$30 USHJA show pass fee**. Owners, riders, and trainers must be active competing members of the USEF and USHJA, join at the show, or pay the listed show pass fees. Farms, partnerships, etc. owning a horse competing in a USEF licensed competition must be recorded with USEF and one recorded owner of the entity must have a current USHJA competing membership.

Riders showing in classes restricted to junior, amateur, or adult must present their membership card or other documentation indicating their junior or amateur status.

The exhibitor has the ultimate responsibility for proper registration of horse, owner, rider, and trainer with USEF and USHJA and for entering the horse under proper ownership where points are

concerned.

Horses/ponies showing in Junior Hunter are required to have a USEF measurement card or arrange to be measured at the show.

Horses must be recorded with USEF annually or in life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards. All horses competing in the USEF licensed hunter/jumper/equitation competitions must be registered with both USEF and USHJA. All horses are required to have a microchip recorded with USEF and USHJA.

FARRIER

No farrier other than the official show farrier will be permitted on the grounds unless pre-approved by the SRJT show management.

COMBINING, DIVIDING, OR CANCELING DIVISIONS, CLASSES, OR CLASSICS

The decision to combine, cancel, or divide classes will be made at the discretion of show management. The update will be reflected on the app and "how many" schedule.

COMBINING/DIVIDING

Once a class, classic, or division has been combined due to insufficient entries, it will not be re-divided for additional entries the day of the class.

A class, classic, or division that has been offered as split may be combined on the day of if scratched entries warrant. Management has the right to run all sections of the class, classic, or division in their entirety before pinning if insufficient entries seem likely.

CANCELING

A class, classic, or division that has been canceled due to insufficient entries will not be reinstated for additional entries on the day of the class.

ANIMAL WELFARE

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, its members, directors, and employees, contractors, sponsoring entities and facility harmless for any loss or accident to horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise.

Manual poling or the use of bamboo o"-sets is prohibited while on the property. Violators will be subject to penalty with the automatic elimination of the horse involved from the class it is competing in and/or the succeeding class in which it was entered and will forfeit all entry fees for that class. Riders/trainers who, in the opinion of the judges or committee, use a whip or spurs in a cruel or excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the current and/or succeeding class in which the horse/rider is entered and will forfeit all entry fees for that class. All incidents may be reported by the USEF steward and to the USEF for possible further investigation.

FORMAL ATTIRE

Formal attire as outlined in HU107 and EQ106 is required.

PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR

It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American

Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parents, guardian, or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with the appropriate safety standards and is properly fitted and in good condition.

ACCIDENTS INVOLVING COMPETITORS

GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until a release is provided. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this rule.

STALLS

Stalls are either permanent in construction with wood walls or temporary with vinyl walls under a tent. The permanent stalls have asphalt flooring and the tent stalls have grass flooring. Permanent stalls are 10'x12' Or 10'x10', and tent stalls are 10'x10'. All stalls have doors. Paddocks available for rent from Dever.

SHARPS

Anyone found discarding sharps in any other manner than the provided sharps containers will be **fin**ed up to \$250 per instance and held responsible for any fines or expenses incurred by management.

CHECKOUT & OPEN BALANCES

The last date for substitutions is the Monday before the show.

Exhibitors are responsible for the fees of all horses entered by them or their agents.

No balances may be rolled forward to the following week. Failure to checkout will incur a **\$50 late check out fee**. All statements become final at the close of business on Sunday evening for that week. Disputes will not be allowed after this time. Management has permission to close out any outstanding balances with the provided payment information. Trainers will be held financially responsible for any clients who do not submit viable payment in a timely manner, including late fees and splits.

Trainers may split miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon on Friday of the show week. Only items billed by the horse show directly may be split (i.e. no feed/bedding ordered through Dever). Any disputes regarding splits should be handled between the trainer and their clients. Competition Management will follow the dictations of the trainer regarding all splits.

The prices in this catalog reflect a discount for paying cash, check, or other means not involving a credit card. **All credit card transactions will incur a 3.25% fee** on the total amount paid.

All foreign exhibitor balances must be paid in cash, check drawn on a U.S. bank, or a credit card using U.S. funds.

Checks returned by the bank and credit card chargebacks will incur a 10% or \$50 penalty, whichever is greater. If not sufficiently paid in 10 days, accounts will be turned over to USEF.

A new W9 form is required for each calendar year. Foreign exhibitors must fill out a W8-BEN or W8 BEN-E in order to receive prize money. Management reserves the right to withhold Prize Money per Internal Revenue Service requirements.

SCHOOLING AND WARM UP

The designated schooling arena for the competition will be restricted to only horses warming up to compete in said classes. Horses wishing to school at times other than their designated competition warm up time must use the arena(s) posted for open flatting/schooling. SRJT management reserves the right to change schooling locations and times to best suit the competition arenas due to conditions, weather, and schedule.

COURTESY CIRCLE

In some instances it may become necessary to restrict the area of the courtesy circle by the mandatory line. If this is implemented it will be clearly marked on the course chart and a corresponding barrier will be erected on the course. A public announcement will also be made.

TIES

Ties in the Classic Round, Under Saddle, and Handy Hunter phases will be broken based on the score of the judge that is designated as

judge number one for each phase of the Championship, any further ties to be broken by the score of the judge that is designated as judge 2, and further ties to be broken by the score of the judge that is designated as judge 3. If a tie still exists for the overall standings, the score from the Classic Round will break such a tie.

Ties for Gladstone will be broken using the scores from Round 1.

EQUITATION

Horses are required to be stabled on the competition grounds for a minimum of twelve (12) hours before the start of the competition. Commencing twelve (12) hours before the start of the USHJA Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic competition and continuing until finishing competition in the USHJA Gladstone Cup Equitation Classic, only the competition rider may ride their entry. These riders must wear their competition number whenever mounted.

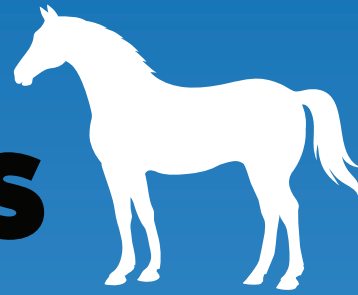

USEF HORSE WELFARE



Scan for Guidelines



USEF has developed horse welfare guidelines based on the stoplight system to help us recognize acceptable or unacceptable interactions between horses and humans

GREEN

horse friendly

The horse appears happy, willing, and content.

The connection between horse and human is harmonious and in sync.

YELLOW

cautionary

Actions that cause you to pause and question whether they are acceptable.

Some actions may be acceptable for a very short period of time but may escalate to mistreatment if pressure or conflict increases in intensity.

RED

unacceptable OR not okay

Actions that make you think, "This is not okay."

Actions that make you immediately think,
"This behavior must stop."

Sometimes athletes can be acting in the red zone without even realizing it - these situations may be resolved by a licensed official interrupting the training, discussing the issue, and providing a verbal warning.

If you see an interaction that falls into the red zone, please alert an official to the situation and submit a report.
