Staff Update

SolSmart Advisor, Leah Thill

Leah Thill has been placed with MACOG in partnership with the SolSmart program to provide technical assistance to make it easier, cheaper, and faster for residents to go solar. Leah will be working specifically with the communities of Goshen, South Bend, and Nappanee. The SolSmart program provides a free Technical Advisor, for a period of 6 months, to enable communities to reduce soft costs and other barriers for solar development. She will leverage connections with other communities and provide guidance for zoning, permitting, inspections, staff training, funding, utility engagement and other areas of interest. Argos Comprehensive Plan Update

MACOG is entering the final stages of the Argos Comprehensive Plan. Last month the Steering Committee was presented the draft Plan and organized a schedule for the 30-day public engagement period, which will begin February 3rd and go until March 6th. During this time, the Steering Committee will be giving presentations on the Plan at several local meetings to help sell the Plan and educate what this Plan means to them. Next month, following the 30-day process, MACOG will present the Plan to the Town's Plan Commission for their endorsement and then adoption by the Town Council.

US 31 Project Update

INDOT hired CHA Consulting to conduct a US 31Corridor Feasibility Study. Initially, the study will focus on developing and reviewing the existing conditions of the corridor, primarily from SR 38 in Hamilton County to US 30 in Marshall County. The Citizens Action Committee (CAC) team will be scheduling public meetings in the first quarter of 2017 to collect information from citizens and community leaders. The Existing Conditions Report is expected to be completed in the first quarter of 2017 followed by the Problem Analysis Report in the summer of 2017. The final Corridor Feasibility Study is due in January 2018.

LTAP - Indiana Local Road and Bridge Conditions Report

In response to an application requirement for the Community Crossings Matching Grant Fund Program, 354 asset management plans for roads and bridges were submitted in 2016, which contain the current conditions of local agency roads and bridges. LTAP recently released the findings in the Indiana Local Road and Bridge Conditions Report. The report describes these condition levels over a ten-year period and can be found on the Indiana LTAP website.

OCRA's New Rural Indiana Stats Data Platform

OCRA and the Purdue Center for Regional Development developed an online interactive mapping and data collection tool to make it easier for individuals, local decision-makers, organizations, and agencies to access community data on demographics, housing, economics, and fiscal data. Data is provided at the county level. The data is used to help make comparisons amongst the counties and track community improvements over time. Rural Indiana Stats also distinguishes the typologies for county geographic classification such as metropolitan versus nonmetropolitan, urban, rural/mixed counties. It also provides data for the Community Vitality Indicators issued from OCRA. This helps gauge a community's vibrancy and can be compared with other counties and track progressive improvements over time. ICAT will be educating the public regarding the value of public transit. The event will give transit organizations the opportunity to communicate to their legislators directly as to why their support for transit is important to communities.
