Caitlin Stevens presented Resolution 26-17 containing Transpo initiated amendments and asked if there were any questions. Phil Jenkins asked for an explanation of a tire lease. James explained that it is common for transit providers to lease tires rather than purchase them. Tires are leased from a vendor and used to a predetermined tread depth and then replaced.

There being no additional questions, David Wood requested the Policy Board's approval.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY MARK SENTER AND SECONDED BY JUDY STONE TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 26-17. THE MOTION CARRIED.

Other Actions

Resolution 27-17 – A Resolution Endorsing an Agreement for the Exchange of Transit Funds between Urbanized Areas.

- WHEREAS, the Michiana Area Council of Governments operates transportation services for the citizenry of Elkhart and Goshen, Indiana. The transit services are funded through local matching funds, state funds, and by annually apportioned Federal Transit Administration Section 5307 program fund; and
- WHEREAS, the MACOG has available to it certain Federal Transit Administrative funds, which to be usable, require certain matching funds to be from local sources of revenue; and
- WHEREAS, the Greater Lafayette Public Transportation Corporation (GLPTC) has available to it certain local funds, which for proper consideration, may be transferred to MACOG for its use in providing support for the Elkhart Goshen transit services. Additional local funds will ensure the continuation of Elkhart and Goshen services to their citizenry, while providing a stable source of local mass transit revenue for the services; and
- WHEREAS, the Greater Lafayette Public Transportation Corporation operates transportation services for Lafayette and West Lafayette area residents. The services are partially funded by local funds and by annually apportioned Section 5307 program funds. The Greater Lafayette PTC is in need of additional operating and capital assistance. The addition of Section 5307 funds will provide the funds needed and make additional capital improvements possible while making Greater Lafayette PTC local funds available for other uses; and
- WHEREAS, an exchange of Elkhart-Goshen apportioned Section 5307 for Greater Lafayette PTC local funds will permit the more efficient use of both funds and will benefit all of the region's public transit services. As the designated recipient, MACOG will agree to transfer Elkhart-Goshen apportioned Section 5307 funds in cooperation with the Indiana Department of Transportation Transit representative of the Governor of Indiana under the provisions of Federal Transit Administration Circular 9030.1C, Chapter IV, Section 6; and
- WHEREAS, the MACOG is the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the area. It is responsible for the continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive planning and coordinating for the administration of the Interurban Trolley fixed route and the Interurban Trolley ADA Access public transportation services; and
- WHEREAS, that the MACOG endorses and recommends approval of the exchange of Elkhart-Goshen and Greater Lafayette PTC funds as benefiting both community public transportation systems and their riders; and

WHEREAS, the MACOG will manage the exchanged funds in an interest bearing account, which will be used to support the operating, capital and planning needs of the Interurban Trolley fixed route and the Interurban Trolley ADA Access public transit services.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that this resolution authorizes the Executive Director of the MACOG to enter into agreements with the Greater Lafayette PTC for the transfer and exchange of FTA Section 5307 funds in cooperation with the Greater Lafayette PTC, and state and federal agencies.

James Turnwald presented Resolution 27-17 and asked for any questions. Todd Johnson asked if it was a dollar for dollar exchange. James explained that it is not, due to the way federal funding is available for transit. For capital expenses, with every two dollars received in local funds; eight dollars in federal funds may be used (80/20). Operating expense is 50/50. MACOG is providing the Greater Lafayette Public Transportation Corporation with \$100,000 in federal funds and will receive \$500,000 in local dollars.

There being no additional questions, James asked for the Policy Boards approval.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY SUZANNE WEIRICK AND SECONDED BY JEREMY STUTSMAN TO ENDORSE RESOLUTION 27-17. THE MOTION CARRIED.

Staff Updates

SolSmart Program Update

Leah Thill announced that in May, the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) recognized the City of Nappanee with SolSmart Bronze. A Solsmart designation recognizes local governments for making it faster, easier, and cheaper to go solar.

Leah indicated the Cities of Goshen and South Bend have also been working to streamline their solar processes and in the coming months, are anticipating designations of SolSmart Gold and Silver respectively.

Moving forward, two groups have been organized in South Bend and Goshen to launch Solarize Programs. This effort will make it even more affordable to go solar by leveraging collective buying power. "Going Solar" workshops will be held in South Bend on July 19 and in Goshen on August 3.

A Request for Proposals (RFP) will be issued to secure a solar installer with the hope of opening up the opportunity for residence for the entire MACOG region to participate.

Phil Jenkins thanked MACOG and SolSmart for the efforts in assisting the City of Nappanee. James Turnwald acknowledged the gratitude and indicated the "thanks" should be passed to Leah for her work on solar projects.

National Complete Streets Coalition (NCSC) Technical Assistance

MACOG will be offering communities within the MACOG region the opportunity to apply for a free Complete Streets workshop. Up to three communities will be selected to receive a customized workshop delivered by the NCSC. Applications will open later this summer. Community Crossings Matching Grant Program

The Community Crossings Matching Grant (CCMG) application process is opened until July 14, 2017. The program provides funding to cities, towns, and counties across Indiana to make improvements to local roads and bridges. In order to receive funds, an INDOT approved asset management plan must be in place, along with the application, a preliminary estimate, project location map, and financial commitment letter.

This year the matching portion of the grant has changed to two levels of matches depending on community size. For cities smaller than 10,000 people and counties with fewer than 50,000 people the state match is 75% up to \$1 million dollars, for larger cities or counties the state match is 50%, also up to \$1 million dollars, for larger cities or counties the state match is 50%, also up to \$1 million dollars. The communities that request more than the cap are responsible for the overages as well as the match. MACOG staff are available to answer questions and help with the application process.

David Wood inquired about unspent funds from the 2016 CCMG Program. James explained the unused funds were from those designated for rural communities. Some rural communities were not able to apply because of the short time frame allowed for applications and the matching funds were too restrictive. Additionally, the grant was provided on a 50/50 match. The 2016 left over funds were added to the available funds for the 2017 program.
