Jeremiah Cox explained Resolution 21-20 is the bus and rail apportionment for the South Bend urbanized area federal formulated funds given to the South Bend area under the CARES ACT. The three transit agencies agreed to split the funds. Jessica Clark asked what the period for using these funds are. Jeremiah stated agencies have already started on the grants to get the funding. The funds can be used 100% for operating. James Turnwald also added that agencies are being allowed to bill retroactively to January 20. Amy Hill indicated Transpo was already in the process of getting this funding approved for operating expenses and the purchase of new vehicles, which they expect to get in the next couple of weeks. Jeremiah then asked for an endorsement for Resolution 21-20.

James Turnwald stated that before the meeting the members received a copy of the 2021 Unified Planning Work Program. This is a compilation of all the work elements. James gave an overview of some of these work elements, also stating that MACOG staff could make minor alterations based on INDOT comments that are more typographical. Hearing no questions, he then asked for the endorsement of Resolution 24-20.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY NATASHA KAUFFMANN AND SECONDED BY TY ADLEY TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 24-20. THE MOTION CARRIED.

Staff Update

Partners for Clean Air Award Winners

Leah Thill told the members that the two award winners for the Partners for Clean Air were announced on Earth Day. The first winner is the Wa-nee Community Schools for piloting eight propane school buses, with a 95% reduction in emissions. The second winner is South Bend Green Corp Program, a new Americorps program that has provided direct energy efficiency upgrades to reduce energy use by 7 – 20% for over 125 homes.

° Volkswagen Onroad and Nonroad Grant Round 2 Update

Leah Thill informed the members that the deadline has been extended through May 31. There is one change, which now limits eligibility for diesel-to-diesel replacement to school bus and refuse trucks only. Local governments who wish to apply should contact MACOG for application assistance through the Green Fleet Program.

Interurban Trolley Yellow Line COVID-19 related Service Changes

Jeremiah Cox stated that starting in the last week of March both the trolleys and Access vans have been providing free rides, the trolleys implemented back door boarding and the Yellow Line has been working with Transpo and running on a Saturday schedule.

° League Cycling Instructor Seminar Update

Alaina Parrish explained that the funding had been received to teach the seminar on bicycle safety, which had to be canceled because of the COVID virus. She stated that it may be hosted in the fall.

° Equitable Mobility Action Plan (EMAP) Update

Caitlin Stevens gave an update on the Equitable Mobility Action Plan, stating there were several themes that came out of the countywide focus group meetings discussing transportation needs in the region. They included; new service recommendations, enhanced and expanded opportunities of existing service, complete street improvements to ensure accessibility for pedestrians and bicyclists, clear marketing, communication and awareness of services, and expansion of available funding opportunities.

° Tactical Urbanism Lending Library

Caitlin stated that MACOG is developing a program to lend municipalities temporary traffic equipment to test various different road improvements. Projects could incorporate things like bump outs, traffic circles, or bike lanes. Please contact Alaina or Caitlin if you are have any potential projects in mind, as MACOG is currently developing the list of materials and equipment to purchase.

° Indiana + Michigan River Valley Trail Signage

Caitlin said MACOG has continued work with consultant, Merje, to look at sign planning and implement some signage along the RVT, thanks to funding from the St. Joseph County Tourism Capital Development Fund. This project will serve as a good pilot for implementation of the Regional Crossway Trails brand.

James Turnwald interjected that he had two new items that he wanted to mention. The first was that LTAP held a webinar on how COVID-19 and stay-at-home orders may have impact on funding. The webinar may be viewed on the Purdue LTAP website. He encouraged everyone to watch it.

The second item is in regards to the CARES ACT passed by Congress. In it were increased funding for SNAP and FEMA, increased transportation funding including aviation and ground transportation. James said he wanted to make sure local governments are aware of programs like the Community Development Block Grant program, EDA Administration received five times their normal funding, and USDA rural development divided into different areas.

Privilege of the Floor

Jessica Clark then asked members to use chat box to indicate if they had anything they wanted to say.

James Turnwald stated MACOG will be having a FHWA and FTA Certification Review this year. It will be held virtually on June 16-17, 2020. The review is related to MACOG planning programs. Joyce Newland added that the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal transit Administration (FTA) would hold two sessions that the public will be allowed to participate in.
