Presentation

Bridge Conditions Dashboard

Zach Dripps gave a presentation on the draft version of the new Bridge Condition Dashboard. He stated that this is the beginning of an effort to make more bridge information available to the members and the public. Zach said this is a draft form and MACOG is looking for feedback on what everyone would like to see.

Zach started by showing a map with the bridges marked the local marked with circles and the state with diamonds. These are bridge conditions based off the Federal Bridge National Inventory. The local region is shown with the bridge conditions are shown in color as Good, Fair, or Poor conditions. He then went into how search filters could be used. Zach said it is an interactive map so that they can zoom in, select bridges, see a data table and a lot more information. MACOG looking for feedback on what the members would like to see and how they'd like to use it.

James Turnwald added that Federal Highway, USDOT moved to implement Performance Measures in a variety areas. They wanted to focus more on transportation outcomes. They are helped to look at items for the state, which supported the state targets not necessarily to a region. James stated MACOG would like to have more focus on our region. One of the Performance Measures was on bridge conditions on the National Highway System which mostly all state facilities. This map shows Bridge Condition – Good, Fair, Poor - based on the National Bridge Inventory for all four of this regions counties for all the bridges regardless of ownership.

Ryan Fellows remarked that the FHWA has a condition metric of 0-9. He asked about whether if MACOG was familiar with this metric. James explained that the ratings are based on this – greater or equal to 7 it is Good, 4-6 was Fair and below 4 Poor – and Zach stated it was also shown in the dashboard.

Bill Holder stated he liked what he sees, but would like to see road conditions.

Tim O'Donnell stated that their runway conditions get posted on a website through INDOT.

Steve Moriarty expressed he concern about it being put out to the public because of their responses about their areas and why if this was done why not that etc.

James wrapped up telling the members they would be sending a test website for the members to play around with and send back their comments and requests.

Ryan Fellows then added that maybe there should be a FAQ and Links page to explain some of this to the public. James agreed this would be a good idea.
