Allyson presented Resolution 40-21, asked for questions and then asked for an endorsement.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY STEVE MORIARTY AND SECONDED BY RYAN FELLOWS TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 40-21. THE MOTION CARRIED.

Presentation

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

Allyson Ragan began an overview of the Infrastructure Bill that just passed. The Bill was signed into law November 15, 2021. The IIJA is a bill that will reauthorize the nation's surface transportation, drinking water and wastewater legislation and provide \$550 billion dollars in new funding. She showed a breakdown in the funding with charts and explained new programs created.

James continued by stating that there is a new Rural Surface Transportation Grant Program, which defines a rural area as any area outside of an urban area with a population of 200,000. Communities and counties could apply and are applying directly to USDOT; it is a national competitive program. No more than ten percent of funds can be used on projects less than twenty five million dollars. He told them to look through the new programs and explained they were national programs and there is significantly more funding. Programs are increasing at about thirty percent, as well as, all the new money.

Allyson told the members that she has found some information on the bill and would be glad to share them.

James stated MACOG would keep the members updated on what needs to be done as he finds out more information.

Staff Update

Allyson reminded members that INDOT's rural call for projects ends on Friday, December 3, 2021.

Grants and Funding

° Community Crossing Matching Grant (CCMG) – Opens January 3

Allyson said today is the last day communities can submit an Asset Management Plan. The CCMG opens January 3 and ends January 28, 2022. The plan must be submitted to be eligible for the grant.

° OCRA CDBG Round 2 – Due December 17

Donny reminded the round two construction grants application are due later this month. He shared we are currently assisting the Town of Claypool to apply to improve their wastewater treatment facility. OCRA will offer round one applications in spring 2022. Let us know if you are interested in applying.

Plans and Programs

° Regional Freight Plan Update

Caitlin Stevens updated on the Freight Plan. Moving into the New Year there should be a draft of the regional profile and the consultants should be able to present information to the board.

° Regional Comprehensive Operational Analysis (COA) Update

James stated the regional transit plan will be called Connect. The consultants were in town to talk to the Policy Board and to Transpo's Board of Directors. They also spoke to many of our local communities and are reviewing the existing conditions. The main focus is on the existing conditions, which lead into future needs with our transit services. He asked everyone to be involved and support the process.

VII. Privilege of the Floor

David Armstrong stated that projects from 2021 first call and prior should have been closed by November 30. If members do not have a close letter they are not eligible for this round. James asked for those awarded recently when they would be due? David said they are usually about eighteen months. David also stated that Communities Crossing grants are state funds and should not be recorded on your federal outlays report.
