Allyson Ragan presented Resolution 13-22. She explained INDOT awarded funding for Items A-F, which was announced at the last TTAC meeting. Item G is a project that let in April but no awardable bids were received so is being moved to a July letting. Ally noted that INDOT prefers bridge projects have their own designation number. Item I is a pedestrian bridge that was added to the TIP.

James Turnwald added the STIP was delayed due to challenges the state experienced and was submitted to FHWA last week. Once the STIP is approved, projects will be reviewed and there may be some reconciliations that need to be made.

Hearing no questions, Allyson asked for an endorsement of Resolution 13-22.

## **Staff Update**

## **Grants and Funding**

- Community Crossings Matching Grant (CCMG) 2022-1 Awards Allyson gave an update regarding Community Crossing Awards. She sated 14 MACOG communities received funding and approximately an \$8.7 million total investment in the MACOG region. INDOT will accept a second round of applications in July.
- MACOG Call for Projects (FY 2023 FY 2028) Coming in June Allyson announced that MACOG will be holding a Call for Projects starting in June. Applications will be accepted through early July, with recommendations for project selection being made in late summer.
- Next Level Trails Awards
   Caitlin stated there were thirty eights projects awarded in the third round of the Next Level Trails program. The River Mill Trail in Middlebury was awarded \$717,370 and provides a local connection into the Pumpkinvine Nature Trail. Caitlin requested that if any communities are interested in applying in future rounds, they reach out to staff for assistance.
- Section 5310 Call for Projects Coming in July
  Tierra Harris said that Transpo, with assistance from MACOG, had been the leading
  entity to administer the 5310 Call for Projects for the South Bend UZA. She stated
  the decision was made to have MACOG be the designated recipient of Section 5310
  funds and take over administration for the South Bend UZA Call for Projects.
  MACOG has been putting together a Capital Call for Projects for the securement of
  Vehicles for July of 2022. This will be for all eligible recipients of Section 5310
  funds. This call will utilize funds from FY2019 and FY2020. Tierra noted the

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application is being finalized and information will be distributed to the public soon.

# **Plans and Programs**

- Regional Freight Mobility Plan Steering Committee Meeting Caitlin announced the Regional Freight Mobility Plan Steering Committee Meeting, previously scheduled for May 18, is postponed until June. The meeting will discuss the needs assessment.
- CONNECT Transit Plan Update
  James informed members that there will a lot of public engagement regarding the CONNECT scenarios. He emphasized that these were scenarios and not proposals. The final proposal will be based on whether the decision is to lean more toward covering more ridership or more area coverage.

# PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

David Armstrong commented on the Community Crossing award letters that went out. He stated that everyone who received an email or a letter needed to have a response sent back within four months. There may need to be a request for contracts and to not wait until the last minute. James Turnwald reiterated what David wanted and asked about previous scenarios about being awarded for an example of seven roads, but only having money for five. David stated that each case would have to be reviewed.
