Allyson then presented Resolution 07-23. She said Item A is being deleted from the TIP because operating assistance was programmed as a separate line item last month. Allyson mentioned that DLZ has been hired for the preliminary engineering for Items B, C, and D. The end goal of the entire project is to reduce travel time between South Bend and Chicago from two hours to 90 minutes. James added that safety in South Bend will be improved because currently there are several atgrade crossings in the last two miles of track to the airport. He also explained MACOG does not receive many NICTD projects because they are usually included in Northwester Indiana Regional Planning Commission's (NIRPC) TIP. Because of the significance and predominant location of the project, it was added to MACOG's TIP as well.

Staff Update

Grants and Funding

Discretionary Grant Preparation Checklist

Caitlin Stevens stated the US DOT recently published a Discretionary Grant Preparation Checklist. She said there will be a webinar on February 4, 2023. The link to the preparation checklist will be available in MACOG's Tech Notes and the MACOGazette.

US DOT RAISE Grant

Caitlin reminded the Committee the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant Program is currently open and applications are due February 28, 2023. Funding is available for surface transportation projects that will have a significant local or regional impact. Please reach out to Caitlin or Allyson if any assistance is needed on an application.

Plans and Programs

Michiana on the Move: 2050 Transportation Plan

Caitlin provided an update on the Michiana on the Move: 2050 Transportation Plan. She said the public engagement portion of the first phase recently closed and moving to identifying deficiencies and data analysis. Caitlin plans to schedule a meeting in March to focus on the identified deficiencies, strategies, and projects to include in the plan.

James added that the US DOT does not want to prioritize the region's applications for discretionary grants. He asked the Committee to be strategic with discretionary grant applications as they move forward with regional priorities. James said to be specific about what the major project needs are as they work through the long-range plan.

Fiscal Year 2024-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Allyson stated MACOG has started creating the FY 2024-2028 TIP. She presented a tentative schedule of the TIP process and said they are currently working on the draft project listing and narrative. Ally stated the new TIP will be adopted at the end of this fiscal year, at which point the FY 2022-2026 TIP will stop being used and MACOG will transition to the FY 2024-2028 TIP.

Partners for Clean Air Awards Luncheon

Leah Thill announced the Partners for Clean Air Awards Luncheon will be held on April 19, 2023. She stated there is a request for award nominations for organizations, businesses, or individuals that have gone above and beyond to improve local air quality over the past year. CONNECT Transit Plan

Zach said the CONNECT Transit Plan is in its final phase and final public engagement phase ends next week. He said the next step will be sharing the summary of public comments at the Policy Board meeting next week.
