Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Grant Update

Kelsey Triebold provided an update on the Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Grant. The Level 2 "Destination" stations site host application has closed. MACOG will make selections by mid-November. MACOG will notify finalists for the Level 3 fast-charging stations on November 15.

Electric Vehicle Test Drive at Tire Rack

Kelsey announced the Electric Vehicle Test Drive Event at Tire Rack is on Tuesday, December 3, 2024. The focus of the event will be on police departments. Other recommended departments include parks, utilities, street, highway, and public works.

ProPEL US 30 and 31

Caitlin stated the ProPEL studies are now in the Level 3 phase of alternatives development and screening. The Draft Level 3 alternatives report will open for public review and comment on November 12. There will be a public information meeting at Plymouth High School on November 14 and at Lincoln Elementary in Warsaw on November 20.

Move Safe Regional Safety Action Plan

Caitlin said the last Task Force meeting for the Move Safe Regional Safety Action Plan will be on December 11 at Chicory Event Center. She said the goal is to have a draft of the plan in early 2025 with a public comment period to follow.

Travel Demand Model Update

Caitlin stated Cambridge Systematics was awarded the contract for the Travel Demand Model. MACOG is currently finalizing the contract with them and will work with them for the next 1-2 years to develop the Travel Demand Model.

James stated that two proposals were received for the General Legal Counsel Request for Qualifications. He said Thorne and Grodnik was awarded the contract and will remain as legal counsel.

Brownfields Coalition Assessment Request for Proposals – Award

James said Roberts Environmental Services was selected for the Brownfields Coalition Assessment Request for Proposals. They will be partnering with DLZ. James said potential sites can be submitted electronically on the MACOG website or discussed further with Leah Thill.
