

Cauvery Water Dispute: TN Terms CWRC's 3,500 Cusecs Water Release Insufficient

CWRC directed Karnataka to release 3,500 cusecs of water daily to Tamil Nadu for 15 days, which TN termed insufficient citing a cumulative shortfall of 9.5 tmc ft.

The Cauvery Water Regulation Committee (CWRC) monitors water availability, storage levels, and regulates daily water release between Cauvery basin states.

- Tamil Nadu received only around **3.5 tmc ft** of water since **June 1** against the calculated requirement of **13 tmc ft**.

- Tamil Nadu emphasized that **3,500 cusecs** release is insufficient to meet **delta agricultural** and drinking water demands.
- The **CWRC** determined the water release quantum after reviewing rainfall data and storage levels across **Cauvery reservoirs**.

STATICS & SYLLABUS FOCUS

Article 262 of the **Indian Constitution** empowers Parliament to legislate on the adjudication of inter-state river disputes.

The **Inter-State River Water Disputes Act** was enacted by Parliament in **1956** under Article 262.

The **Cauvery Water Disputes Tribunal** (CWDT) was constituted on **June 2, 1990** to resolve inter-state water sharing.

On **February 16, 2018**, the **Supreme Court** allocated **177.25 tmc ft** of water annually to Tamil Nadu in a normal year.

The Central Government notified the **Cauvery Water Management Authority** (CWMA) and CWRC in **June 2018**.

River Cauvery originates at **Talakaveri** in the **Brahmagiri range** of Western Ghats in Kodagu district, **Karnataka**.

The Cauvery basin spans four administrative units: **Tamil Nadu**, **Karnataka**, **Kerala**, and **Puducherry**.
