

ECI to Madras HC: No Child Influence on TN Voters

The Election Commission of India informed the Madras High Court that there cannot be a presumption of children influencing voter behavior in Tamil Nadu.

A clarification by the Election Commission of India to the Madras High Court regarding the alleged influence of minors on voter behavior during Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly elections.

STATICS & SYLLABUS FOCUS

The **Election Commission of India** (ECI) is an autonomous **constitutional body** responsible for **administering elections** in India.

Article 324 of the Indian Constitution vests the power of **superintendence, direction, and control** of elections in the **Election Commission**.

The ECI consists of a **Chief Election Commissioner** (CEC) and such number of other **Election Commissioners** (ECs) as the **President** may fix.

The **tenure** of the CEC and ECs is **six years** or until they attain the age of **65 years**, whichever is earlier.

The **Madras High Court**, established in **1862**, is one of the **three oldest High Courts** in India, along with **Calcutta** and **Bombay**.

Article 326 of the Constitution provides for **adult suffrage**, ensuring that every citizen above **18 years** of age has the **right to vote**.

The **61st Constitutional Amendment Act** of **1989** reduced the **voting age** from **21 years** to **18 years**.

The **Representation of the People Act, 1951**, contains provisions related to the **conduct of elections** and the **secrecy of voting**.
