

J&K Flash Floods: 12 Dead, Amarnath Yatra Halted

Heavy rains caused flash floods and landslides in Jammu and Kashmir, resulting in 12 deaths and halting the Amarnath Yatra.

Flash floods are sudden, rapid floods caused by heavy rainfall, often leading to landslides in hilly terrains.

The **Amarnath Yatra** is an annual Hindu pilgrimage to the **Amarnath Cave Shrine** in **Jammu and Kashmir**.

The **Amarnath Cave** is dedicated to **Lord Shiva** and is located at an altitude of **3,888 meters**.

Pahalgam and **Baltal** are the two traditional routes used for the **Amarnath Yatra**.

Flash floods are characterized by their rapid onset and high velocity, often occurring in **mountainous regions**.

Landslides involve the movement of rock, debris, or earth down a slope, often triggered by **heavy rainfall** or earthquakes.

The **National Disaster Response Force (NDRF)** is India's specialized force for **disaster response** and relief operations.

Jammu and Kashmir was reorganized into a **Union Territory** on **October 31, 2019**.
