

Ken-Betwa Project: Tribal Opposition Explained

Tribal communities are protesting against the Ken-Betwa river-linking project over rehabilitation, compensation, and environmental concerns.

The Ken-Betwa Link Project aims to transfer surplus water from the Ken river in Madhya Pradesh to the Betwa river in Uttar Pradesh.

STATICS & SYLLABUS FOCUS

The **Ken-Betwa Link Project** (KBLP) is considered India's **first major river interlinking project**.

The project aims to transfer water from the **Ken river** in **Madhya Pradesh** to the **Betwa river** in **Uttar Pradesh**.

A key component of the **KBLP** is the construction of the **Daudhan Dam**.

The project is expected to submerge a significant portion of the **Panna Tiger Reserve** in **Madhya Pradesh**.

The **Union Cabinet** approved the **Ken-Betwa Link Project** in **December 2021**.

The project is part of the **National Perspective Plan** for interlinking rivers, formulated by the **Ministry of Water Resources**.

The **National Water Development Agency (NWDA)** is responsible for identifying and preparing feasibility reports for **river interlinking projects**.

Article 262 of the **Indian Constitution** deals with the adjudication of disputes relating to waters of **inter-state rivers** or river valleys.
