

Lok Sabha Expansion to 815 Seats: MP Raises Concerns

Congress MP Karti Chidambaram warned that a proposal to expand Lok Sabha to 815 seats would make the House ineffective and marginalize southern states.

The Lok Sabha is the lower house of India's Parliament, with its members directly elected by universal adult suffrage.

STATICS & SYLLABUS FOCUS

Article 81 of the Indian Constitution deals with the composition of the House of the People (**Lok Sabha**).

Article 82 mandates the **readjustment** of Lok Sabha seats after each **census**.

The **42nd Constitutional Amendment Act** of **1976** froze Lok Sabha seats based on the **1971 census** until the year **2000**.

The **84th Constitutional Amendment Act** of **2001** extended the freeze on Lok Sabha and Assembly seats until **2026**.

Currently, the **Lok Sabha** has **543 elected members**.

The maximum strength of the Lok Sabha is **550 elected members**, following the **104th Amendment Act** which removed **Anglo-Indian nomination**.

The **Delimitation Commission** is responsible for redrawing **Lok Sabha** and **Assembly constituencies**.

Seats are allocated to **states** in the **Lok Sabha** primarily on a **population basis**, as per the Constitution.

Southern states have expressed concerns that their effective **population control measures** could lead to **reduced representation** if delimitation is based on recent census data.
