

Parliament Monsoon Session: Lok Sabha Adjourned Amid Protests

Lok Sabha was repeatedly adjourned on Day 4 of the Monsoon Session 2026 due to Opposition protests demanding the Union Education Minister's resignation over the NEET paper leak issue.

The Monsoon Session is one of the three regular parliamentary sessions held annually, where legislative business and debates on national issues take place.

- **Rajya Sabha** was scheduled to resume its proceedings at **3 p.m.** on the same day.

STATICS & SYLLABUS FOCUS

The Indian Parliament typically holds **three sessions** annually: the **Budget Session**, the **Monsoon Session**, and the **Winter Session**.

The **President of India** summons each House of Parliament to meet at such time and place as he thinks fit, as per **Article 85(1)** of the Constitution.

The maximum gap between two sessions of Parliament cannot be more than **six months**.

Adjournment is a temporary suspension of the proceedings of a House for a specified time, decided by the **presiding officer**.

Prorogation refers to the termination of a session of Parliament by the **President**, but it does not dissolve the House.

The **Council of Ministers** is **collectively responsible** to the **Lok Sabha**, as stated in **Article 75(3)** of the Constitution.

A **No-Confidence Motion** can be moved only in the **Lok Sabha** against the entire Council of Ministers, requiring the support of at least **50 members**.

The **Union Education Minister** is a member of the **Union Council of Ministers**, responsible for the **Ministry of Education**.
