

Parliament Passes Registration of Births and Deaths Amendment Bill

Parliament passed the Registration of Births and Deaths (Amendment) Bill to streamline delayed registration procedures and prevent fraudulent certificates.

An amendment to the central law governing the registration of vital statistics (births and deaths) across India.

STATICS & SYLLABUS FOCUS

The principal legislation, the **Registration of Births and Deaths Act**, was enacted in the year **1969**.

'Vital statistics including registration of births and deaths' is listed under **Entry 30** of the **Concurrent List (List III)** in the **Seventh Schedule**.

The **Registrar General of India** (RGI) functions under the **Ministry of Home Affairs** to coordinate civil registration activities across India.

At the state level, the **Chief Registrar** of Births and Deaths serves as the executive authority for implementing the Act.

Under standard statutory rules, registration of birth or death must be completed within a prescribed period of **21 days**.

In **Tamil Nadu**, the **Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine** acts as the Chief Registrar of Births and Deaths.
