

SC: Bail Revocation Requires Egregious Circumstances

Supreme Court upheld Chaitanya Baghel's bail in a liquor scam case, ruling on conditions for bail revocation.

This ruling clarifies the legal threshold for revoking bail, emphasizing that continued liberty must 'so egregiously' undermine justice.

Article 136 of the Indian Constitution grants the **Supreme Court** special leave to appeal from any judgment, decree, determination, sentence or order in any cause or matter passed or made by any court or tribunal in the territory of India.
