

Southern CMs Meet in Chennai: Cauvery, Delimitation on Agenda

Chief Ministers of Karnataka, Kerala, and Andhra Pradesh attended the Southern Zonal Council meeting hosted by Tamil Nadu in Chennai, while Puducherry's CM skipped.

The Southern Zonal Council is a statutory body promoting inter-state cooperation and discussion on matters of common interest among its member states.

DID YOU KNOW..!?

Zonal Councils are statutory bodies established under the **States Reorganisation Act, 1956**.

There are **five Zonal Councils** in India: Northern, Central, Eastern, Western, and Southern.

The **Union Home Minister** serves as the **Chairman** of each Zonal Council.

The **Cauvery Water Dispute** involves **Tamil Nadu**, **Karnataka**, **Kerala**, and the Union Territory of **Puducherry**.

Delimitation is the process of redrawing boundaries of **Lok Sabha** and state assembly constituencies.

Articles 82 and **170** of the **Indian Constitution** deal with the process of delimitation.

The **North Eastern Council** was established under the **North Eastern Council Act, 1971**, as a separate statutory body.

Tamil Nadu MPs have previously opposed any potential reduction in the State's parliamentary representation under proposed **delimitation**.
