The Vichar Nag Temple is a historic Hindu shrine in Srinagar, Jammu and Kashmir, significant for the Kashmiri Pandit community.

Srinagar serves as the **summer capital** of Jammu and Kashmir, situated on the banks of the **Jhelum River**.

The **exodus** of **Kashmiri Pandits** from the Kashmir Valley occurred primarily due to militancy in the **1990s**.
