

Supreme Court May Intervene on Metro Closures: CJI

Chief Justice of India indicated potential Supreme Court intervention due to persistent Delhi Metro station closures affecting lawyers.

The Chief Justice of India (CJI) is the head of the Indian judiciary and the Supreme Court, responsible for judicial administration and upholding the rule of law.
