

TN Assembly Passes Resolution Against FCRA Amendment Bill 2026

The Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly unanimously passed a resolution urging the Union Government to withdraw the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Amendment Bill, 2026.

It is a legislative resolution adopted by the Tamil Nadu Assembly calling for the withdrawal of proposed federal amendments to foreign funding regulations for voluntary organizations.

KEY EXAM POINTS

- The Assembly unanimously urged the Union Government to withdraw the **Foreign Contribution Regulation Amendment Bill, 2026** in its current form.
- The House expressed concern regarding provisions related to restrictions on transfer and monitoring of **foreign contributions**.
- The resolution emphasized that the Union Government should conduct **comprehensive consultations** with all stakeholders prior to enacting amendments.
- Members across political parties present during the Assembly session in **Chennai** extended their full support to the resolution.

STATICS & SYLLABUS FOCUS

The **Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act** (FCRA) was originally enacted in **1976** during Emergency to regulate foreign funds received by individuals and associations.

A consolidated new FCRA statute was subsequently enacted in **2010** to strictly regulate acceptance and utilization of foreign donations.

The **Ministry of Home Affairs** (MHA) serves as the nodal administrative authority for enforcing FCRA compliance and NGO registrations.

Under **Article 208** of the Indian Constitution, a House of the Legislature of a State may make rules for regulating its procedure and conduct of business.

FCRA registration certificates issued to eligible voluntary organizations remain valid for a statutory period of **5 years**.

The **FCRA Amendment Act 2020** made it mandatory for foreign contributions to be received only in designated FCRA accounts at the **State Bank of India**, Main Branch, New Delhi.

Under **Article 174** of the Constitution, the Governor has the power to summon, prorogue, and dissolve the State Legislative Assembly.
