BACKGROUND:

Per AMC 7-4.05, "The Tree Advisory Board of the City of Artesia is hereby created and shall consist of the members of the Beautification and Maintenance Commission." In the same section, the duties of the Tree Advisory Board are described. One of the duties of the Tree Advisory Board is to designate trees as "heritage trees" as defined by Section **7-4.09**. Criteria for heritage tree designation is as follows:

- (a) Shall be in a condition that the tree can be maintained in the landscape so as not to create an unreasonable risk.
- (b) Shall be at least 12 inches in diameter.
- (c) Shall have the consent of the property owner. For a tree on City-owned property, the City Manager or designee must consent; and
- (d) Shall meet at least one of the following criteria:
 - (1) Specimen tree of significant habitat value for migratory birds and butterflies.
 - (2) California native species.
 - (3) Historical or cultural significance.
 - (4) A tree that plays an important functional role in the City parks or for City planning and maintenance.
 (Ord. 22-931, § 3)

ANALYSIS:

Currently, the City is in the process of designing the Artesia Botanical Garden. As part of the design process, the City and designer met with the LA County Fire to make sure that the design was in compliance with LA County Code requirements regarding access for emergency vehicles. The area of access requires a certain level of clearance for fire trucks. LA County Fire planning officials told the City that any trees that were encroaching in the access area, would be required to have their tops trimmed to blue sky. However, if the trees were designated heritage trees, they would only be required to be trimmed up to 13 feet and the remaining canopy would be allowed to remain.

The trees in question, meet criteria a-c and section (4) of d above. The City has determined that the functional role of the trees in the Botanical Garden are to provide shade as well as a beautiful canopy for visitors to enjoy. If the trees, are not designated as heritage trees, their tops will be trimmed and the shade and natural beauty of a mature forest in the Botanical Garden would be eliminated. There are 10 trees that are in the access area. Each tree was tagged with an id number by the designer's arborist. Photographs of each tree and their id number are attached to this report.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Tree Advisory Board approve 10 trees identified as 49, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58 and 59 located at 11462 178th St. (Artesia Botanical Garden Site) to be designated as Heritage Trees.



TREES PROPOSED FOR HERITAGE TREE DESIGNATION





























RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Beautification and Maintenance Commission review the proposed improvements and provide comments and recommendations.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Artesia was recently awarded \$209,430 in Highway Safety Improvement Program funding in order to install a Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon at the northwest corner of 186th Street and Devlin Avenue, as well as enhanced crosswalks at eight (8) un-signalized intersections throughout the City. These improvements are prescribed by the City's Local Roadway Safety Plan, which analyzed crossroads collision data between 2015 and 2019 across the City's entire roadway network. Through this process a list of intersections and roadway segments with high incidences of collisions was developed. This process identified the need for signalized and un-signalized improvements Citywide.

Additionally, Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Agency has designated downtown Artesia as the terminus location of the Southeast Gateway Line and has prioritized active transportation improvements surrounding the future station. As such, active transportation improvements funded by the City, such as enhanced crosswalks and other improvements that encourage walking and biking may be eligible costs that can be used to reduce the City's cost to build the line. Staff is actively incorporating eligible improvements on Pioneer Boulevard improve active transportation and reduce the city's future financial commitments to the Southeast Gateway Line.

ANALYSIS:

The proposed Highway Safety Improvement Program improvements include:

- Installation of enhanced crosswalks at eight (8) locations:
 - 166th Street and Alburtis Avenue
 - 178th Street and Roseton Avenue
 - 178th Street and Jersey Avenue
 - Ashworth Street and Clarkdale Avenue
 - 183rd Street and Elaine Avenue
 - 186th Street and Elaine Avenue
 - 186th Street and Grayland Avenue

- 186th Street and Horst Avenue
- Installation of enhanced crosswalks with beacon at 186th Street and Devlin Avenue.
- Installation of new street pavement at 186th Street between Pioneer Boulevard and Norwalk Boulevard, Elaine Avenue between 183rd Street and South Street, and Grayland Avenue between 183rd Street and South Street.
 - Elaine Avenue and Grayland Avenue to receive pavement markings and additional signage to discourage speeding.

The proposed improvements to Pioneer Boulevard between 183rd Street and 187th Street include:

- Installation of Durathurm treatment at existing crosswalks;
- Removal of bulb outs and palm trees to establish positive drainage at 186th Street and 187th Street;
- Installation of decorative pavement art at the center of Pioneer Boulevard and 183rd Street; and
- Addition of right turn lane from Pioneer Boulevard northbound to 187th Street.






CITY MAP SCALE: NTS NORTH
