





My wife and I are homeowners here in Brea living near The Tracks Trail, the usage of which we very much enjoy. We generally walk it from Brea Blvd. east to State College or Birch Street end and back. Of course as you know, folks of all ages, from seniors such as my wife, Mila and I, down to infants in strollers being pushed by their mothers, populate the lanes. Also a notable presence along the trail are bike riders, specifically electric motorized bike riders -- and this email today is a serious concern about the alarming safety hazard these customarily speeding bicycles represent as they dangerously whiz past unaware pedestrians, myself included. One of these days someone is going to get hurt, badly, because of this. With subsequent injury, liability and legal claims, this is not likely to end well if the city may be found complicit, if not actually negligent, in this potential matter of inattention to public safety.

Those in a position of appropriate responsibility at the city of Brea are urged to address this problematic issue and enact measures to control it: e.g., Speed limit signage for motorized bicycles. Or whatever. In this regard, I should like to think that prudent action in the best interests of public safety is the inarguable priority in your decision-making.

Am suggesting this day and time as it seems particularly popular with Tracks users that often includes racing-style bicyclists bunched-up in fast-moving groups crowding over the marked trail lanes, in directions coming or going, weaving dangerously close to the pedestrians who are of course simultaneously using the same trail paths. I am not a squeamish or frail person but I am rational enough to avoid dangerous situations -- as is persistently being presented here, something, it goes without saying, the city did not anticipate but nonetheless is well-advised at this time to sensibly, satisfactorily remedy for the public good, as stated earlier. 

Youth Programs

The After-School Program and Teen Zone are officially more than halfway through the school year. The kids continue to enjoy daily activity areas: sports/group games in the gym, art, Switch video game tournaments, playground, and games/hangout time in the cafe on top of study hall time to complete their homework. The month has seen fun seasonal activities and games. The kids were especially excited to make shamrock shakes in Cooking Club to Celebrate St. Patrick's Day and make leprechaun traps. The After School Program is full for Kinder through 6th, but there is still availability in the Teen Zone. The programs are still seeing an average of 100 students a day.

The Tiny Tots part-time preschool-aged program's Winter session came to an end on March 14The last week brought about lots of green and St. Patrick's Day-themed activities including edible rainbows made out of fruit loops, marshmallows, and pots of gold coins. The program is also still working on growing its new TK/Kinder Club that takes place Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 12:30-3:15. Participants have lunch with friends, and participate in more music, story time, arts and crafts, center play, and small group learning. It is a great program to partner with those in morning TK/ Kinder classes or for homeschooled or online learning students whose parents are looking for small group socialization and additional enrichment to their current learning platforms. The Spring session starts on March 25 with all classes full except Tues/Thurs in the 4-year-old room and the TK/Kinder Club. Participants can start anytime as long as there is space.

Ron, who conducts one-on-one veteran services counseling at the Brea Resource Center, will often counsel his clients over the phone to ensure they are provided the resources and information that they need. Through their services, both Ron and Gary provide benefit claims counseling and referral assistance to our local heroes. For the month of February, our Veteran Service Officers assisted 15 Veterans.

For the month of February, HOPE Center received 51 calls regarding homeless concerns in Brea from these calls two homeless clients were placed in shelters. The HOPE Center conducted 14 proactive engagement, this is where the dispatch team is providing services and building rapport with homeless clients.

Community Health Initiative of Orange County (CHIOC) continued to provide free county services that include, Cal-Fresh, Medi-Cal, CalWORKs and General Relief. For the month of February, the representative assisted two clients.




