TRAFFIC COMMITTEE MINUTES – April 17, 2025

TIME: 5:30 P.M.

LOCATION: Executive Conference Room

- **1. Call to Order/Introductions** The meeting was called to order at 5:30 P.M. by Committee Chair Fujioka.
- 2. Approve Minutes of the March 20, 2025 Regular Meeting A motion was made to approve the minutes by Vice Chair Chandler, seconded by Committee Member Hickenbottom. Motion approved.
- 3. Matters from the Audience None.
- 4. Traffic Collision and Citations Update Corporal Nguyen reported that there were several crashes at Central Ave. and Tamarack Ave. The crashes generally were a result of westbound motorists on Central Ave. failing to yield to southbound traffic on Tamarack Ave.
- 5. Discussion Item Country Road Homeowners Association Traffic Calming Proposal: Thomas Wheat, Traffic Engineer (TJW Engineering) introduced Colin McGahey, Managing Agent for Country Road HOA, and provided a brief update from the January Traffic Committee Meeting, where they presented a traffic study outlining traffic safety and parking enhancements within the Country Road HOA (345 homes) for City staff review.

Mr. Wheat provided a presentation detailing the observations and requests for three City streets: Country Lane, Live Oak Street, and Park Lane. For each of these streets he discussed the need for traffic calming (due to narrow street widths), the need to add centerline striping, and improved sight distances through the installation of signage, striping, and red curbing.

Traffic and Parking Control Requests:

- **1.** Add yellow centerline striping at the intersection of Park Ln. and State College Blvd. and install red curb from State College to Mountain Court;
- **2.** Add yellow centerline striping at the intersection of Live Oak and State College Blvd. and install red curb from State College to Live Oak;
- 3. Add red curb at all fire hydrants;
- 4. Add red curb at corners and curvatures of various roads; and
- **5.** Add warning signs at curves within neighborhood.

The HOA representative indicated that they are okay with the loss of parking that would occur based on the red curb requests. The HOA believes there is sufficient off-street parking available to residents as long as those residents use their garages for vehicle parking and not storage and work out equipment.

A motion was made by Committee Member Zambon to concur with TJW Engineering's proposed traffic and parking control changes and to direct City staff to develop the appropriate work orders and plans for the implementation of the improvements as appropriate once the HOA has notified the community of the planned changes.

- 6. Project Updates The City Engineer reported on the following items:
 - Blackstone Traffic Safety Requests: A work order has been issued for the installation of a one-way stop sign at Belridge Terrace and Temblor Ranch Dr. The removal of the mini stop signs on the bike path within the northerly part of Blackstone will be further studied as part of the future General Plan Update.
 - Staff has reviewed the Puente Street speed humps in the field with the resident that made the initial request. Staff has determined that the humps are not all the same; however, they are still viable and that it would be best to address the variations of the humps in a future paving project.
