The City Council met in a regular session on Tuesday, February 25, 2025, at 5:00 p.m. in the City Council Chamber of the Civic Center, 6650 Beach Boulevard, Buena Park, California, Mayor Ahn presiding.

5A. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN THE CITY OF BUENA PARK AND KUKKIWON CALIFORNIA, LLC TO PROMOTE MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING AND COOPERATION IN SPREADING TAEKWONDO CULTURE AND BRINGING COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TO THE BUENA PARK COMMUNITY

Recommended Action: 1) Adopt a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Buena Park and Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC to promote mutual understanding and cooperation in spreading Taekwondo culture and bringing community and economic development to the Buena Park community; 2) Authorize the City Manager and City Attorney to make any necessary, non-monetary changes to the agreement; and, 3) Authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to execute the agreement.

Assistant City Manager Fenton provided a report regarding a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Buena Park and Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC. Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC is proposing to promote Taekwondo culture and its educational value within the community; support the growth and activation of Taekwondo programs in Buena Park; enhance regional publicity through international Taekwondo events and cultural exchanges; consider Taekwondo education in Buena Park's local elementary and middle schools; and, strive to increase tourism, and promote and recommend that Program participants utilize local Buena Park hotels, restaurants, and businesses during tournaments and events. In exchange, Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC is seeking an agreement with the City for use of City banquet facilities, at no cost, to be used for Taekwondo events. In addition, the City would provide promotional efforts within the community and encourage community participation in their Taekwondo programs. The proposed MOU is for a two-year period allowing Kukkiwon California, LLC usage of City banquet facilities on five occasions per year based on availability, advance scheduling, and requiring Kukkiwon California to enter into and comply with Buena Park's standard facility use agreement. Any additional reservation requests, other than what has been agreed by both parties, will be paid at the current facility rates. It was recommended that the City Council adopt a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Buena Park and Kukkiwon California Branch, for use of City banquet facilities on five occasions per year based on availability and advanced scheduling.

Vice Mayor Traut asked about potential additional dates that Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC is interested in booking outside of the MOU.

Mr. Jinseob Kim, Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC Chairman, indicated the organization's plan to hold more events in Buena Park in addition to the five dates presented, and the organization's willingness to pay the current facility rates to hold additional events.

Yong Choi, Buena Park resident and business owner, spoke in opposition to the adoption of the MOU with Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC because of its impact to local Taekwondo businesses.

Joe Pak spoke regarding September 4 as California Taekwondo Day legislated by Assemblywoman Quirk-Silva and the benefits of Taekwondo to the youth.

Mayor Ahn requested staff to explain the discussion and direction provided by the City Council at the January 28, 2025 meeting regarding the MOU with Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC.

Assistant City Manager Fenton summarized Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC's intention to promote mutual understanding and cooperation in spreading Taekwondo culture and bringing community and economic development to the Buena Park community. At the January 28, 2025 Regular City Council meeting, staff presented the proposed activities such as overseeing Dan certificate examinations and issuance, providing guidance and support for international instructor qualifications, providing Kukkiwon-certified Taekwondo programs and instructor training, hosting Taekwondo seminars, events, and international certification programs; and strengthening collaboration with local Taekwondo schools. Following City Council discussion, staff was directed to draft an MOU with Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC for a term not to exceed two years, including use of up to five event spaces per year pending availability, and return at a future City Council meeting for formal approval. Additionally, Assistant City Manager Fenton clarified that Dan certificate examinations are to be facilitated by Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC and the City does not have authority to issue Dan certificates.

Council Member Franco asked about Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC's association with other Taekwondo businesses and community groups in the area; the MOU's direct benefit to Buena Park residents; and, affordability of City facility use for businesses.

Council Member Hoque asked about the economic benefit of the MOU, and recommended that the City Council adopt the proposed two-year MOU with year 2 being contingent upon the economic impact of Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC's events. Moreover, Council Member Hoque requested staff provide the City Council Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC's program curriculum for a better understanding of the organization's events plan.

Assistant City Manager Fenton explained that the MOU's economic benefit is the revenue the City will gain from the event participants staying in hotels and dining in restaurants in Buena Park on the dates presented. Event participants will be encouraged to stay and dine in the City. Assistant City Manager Fenton also discussed the fees associated with renting City banquet facilities.

Vice Mayor Traut spoke in favor of the opportunity to attract new businesses and organizations for the purpose of economic development in the City; and, in support of Council Member Hoque's recommendation to review and evaluate the economic impact of the MOU at the conclusion of its first year and the second year be contingent upon the success of the events.

Mayor Ahn spoke in support of Council Member Hoque's recommendation to review and evaluate the economic impact of the MOU at the conclusion of its first year and the second year be contingent upon the success of the events; and, reopened public comment.

Yong Choi, Buena Park resident and business owner, spoke regarding his concerns with Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC's Dan certification and Taekwondo festival; and, the direct benefit of the MOU to the City.

Assistant City Manager Fenton explained that the language on the MOU states that Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC will promote and recommend participants to book at Buena Park hotels. However, nothing indicates requiring them to stay at Buena Park hotels.

Council Member Franco spoke in support of Council Member Hoque's recommendation and suggested that Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC work with local Taekwondo schools in promoting the Taekwondo culture and its educational value within the community.

Council Member Sonne stated her understanding of the concerns raised, and anticipated the revenue that the business would bring to the City. Council Member Sonne also agreed with other Council Members' comments regarding a possible termination of the MOU if there is no actual economic impact to the City.

Mayor Ahn recommended adding a section to the MOU for Kukkiwon California Branch, LLC to abide by the City's policy for use of the City logo.

9. STUDY SESSION (9A – 9B)

9A. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING THE CITY'S MID-YEAR BUDGET

Director of Finance Hyun provided a report regarding the City's mid-year budget. Director Hyun reviewed the results from FY 2023-24 and projected results for FY 2024-25; and, appropriated carryover requests from FY 2023-24 to FY 2024-25 and mid-year budget adjustment requests for FY 2024-025. Director Hyun compared the General Fund Revenues from FY 2022-23 to FY 2023-24, and General Fund Expenditures from FY 2022-23 to FY 2023-24, and explained the General Fund Balance for FY 2023-24, Workers' Compensation Self-Insurance Fund, Public Liability Self-Insurance Fund, Accrued Leave Fund, and other funds. Director Hyun discussed General Fund Revenues and Expenditures for FY 2024-25, as well as carryover requests and mid-year requests pertaining to various City departments and other funds.

City Manager France indicated the passing of Measure R, a one percent (1%) local transactions and use tax (local sales tax); and, explained the top priorities identified by the community.

Assistant City Manager Fenton discussed staff's recommendations on Measure R fund allocation for municipal services and priorities identified by the residents. This includes proposed positions for the Police Department; proposed positions for Public Works Department; proposed positions for Human Resources Department; and, proposed capital improvement projects.

Council Member Hoque requested staff explore options to permanently fund the two police officer positions budgeted using the state law enforcement grant fund.

Assistant City Manager Fenton stated that Council Member's Hoque request would be incorporated in the budget and presented to the City Council for formal approval.

Following the discussion, the City Council directed staff to move forward with the appropriation of funds as indicated on the carryover and mid-year budget requests.

9B. DESIGNATE A COUNCIL MEMBER AS THE CITY'S VOTING DELEGATE AND ALTERNATE VOTING DELEGATE FOR THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA ASSOCIATION OF GOVERNMENTS (SCAG) 2025 GENERAL ASSEMBLY BUSINESS SESSION

Director of Government and Community Relations/City Clerk Jimenez provided a report regarding the upcoming Southern California Association of Government (SCAG)'s 2025 General Assembly scheduled for May 1-2, 2025, in Palm Desert. The General Assembly Delegate Representative for Buena Park has an opportunity to propose any policy matter for determination by the General Assembly in the form of a proposed Resolution, and revisions to SCAG Bylaws. Staff will report to the City Council once additional information regarding proposed resolutions is received. Furthermore, Director Jimenez sought City Council direction to designate a Council Member as the City's voting delegate and alternate voting delegate for the Southern California Association of Government (SCAG) General Assembly Business Session by City Council Minute action.

The City Council designated Council Member Franco as the City's voting delegate and Vice Mayor Traut as alternate voting delegate.
