3. STUDY SESSION

3A. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION ON THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-25 REVISED BUDGET

Director of Finance Hyun presented the revisions to the FY 2024-25 budget, which is the second year of the two-year budget. There has been a continuous effort to engage residents through *Speak Up Buena Park!* Over 1,600 residents participated in the community discussion around City service needs and priorities and they are as follows:

- Preventing crime, including property crimes, like burglary, robbery and car theft
- Ensuring that children have safe places to play and safe routes to school
- Maintaining 911 emergency response and retaining/attracting well-trained police officers
- Keeping public areas safe and clean
- Keeping Buena Park affordable for middle class and working people
- Helping maintain the City's quality of life for local residents
- · Addressing homelessness

The budget feedback on the identified community priorities are as follows:

- Residents have told us public safety is a top priority and the budget currently reflects:
 - The Buena Park Police Department is facing a staffing shortage.
 - The City must be able to recruit and retain experienced police officers.
 - Even in safe communities like Buena Park, robberies, assaults, burglaries, vehicle thefts and arson all increased in 2022.
 - 911 calls have increased 24% since 2021, straining response times.
- Thousands of Buena Park older adults benefit from our community's senior programs like Meals on Wheels, senior transportation services and the Buena Park Senior Center. The City strives to continue to offer quality programs that support our growing senior community and allow them to age in place.

• During these uncertain times, the City must preserve local control over Buena Park taxpayer dollars so that they stay local and serve our community's needs ensuring they are spent in our own community on essential City services.

Furthermore, Director Hyun discussed the budget revisions for FY 2024-25, and sought City Council direction on such revisions.

The City Council directed staff to approve the FY 2024-25 General Fund Budget revisions as presented, and a policy issue to increase the WE LEAD BP budget allocation to \$12,500 for FY 2024-25.

Assistant City Engineer Arabolu provided a report regarding the proposed approval of contract for the Magnolia Avenue Water Main Interconnect Project. The recently developed tract adjacent to the intersection of Magnolia Avenue and Orangethorpe Avenue is currently supplied by one water main. A water main interconnect with the City of Fullerton would benefit the City by providing additional water supply. The additional water supply would provide redundancy in meeting fire flow requirements, as needed, by correcting pressure loss in the system, should a water main break occur. It was noted that the proposed water main interconnect will have a one-way function to provide water only to Buena Park residents and could not be used to sell or provide water to the City of Fullerton. Construction is anticipated to begin in August 2024 and be completed by October 2024. The project was advertised for competitive bid on April 10, 2024. The City received and publicly opened three (3) bids. The lowest, responsible bid was submitted by G&A Nelos Construction Inc. of Lake Elsinore, CA, in the amount of \$627,164. Staff recommended that the City Council award a contract to G&A Nelos Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$627,164 and approve a contingency fund in the amount of \$62,836.

6A. RESOLUTION AMENDING FEES AND CHARGES ASSOCIATED WITH THE PARAMEDIC PROGRAM

Recommended Action: 1) Conduct a public hearing on the proposed update to the Paramedic Fee (Advanced Life Support transport fee); 2) Adopt a resolution amending the Paramedic Subscription Service Program by increasing the paramedic fee schedule to be in line Orange County's approved ambulance user fee schedule for ALS transport; 2) Make the new Paramedic Fee effective July 1, 2024; 3) Adjust the Hardship Exemption to a new low-income assistance program threshold; and, 4) Authorize the City Manager to notify Emergency Ambulance Service, Inc. (the City's ambulance services provider) to incorporate and collect the paramedic fee increase on the City's behalf.

Mayor Sonne stated that this was the time and place for a public hearing to consider a resolution amending the Paramedic Subscription Service Program by increasing the paramedic fee schedule to be in line with the Orange County's approved ambulance user fee schedule for ALS transport.

Assistant City Manager/Director of Human Resources Fenton provided a report regarding amending the fees and charges associated with the Paramedic Subscription Service Program. The City of Buena Park is a political subdivision of the State of California with the authority to designate emergency ambulance service providers through a competitive procurement process. As such, the City has the authority to set rates associated with those services. Assistant City Manager Fenton explained the voluntary annual subscription and first responder fee to which no changes are proposed at this time. Assistant City Manager Fenton also discussed the current paramedic fee; proposed paramedic fee; current hardship exemption; proposed hardship exemption; and, budget impact of the Paramedic Fees increase. Staff recommended that the City Council update the Low-Income Threshold to the current industry standard as part of the annual Paramedic Subscription Service Program.

Mayor Sonne opened the public hearing and inquired if anyone present desired to speak. There being no requests to speak, Mayor Sonne closed the public hearing.

Council Member Traut asked about the Extremely Low category on the proposed hardship exemption options.

Vice Mayor Ahn asked about waiving the paramedic fee to extremely low-income households.

Assistant City Manager Fenton explained that the \$47,350 was derived from the 30% of the median income of \$129,000 for a family of four, according to the threshold HCD established as extremely low-income household. It was recommended that the City Council select one of the proposed hardship exemption options presented to update the City's Low-Income Threshold. Moreover, patients transported by ambulance may be exempt from payment of the First Responder fee if they qualify as a low-income household. Residents, however, continue to have the option to pay \$45 per year if they choose to enroll in the program.

- 9A. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING A FREE HEALTH CLINIC IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE KOREAN AMERICAN MEDICAL GROUP

Community Services Supervisor Hurtado provided a report on the Korean American Medical Group, under the leadership of Chairman Dr. Paul Chang, proposal of a collaboration with the City to hold a health clinic at the Ehlers Senior Activity Center in Legacy Hall on Saturday, August 3, 2024, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The event aims to provide essential healthcare services to Buena Park seniors and of neighboring communities free of charge. The event will feature a mobile dental truck, stroke screenings, diabetes and cholesterol screenings, and blood pressure checkups for all participating seniors. The health clinic precedes the City's Super Senior Saturday scheduled for Saturday, August 17, 2024. It was also noted that staff costs for this event will be minimal. Furthermore, staff requested City Council direction on moving forward with the free health clinic, and to integrate the health clinic into the Super Senior Saturday event in the future.

Vice Mayor Ahn indicated that eye checkups will also be offered at the said event, and sought the City Council's support in approving the free health clinic.

Council Member Traut and Mayor Sonne spoke in support of the free health clinic.

Following the discussion, the City Council directed staff to proceed with the free health clinic in partnership with the Korean American Medical Group.

9B. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF TWO SCOREBOARDS AND TWO BATTING CAGES AT BELLIS PARK

Community Services Supervisor Kurata provided a report regarding the purchase and installation of two scoreboards and two batting cages at Bellis Park. Bellis Park is home to both Buena Park National Little League (BPNLL) and Buena Park Chargers Youth Football & Cheer. Both organizations are long running organizations with the City and each have expressed interest in enhancing their league and participant experiences. BPNLL has requested the placement of one scoreboard for Field 3 (junior division field) and two batting cages to be installed outside of the field of play alongside the first base side of Field 4. The batting cages would be centrally-located in the middle of the baseball fields to allow usage by all age divisions within BPNLL. Buena Park Chargers, on the other hand, has requested one scoreboard to be installed on the north side of the football field (Fields 1 and 2). The scoreboard would face south towards spectators that sit behind a fence line on the south side of the football field. Since the staff report was submitted, staff added roof coverings and interior sports lighting for the two existing batting cages at San Antonio Park and two new batting cages at Bellis Park. The total cost for all items is approximately \$350,000. Community Services Supervisor Kurata indicated that this project is not included in the current or future budgets. Staff sought City Council direction to consider funding this project and that it be included and prioritized in the Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

Council Member Traut spoke in support of the purchase and installation of two scoreboards and two batting cages at Bellis Park.

Council Member Brown and Vice Mayor Ahn spoke in support of the items being requested, and indicated to refer to the Community Services Commission about including the project in the Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

Miguel Prieto, Buena Park resident and Buena Park National Little League President, spoke regarding working to improve Bellis Park and youth sports in general.

Following the discussion, the City Council directed the Community Services Commission to discuss and incorporate the items discussed into the Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

9C. DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION REGARDING THE PARK MONUMENT DESIGN FOR THE THEMED CITY PARKS AT FRIENDSHIP, BESSIE COLEMAN, AND HEROES PARK

Associate Engineer Miller provided a report regarding the park monument design for the themed City parks at Friendship, Bessie Coleman, and Heroes Park. At its April 23, 2024 meeting, the City Council approved the contract with Bravo Sign and Design for the installation of the six (6) new park monument signs, including modernizing the existing old sign design of San Antonio Park; and, a budget transfer from the General Fund to the ADA Parks Compliance CIP Project Account. The City Council also requested a discussion to reevaluate the new monument sign design to align with the park's theme. Associate Engineer Miller indicated that staff prepared a conceptual park monument sign for Larwin Park to better complement the new \$2.1 million park renovation project in 2018. The new sign design was then reviewed by the former Park & Recreation Commission and approved by the City Manager for installation. A few City parks already have the updated monument sign design, and the remainder of the park signs are scheduled to be replaced. Staff conducted an assessment to determine the best approach for integrating a theme into the signs, but at the same time, considering to minimize the budgetary impact while maintaining consistency and uniformity across all City parks. Staff presented park monument sign designs that are similar to the existing design while incorporating elements to the theme City parks.

The City Council selected the following designs for each of the four parks – Design 5 for Friendship Park; Design 6 for Bessie Coleman Park; and, Design 2 for Heroes Park. Additionally, the City Council directed staff to incorporate an image of a girl playing softball as the monument sign design for San Antonio Park.

JUNETEENTH JUNE 19, 2024

- WHEREAS, on September 22, 1862 President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, officially ending slavery and changing the status of more than 3.5 million enslaved African Americans in the confederate states; and,
- WHEREAS, on June 19, 1865, more than two years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation, Union General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas, to inform enslaved African Americans of General Order Number 3: "The people of Texas are informed that in accordance with a Proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free. This involves an absolute equality of rights and rights of property between former masters and slaves, and the connection heretofore existing between them becomes that between employer and hired laborer"; and,

1) Approve the Measure M2 Seven-Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP); 2) Adopt a resolution concerning the status and update of the pavement management plan for the Measure M (M2) Program; 3) Authorize the City Clerk to certify the resolution adoption; and, 4) Authorize staff to submit the necessary documentation to the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA).

PREVIOUS CITY COUNCIL ACTION

On June 14, 2022, Council adopted a resolution concerning the status of the Pavement Management Plan. On June 6, 2023, the City Council adopted a resolution concerning the status and update of the Local Signal Synchronization Plan and the Circulation Element and Mitigation Fee Program. Additionally, the City Council authorized staff to submit an updated CIP to OCTA to maintain Measure M2 Program eligibility.

DISCUSSION

Measure M2 provides significant funding to Orange County cities as it supports critical transportation infrastructure projects, including road maintenance, highway expansions, and public transportation enhancements. These improvements reduce traffic congestion, enhance safety, and promote economic growth by facilitating better commutes and attracting businesses. Additionally, Measure M2 funds contribute to environmental benefits by supporting green transportation options and reducing emissions, while also enhancing the community through street repairs and beautification projects.

The City is required to submit annual documentation on its transportation-related programs to receive Measure M2 sales tax revenue from OCTA. These documents generally pertain to the City's programs and projects affecting circulation and transportation to ensure proper alignment with Measure M2 and countywide plans. This year's submittal requires the following components:

1. M2 Seven-Year CIP for FY 2024-25 through FY 2030-31:

The City's Measure M2 Seven-Year CIP is a transportation planning and fiscal forecasting document used for programming future transportation-related capital improvement projects. The Measure M2 Ordinance requires cities to adopt a CIP demonstrating their plan to use these funds to complete local transportation system enhancement and maintenance projects.

The CIP is adjusted annually to address changing Pavement Condition Index (PCI) information, resource availability, funding sources, and schedule. The proposed 2024-2025 Seven-Year CIP is an update of the previously adopted CIP on June 6, 2023. This update includes projects from Fiscal Year 2024-25 to Fiscal Year 2030-31.

Adoption of a Seven-Year CIP does not obligate the City to complete any of the listed projects with the exception of specified projects where Measure M2 funds have already been allocated.

2. Pavement Management Plan (PMP):

The PMP was updated to provide a plan that manages the preservation, rehabilitation, and maintenance of paved roads by analyzing pavement life cycles, assessing overall system performance cost, and determining alternative strategies and funds necessary to improve paved roads.

The City's PMP is in full compliance with this requirement. A resolution must be adopted every two years attesting to this plan. The previous PMP resolution was last adopted in June 14, 2022, and is now due for readoption.

BUDGET IMPACT

There is no budget impact with the approval of these programs, plans, and resolutions. The recommended actions will maintain the City's eligibility to continue receiving M2 funds and additional competitive program funds in the future.

Adoption of the Seven-Year CIP does not financially obligate the City beyond the adopted Fiscal Year 2024-2025 CIP.

- a) The PMP is in conformance with the PMP Submittal Template provided in the Countywide Pavement Management Plan Guidelines.
- b) The City hereby adopts a PMP and has provided an updated PMP report, using the required format, to OCTA.
- c) The Public Works Director, City Engineer or designee is authorized to sign the PMP certification form.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

1) Approve Addendum No. 13 to the agreement with Townsend Public Affairs, Inc. (TPA) for legislative advocacy and public affairs consulting services; 2) Authorize the City Manager and City Attorney to make any necessary, non-monetary changes to the addendum; and, 3) Authorize the City Manager and City Clerk to execute the addendum.

PREVIOUS CITY COUNCIL ACTION

On June 14, 2022, the City Council approved a two-year agreement with TPA for the same services.

DISCUSSION

The City has utilized the professional services of Townsend Public Affairs, Inc. (TPA) for legislative advocacy and public affairs consulting services for more than a decade. TPA was initially selected after an extensive selection process by a City Council-appointed sub-committee. Sensitive to the City's budgetary constraints, on June 28, 2011, an addendum was approved by City Council, which reduced the payment rate by 5%. The proposed addendum will extend the agreement through June 30, 2026, and maintain the same annual cost.

Townsend Public Affairs has been instrumental in assisting the City with the following:

State:

TPA worked with the City to support AB 1175 (Quirk-Silva), which allows existing and permitted signs that
were once located in a redevelopment area to remain in place. This bill allowed for the extended operation of
the Buena Park Nissan dealership sign, used for both dealership advertisements and City announcements.
 TPA worked with the author, staff, committee members, and a coalition of other impacted agencies to move
the bill forward. Ultimately, the measure was signed into law and the City's signage and associated revenues
remain temporarily stabilized.

- TPA worked with the City to craft an updated legislative platform document that reflects City positions on
 policy statements and upcoming legislative initiatives. The adoption of the document provides the City with a
 seamless process of taking positions on measures if they align with one of the numerous City-specific policy
 statements, thus allowing the City to be nimble throughout the often tumultuous legislative session.
- TPA worked with the City to chart a path forward regarding the Surplus Land Act designation of a site the City
 wished to use for economic development purposes. These actions included coordinating calls with HCD, the
 City's legislative delegation, as well as various City leaders to discuss the issue and identify any workarounds.
 This advocacy plan allowed the City to move forward with utilizing the parcel for economic development
 purposes.
- TPA worked to craft an application for the SCAG Sustainability Awards, which recognizes excellence in
 sustainable planning and development projects in southern California. The City was successful in being
 awarded recognition in the category of "Active, Healthy, and Safe Communities" for the Silverado Trail Phase
 2 Project. TPA worked with staff to gather information and craft a compelling application demonstrating the
 project's aim to further reduce major gaps in the city's existing network and to connect previously isolated
 segments to support a healthier, greener, and more sustainable community lifestyle.
- TPA engaged with the Buena Park team on the selection and process for the creation of a Climate Action and Adaptation Plan. TPA continues to provide staff and the Sustainability Manager with upcoming funding opportunities, and will begin work on the grant writing for these opportunities once the Climate Action and Adaptation Plan is finalized.

Federal:

- TPA facilitated a Washington DC advocacy trip for the Buena Park City Council in June 2023. The Mayor and
 Council Members connected with officials at key agencies to discuss policy priorities of the City Council,
 including the White House Office of Intergovernmental Affairs, HUD Office of Community Development, DOJ
 Bureau of Justice Assistance, Department of Transportation, and DOC National Telecommunications and
 Information Administration. The City Council was also able to connect with Congresswoman Steel and
 Congresswoman Kim to push for City funding priorities. The visiting delegation was also able to meet with
 the offices of Senator Padilla and Senator Feinstein.
- For the FY 2024 Federal Appropriations Process, TPA worked closely with Congresswoman Steel's office to secure funding for a new municipal water well construction project in the amount of \$1,000,000 in the FY24 Federal Budget. This included crafting the application materials, securing letters of support, and working with Appropriations Committee staff and leadership to advocate for the project's inclusion in the federal budget.
- For the FY 2023 Federal Appropriations Process, TPA worked closely with Congresswoman Kim's office to
 secure funding for the North Orange County Public Safety Taskforce project funding in the amount of
 \$5,000,000 in the FY23 Federal Budget. This included crafting the application materials, securing letters of
 support, and working with Appropriations Committee staff and leadership to advocate for the project's
 inclusion in the federal budget.
- For the FY 2022 Federal Appropriations Process, TPA worked with Congresswoman Kim's office to secure
 funding for the North Orange County Public Safety Taskforce project funding in the amount of \$5,000,000 in
 the FY22 Federal Budget. This included crafting the application materials, securing letters of support, and
 working with Appropriations Committee staff and leadership to advocate for the project's inclusion in the
 federal budget.

TPA is an integral part of the success of the City's state and federal legislative advocacy and grant funding. Due to this, staff recommends approving the proposed amendment to the agreement to continue services with TPA for another two years.

BUDGET IMPACT

TPA has agreed to maintain the same cost for services in the total amount of \$8,075 per month or \$96,900 per year. Funds are budgeted and split between the General Fund (City Manager's Office) and the Water Fund. A total of \$72,680 will be paid for by the General Fund (Account No. 11-6240-105105) and \$24,220 will be paid for by the Water Enterprise Fund, which equates to a 75/25 split.

On April 28, 2017, the Governor of California signed Senate Bill 1 (SB1), also known as the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (the "Act"), to address basic road maintenance, rehabilitation, and critical safety needs on both the state highway system and the local streets and roads system. The Act, in part, created the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA). The guidelines for the RMRA were adopted by the California Transportation Commission (CTC) in August 2017, and specify that before eligible local agencies can receive their apportionment of the RMRA funds in a given fiscal year, they must adopt a list of proposed projects that are included in the agency's budget. The submittal must include a description, location, completion date, and estimated useful life of each project.

While neither the CTC nor the State Controller's Office prepare formal estimates of RMRA funds, the Department of Finance estimates the total amount of funding that will be deposited into RMRA annually. The City's estimated FY 2024-25 RMRA distributions are \$2,156,540.

In anticipation of the City receiving its RMRA fund allocation, staff has identified the following projects to be amended into the FY 2024-25 Capital Improvement Program.

1. 2024-2025 Annual Pavement Rehabilitation:

Road rehabilitation for various residential streets west of Knott Avenue and north of La Cienaga Drive, and San Dimas Circle north of San Diego Drive and south of La Palma Avenue. A budget amendment of \$1,400,000 is requested to fund this project, with the funding sourced from the RMRA allocation.

2. 2024-2025 Annual Slurry Seal Project:

Applying slurry to preserve the pavement for various residential streets between City's western city limit and Knott Avenue north of Orangethorpe Avenue, and east of Valley View Street and south of Orangethorpe Avenue. A budget amendment of \$400,000 is requested to fund this project, which will be funded by the RMRA allocation.

3. Valley View Street Pavement Rehabilitation from Orangethorpe Avenue to Lincoln Avenue Project:

Road rehabilitation on Valley View Street from Orangethorpe Avenue to Lincoln Avenue. A budget amendment of \$300,000 is requested to fund this project of which \$200,000 will be funded by RMRA allocation and \$100,000 from the Gas Tax Fund.

4. Valley View Street Pavement Rehabilitation from Ball Road to Cerritos Avenue Project:

Road rehabilitation on Valley View Street from Ball Road Avenue to Cerritos Avenue. A budget amendment of \$200,000 is requested to fund this project, which will be fully funded by RMRA allocation.

Pursuant to Streets and Highways Code (SHC) Section 2034(a)(1), this project list will not limit the City's flexibility to fund projects in accordance with local needs and priorities, so as long as the projects are consistent with SHC Section 2030(b).

In order to maintain RMRA allocations, a Local Streets and Roads Project List Form along with the necessary supporting documentation must be submitted to the CTC by July 1, 2024.

BUDGET IMPACT

A budget amendment in the amount of \$2,256,540 is required to fund the designated projects, of which \$2,156,540 will be funded by the anticipated RMRA allocation and \$100,000 from the Gas Tax Fund.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, the City, will receive an estimated \$2,156,540 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2024-25 from SB 1; and

WHEREAS, this is the eighth year in which the City is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the City to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

WHEREAS, the City has undergone a public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities/the project list; and

WHEREAS, the City used a Pavement Management System to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the communities priorities for transportation investment; and

WHEREAS, the funding from SB 1 will help the City maintain and rehabilitate streets/roads, bridges, add active transportation infrastructure throughout the City this year and perform similar projects in the future, which will upgrade the roadway to current standards, improve the structural integrity of the pavement, extend the street's lifespan; and

WHEREAS, the 2023 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that some of the City's streets and roads are in a "poor" condition and this revenue will help us increase the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets and roads into an "excellent" condition; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide. SB 1 funds will help the City improve pavement conditions and avoid the deferred maintenance, thereby preserving the pavement network.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

That the City Council adopt the following titled resolutions: 1) A Resolution calling for the holding of a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, for the election of one Council Member in District 3, and one Council Member in District 4, for a full term of four years each; 2) A Resolution calling for the holding of a Special Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, for the election of one Council Member in District 2, for a short-term of office of two years, ending November 2026; 3) A Resolution requesting the Orange County Registrar of Voters consolidate the General Municipal Election to be held on November 5, 2024, with the Statewide General Election to be held on the same date pursuant to Section 10403 of the California Elections Code; 4) A Resolution adopting regulations pertaining to candidates statements for both the General Municipal Election and the Special Election; 5) A Resolution determining a tie-vote shall be resolved by a runoff election for both the General Municipal Election and the Special Election; and, 6) Approve a budget amendment in the amount of \$25,000 from the undesignated General Fund reserve balance to allocate funding for the Special Municipal Election.

PREVIOUS CITY COUNCIL ACTION

On May 30, 2024, the City Council held a special meeting to determine how to fill the vacant City Council Office for District 2. The City Council directed the City Clerk/Director of Government and Community Relations to prepare the resolutions necessary to hold a special election.

DISCUSSION

This year the City will have a General Municipal Election consolidated with the Statewide General Election on Tuesday, November 5, 2024. There will be two City Council seats to fill: one in District 3 and one in District 4 for a full-term of four years. The nomination filing period is from July 15, 2024 through August 8, 2024. If an eligible incumbent does not file, a five-day extension will permit filing until Tuesday, August 13. Public Notices will be published and posted at the City's designated posting locations (City Hall, Ehlers Event Center, and Buena Park Library).

On May 23, 2024, Jose Trinidad Castañeda, Council Member for District 2 of the Buena Park City Council, submitted a letter of resignation effective immediately to the City Clerk. The resignation created a vacancy in the District 2 Office and as a result, within 60 days, the City Council must fill the vacancy by appointment or call a special election. On May 30, 2024, the City Council held a special meeting and received a report from the City Clerk/Director of Government and Community Relations on filling the vacant seat by appointment or special election. At that meeting, the City Council directed the City Clerk/Director of Government and Community Relations to prepare the necessary resolutions to hold a special election to fill the seat by election to be consolidated with the November 5, 2024 General Municipal Election.

The additional resolutions for City Council's consideration establish guidelines for candidate statements, authorize a runoff election in the event of a tie-vote, and request the City Council consolidate with the County of Orange for election services. The CA Election Code states that a tie-vote shall be resolved by a runoff election and the City Council is authorized to adopt provisions for such. Additional costs in the amount of approximately \$25,000 per district would need to be approved if a runoff election is held. Pursuant to Sections 10400 - 10418 of the CA Elections Code and provision of law in the California Government Code, these Resolutions must be adopted in order to proceed with the General Municipal Election. Therefore, it would be appropriate for the City Council to call for the election, request its consolidation with the Statewide General Election, establish regulations for candidates' statements, and authorize a runoff election in the event of a tie-vote.

BUDGET IMPACT

The Orange County Registrar of Voters' estimate of \$48,800 was recommended in the FY 2023-2025 budget to cover the cost of consolidating the General Municipal Election for Districts 3 and 4. Staff recommends that the City Council appropriate funds in the additional amount of \$25,000 from the undesignated General Fund reserve balance for costs associated with holding a Special Municipal Election to fill the vacancy in District 2.

- Section 4: That the polls for the election shall be open at seven o'clock a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, pursuant to Election Code § 10242, except as provided in §§ 14212, 14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California; and,
- <u>Section 5:</u> That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections; and,
- <u>Section 6:</u> That notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law; and,
- <u>Section 7:</u> That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUENA PARK, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING REGULATIONS FOR CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE PERTAINING TO CANDIDATES STATEMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 2024

WHEREAS, §13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California provides that the governing body of any local agency adopt regulations pertaining to materials prepared by any candidate for a municipal election, including costs of the candidates statement.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUENA PARK CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: General Provisions. That pursuant to §13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California, each candidate for elective office to be voted for at an Election to be held in the City of Buena Park on November 5, 2024, may prepare a candidate's statement on an appropriate form provided by the City Clerk. The statement may include the name, age, and occupation of the candidate and a brief description of no more than 200 words of the candidate's education and qualifications expressed by the candidate himself or herself. The statement shall not include party affiliation of the candidate, nor membership or activity in partisan political organizations. The statement shall be filed in typewritten form in the office of the City Clerk at the time the candidate's nomination papers are filed. The statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period.

Section 2: Foreign Language Policy.

- A. Pursuant to the Federal Voting Rights Act, candidates' statements will be translated into all languages required by the County of Orange. The County is required to translate candidate's statements into the following languages: Spanish, Tagalog, Vietnamese, and Korean.
- B. The County will mail separate voter information guides and candidates statements in Spanish, Tagalog, Vietnamese, and Korean to only those voters who are on the county voter file as having requested a voter information guide in a particular language. The County will make the voter information guides and candidates statements in the required languages available at all polling places, on the County's website, and in the Election Official's office.

Section 3. PAYMENT.

A. Translations.

- 1. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of translating the candidate's statement into any <u>required</u> foreign language as specified in Section 2 above pursuant to Federal and\or State law.
- 2. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of translating the candidate's statement into any foreign language that is <u>not required</u> as specified in Section 2 above, pursuant to Federal and\or State law, but is requested as an option by the candidate.

B. Printing.

- 1. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in English in the main voter pamphlet.
- 2. The candidate shall be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement in a foreign language required in Section 2 above, in the main voter pamphlet.

The City Clerk shall estimate the total cost of printing, handling, translating, and mailing the candidate's statements filed pursuant to this section, including costs incurred as a result of complying with the Voting Rights Act of 1965 (as amended), and require each candidate filing a statement to pay in advance to the local agency his or her estimated pro rata share as a condition of having his or her statement included in the voter's pamphlet. In the event the estimated payment is required, the estimate is just an approximation of the actual cost that varies from one election to another election and may be significantly more or less than the estimate, depending on the actual number of candidates filing statements. Accordingly, the Clerk is not bound by the estimate and may, on a pro rata basis, bill the candidate for additional actual expense or refund any excess paid depending on the final actual cost. In the event of underpayment, the Clerk may require the candidate to pay the balance of the cost incurred. In the event of overpayment, the Clerk shall prorate the excess amount among the candidates and refund the excess amount paid within 30 days of the election.

Section 4. MISCELLANEOUS.

- A. All translations shall be provided by professionally-certified translators.
- B. The City Clerk shall allow bold type, underlining, capitalization, indentations, leading hyphens, to the same extent and manner as allowed in previous City elections.
- C. The City Clerk shall comply with all recommendations and standards set forth by the California Secretary of State regarding occupational designations and other matters relating to elections.

WHEREAS, § 15651(b) of the Elections Code of the State of California authorizes the City Council, by majority vote, to adopt provisions to require the conduct of a Special Runoff Election to resolve a tie vote involving those candidates who received an equal number of votes and the highest number of votes for an elective office;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUENA PARK CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A Special Runoff Election shall be called and held on a Tuesday not less than 40 nor more than 125 days after the administrative or judicial certification of the election which resulted in a tie vote.

<u>Section 2.</u> That this resolution shall apply only to the election to be held on November 5, 2024 and shall then be repealed.

<u>Section 3:</u> That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original Resolutions.

- <u>Section 1</u>. That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of Buena Park, California, on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, a Special Municipal Election for the purpose of the election of a Council Member Seat for District 2 for the short-term of office of 2 years, in which the vacancy was created by the resignation of Jose Trinidad Castañeda, which ends November, 2026.
- <u>Section 2</u>. That the county election department is authorized to canvass the returns of the Special Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used. The election will be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of law regulating the statewide or special election.
- Section 3. That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.
- <u>Section 4.</u> That the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to coordinate with the County of Orange Registrar of Voters to procure and furnish any and all official ballots, notices, printed matter and all supplies, equipment and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election; and,

That the polls (vote centers) shall be open at seven o'clock a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock p.m. of the same day when the polls (vote centers) shall be closed, pursuant to Election Code § 10242, except as provided in except as provided in §14212, §14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.
- <u>Section 6</u>. That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.
- Section 7. That notice of the time and place of holding the election is given and the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

1) Adopt a resolution approving plans and specifications for the Friendship Park (formerly Smith Murphy) and Carl Brenner Park Accessibility Improvements Project; 2) Award a contract to Aguilar & Calderon Corporation in the amount of \$778,611.66 for the Project; 3) Authorize contingency funds in the amount of \$119,039.05 in the same purchase order; 4) Authorize construction engineering in the amount of \$20,000; 5) Authorize a purchase order for The Solis Group in the amount of \$4,035 for the Community Workforce Agreement (CWA) administration; 6) Approve a budget transfer in the amount of \$165,000 from the undesignated General Fund balance; 7) Authorize the City Manager and the City Clerk to execute the contract; and, 8) Reject the bid protest submitted by RMS Construction.

PREVIOUS CITY COUNCIL ACTION

On March 14, 2023, the City Council authorized the Economic Development Division to incorporate the FY 2023-2024 Community Development Grant (CDBG) activities and budget into the City's Annual Action Plan. Several city departments included their projects in the CDBG activities. The Public Works Department Capital Improvement Program (CIP) included accessibility improvements to Friendship (formerly Smith Murphy) and Carl Brenner Parks which was one of the projects included in the CDBG activities. This project was allocated an amount of \$609,440 through the CDBG funding.

DISCUSSION

The Friendship Park (formerly Smith Murphy) and Carl Brenner Park Accessibility Improvements Project includes several accessibility improvements to the exterior and interior of the park's infrastructure, bringing them into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The improvements include ADA upgrades to paths of travel, restrooms, parking lots, picnic tables, playground area, drinking fountains, etc. This CIP project aims at improving park accessibility for all groups of users and will help with the City's goal of fulfilling public facility improvements as a part of its Consolidated Plan. This project is a part of the City's CIP for the year 2022-2023. Since the funding allocated for this project is through CDBG, all the federal crosscutting requirements that include National Environmental Policy Act (Environmental reviews), Davis-Bacon Act (Federal Prevailing Wage), Build America Buy America Act (BABA) and other procurement requirements like Minority Business Enterprises/Women Business Enterprises (MBE/WBE) must be satisfied.

On May 13, 2024, this project was advertised for bids. On May 29, 2024, three (3) bids were received and publicly opened by City staff. Total bid amounts ranged from \$778,611.66 to \$781,736.00. The engineer's estimate is \$780,000. Aguilar & Calderon Corporation is the lowest responsive/responsible bidder at \$778,611.66. This contractor possesses the required license and has completed similar work for the cities of Whittier and Fullerton, and Orange County Public Works. Staff recommends awarding a contract to Aguilar & Calderon Corporation of Whittier, California, in the amount of \$778,611.66, approving contingency funds in the amount of \$119,039.05, and approving construction engineering funds in the amount of \$20,000

Construction is scheduled to begin in June 2024 and be completed by September 2024. The Community Services Department is aware of the schedule and has made alternate arrangements in an effort to minimize any inconvenience to residents and park users.

BUDGET IMPACT

The project budget includes the following:

This project is listed on the FY 2023-24 Capital Improvement Project Budget and will be funded by the Various Park Projects for ADA Compliance Project account (32-9806-290157) and CDBG funds. However, a budget transfer in the amount of \$165,000 is needed from the undesignated General Fund balance to fund the project.

Contractor shall perform all Work necessary to complete, in a good and workmanlike manner, a public works project identified in the title of this Contract above (the "Project"), as such Project and the Work to be performed by Contractor is further are described in the Contract Documents.

Any addenda or change orders for the Project approved by the City subsequent to

and

the Effective Date of this Contract.

K.

- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. In consideration for Contractor's performance of the Work required to complete the Project hereunder, City shall pay Contractor a total *NOT-TO-EXCEED* amount of **Seven Hundred Seventy-Eight Thousand Six Hundred Eleven Dollars and Sixty-six Cents** (\$778,611.66) in accordance with the prices as submitted in the Bid ("Compensation"). The Compensation shall be the total and complete such payable by the City for any and all costs, direct or indirect, of the Contractor for provision of the Work and completion of the Project, including but not limited to general and supplementary conditions, performance and payment bonds, Contractor fee for construction, and Contractor overhead and profit, and any other items of costs, accounting, or expense relating to or arising therefrom. Compensation shall under no circumstances be increased except via a formal change order approved by the City; and only if such overruns result of additional scope from the City, as opposed to price overruns, delays, errors, or omissions.
- 4. <u>Term of Contract</u>: The Contractor agrees to complete the work to City's satisfaction within **THIRTY (30) WORKING DAYS** from the date of written notice to proceed. The Contractor further agrees to the assessment of liquidated damages in the amount of <u>FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS</u> (\$500) for each calendar day the work remains incomplete beyond the expiration of the completion date. The City may deduct the amount thereof from any monies due or that may become due the Contractor under this Contract.
- 5. <u>Incorporation by Reference</u>. All of the following documents are attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference: Workers' Compensation Certificate of Insurance, Additional Insured Endorsement (Comprehensive General Liability), Additional Insured Endorsement (Automobile Liability), and Additional Insured Endorsement (Excess Liability).
- 6. <u>Insurance</u>: The Contractor shall not commence work under this Contract until it has obtained all insurance required hereunder in a company or companies acceptable to City nor shall the Contractor allow any subcontractor to commence work on a subcontract until all insurance required of its subcontractor has been obtained. The Contractor shall take out and maintain at all times during the life of this contract the following policies of insurance:

A. Compensation Insurance.

- 1. Before beginning work, the Contractor shall furnish to the City a certificate of insurance as proof that it has taken out full compensation insurance for all persons whom the Contractor may employ directly or through subcontractors in carrying out the work specified herein, in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Such insurance shall be maintained in full force and effect during the period covered by this Contract. Further such policy of insurance shall provide that the insurer waives all rights of subrogation against City and its elected officials, officers, employees, volunteers, and agents.
- 2. In accordance with the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code, every Contractor shall secure the payment of compensation to his employees. Contractor, prior to commencing work, shall sign and file with the City, a certification as follows:

"I am aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for worker's compensation or to undertake self insurance in accordance with the provisions of that Code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract."

B. General Insurance Requirements

- 1. Types of Coverage. Contractor shall maintain the following insurance coverage throughout the term of this Contract, and upon request Contractor shall show City evidence of such coverage, which may include visual inspection of all policies, copies of declarations page, endorsements signed by an authorized representative of the underwriting company, or certificates of insurance. Insurance coverage shall be provided in the following form:
- a. Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage occurrence form number CG 00 01 11 85 or 88.
- b. Automobile Liability insurance with coverage at least as broad as Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 06 92 covering "Any Auto" (Symbol 1).
- c. Workers Compensation insurance as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability insurance.
- 2. Minimum Limits of Insurance. Contractor shall maintain insurance coverage limits no less than:
- a. General Liability: \$2,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage. If Commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit, and shall contain specified language creating a duty to defend against any suit seeking damages.
- b. Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
 - c. Employer's Liability: \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury or disease.
- C. Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions. Any deductibles and/or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the City. At the option of the City, either: the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the City, its officers, elected officials, employees, agents, and volunteers; or, the Contractor shall provide a financial guarantee satisfactory to the City, guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claim administration and defense expenses.

D. Other Insurance Provisions. The Contractor and City further agree as follows:

- 1. All insurance coverage and limits provided pursuant to this Contract shall apply to the full extent of the policies involved, available or applicable. Nothing contained in this Contract or any other agreement relating to the City or its operations limits the application of such insurance coverage. Nothing contained in this Section is to be construed as affecting or altering the legal status of the parties to this Contract.
- 2. Requirements of specific coverage features or limits contained in this Section are not intended as a limitation on coverage, limits or other requirements, or a waiver of any coverage normally provided by any insurance. Specific reference to a given coverage feature is for purposes of clarification only and is not intended by any party to be all inclusive, or to the exclusion of other coverage, or a waiver of any type.
- 3. For any claims related to this Project, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary to any other similar insurance. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City,

its officers, employees or volunteers, shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

- 4. The City, its officers, elected officials, employees, agents, and volunteers are to be covered as additional insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by or on behalf of the Contractor and with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance, or as a separate owner's policy.
- 5. For purposes of insurance coverage only, this Contract will be deemed to have been executed immediately upon any party hereto taking any steps that can be deemed to be in furtherance of or towards, performance of this Contract.
- 6. All general or auto liability insurance coverage provided pursuant to this Contract, or any other agreements pertaining to the performance of this Contract, shall not prohibit Contractor, and Contractor's employees, or agents, from waiving the right of subrogation prior to a loss. Contractor waives its right of subrogation against City.
- 7. In the event any policy of insurance required under this Contract does not comply with these requirements or is canceled and not replaced, City has the right but not the duty to obtain the insurance it deems necessary and any premium paid by City will be promptly reimbursed by Contractor.
- 8. Contractor shall provide proof that policies of insurance required herein expiring during the term of this Contract have been renewed or replaced with other policies providing at least the same coverage. Such proof will be furnished within 72 hours of the expiration of the coverages.
- 9. Any actual or alleged failure on the part of City or any other additional insured under these requirements to obtain proof of insurance required under this Contract in no way waives any right or remedy of City or any additional insured, in this or any other regard.
- 10. All insurance coverage shall contain a provision that prohibits cancellation, modification or lapse without thirty (30) days' prior written notice from insurer to the City. Contractor agrees to require its insurer to modify the certificates of insurance to delete any exculpatory wording stating that failure of the insurer to mail written notice of cancellation imposes no obligation, and to delete the word "endeavor" with regard to any notice provisions.
- 11 All insurance coverage shall include a severability of interests clause substantially similar to the following: "The insurance afforded by this policy applies separately to each insured against whom a claim or suit is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limit of the insurer's liability."
- 12. All insurance coverage shall contain a clause substantially in the following words: "It is hereby understood and agreed that this policy shall not be canceled nor materially changed except upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the City of Buena Park of such cancellation or material change as evidence by a return receipt for a registered letter."
- 13. All insurance coverage shall cover the operations of the Contractor pursuant to the terms of this Contract.
 - 14. Contractor agrees to provide immediate notice to City of any claim or loss against

Contractor that includes City as a defendant. City assumes no obligation or liability by such notice, but has the right (but not the duty) to monitor the handling of any such claim or claims if they are likely to involve City.

- 15. In the event of any loss that is not insured due to the failure of Contractor to comply with these requirements, Contractor agrees to be personally responsible for any and all losses, claims, suits, damages, defense obligations and liability of any kind attributed to City, or City's employees, or any of the additional insureds as a result of such failure.
- 16. Coverage will not be limited to the specific location or individual or entity designated as the address of the Project.
- 17. Contractor agrees not to attempt to avoid its defense and indemnity obligations to City and its employees, agents, officials and servants by using as a defense Contractor's statutory immunity under workers' compensation and similar statutes.
- 18. Contractor agrees to require all parties or subcontractors, including architects or others, with which it enters into contracts or hires pursuant to or related in any way with the performance of this Contract, to provide insurance covering the operations contracted for and naming as additional insureds all parties to this Contract. Contractor agrees to monitor and review all such coverage and assumes all responsibility for ensuring that such coverage is provided as required here. Contractor agrees that no contract, standard form or otherwise, used by any party in any way connected with this Contract, or contracts Contractor enters into on behalf of City, will reserve the right to charge back to City the cost of insurance required by this or any other agreement.
- E. Acceptability of Insurers. Coverage shall be written by insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than "A:VIII," and be admitted to conduct business in the State of California by the Department of Insurance.
- F. Verification of Coverage. Contractor shall furnish the City with evidence of the insurance required by this Section, satisfactory to City, consisting of original certificates of insurance and amendatory endorsements, and an additional insured endorsement at least as broad as Insurance Services Office form CG 20 10 11 85. The endorsements should be on forms provided by the City or on other than the City's forms or a separate owner's policy, provided those forms or policies are approved by the City, and amended to conform to the City's requirements. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the City before work commences. The City reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements effecting the coverage required by these specifications at any time. Contractor agrees to provide complete certified copies of policies to City within 10 days of City's request for said copies.
- G. Subcontractors. Contractor shall include all subcontractors or any other party involved in the Project by Contractor as insured under its policies or shall require subcontractors or any other party involved in the Project by Contractor to carry the same insurance as required herein. Contractor agrees to obtain certificates evidencing such coverage and make reasonable efforts to ensure that such coverage is provided as required here. Contractor agrees to require that no contract used by any subcontractor, or contracts Contractor enters into on behalf of City, will reserve the right to charge back to City the cost of insurance required by this Contract. Contractor agrees that upon request, all agreements with subcontractors or others with whom Contractor contracts with on behalf of City and all certificates of insurance obtained in compliance with this paragraph will be submitted to City or review. Failure of City to request copies of such documents will not impose and liability on City, or its employees.

7. Indemnitifcation.

- A. Contractor and City agree that City, its employees, officers, agents and elected officials should, to the extent permitted by law, be fully protected from any loss, injury, damage, claim, lawsuit, cost, expense, attorneys fees, litigation costs, defense costs, court costs or any other cost arising out of or in any way related to the performance of this Contract. Contractor acknowledges that CITY would not have entered into this Contract in the absence of the commitment of Contractor to indemnify and protect City as set forth here.
- B. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless City, its elected officials, employees, agents, volunteers and officers ("Indemnitees"), from any and all liabilities, claims, suits, actions, arbitration proceedings, administrative proceedings, stop notices, regulatory proceedings, losses, expenses or costs of any kind, actual attorneys fees incurred by City, court costs, interest, defense costs including expert witness fees and any other costs or expenses of any kind whatsoever without restriction or limitation incurred in relation to, as a consequence of, arising out of or in any way attributable actually, allegedly or impliedly, in whole or in part to the Contractor's performance of this Contract. All obligations under this provision are to be paid by Contractor as they are incurred by the City.
- C. Without affecting the rights of City under any provision of this Contract or this section, Contractor shall not be required to indemnify and hold harmless City as set forth above for liability attributable to the sole fault of City, provided such fault is determined by agreement between the parties or the findings of a court of competent jurisdiction. This exception will apply only in instances where the City is shown to have been solely at fault and not in instances where Contractor is solely or partially at fault or in instances where City is fault accounts for only a percentage of the liability involved. In those instances, the obligation of Contractor will be all-inclusive and City will be indemnified for all liability incurred, even though a percentage of the liability is attributable to the conduct of the City.
- D. Contractor acknowledges that its obligation pursuant to this section extends to liability attributable to City, if that liability is other than the sole fault of City. Contractor has no obligation under this Contract for liability proven in a court of competent jurisdiction or by written agreement between the parties to be the sole fault of City.
- E. The obligations of Contractor under this or any other provision of this Contract will not be limited by the provisions of any workers' compensation act or similar act. Contractor expressly waives its statutory immunity under such statutes or laws as to the Indemnitees. The Contractor's indemnity obligation set forth in this section shall not be limited by the limits of any policies of insurance required or provided by the Contractor pursuant to this Contract.
- 8. <u>Antitrust Claims</u>. In entering into this Contract, Contractor offers and agrees to assign to City all rights, title, and interest in and to all causes of action it may have under Section 4 of the Clayton Act (15 U.S.C. § 15) or under the Cartwright Act (Business and Professions Code Section 16700 *et seq.*) arising from purchases of goods, services, or materials pursuant to the Contract. This assignment shall be made and become effective at the time City tenders final payment to Contractor without further acknowledgment by the parties.
- 9. <u>Prevailing Wages</u>. City and Contractor acknowledge that the Project is a public work to which prevailing wages apply. Contractor shall be required to pay the prevailing rate of wages in accordance with the Labor Code which such rates shall be made available at Engineering

Department or may be obtained online at http://www.dir.ca.gov/dlsr. and which mustbe posted at the job site. If the Work involves federal funds or otherwise requires compliance with the Davis-Bacon Fair Labor Standards Act, the Contractor and all its subcontractors shall comply with the higher of the state or federal prevailing wage rates. Contractor shall comply with the Davis-Bacon Fair Labor Standards Act (40 USC a-276, a-5) and the implementation regulations thereof. Contractor shall comply with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Federal Labor Standards Provisions (HUD 4010).

- 10. <u>Community Development Block Grant Funding.</u> Contractor and Owner do hereby acknowledge that this project will be funded with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds [24 CFR 570], and is therefore, subject to applicable Federal procurement, labor, environmental, equal opportunity, and other regulations.
- 11. <u>Section 3 Compliance</u>. The Contractor hereby acknowledges that this federally-funded project is subject to Section 3 of the *Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968* [12 U.S.C. 1701u and 24 CFR Part 135] and agrees to the following:
- A. The work to be performed under this contract is subject to the requirements of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701u (Section 3). The purpose of Section 3 is to ensure that employment and other economic opportunities generated by HUD assistance or HUD-assisted projects covered by Section 3, shall, to the greatest extent feasible, be directed to low- and very low-income persons, particularly persons who are recipients of HUD assistance for housing.
- B. The parties to this contract agree to comply with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR Part 135, which implement Section 3. As evidenced by their execution of this contract, the parties to this contract certify that they are under no contractual or other impediment that would prevent them from complying with the Part 135 regulations.
- C. The contractor agrees to send to each labor organization or representative of workers with which the contractor has a collective bargaining agreement or other understanding, if any, a notice advising the labor organization or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this Section 3 clause, and will post copies of the notice in conspicuous places at the work site where both employees and applicants for training and employment positions can see the notice. The notice shall describe the Section 3 preference, shall set forthminimum number and job titles subject to hire, availability of apprenticeship and training positions, the qualifications for each; and the name and location of the person(s) taking applications for each of the positions; and the anticipated date the work shall begin.
- D. The contractor agrees to include this Section 3 clause in every subcontract subject to compliance with regulations in 24 CFR Part 135, and agrees to take appropriate action, as provided in an applicable provision of the subcontract or in this Section 3 clause, upon a finding that the subcontractor is in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR Part 135. The contractor will not subcontract with any subcontractor where the contractor has notice or knowledge that the subcontractor has been found in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR Part 135.
- E. The contractor will certify that any vacant employment positions, including training positions, that are filled (1) after the contractor is selected but before the contract is executed, and (2) with persons other than those to whom the regulations of 24 CFR Part 135 require employment opportunities to be directed, were not filled to circumvent the contractor'sobligations under 24 CFR Part 135.
- F. Noncompliance with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR Part 135 may result in sanctions, termination of this contract for default, and debarment or suspension from future HUD assisted

contracts.

- G. With respect to work performed in connection with Section 3 covered Indian housing assistance, Section 7(b) of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450e) also applies to the work to be performed under this contract. Section 7(b) requires that to the greatest extent feasible (i) preference and opportunities for training and employment shall be given to Indians, and (ii) preference in the award of contracts and subcontracts shall be given to Indian organizations and Indian-owned Economic Enterprises. Parties to this contract that are subject to the provisions of Section 3 and Section 7(b) agreeto comply with Section 3 to the maximum extent feasible, but not in derogation of compliance with Section7(b).
- 12. Record Keeping. Contractor shall maintain and keep books and records on a current basis, recording all transactions pertaining to this agreement in a form in accordance with generally acceptable accounting principles. Said books and records shall be made available to the City, the State of California, the Federal government, and to any authorized representative thereof for the purposesof audit at all reasonable times and places. All such books and records shall be retained for such periods of time as required by law, provided, however, notwithstanding any shorter periods of retention, all books, records, and supporting detail shall be retained for a period of at least four years after the expiration of the term of this Agreement.
- 13. <u>Community Workforce Agreement.</u> The City and contractor acknowledge that the project is covered by a Community Workforce Agreement between the City and the Los Angeles/Orange Counties Building and Construction Trades Council and the Signatory Craft Councils and Local Unions (the "CWA"). Contractor agrees to abide by the terms and conditions of the CWA.
- 14. <u>Titles</u>. The titles used in this Contract are for convenience only and shall in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of this Contract or any part of it.
- 15. <u>Authority</u>. Any person executing this Contract on behalf of Contractor warrants and represents that he or she has the power and authority to execute this Contract on behalf of Contractor and has the power and authority to bind Contractor to the performance of its obligations hereunder.
- 16. <u>Entire Agreement; Modification</u>. This Contract, including the Contract Documents and any other documents incorporated herein by specific reference, represents the entire and integrated agreement between City and Contractor. Each Party to this Contract acknowledges that no representations, inducements, promises, or agreements, oral or otherwise, have been made by any Party, or anyone acting on behalf of any Party, which are not embodied herein. This Contract supersedes all prior oral or written negotiations, representations or agreements. This Contract may not be modified or amended, nor any provision or breach waived, except in a writing signed by both parties that expressly refers to this Contract.
- 17. Exhibits; Precedence. All documents referenced as exhibits in this Contract are hereby incorporated into this Contract by this reference. In the event of any inconsistency between the express provisions of this Contract and any provision of an exhibit, the provisions of this Contract, then the City's invitation for bids, if any, shall prevail.
- 18. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Contract may be executed in counterpart originals, duplicate originals, or both, each of which is deemed to be an original for all purposes.

CONTRACTING WITH SMALL AND MINORITY FIRMS, WOMEN'S BUSINESS ENTERPRISE, AND LABOR SURPLUS AREA FIRMS

- 1. It is national policy to award a fair share of contracts to small and minority business firms. Accordingly, affirmative steps must be taken to assure that small and minority businesses are utilized when possible as sources of supplies, equipment, construction, and services. Affirmative steps shall include the following:
 - a. Including qualified small and minority businesses on solicitation lists.
 - b. Assuring that small and minority businesses are solicited whenever they are potential sources.
 - c. When economically feasible, dividing total requirements into smaller tasks or quantities so as to permit maximum small and minority business participation.
 - d. Where the requirement permits, establishing delivery schedules which will encourage participation by small and minority businesses.
 - e. Using the services and assistance of the Small Business Administration and the Minority Business Development Agency of the Department of Commerce as required.
 - f. If any subcontracts are to be let, requiring the prime contractor to take the affirmative steps in 1a through 1e above.
- 2. Grantees shall take similar appropriate affirmative action in support of women's business enterprise.
- 3. Grantees are encouraged to procure goods and services from labor surplus areas.

The City of Buena Park ("City") has received and considered your bid protest, dated June 1, 2024 ("Protest") and objecting to the City's expressed intention to award Project work to the apparent lowest-and-responsive bidder, Aguilar & Calderon Corporation ("Aguilar"). The Protest alleges twelve inaccuracies or deficiencies in Aguilar's bid, each of which the City rejects for the reasons explained below reason(s):

1. Page B-1 company certifies three (3) years of current experience, however they show no revenue on page B-17.

Response: The City disagrees that there are any errors or discrepancies in this item. The City is satisfied that based on the information provided in the bid and references that Aguilar has the requisite 3 years' experience.

2. Page B-8 inaccurate statement that company has "Number of years' experience the company has as a contractor in construction work; 22." The company has been licensed for less than three years.

Response: The City disagrees that there are any errors or discrepancies in this item. The City is satisfied that based on the information provided in the bid and references that Aguilar has the requisite experience to complete the Project work, and indicate that Aguilar has been licensed for more than three years.

3. Page B-10 Company did not answer (18) within last five (5) etc."

Response: The City disagrees that there are any errors or discrepancies in this item, as a response to #18 on the Bidder's Questionnaire Form only requires a response if an officer or partner of a bidder's company has failed to complete a contract within the last 5 years.

4. Page B-17 inaccurate project count, they show only five (5) projects yet on reference they show six (6) references.

Response: The City disagrees that there are any errors or discrepancies in this item, as the list of projects for the "Industrial Safety Record Form" in page B-17 is limited by the availability of records, as the explanatory text on the City's bid-form says.

- 5. B-27 missing.
- 6. B-28 missing.
- 7. Certification of Understanding Federal Labor Provisions missing.
- 8. Certification of Federally Assistant Projects missing.
- 9. Certification regarding previous performance missing.
- 10. Declaration of intent to comply with section 3 missing.
- 11. Section 3 clause certification missing.
- 12. Section 3 Business Concern Certification missing.

Response: Aguilar provided each of these documents and certifications in their original bid, but they were inadvertently omitted from the City's Notice of Intent due to a copying / scanning issue on the part of City staff. There was no error or deficiency in Aguilar's bid.

To the extent any minor errors or deviations in Aguilar's bid do exist, the City's Invitation to Bidders reserved the City's right to waive any irregularities or informalities in it. On this point, the City notes that the bid submitted by your company RMS Construction contained actual errors, in the form of discrepancies in the tabulation and calculation of the total bid, that were more substantive than any of the alleged errors in the Aguilar bid.

The City Council is scheduled to consider awarding a contract for the Project on June 11, 2024, and consistent with this letter, staff will be recommending that the City Council: (a) approve the bid submitted by Aguilar as the apparent "lowest-and responsible bidder," and (b) authorize a contract with Aguilar for the Project work. DISCUSSION

At the request of Council Member Traut, this item is being brought forward for discussion regarding the reinstatement of the City of Buena Park P-Nut Baseball End-of-the-Season Campout program at Peak Park. Per City Council discussion and direction, the program was suspended at the City Council Meeting of March 12, 2024.

The P-Nut Baseball Program caters to boys and girls ages 4-17, emphasizing participation, teamwork, and sportsmanship. Using a coach-pitch format, all participants have the opportunity to bat and everyone plays in the field on defense. This season, there are 279 registered participants, with games commencing in early May and concluding on Saturday, July 20 at Peak Park.

The customary end of season tradition involves the "P-Nut Campout and Picnic Day," spanning from Friday evening into Saturday afternoon. Friday's activities include baseball games/awards for the Clinic Division (ages 4-5), a skills competition, pre-movie activities, a movie screening, and overnight camping. Saturday's events feature championship games, a kid's carnival with a dunk tank and water slide, and culminating in an awards ceremony at 3 pm for P-Nut League participants.

At the study session of March 12, 2024, the City Council deliberated on the Community Services Department's special events portfolio. A review of 24 events for potential changes or suspension occurred, with two new events added. During the discussion, staff and Council agreed the P-Nut Campout portion of the end of season festivities would be eliminated, resulting in a cost reduction of \$6,850.

Following a petition by P-Nut league coaches and a speaker during oral communications at the City Council meeting on May 28, 2024 advocating for the reinstatement of the overnight campout, a reevaluation was requested.

Should the City Council opt to reinstate the campout, staff is prepared to implement the P-Nut Baseball End-of-the-Season Campout program on July 19-20, 2024.

A budget request of \$5,000 for part-time salaries and program costs would be needed to reinstate the campout. The allocation, if approved, will be included in the fiscal year 2024-25 budget.

Introduction:

The Community Services Department has consistently strived to deliver public services at a high level, most of which are well-received by the Buena Park community. One significant aspect of our department involves the planning and execution of Citywide special events. Over the past five years, this segment has experienced substantial growth, with the 2024 calendar comprising a total of 26 special events.

DISCUSSION

This study session item was requested by Council Member Brown to discuss potential future amendments to the Buena Park Municipal Code (BPMC) to prohibit gas-powered lawn equipment. The state legislature approved Assembly Bill No. 1346, which banned the sale of gas-powered lawnmowers and leaf blowers in California as of January 1, 2024. While homeowners and businesses will still be permitted to use gas-powered equipment after that date, they will no longer be able to purchase them in California.

The negative environmental impacts of gas-powered lawn equipment is substantial. According to the California Air Resources Board (CARB), a gas-powered lawnmower operating for one hour emits as much smog-forming pollution as driving a mid-sized sedan, about 300 miles and one hour of using a commercial leaf blower is equivalent to driving 1,100 miles. Leaf-blowers and lawnmowers are classified as Small Off-Road Engines, or SORES. As of 2017, there were nearly 16.5 million SOREs in California, which was greater than the 13.7 million passenger cars in the state. The air pollution that this equipment generates is responsible for health risks as they emit high levels of reactive organic gases (ROG), particulate matter (PM) and nitrogen oxide (NOx). Not only are these emissions harmful to the people operating the equipment, but also the neighborhoods and the environment at-large. Most leaf blowers are powered by two-stroke engines, which run on a mix of oil and gas. Two-stroke engines produce more pollution than four-stroke engines because the fuel-air mixture in them is contaminated with the engine's lubricating oils. Simultaneously the combustion chamber draws in the contaminated mixture as exhaust gases are expelled through an exhaust port. Some of the fuel and oil gets mixed with the exhaust. According to a 2020 report, lawn equipment across the United States produced more than 68,000 tons of nitrogen oxides, more than 350,000 tons of volatile organic compounds, 30 million tons of carbon dioxide, and nearly 19,000 tons of methane.

Buena Park has recently taken several steps to expand its commitment to environmental stewardship and sustainability, including the development of a Climate Action and Adaption Plan, adoption of an Environmental Justice Element in the City's General Plan, creation of a Sustainability Manager position, and implementation of a Climate Action Commission. Should the City Council direct staff to prepare an ordinance to prohibit the use of gas-powered leaf blowers and lawnmowers within the city, the following measures are recommended:

- Create or revise definitions within the Municipal Code for gas-powered lawn mowers, leaf blowers, trimmers, and other maintenance equipment.
- Implement a phased approach to allow sufficient time for residents, businesses, and landscaping contractors to transition to compliant equipment. Provide outreach and educational resources to support the transition process.

 Consider exemptions for certain circumstances where electric or battery-powered alternatives are not feasible or practical (e.g. declared emergencies, extended power outages) and develop guidelines and criteria for exemption requests.

There are relatively few cities in the state that have taken action to ban the use of gas-powered leaf blowers and lawnmowers. The nearest examples that staff could find are the cities of Irvine and Pasadena. Irvine recently adopted an ordinance that will ban gas-powered leaf blowers, lawnmowers, string trimmers, hedge trimmers, edgers and chainsaws. Beginning July 1, 2024, businesses working in Irvine that employ more than 50 people won't be able to use gas-powered leaf blowers and lawnmowers while residents, and all other smaller businesses will have until January 1, 2025. The ban on using all other gas-powered equipment will go into effect on January 1, 2025, for businesses that employ more than 50 people, and July 1, 2026, for residents and all other businesses. Any landscaping company working in Irvine, regardless of where that business is based, will be subject to these regulations. The City Council also allocated up to \$150,000 to assist residents and Irvine-based businesses to purchase electric lawn equipment. This financial assistance is in addition to the rebates and other programs offered by the South Coast Air Quality Management District and the Orange County Power Authority.

The Pasadena City Council also voted to ban the use of gas-powered leaf blowers in March 2022. The ban also made it illegal to use a leaf blower to cause debris to travel beyond the property boundaries of the parcel on which it is being used, to adjoining properties or public rights-of-way within the city, and to remain there for more than 15 minutes. Further, electric-powered leaf blowers may only be used between the hours of 8 am and 6 pm, Monday through Friday, and 9 am to 5 pm on Saturdays. Leaf blowers may not be operated on Sundays and holidays.

The Pasadena leaf blower ban is enforced by Code Enforcement on a reactive, complaint basis. A warning notice with a 30-day compliance period is issued to the landscape business owner/operator with continued violations resulting in citations. The City also offered resources to landscaping companies and community members about grants and rebates that may be available to defer all or a portion of the costs associated with transitioning to battery-powered or electric equipment. For example, SB-170 included \$27 million to sole proprietors and other small landscaping businesses to assist in the purchase of zero-emission SOREs, including leaf-blowing machines, lawnmowers and string trimmers. Additionally, California Clean Off-Road Equipment Voucher Incentive Project (CORE) is offering point-of-sale discounts of up to \$400 per electric-powered leaf blower for small businesses and sole-proprietor landscapers.

Impacts on City or City-contracted Landscape Services

The City contracts with Merchants Landscape Services, Inc. (Merchants) to provide landscaping to City-owned parks, medians, parkways, and facilities. This is supplemented with additional landscaping activities by City staff. Currently, all leaf blowers and lawnmowers utilized by Merchants are gas-powered.

Merchants currently operates seven leaf blowers in Buena Park. It costs about \$1,500 to replace a gas-powered leaf blower with a battery-powered model, which includes four sets of batteries and a charger. It would cost approximately \$10,500 for Merchants to replace their gas-powered leaf blowers with battery-powered models. Merchants work is supplemented by City staff, who currently operate an additional eleven leaf blowers, three of which are battery-operated. It would cost another \$12,000 to replace the City's remaining gas-powered leaf blowers. The total cost for Merchants and City staff to switch to battery-powered leaf blowers is approximately \$22,500.

Additionally, Merchants operates four 72-inch gas-powered lawnmowers. These lawnmowers are 26.5 HP and exempt from the California AB-1346 ban on gas-powered lawnmowers. The nearest equivalent battery-powered lawnmower is 60-inch and costs approximately \$51,800 for the lawnmower, six sets of batteries, and a charger. Due to the smaller size, an additional 3 to 4 lawnmowers would be needed which would also increase labor costs. Replacing the gas-powered lawnmowers with battery-powered would cost between \$362,000 – \$415,000 for equipment and would approximately double labor and equipment transportation costs.

Merchants recently switched over to battery-powered lawnmowers in specific areas of the City of Irvine but found that the limited runtime and smaller size of the units was impeding productivity. After a few months, Merchants and the City of Irvine agreed to reintroduce gas-powered lawnmowers alongside the battery-powered lawnmowers to supplement them.

Next Steps:

Should the City Council direct staff to implement a ban on gas-powered lawn equipment, city staff will work collaboratively with stakeholders to develop implementation guidelines, outreach materials, and enforcement mechanisms for the proposed ban, and the item will be placed on the agenda for review and consideration of a Municipal Code Amendment at a future noticed public hearing. If adopted, staff would monitor compliance and evaluate the effectiveness of the ordinance in achieving its environmental and public health objectives. The ban, and associated reduction in GHG emissions, would also be incorporated into the forthcoming Climate Action and Adaptation Plan as part of the City's strategies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

DISCUSSION

The City Council discussed illegal sidewalk vending at the study session on February 27, 2024. Following the presentation by staff, the City Council requested this item come back to a future study session with additional information and background. Specifically, the City Council requested more information about the estimated number of illegal street vendors operating in the city, the street vendor permitting process, and additional options for enforcement.

The California Safe Sidewalk Vending Act, Senate Bill 946 (SB 946), became effective in January 2019. SB946 represented a significant shift in the state's approach to street vending, aiming to balance the economic needs of vendors with the interests of local communities and businesses. To comply with SB946, the city adopted Ordinance No.1653 amending BPMC Chapter 5.64 to create a permitting and regulatory program that preserves public parks, rights-of-way, and other public places for the use and enjoyment of the community at-large. The BPMC defines 'sidewalk vending' and 'sidewalk vending activities' to regulate the location and manner in which sidewalk vending can occur.

In addition to location restrictions, sidewalk vendors are required to obtain a Sidewalk Vending Permit and a Business License from the City, and any additional licensing requirements from Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA). For street vendors selling food, both the City and County of Orange have additional licensing requirements to ensure that the food is being prepared, stored, and served in a safe and hygienic manner. Illegal/unregulated street vending has several negative impacts on the surrounding businesses, residents, and the community, including:

- Illegal street vending often obstructs sidewalks and impedes pedestrian traffic, posing safety risks to both vendors and the public.
- Illegal street vending, particularly food vending, poses a substantial public health risk for patrons.
- Unregulated street vending contributes to litter and improper waste disposal, including disposal of fats, oils and grease onto public sidewalks and rights-of-way.
- Local businesses may suffer from unfair competition due to illegal vendors operating without adherence to licensing, health, and safety regulations.

 Unregulated street vendors have not obtained a business license from the city and do not pay sales tax for their products or food.

A survey of surrounding cities found that most have adopted similar street vending regulations as Buena Park, but very few have issued street vending permits due the vendors' inability to provide the minimum standards to receive a permit from the OCHCA or be able to comply with City regulations.

OCHCA Permit Process

Beginning in 2023, OCHCA reclassified street vending as Compact Mobile Food Operation (CMFO). Depending on the operation and what type of food is being offered, a permit may or may not be required. However, some requirements must be met regardless of whether a permit is needed.

CMFOs include individuals, pushcarts, stands, displays, and wagons. CMFOs may only sell prepackaged foods, whole uncut produce, or food with limited food preparation.

CMFO Requirements:

- Health permit*
- Plan review*
- Commissary required The commissary can either be a permitted food facility or a permitted Cottage Food
 Operation. A Cottage Food Operation can serve as a commissary for a maximum of two CMFOs.
- Ware washing (containers, utensils, cooking pans, etc.) and hand-washing equipment are required for permitted CMFOs
- · Food Handler Cards are required
- Potentially hazardous food prepared at an approved facility and served from a CMFO shall be destroyed at the end of the operating day
- Routine inspections required*
- · Payment of permit fees

*Health permits, plan review, and routine inspections may not apply for CMFOs that have less than 25 square feet of display space AND sell only non-potentially hazardous prepackaged food or whole, uncut produce.

To get a permit, applicants must first complete an application from OCHCA. Depending on the food operation, applicants may need to submit plans for their CMFO, attach operating procedures for any ware washing and handwashing, and provide the location for the commissary. The application, plans, operating procedures, and commissary will all be reviewed and evaluated by the OCHCA staff. In addition to the above-referenced items, the application also requires information regarding ownership, including address, driver's license number, and contact information. The application must also provide a Commissary Agreement, Route Stops, and Events for field inspections by OCHCA.

Per OCHCA standards, a CMFO is only permitted to conduct "Limited Food Preparation," which includes:

- Heating, frying, baking, roasting, popping, shaving of ice, blending, steaming, or boiling of hot dogs, or assembly of non-prepackaged food.
- Dispensing and portioning of non-potentially hazardous food or dispensing and portioning for immediate service to a customer of food that has been temperature controlled until immediately prior to portioning or dispensing.
- Holding, portioning, and dispensing of any foods that are prepared for satellite food service by the onsite permanent food facility or prepackaged by another approved source.
- Holding, portioning, and dispensing of any foods that are prepared by a catering operation.
- Slicing and chopping of non-potentially hazardous food or produce that has been washed at an approved facility or slicing and chopping of food on a heated cooking surface during the cooking process.
- Cooking and seasoning to order.

- Juicing or preparing beverages that are for immediate service, in response to an individual consumer order, that do not contain frozen milk products.
- Hot and cold holding of food that has been prepared at an approved permanent food facility.
- Reheating of food that has been previously prepared at an approved permanent food facility and held at temperatures required by this chapter.

"Limited Food Preparation" does not include:

- Slicing and chopping potentially hazardous food (e.g. meat), other than produce, unless it is on the heated cooking surface.
- Thawing.
- · Cooling of cooked, potentially hazardous food.
- Grinding raw ingredients or potentially hazardous food.
- Washing of foods.
- · Cooking of potentially hazardous foods for later use.
- Handling, manufacturing, freezing, processing, or packaging of milk, milk products, or products resembling
 milk products subject to licensing under the Food and Agricultural Code.

A Health Permit is not required if the CMFO is 25 square feet or less of display and food storage back stock only prepackaged, non-potentially hazardous food or uncut whole produce is offered. A permit is required if the CMFO has more than 25 square feet of display area of any type of food.

City Enforcement Efforts

Most cities have adopted a similar enforcement practice as Buena Park, which relies on a team consisting of Code Enforcement, Public Works, Police Department, and OCHCA to shut down vendors and impound food/equipment. Participation by the OCHCA is vital because it is through their authority that the City can dispose of the food and impound the equipment on behalf of the OCHCA. However, the reliance on OCHCA staff to participate in enforcement actions limits the number enforcement efforts that can be conducted. Buena Park has only been able to secure OCHCA staff for vendor sweeps a few times per month. OCHCA impounds all food items and equipment under the authority of Division 104, Part 7, Section 114393, of the California Health and Safety Code. All perishable items are immediately discarded and the equipment is destroyed after 30 days. Typically, the street vendors do not carry identification and are not the responsible party or owners of the equipment. Even after impounding of all food and equipment, it is not uncommon to have the same street vending operation back out on the sidewalk the following night or following week with new equipment.

The number of illegal street vendors operating in the City fluctuates significantly from day-to-day and from daytime to nighttime. Based on Code Enforcement staff inspections, it is estimated there are 8 to 12 street vendors operating daily in the City. These include stationary vendors and pushcart vendors. During nights and weekends, the number increases to approximately 15 to 20. During Halloween Haunt, the number of vendors could increase to as many as 30.

In late April 2024, it was discovered that one or more street vendors had begun placing a 'spotter' at City Hall during the evenings to act as a look-out to notify street vendors when Code Enforcement vehicles were exiting the City Hall parking lot to conduct inspections. Similar strategies have been reported by the cities of Anaheim and Orange.

Options for Enforcement

Recently, the City of Anaheim approved amendments to its Municipal Code to enable Code Enforcement to impound food and equipment without participation from the OCHCA to increase the amount of enforcement actions that can be conducted. Several other Orange County cities are also considering this amendment. This code amendment would allow for an increased amount of enforcement actions by the city, but would not reduce the City's costs associated with vendor enforcement. Some cities have utilized a third-party consultant to provide code enforcement services on behalf of the city for vendor enforcement while others have added part-time code officers, who focus on street vending and work mostly nights and weekends when street vendors are most prevalent.

In addition to code amendments and increased enforcement, the City Council could consider an expanded outreach and education campaign that could accompany enforcement actions that would provide educational programs to inform vendors and the public about the legal requirements to obtain a Street Vending Permit with the goal of transitioning illegal vendors into legal ones.
