4. **PUBLIC HEARING**

4A. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. CU-23-5

A request to create a year-round Halloween/horror themed entertainment facility located at 8308 On the Mall within the Buena Park Downtown Mall. The proposal includes two (2) interactive movie theaters, concessions, two (2) escape rooms, a seasonal Halloween maze, temporary horror-themed attractions, and common area. The property owner is NEWKOA, LLC, 3240 Wilshire Boulevard Suite 570, Los Angeles, CA 90010. The applicant is Heather Luther, 360 E 1st Street #667, Tustin, CA 92780.

Mr. McAleese presented the staff report.

Commissioner Patiño asked how traffic and parking will be impacted by the proposed business, and about security and contingency plans to handle numerous customers, and if the design will be on the façade or limited to the interiors.

Commissioner Choi asked if parking will affect the current tenants of the mall, and if there will be ample fire and security exits.

Vice Chair Davis asked about the number of entrances to the mall and if there is an entrance from the back of the mall.

Chair Judeh asked about the maximum capacity of the proposed business and, because the attractions are seasonal, how the site will be used off-season. She noted that security guards will be present one hour before opening and one hour after closing, but asked for a specific timeline on the presence of security guards.

Mr. McAleese stated that there will be no negative impact on traffic and parking because the Buena Park Downtown Mall was designed and approved with an analysis and adequate provision of parking required for all tenant spaces that currently exist. Therefore there will be no negative impact on current tenants of the mall. Regarding security, Mr. McAleese stated that the proposed security plan includes the presence of security guards from 7:00 p.m., which is one hour before the mall closes, to one hour after the proposed business closes at night. He added that a more comprehensive detailed security plan will be submitted for review and approval prior to the approval of the required Entertainment Permit. The proposed modification will only be within the interior of the mall and will not affect the façade (of the Mall). Regarding the maximum occupancy the staff does not currently have the occupancy information on hand, but that the applicant has already submitted the occupancy load information to the Building Division and Fire for their review.

Ms. Arabolu said a traffic study was completed for the Village project and there will be no negative impact. She added that when the Village project is completed, there will be 2,000 less trips, which will improve the situation.

Mr. McAleese said there is one primary entrance to the proposed business from inside the mall; stairs, an elevator for accessibility, emergency evacuation corridors, and emergency/fire exits on the south portion.

There being no other questions of staff, Chair Judeh opened the public hearing.

Robert Luther, applicant, 12817 Artnell Road, Santa Ana, CA 92701, said that the overall maximum capacity of about 448 is expected to be lower, their tickets will be pre-sold every 30 minutes for each of the varied attractions such as interactive movie theaters (maximum 50 persons per show), each escape room (24 persons per hour), and the Halloween maze main attraction (300 persons total per hour). He said that during the non-seasonal period, the maze will be unused (not open to the public), with possible improvements taking place.

Mr. Luther said that because of the intense and interactive nature of their attractions, their expected customers' ages range from 25 to 30, with some in their 50s, and fewer below 19. Mr. Luther said that the Buena Park location will be their new home.

In response to Chair Judeh, Ms. Santos stated that a written communication was received from Mr. John Parlet, owner of John's Incredible Pizza Company, expressing his concerns about traffic and parking.

John Parlet, owner and founder of John's Incredible Pizza, 36 Mountain Laurel, Rancho Santa Margarita, CA, introduced himself as a proud member of the Buena Park community, with a successful business that has been in existence for 15 years now. He said that after 27 years in the business, with 14 locations, one of his company's biggest requirements is parking. He said that he is very concerned about parking problems that the proposed business will cause, he has read the city calculations and traffic reports but he is not convinced and believes that the project will have a negative impact on his business. He referred to aerial photographs of the parking areas which were taken on a weekend that was not busy; stated that the open areas by the old Sears site will all go away (once the Village project starts construction). He added that the only open parking spaces are on the left back side of Walmart, but his customers, especially couples with kids on strollers, will most likely not park that far and walk to the other side where his business is. He asked for recalculation of parking statistics or rejection of this project.

In response, the applicant, Mr. Luther stated that there are enough parking spaces, most of which are farther away. He noted that the aerial photos did not show the southwest portion of the parking lot (where there are available parking spaces), and pointed out that as far as parking spaces, their customers will not overlap with John's Incredible customers. He also assured Mr. Parlet that they will instruct the staff (of the proposed business) to park all the way in the farthest spots first. Mr. Luther added that their peak hours are between 9:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m., and by 8:00 p.m., 73% of the mall tenants are closed. He assured Mr. Parlet that the proposed business will not negatively impact Mr. Parlet's business.

Mr. Cardinale stated that he understood the concerns raised but, as staff had mentioned in the presentation, the mall was built and approved in the 1970s, with adequate parking for a fully built out mall, including a food court at this location that probably served numerous customers per hour. He added that since the mall was approved, there have been changes in State laws, including limitations in staff's ability to mandate more parking spaces, unless based on specific findings and facts.

Mr. Luther said, they can add the parking location information to their site or print it on the tickets.

There being no other speakers or written communications, Chair Judeh closed the public hearing.

Vice Chair Davis moved and Commissioner Choi seconded the motion to adopt the resolution approving Conditional Use Permit No. CU-23-5.

PROPERTY INFORMATION:

The project site consists of an approximately 2.30-acre vacant site comprised of sixteen (16) separate parcels that are owned by the City and are in the process of being consolidated through Parcel Map No. 2023-114 which was previously approved by the Planning Commission on April 26, 2023. The project site is situated on the south side of Auto Center Drive between Western Avenue and the Interstate-5 freeway on-ramp/off-ramp, located west of Beach Boulevard at 6245 Auto Center Drive (APNs: 277-021-02, -03, -04, -05, -06, -07, -08, -10, -13, -15, -16, -17, -18, -19, -20, and -21). The parcels are zoned Auto Center Specific Plan (ACSP) Sub-District A-1 with a General Plan Land Use designation of Commercial.

APPLICATION ANALYSIS:

Project Description

The applicant is requesting a conditional use permit and variance to construct a new 28,825 square-foot thirty-six (36) foot high two-story automobile dealership (Simpson Cadillac) with a roof parking deck and an attached service garage. The project also proposes a detached 1,320 square-foot car wash (for dealership use only) with an 806 square-foot attached canopy, off-street parking, landscaping, and other site improvements. The applicant is requesting variances from the building front yard setback, and to allow an increase in the maximum wall height within the required street setback.

According to the submitted business operation plan, the automobile dealership will operate Monday through Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. and employ approximately 22 people. A more detailed business operation plan is provided in Attachment 3.

Floor Plan

The proposed dealership is comprised of two (2) floors with a roof parking deck having a total area of 81,006 square feet. The first floor comprises 25,317 square feet and will consist of a showroom with sales offices, a lounge area with amenities, building support offices, and a new car delivery area. The western portion of the building will be dedicated to the service garage with a 1,545 square-foot mezzanine for parts storage. Dividing these two sections will be a three (3) lane vehicle service drive with a service write-up area for customer vehicle intake. A vehicle ramp to access the second floor and roof parking deck will be located at the rear (south) elevation of the building. The second floor will consist of a 3,508 square-foot office support and meeting room area and a 23,564 square-foot vehicle inventory parking area. The roof deck will also consists of a vehicle inventory parking area containing 27,072 square feet. The proposed 1,320 square-foot detached car wash tunnel with an attached 806 square-foot canopy and a trash enclosure area will be situated on the west side of the lot.

Access/Site Design/Parking

The project site will include three (3) driveways along Auto Center Drive. The internal drive-aisles have been designed to adequately accommodate on-site vehicular access, emergency and trash service vehicle circulation, access to the vehicle ramp on the south side of the building, and access to the inventory parking areas and required off-street parking spaces. The service drive, located between with showroom and the service garage, will be closed utilizing a metal, semi-transparent roll-up door during non-operating hours. This door is set back 20 feet from the front property line.

The proposed buildings comply with the minimum setback and maximum height requirements in the Buena Park Municipal Code (BPMC), except for the setback from the north property line. The building is setback ten (10) feet from the north property line, while a twenty (20) foot setback is required per the Section 19.520.020.B.1 (Front Yard, and Side/Rear Yards Abutting a Street).

BPMC Table 19.536.040 (Parking Spaces Required) requires vehicle sales and display uses to provide two and a half (2.5) parking spaces per 1,000 square feet gross floor area, plus one (1) space per 1,000 square feet of outdoor display area. Therefore, based on the total combined dealership and outdoor display area, the proposed automobile dealership will require a total of 88 off-street parking spaces. The proposed project provides a total of 275 parking spaces. A total of 15 customer parking spaces, nine (9) vehicle display parking spaces, and two (2) display pads are provided along the east side of the property and 48 surface parking spaces for service vehicles will be provided at the west side of the property. The remaining 201 parking spaces will be utilized for inventory and vehicles being serviced and are located on parking deck levels two and three. The parking spaces provided exceed the minimum off-street parking requirements for the proposed development.

Landscaping/Fencing

The proposed project will provide approximately 8,942 square feet of landscaping throughout the development, including along Western Avenue and Auto Center Drive to buffer the off-street parking areas from the adjacent public right-of-way. The ten-foot landscape area along the north portion of the site will feature a two-foot-high landscaped berm planted with mature trees and enhanced landscaping to provide a visual buffer from Auto Center Drive. As conditioned, 30-foot tall Mexican Fan Palm trees will be planted along the entire north property line, minimum 24-inch box size trees will be located within the parking areas on the east side of the property, and the size of plants/shrubs will be a minimum of 5 gallons.

The site currently has an existing ten (10) foot high wall with guardrail and four (4) foot high wall with guardrail along Western Avenue, and a Caltrans wall that is located along the entire south property line separating the subject site from the I-5 Freeway. A new eight (8) foot high block wall painted to match the building with a decorative cap is proposed along the northwest portion of the site, with a ten (10) foot setback. In order to soften the new block wall, as conditioned, climbing vines will be planted within the landscape area along the entire length of the block wall.

<u>Architecture</u>

The proposed building design will feature a variety of materials incorporating a distinctive modern design that will establish an architectural presence along Auto Center Drive. Articulated and angled walls at the northeast section of the building along with the change in building materials has been provided to break up the massing of the building elevations. The building incorporates a flat roof with parapet walls to screen the parking deck. The east and north elevations will feature floor to ceiling glass curtain wall on the first and second levels to emphasize the showroom area and in an effort to further break up the massing of the building elevations nearest to the street.

<u>Signage</u>

New signage will be provided throughout the property consisting of a combination of wall signs, a freeway oriented sign, and directional signs. The proposed freeway oriented sign will be located adjacent to the north property line east of the driveway near the I-5 on-ramp/off-ramp with a total height of thirty (30) feet. The total sign area of the freestanding sign is 296 square-feet per face with the Cadillac logo and name situated towards the top, and auto dealership name below. A wall sign with logo will also is proposed on the building east elevation, with an additional wall sign proposed above the service center to direct customers to the service entrance. The two directional signs are proposed adjacent to the west and east driveway entrances.

DISCUSSION:

Entitlements Requested

The following entitlements are requested for this project:

- Conditional Use Permit Pursuant to the ACSP Section V (Permitted Uses), new sales of autos and trucks not exceeding 3 tons and mechanical car washes are permitted by right within Sub-District A-1, and repair and/or service of autos and trucks not exceeding 3 tons is an associated use that requires a Conditional Use Permit.
- Variance A request to allow a deviation of the required building front yard setback from twenty (20) feet to ten (10) feet, and to allow an increase of the maximum block wall height within the required twenty (20) foot street setback from 3 feet 6 inches to eight (8) feet high.

Conditional Use Permit (CUP)

BPMC Section 19.128.020 (Conditional Use Permit) requires Planning Commission review and approval for certain types of uses and development situations that require special consideration of the unique circumstances of each case in order to ensure that the intent of the Zoning Code is adequately implemented. As proposed, the project meets the criteria contained in the BPMC and ACSP for the structure and the use, including lot size, FAR, height, parking, and landscaping, with the exception of the front setback. The design is consistent with the intent and vision for auto dealerships within the Buena Park Auto Mall and the architectural character of the area.

Variance

BPMC Section 19.132.010 (Variance) requires Planning Commission review deviations from the strict application of the requirements of the BPMC in those special circumstances where the literal requirements unintentionally discriminate against a particular property because of unusual and unanticipated circumstances. In such circumstances, a variance may be granted to correct an inequity, but may not be used to grant any special privilege. The narrow irregular shape of parcel, along with the existing Caltrans easements along the southern portion of the lot that are unable to be vacated, restricts the areas where structures could be otherwise located on the subject property. As a result of these limitations, a reduction to the required 20-foot front yard setback is necessary to allow the development of an automobile dealership and associated improvements on the subject property. A majority of the easements on the property are present on the south portion of the property running east to west, with several easements located on the west and east portions of the site as well. With the restrictive nature of the site, the building being situated ten (10) feet closer to the front property line will allow the site to be developed to the same potential as another site without the above-mentioned constraints. Similarly, the decorative wall being situated at the parking setback instead of at building setback would alleviate the restrictive nature of the site layout. The block wall will provide screening for parking areas, car wash tunnel and attached canopy. Enhanced landscaping will be provided to reduce the visual impact of the block wall within the setback area.

The proposed development and establishment of an automobile dealership, as conditioned, is consistent with the goals and policies of the General Plan and complies with all development standards, with the proposed deviations, of the ACSP Sub-District A-1. The proposed development will revitalize a piece of land that has been vacant and unimproved for several years, and further promotes Auto Center Drive as an automotive sales corridor.

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT:

In accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the City has determined that the proposed project is Categorically Exempt, pursuant to Section 15332 (In-Fill Development Projects) Class 32 of the State CEQA Guidelines, because the project: (a) is consistent with the applicable general plan designation and all applicable general plan policies as well as with applicable zoning designation and regulations; (b) occurs within city limits on a project site of no more than five (5) acres substantially surrounded by urban uses; (c) has no value as habitat for endangered, rare, or threatened species; (d) approval of the project would not result in any significant effects relating to traffic, noise, air quality, or water quality; and, (e) can be adequately served by all required utilities and public services.

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE:

Notice of the public hearing was posted at City Hall, the Buena Park Library, and Ehlers Event Center on May 31, 2024, and 31 notices of this Planning Commission public hearing were mailed to property owners located within 300-feet of the subject property on May 31, 2024. As of the publication of this report, no public comments have been received regarding the proposed actions.

RESOLUTION NO. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. CU-22-16 VARIANCE NO. V-22-3

A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BUENA PARK, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING A REQUEST FOR ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. CU-22-16 AND VARIANCE NO. V-22-3 TO CONSTRUCT A NEW 28,825 SQUARE-FOOT TWO (2) STORY AUTOMOBILE DEALERSHIP WITH ROOF PARKING DECK, A DETACHED CAR WASH TUNNEL WITH AN ATTACHED CANOPY, OFF-STREET PARKING, LANDSCAPING, AND ASSOCIATED SITE IMPROVEMENTS, AND TO ALLOW A DEVIATION OF THE REQUIRED BUILDING FRONT YARD SETBACK FROM 20 FEET TO 10 FEET, AND TO ALLOW AN INCREASE IN MAXIMUM WALL HEIGHT WITHIN THE REQUIRED 20-FOOT STREET SETBACK FROM 3 FEET 6 INCHES TO 8 FEET HIGH ON A PROPERTY LOCATED AT 6245 AUTO CENTER DRIVE (APNS: 277-021-02, -03, -04, -05, -06, -07, -08, -10, -13, -15, -16, -17, -18, -19, -20, AND -21), AND MAKING FINDINGS IN SUPPORT THEREOF

A. Recitals.

- (i) Douglas Andresen, applicant, Andresen Architecture, 17087 Orange Way, Fontana, CA 92335, on behalf of the City of Buena Park, property owner, 6650 Beach Boulevard, Buena Park, CA 90622, has filed an application for a Conditional Use Permit No. CU-22-16 and Variance No. V-22-3 to allow the development of a new 28,825 square-foot two (2) story automobile dealership with a roof parking deck, a detached car wash tunnel with an attached canopy, its required off-street parking, landscaping and associated on- and off-site improvements; and a request to allow a deviation of the required building front yard setback from 20 feet to 10 feet, and to allow an increase in the maximum block wall height within the required 20-foot street setback from 3 feet 6 inches to eight (8) feet high for a property located at 6245 Auto Center Drive in Buena Park, California, 90621, in the County of Orange (APNs: 277-021-02, -03, -04, -05, -06, -07, -08, -10, -13, -15, -16, -17, -18, -19, -20, and -21). Hereinafter in this Resolution, the subject Conditional Use Permit and Variance request is referred to as the "application."
- (ii) On June 12, 2024, the Planning Commission conducted a duly noticed public hearing on the application, as required by law, and concluded said hearing prior to the adoption of this Resolution.
- (iii) The Planning Commission has reviewed and considered all components of the proposed Conditional Use Permit No. CU-22-16 and Variance No. V-22-3 and concluded its public hearing prior to adoption of this Resolution.
 - (iv) All legal prerequisites to the adoption of this Resolution have occurred.

B. Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BUENA PARK, does hereby finds, determines, and resolves as follows:

Resolution No. Conditional Use Permit No. CU-22-16/Variance No. V-22-3 June 12, 2024

- 1. The Planning Commission hereby specifically finds that all the facts set forth in the Recitals, Part A, of this Resolution are true and correct.
- 2. Based upon substantial evidence presented to the Planning Commission during the above-referenced hearing, including written staff report, verbal testimony, and the Conditional Use Permit No. CU-22-16 and Variance No. 22-3 Development Plans stamped "RECEIVED APR 16 2024 PLANNING DIV.," this Commission hereby specifically finds, determines, and resolves as follows:

Conditional Use Permit

FACT:

FACT:

a. **FINDING:** The proposed use and development is consistent with the General Plan and any applicable specific plans.

The proposed two (2) story auto dealership development with roof parking deck and detached car wash with the repair and/or service of autos and trucks not exceeding 3 tons is a conditionally permitted use within the ACSP (Auto Center Specific Plan) Sub-District A-1, and as conditioned, will meet all applicable requirements of the General Plan and ACSP with requested deviations, and other laws. The proposed development will revitalize a piece of land that has lain vacant and unimproved for several years, and promotes the Auto

Center as an automotive sales corridor. The proposal will comply with site area, lot coverage, building height, floor area, off-street

parking, circulation, landscaping, building materials, and other applicable requirements.

b. **FINDING:** The site is adequate in size, shape, topography, location, utilities and other factors, to accommodate the proposed use.

The site is currently undeveloped and is temporarily being used for storage of vehicle inventory for Simpson Buick GMC. The site is adequate in size, shape, topography, location, and other factors, to accommodate the proposed automobile dealership. Based on the hours of operation, and consistency with nearby dealerships, as conditioned, there will be no conflicts or incompatibility created based on the nature of the proposed use.

c. **FINDING:** Adequate street access and traffic capacity are or will be available to serve the proposed development as well as existing and anticipated development in the surrounding area.

The subject site is located on the southeast corner of Auto Center Drive and Western Avenue, and to the west of the Interstate-5 freeway on-ramp/off-ramp. Western Avenue is considered a Secondary Highway in the City's Mobility Element, within the General Plan. A Secondary Arterial is a four-lane undivided (without a median) roadway, with a typical right-of-way width of 80 feet, and a roadway width from curb-to-curb of 64

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feet. Additionally, the property is served by Auto Center Drive which meets the definition of a Primary Highway in the City's Mobility Element, within the General Plan. A Primary Arterial is a four-lane divided roadway, with a typical right-of-way width of 100 feet and a roadway width curb to curb of 84 feet. As such, adequate street access and traffic capacity are available to serve the proposed auto dealership as well as existing development in the surrounding area.

d. **FINDING**:

Adequate utilities and public services will be available to serve the use as well as existing and anticipated development in the surrounding area.

FACT:

Adequate utilities and public services are available to serve the proposed automobile dealership use as well as existing and anticipated development in the surrounding area. The site is fully served by utilities, and meets the City standards for public services and utilities to serve the site.

e. **FINDING**:

The use and development will be compatible with the intended character of the area.

FACT:

The proposed automobile dealership use will be compatible with the existing auto dealerships and intended character of the area. The proposal, as conditioned, will not create a use inconsistent with the established and anticipated area uses due to required operating conditions and proposed site design.

f. **FINDING:**

Any criteria set forth elsewhere in this Title for the approval of the specific use and development will be satisfied.

FACT:

Pursuant to the ACSP, any associated repair and/or service of autos and trucks requires approval of a Conditional Use Permit. As conditioned, the proposed associated repair will complement the proposed automobile dealership and surrounding area.

g. **FINDING:**

Any adverse effects of the use and development are justified and fully balanced by offsetting benefits to the public interest.

FACT:

Any adverse effects that may come from the proposed automobile dealership with associate repair at this site are justified and fully balanced by offsetting benefits to the public interest in that the primary use of the property will be for auto sales. Additionally, there are conditions of approval that shall be implemented to prevent potentially adverse effects on the general public.

Variance

a. **FINDING**:

There are special circumstances applicable to the subject property such as size, shape, topography, location, or surroundings which result in the strict application of the requirements of this Title depriving the property of privileges enjoyed by other properties in the same zone and vicinity.

FACT:

The existing site conditions including the size, location of existing Caltrans easements, and limited options for siting of buildings are unique to this property. Further, the existing automobile dealerships located within Sub-District A-1 of the ACSP do not have to contend with the oversaturation of easements that prevents the maximum development of their site. The majority of the easements run along the south portion of the site which prevents the building from being situated near the freeway, with several easements running along the west and east portions as well. The combination of these easements restricts the building placement to only be viable near Auto Center Drive. Granting a variance for the reduction in the front setback for the proposed building, and the increase in the height of the block wall within street setback areas are necessary in order for the site to be developed with an automobile dealership containing the required square footage and associated amenities to be consistent with the other dealerships located in the Buena Park Auto Mall.

b. **FINDING**:

The variance will not grant special privileges to the subject property not enjoyed by other properties in the same zone and vicinity.

FACT:

Numerous other auto dealerships in the area were able to fully develop their properties without having to contend with large amounts of easements preventing optimal placement of their structures. Therefore, the request for a variance to deviate from the required street setback for the building and increase in wall height within said setback will not grant special privileges to the subject property not enjoyed by other properties in the same zone and vicinity.

c. **FINDING**:

The variance will not produce results detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare and will not be injurious to other property in the vicinity.

FACT:

Based on the proposed site layout and operating standards, the development of the property as proposed is expected to be in harmony with the other properties in the surrounding area. As such, the reduction in setback and increased height of the wall from what would typically be required, will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare and will not be injurious to other property in the vicinity.

d. **FINDING:** The variance will not be contrary to the objectives of the general

plan, any applicable specific plan, or the intent of this Title.

FACT: The project will implement goals and policies as envisioned in the ACSP by expanding the Auto Center sales corridor and by

revitalizing an unimproved vacant piece of land. Therefore, granting the variance to allow the reduction in the building front setback and an increase in the maximum wall height would not produce results that are contrary to the objectives of the General

Plan, Specific Plan, or the intent of the Municipal Code.

3. The Planning Commission hereby finds and determines that the application, as identified above in this Resolution, is Categorically Exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15332 (In-Fill Development Projects) Class 32 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, because the application: (a) is consistent with the applicable general plan designation and all applicable general plan policies as well as with applicable zoning designation and regulations; (b) occurs within city limits on a project site of no more than five (5) acres substantially surrounded by urban uses; (c) has no value as habitat for endangered, rare or threatened species; (d) approval of the project would not result in any significant effects relating to traffic, noise, air quality, or water quality; and, (e) can be adequately served by all required utilities and public services.

- 4. Based upon the findings and conclusions set forth in paragraphs 1, 2, and 3, above, the Planning Commission hereby approves Conditional Use Permit No. CU-22-16 and Variance No. V-22-3 development plans stamped "RECEIVED APR 16 2024 PLANNING DIV.," as modified herein and the following conditions set forth in paragraph 5 of this Resolution.
- 5. The following conditions are deemed necessary to protect the public health, safety, and general welfare and are reasonable and proper in accordance with the purpose and intent of the Buena Park City Code:

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

- 1. Grading, storm drain, street, sewer, water, and erosion control plans shall be prepared by a registered engineer, at a minimum scale of 1" = 40', and on 24" by 36" sheets. Any proposed improvements shall be designed and constructed per City Standards. Any existing improvements in the public right-of-way, adjacent to project parcel frontage, that are not in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) shall be removed and reconstructed or added to meet the ADA requirements and must comply with City Standards. Separate Street Improvement Plans shall be prepared for proposed street and utility improvements within the public right-of way.
 - a. All vehicular access to the site shall be provided in locations approved by the Traffic Division. An emergency access within the project parcel shall be approved by the Orange County Fire Authority and an approved copy of the plan shall be submitted to the Engineering Division with the submittal of the grading plan.

- b. Traffic Impact fees shall be in accordance with City Resolution 9726 and the latest City Fee Schedule. Sewer, water, and stormwater impact fees shall be per the latest City Fee Schedule.
- c. Planting of turf with irrigation is required within the existing parkway landscaping area along the north side of the project frontage. Landscaping design shall comply with the City's Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (https://ecode360.com/42923406) and with the Guidelines for Implementation of the Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance.
- d. Provide an engineering study for any proposed sewer and water connections to the City system. The study shall be prepared by a registered civil engineer for approval by the City Engineer. Any infrastructure upgrades necessary to meet the sewer capacity, fire code or the domestic water capacity shall be mitigated by developer. Easements shall be dedicated as needed to accommodate a new public water or sewer system. The proposed utility connections shall be made to the City water and sewer systems in accordance with the City Code, standards and applicable Federal, State and County regulations.
- e. A double check detector assembly is required for domestic and fire service connections, and a reduced pressure principle device (RPPD) is required for irrigation service connection per City standards, and devices shall be supplied and installed by contractor. Contractor shall supply and install City approved water meters in the public right-of-way.
- f. A hydrology and/or hydraulics study, prepared by a registered engineer, shall be submitted for approval when drainage is altered and/or there is a net increase of the storm water for the proposed project. The storm drain system shall be designed and constructed for a minimum of a 25-year flood per the County of Orange standards. It shall be privately owned and maintained.
- g. Driveway approaches, sidewalks, curb, and gutter along the project frontage that are lifted, fractured, or failing shall be removed and replaced per City standards.
- h. All existing public facilities in conflict with new improvements shall be relocated at no cost to the City. Property owner shall dedicate, or cause to be dedicated all easements needed to accommodate the relocation, modification or installation of facilities to be maintained by the City or any public utility company.
- i. Water Meter Installation Requirements:
 - I. For 1" or smaller meter sizes, the water meter model shall be Neptune T-10 with Encoder that reads in gallons or City approved equal.
 - II. For 1.5" or larger meter sizes, the water meter model shall be Neptune HPT or Neptune MACH-10 with Encoder that reads in gallons or City approved equal
- A geotechnical study prepared by a registered geotechnical engineer is required. The
 report shall recommend pavement structural section of proposed streets and parking
 lots. A WQMP is required and the report shall test and analyze soil conditions for LID
 (Low Impact Development) requirements, and the implementation of water quality for
 storm water runoff, including potential infiltration alternatives, soil compaction,

- saturation, permeability and ground water levels per the County of Orange Technical Guidance Document.
- 3. Prior to issuance of grading or building permits, permit applicant shall submit for approval, a Water Quality Management Plan (WQMP) specifically identifying Best Management Practices (BMPs) that will be used on site to control pollutant run-offs. This WQMP shall identify the structural and non-structural measures, detailing implementation of BMP's whenever they are applicable to the project. The design criteria and templates are can be found at: https://buenapark.com/city_departments/public_works/engineering_services/water_q uality_management_plans.php
- 4. The proposed project results in a soil disturbance of more than one acre of land. Therefore, prior to the issuance of a grading permit, a copy of the Notice of Intent (NOI) and assigned Waste Discharge Identification (WDID) number from the State Water Resources Control Board shall be submitted to the City. As this project is subject to this requirement, you shall prepare and implement a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP). A copy of the approved SWPPP by the State Water Resources Control Board shall be kept at the project site and be made available for the City upon request. The assigned WDID number must appear on the cover sheet of the grading plan.

PERMIT ISSUANCE

- 5. All fees, deposits, and bonds associated with improvements required by the Public Works Department shall be paid prior to the issuance of permits for construction. The fee amounts are specified in the City Fee Schedule.
- 6. Before exercising any right or performing any obligation pursuant to any permit issued by the Public Works Department, the developer/contractor shall obtain a City Business License and submit required insurance certificates.
- 7. A Transportation Hauling permit shall be obtained to operate or move a vehicle or combination of vehicles or special mobile equipment of a size or weight of vehicle or load exceeding the maximums specified in the California Vehicle Code (CVC) and the Caltrans Transportation Permit Manual.
- 8. Prior to issuance of a grading permit, applicant shall record an approved WQMP that includes the Master Covenant & Agreement and an Operational Maintenance Plan with the Orange County Recorder's office. Two hard copies of the WQMP in 3-ring binders shall be provided to the City.
- 9. Prior to final release of the project by the Public Works Department or the refund of any cash deposits, the developer/contractor shall provide the City with a warranty bond to be held by the City for a period of one (1) year for all public facilities and improvements.
- 10. Prior to the grant of occupancy by the City or commencement for the approved use, all improvements required by the Public Works Department shall be completed.

CONSTRUCTION

- 11. A traffic control plan prepared by a registered engineer shall be submitted for approval for all utility connections, street improvements, and any other work performed in the public right-of-way that require a lane closure. A traffic control plan prepared by a registered engineer shall also be submitted for work on private property that results in lane closures.
- 12. When more than one trench cut is made to install utility lines, then the street shall be either slurry sealed or grind and capped with AC to the nearest lane line of a trench cut from property line to property line. The method of replacing the pavement in kind or better shall be decided based on existing pavement condition.
- 13. An Engineered Grading and Utility Certification shall be certified by the project engineer. Each phase of construction, fill and soil compaction, rough grading including pad elevations, final grading, utilities, and Water Quality Management Plan shall be certified by the project engineer and submitted to the City.
- 14. Applicant shall abandon any existing private water wells per the City and Orange County Health Department requirements.
- 15. Prior to issuance of occupancy, applicant shall demonstrate all structural BMPs have been constructed in conformance with the approved WQMP.
- 16. Any work on State Highway, Beach Boulevard from the I-5 Freeway to north City limit, shall require a Caltrans permit.
- 17. The applicant/contractor shall be responsible for protecting all existing horizontal and vertical survey controls. Any survey controls disturbed during construction shall be reset per Orange County Surveyor Standards after construction.
- 18. All trash collection services needed during construction or after project completion shall be obtained from the City's authorized provider.

ORANGE COUNTY FIRE AUTHORITY

- The applicant or responsible party shall submit the plan(s) listed below to the Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA) for review. Approval shall be obtained on each plan prior to the event specified.
 - a. Prior to OCFA clearance of a final map or issuance of a precise grading permit or a building permit, if the grading permit is not required:
 - i. Submittal of a Fire Master Plan (service code PR145)
 - b. Prior to issuance of a building permit:
 - i. Tanks storing hazardous materials (service codes PR300-PR305), if above ground tank is present

- ii. Hazardous materials compliance and chemical classification (service codes PR315-PR328)
- iii. Fire sprinkler system (service codes PR400-PR465)
- iv. High-piled storage (service code PR330)
- v. Underground piping for private hydrants and fire sprinkler systems (service code PR470-PR475)
- c. Prior to concealing interior construction:
 - i. Sprinkler monitoring system (service code PR500)
- 2. Specific submittal requirements may vary from those listed above depending on actual project conditions identified or present during design development, review, construction, inspection, or occupancy. Portions of the project that are deferred shall be subject to the codes, standards, and other applicable requirements in force on the date that the deferred plan is submitted to OCFA. Standard notes, guidelines, informational bulletins, submittal instructions, and other information related to plans reviewed by the OCFA may be found by visiting ocfa.org on the Planning and Development Section homepage.
- 3. Temporary/Final Occupancy Inspections: Prior to issuance of temporary or final certificate of occupancy, all OCFA inspections shall be completed to the satisfaction of the OCFA inspector and be in substantial compliance with codes and standards applicable to the project and commensurate with the type of occupancy (temporary or final) requested. Inspections shall be scheduled at least five days in advance by calling OCFA Inspection Scheduling at 714-573-6150.
- 4. Traffic Pre-emption Devices. Prior to issuance of a final map, grading permit, or building permit, whichever comes first, the applicant or responsible party shall arrange with the appropriate city, county, or state public works department or agency for installation of traffic pre-emption devices on each traffic signal installed, relocated, or similarly modified as part of this project.
- 5. Lumber-drop Inspection: After installation of required fire access roadways and hydrants, the applicant shall receive clearance from the OCFA prior to bringing combustible building materials on-site. Call OCFA Inspection Scheduling at 714-573-6150 with the Service Request number of the approved fire master plan at least five days in advance to schedule the lumber drop inspection.

BUILDING DIVISION:

- 1. The project shall comply with state and federal disabled access requirements.
- 2. The project shall comply with the California Building Codes as adopted and amended by the City of Buena Park Municipal Code, Title 15.
- 3. The building/buildings shall be fully fire-sprinklered as required by the City of Buena Park Municipal Code, Title 1, and/or the California Building Codes.

- 4. A geotechnical investigation report prepared by a qualified geotechnical engineer is required. The applicant shall submit this report for review and approval prior to the issuance of building permits.
- 5. The construction plans require professional preparation. Submit plans and structural calculations prepared by a California registered engineer or architect.
- 6. After the public hearing appeal period ends, applicant shall submit three (3) sets of construction plans to the Building Division for plan check in order to obtain required building permits.
- 7. New commercial buildings, 10,000 square feet and over, require a completed commissioning plan in accordance with Section 5.410 of the California Green Building Standards Code.

PLANNING DIVISION:

- 1. This approval shall be for the development of a two (2) story automobile dealership with roof parking deck with an attached service garage, a detached 1,320 square-foot carwash tunnel with an 806 square-foot attached canopy, off-street parking, landscaping, screening wall, freestanding sign, and other site improvements located at 6245 Auto Center Drive (APNs: 277-021-02, -03, -04, -05, -06, -07, -08, -10, -13, -15, -16, -17, -18, -19, -20, and -21) in substantial compliance with Conditional Use Permit No. CU-22-16 and Variance No. V-22-3 Development Plans dated "RECEIVED APR 16 2024 PLANNING DIV.," and as conditioned herein.
- The applicant and/or property owner shall ensure that a copy of the Planning Commission Resolution, including all conditions of approval, be reproduced on the first pages of construction drawings and shall be distributed to all design professionals, contractors, and subcontractors participating in the construction phase of the project.
- 3. Plans submitted for plan check shall include architectural amenities generally consistent with the submitted plans stamped "RECEIVED APR 16 2024 PLANNING DIV." All construction drawings submitted for the development shall include sufficient construction details showing architectural accents, colors, details of construction, and techniques to ensure architectural compatibility throughout the development. Final details shall be approved by the Planning Division prior to issuance of building permits for the project. Final color and material samples shall be provided to the Planning Division with plan check submittals. Specifications and samples of the following shall be submitted to the Planning Division for review and approval prior to issuance of building permits:
 - Paint colors for cement plaster: Benjamin Moore Snow White OC-65 and Marina Gray 1599
 - b. Cement plaster exterior finish
 - c. Colors for ACM panel siding: White and grey
 - d. Colors for decorative split face block: White and grey
 - e. Decorative roll up door

Architectural features may be replaced or modified subject to approval of the Community and Economic Development Director based on equivalent provision of acceptable alternatives.

- 4. All mechanic and service work must be conducted fully within a building at all times. Vehicles in the process of being repaired shall be stored in the service vehicle parking area.
- 5. The roll-up door that provides access to the service center shall remain open at all times during normal business operating hours.
- 6. Any new walls, fencing, and gates including those shown on plans shall comply with the City of Buena Park Municipal Code (BPMC) Chapter 19.528 (Development Standards – Fences, Walls, Hedges, and Berms), except as approved through this Variance, and shall require separate fence and wall permit approval by the Planning Division, and other agencies as necessary. All the perimeter walls shall match in color and texture. No block wall construction shall occur until a Grading Plan has been approved by the Public Works Department. Double walls shall be filled and capped to the satisfaction of the City.
- 7. Landscaping shall be installed in substantial compliance with plans dated "RECEIVED APR 16 2024 PLANNING DIV". An electronic version of detailed landscaping / irrigation / sprinkler plans, with signed and stamped Certification of Landscape Design form shall be submitted to the Planning Division for plan check. A "Landscape Installation Certificate of Completion" shall be submitted to the Planning Division prior to issuance of building permits. All landscaping/irrigation/sprinkler plans shall comply with the City of Buena Park Water Efficiency Landscape Ordinance, Title 13, Chapter 13.30 (Water Efficient Landscaping) of the Buena Park Municipal Code.
- 8. The installation of 30-foot tall, Mexican Fan Palm trees within the required front yard landscaped areas along Auto Center Drive shall be required, and a minimum of 24-inch box trees shall be planted within the parking lot area. Additionally the proposed plants/shrubs shall be a minimum size of 5 gallons.
- 9. Drought tolerant climbing vines shall be planted along the full length of the proposed precision block screening wall and shall be maintained at all times.
- 10. All landscaped areas shall be separated from adjacent vehicular areas by a masonry wall or portland cement concrete (p.c.c.) curb a minimum of 6 inches in height, or by p.c.c. or masonry walkway. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that proposed landscaping is consistent with the Water Quality Management Plan.
- 11. The installation of a landscaped parkway along Auto Center Drive shall be in compliance with Public Works Department Condition of Approval, consistent with the plans stamped "RECEIVED APR 16 2024 PLANNING DIV.", and shall be installed and maintained by the property owner.
- 12. Before any building permits are issued, the Final Map (currently Parcel Map No. 2023-114) consolidating the existing sixteen (16) parcels into one parcel, shall be recorded with the Orange County Recorder.

- 13. Decorative lighting to complement the architectural design of the development shall be provided throughout the entire development including the parking area and landscape areas. Final location and design of light standards and wall light fixtures shall be reviewed and approved by the Planning Division prior to issuance of building permits. Standard light poles with box fixtures are not considered decorative.
- 14. Building and site lighting shall be decorative and consistent with the building design. Plans submitted for plan check shall include a complete photometric plan to illustrate the equivalent of one (1) foot candle minimum shall be provided throughout the project site. All luminaries shall be designed, shielded, or aimed in such a manner so as not to produce glare upon adjacent properties and public right-of-ways.
- 15. Parking areas and driveways shall be paved and striped in compliance with BPMC Section 19.536.060 (Parking Dimensions and Layout) and Section 19.536.070 (Parking Improvements), and as shown on the approved plan. All customer and employee parking areas shall be striped with white double lines separating stalls, with minimum 4-inch wide stripes and a minimum 8-inch separation. Installation of speed bumps shall not be permitted within required fire lanes, access drive aisle and driveway of the proposed project. It shall be the responsibility of the developer to submit to the Public Works Department such plans as are necessary to ensure the installation of curbs or walls do not detrimentally affect drainage.
- 16. In all angle-parking stalls (including 90-degree parking) facing the perimeter of a parking area, individual concrete wheelstops or a six-inch high poured-in-place concrete curb shall be provided, located three feet inside the front boundary of the stalls.
- 17. A secure and convenient bicycle rack shall be provided for customers and/or employees. The design of the bicycle storage rack shall be consistent with the design of the building.
- 18. The car wash facility shall only be utilized by the automobile dealership and shall not be open to the general public.
- 19. All required utility services and equipment, including transformers, gas meter, "J" boxes, and similar devices shall be located below grade, to the extent possible, or shall be screened from view by landscaping or ornamental decorative walls. The placement and treatment of all screening devices shall be subject to review and approval of the Planning Division. In addition to said walls, landscaping may also be required as a solution for screening. A preliminary electrical equipment plan, which is prepared by the Southern California Edison Company, shall be reviewed and approved by the City Planning Division prior to the issuance of building permits. The applicant is required to return City approved redline prints to the Southern California Edison Company Planning Department for preparation of final construction drawings. The location of other utility companies' appurtenances and meters shall be submitted to the City Planning Division for review and approval prior to installation.
- 20. All required double check valve assemblies located within public view shall be located below grade to the extent possible or shall be screened from view by landscaping ornamental decorative walls. The placement and treatment of all screening devices shall be subject to review and approval of the Planning Division.

- 21. All rain gutters and downspouts shall be located internal within the building walls.
- 22. All roof-mounted mechanical equipment shall not be visible from adjacent and surrounding properties and streets from a height of five (5) feet above ground level. The installation and screening of air conditioning and similar equipment shall comply with existing design criteria and BPMC Section 19.544.020 (Visual Screening of Mechanical Equipment).
- 23. The proposed trash enclosure shall be incompliance with the Buena Park Municipal Code Section 19.524.010 (Trash Storage Facilities), and will require separate approval for capacity, accessibility, and design by the City's franchise trash hauler. The design, materials, and colors of the trash enclosure shall match the building.
- 24. All landscaping, including trees throughout the development, shall be properly maintained in living condition and any damaged or diseased plant and tree shall be replaced in kind by the property owner.
- 25. All inventory delivery/offloading shall occur on site, and not on any public right-of-way.
- 26. Graffiti shall be removed or painted over to match the color of the surface to which it is applied within 24-hours of its occurrence.
- 27. Prior to the issuance of any sign permit for the proposed auto dealership development, a sign program shall be reviewed and approved by the Planning Commission.
- 28. Signs shall be posted within the parking lot area that prohibit loitering at any time.
- 29. Any appreciable modifications to the approved plans or conditions of approval shall require the approval of the Planning Commission. Minor modifications may be reviewed and approved by the Community and Economic Development Director.
- 30. The construction authorized by the Conditional Use Permit shall be started within one (1) year of the expiration of the appeal period and thereafter diligently advanced until completion of the project.
- 31. This approval may be revoked for any violation of noncompliance with any of these conditions in accordance with BPMC Section 19.132.030 (Revocation).
- 32. Prior to final inspection, these conditions and all improvements shall be completed to the satisfaction of the City.
- 33. The project and/or use authorized by this approval shall at all times comply with all applicable local, state, and federal ordinances, statutes, standards, codes, laws, policies, and regulations.
- 34. The applicant and property owner shall sign a notarized Affidavit of Acceptance of all conditions of approval and return it to the Planning Division within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this approval or prior to the issuance of a building permit or certificate of occupancy, whichever may occur first.

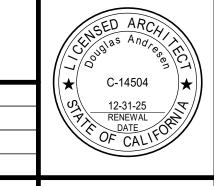

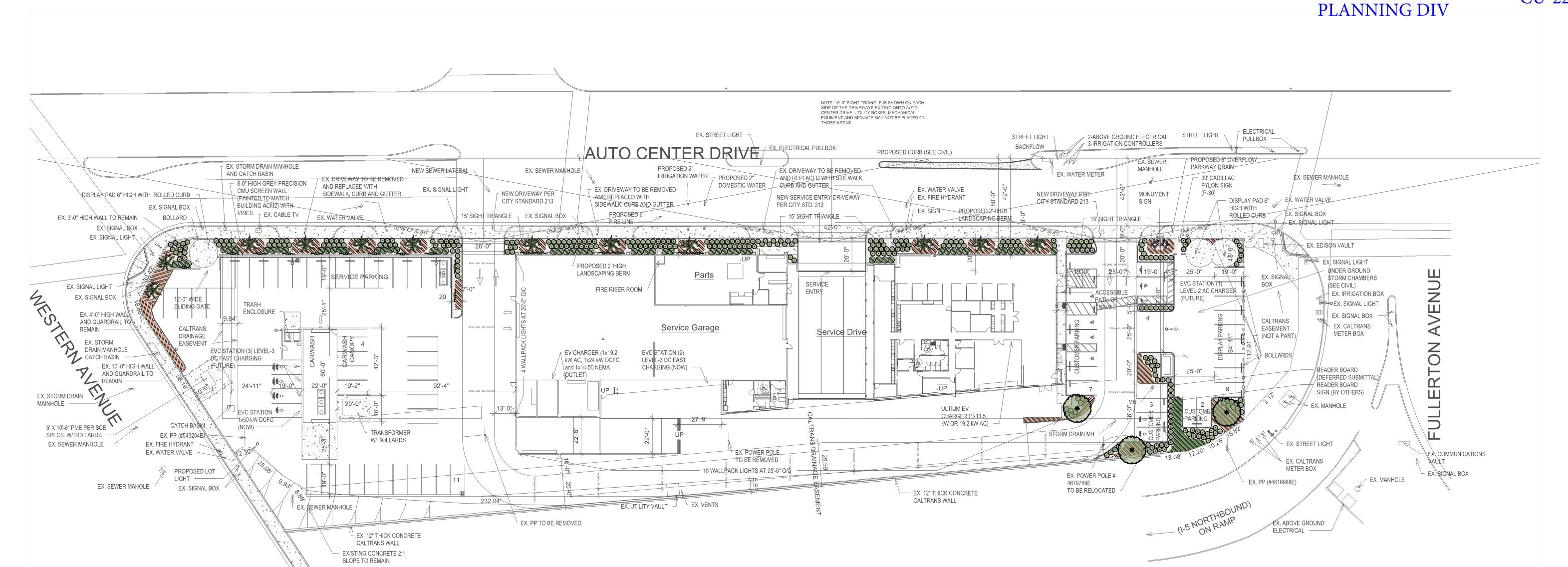

UNACCEPTABLE CONDITIONS FOR ROOT SYSTEMS:
Plants with exposed roots, girdled roots, overgrown or undersized root systems will be considered unacceptable.

Trees are required to stand on their own without the support of the nursery stake. Trees must also be free of disease, infestations, signs of heavy pruning within the canopy, broken primary limbs or leaders, and damage. New trees planted within the project area are to be installed per the detail below. The tree pit is to be excavated to measure 3 x root ball at the finish

with clean native soil only. Trees are to be triple stake as shown on details.

ROOT BARRIER:

Use Lineal Root Barrier when tree is within 5' min. distance adjacent to hardscape areas. Root Barriers shall be installed in sheets parallel with hardscape w/ top edge placed 1" below grade. Root Barrier shall extend the expected length of tree canopy as shown per plan. barriers shall be placed at a slight angle (75°) with base of barrier directed under hardscape &

away from tree.

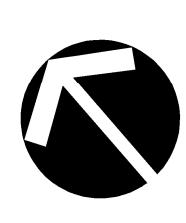

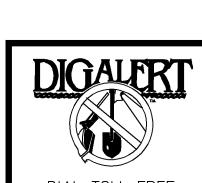

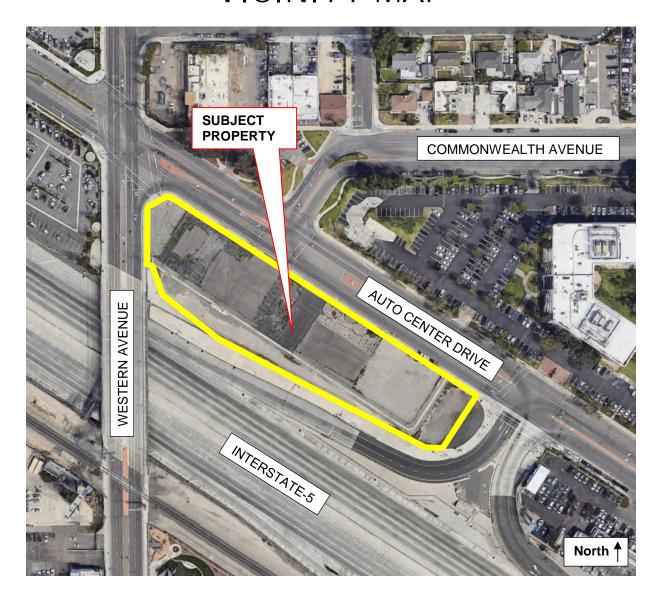
