TATANKA EVENT CENTER Justification: The Native American word for buffalo (specifically the American bison) is often "tatanka" in the Lakota language. While "tatanka" is now commonly used to refer to buffalo in general, it specifically refers to the male bison. The female bison is referred to as "pte" in Lakota. The Cibolo area was home to several Native American tribes, including the Wichita, Karankawa, Caddo, Lipan Apache, Tonkawa, and Comanche. These tribes used the area for hunting, camping, and gathering resources. The Cibolo Creek was a significant resource, used for hunting buffalo and as a campground. Here's a more detailed look at some of the tribes that inhabited the Cibolo area: * Wichita: The Wichita were a group that resided in the northern plains, and they eventually migrated towards the south, settling in the Cibolo area. * Karankawa: The Karankawa were known as a hunter-gatherer group who lived in the coastal areas of Texas, but they also used the Cibolo area for hunting. * Lipan Apache: The Lipan Apache were a nomadic tribe who roamed through the region, including the Cibolo area, for hunting and gathering. * Tonkawa: The Tonkawa were another nomadic tribe who were known to inhabit the Cibolo area. * Comanche: The Comanche were a powerful tribe that moved into the area later, known for their equestrian skills and control of the plains.

Red Ball Center--people have talked for years about the Red Ball Cafe which was right at the location of this center. You can also start a fund to get the building moved over to Main Street and restored.









