Proclamation declaring the City of Cibolo's 60th Anniversary

WHEREAS, October 9, 2025, marks the 60th anniversary of the City of Cibolo; and

WHEREAS, the history of Cibolo begins long before its incorporation, as the area was once home to the Comanche and other tribes, and later to German settlers who arrived in the mid-1800s; and

WHEREAS, the name "Cibolo," meaning "buffalo," reflects the heritage of the region and was inspired by the Cibolo Creek that flows through the area; and

WHEREAS, the development of the Southern Pacific Railroad through present-day Cibolo in 1876 established an important connection to San Antonio, Houston, and beyond, laying the foundation for a thriving farming community; and

WHEREAS, the Old Spanish Trail, a historic transcontinental route, also passed through this area, further linking Cibolo to regional trade and travel; and

WHEREAS, on October 9, 1965, Cibolo residents voted to become an independent township, electing M.O. Grooms as Mayor, along with Carl Biser, Ted Dykes, Alwin Lieck, Fred Niemietz, and D.O. Trotti as the first City Council; and

WHEREAS, since its incorporation, Cibolo has grown from a small agricultural town into a vibrant, diverse community that is part of the San Antonio Northeast Metrocom region, with Randolph Air Force Base nearby serving as a vital presence; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cibolo continues to honor its history while embracing progress, growth, and the shared values that make it a strong and thriving community; and

WHEREAS, since adopting a home rule charter on September 21, 2004, the City of Cibolo has been empowered to chart its own course, guided by the wisdom of its elected officials, the tireless service of its city staff, and the invaluable spirit of community volunteers, all of whom have worked together to build the vibrant city we know today; and

WHEREAS, special activities have been planned to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the City's incorporation; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that we come together as residents, businesses, and community partners to honor the legacy of those who came before us and to celebrate Cibolo's achievements over the past six decades.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mark D. Allen, Mayor of the City of Cibolo, do hereby proclaim the Fiscal Year 2026 (October 1, 2025 – September 30, 2026) as:

Ms. McDaniels representing the Parks Commission brief the Council on the Fun Run scheduled for September 27th at Steele High School. Volunteers are still needed. Mr. Dawson from the Fire Birds Youth Team spoke on using Veterans Park during the week. They are willing to help with the maintenance of the field. They also would like to use the Multi-Event field once a month on Saturday. The following individuals either spoke during the meeting or sent an email on Relentless Soccer and using the Multi-

Event Center field: Ms. Garcia, Ms. Rish, Mr. Kelly, Mr. Adams, Mr. K. Humphrey, Ms. Winney, Mr. Bermudes, Ms. Waddell, Ms. Moore, Mr. Humphrey, and Ms. Vansa. All the individuals spoke on having a place to practice that is safe. How accessible it is for families, especially grandparents and older relatives. They spoke on allowing Relentless Soccer to access the fields on Mondays and Wednesdays for practice. They spoke how grateful they are in the support the city has shown for youth programs in the past. The hope that this partnership could continue. Several of the parents stated that playing on the Relentless Soccer teams has given their child structure, discipline, and a sense of purpose. Mr. Guyett ask if a temporary red light could be placed on Coy Lane, especially during rush hour and school hours. Cars are speeding and it's unsafe for everyone in the area. Ms. Harrison ask council to reconsider the tax increase. She stated that salary increase should be used to recruit additional police and fire. Mr. Benson wrote that council should reject the request for the City Manager to serve on the SCUCISD Bond Planning Committee. BACKGROUND:

The current 5-year lease agreement for multi and large format printers with Documation was signed in December of 2021. Our original lease with Documation was for 10 devices. As the City has grown and new buildings have been added, it has been necessary to add to this lease. Since lease inception, we have added an additional 8 devices for Fire Station 3, City Hall Annex, Public Works, and the Cibolo Community Center. These additions have cause the total annual lease payment and cost of printing overages paid to Documation to exceed the \$50,000.00 City Manager approval threshold.

Current monthly print allowances for black and white images is 25,000 pages and 10,000 for color. This is a combined monthly allowance for all devices. Excess image charges for black and white are \$0.0125 and \$0.07 for color.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of expense for lease payments and print overage charges to Documation, Inc., in the estimated amount of \$75,000.00 for fiscal year 2025.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The lease agreement for all multi and large format print devices is funded through the Information Services departmental budget. Fund expenses were included in the FY25 budget process and FY25 year end budget process.

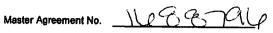

MASTER TERMS & CONDITIONS

- Ownership and Use of System: Owner is the sole owner and title holder to the "System". The "System" shall mean all hardware and software (except as limited by section 10 below) products free and clear of all ilens and claims. Customer agrees that the System and associated products will be used solely for business purposes and not for consumer purposes of personal use and that the Customer's location is a business address.
- 2. Payment: Monthly payments will begin on the Commencement Date (as defined below). The Customer agrees to pay Owner the base payment which includes the minimum base image allowance when due. The Customer also agrees to pay a charge for each image in excess of the image allowance. The base payment and the charge for the overages are as indicated on the first page of this Agreement. If any payment is more than ten days late, the Customer agrees to pay a fee of up to 15% or \$29 (whichever is greater) on the overdue amount, but not to exceed the maximum amount allowed by law. The Customer also agrees to pay \$35 for each check that the bank returns for insufficient funds or any other reason. At the end of the first year of this Agreement, and once each successive twelve-month period thereafter, Owner may increase the base payment and the Diessas Par image charges by an amount not to exceed 5% of the then current payment and charges. The Customer's obligation to pay the base payments and its other obligations hereunder is absolute and unconditional and is not subject to cancellation, reduction, setoff or counterclaim. THIS AGREEMENT IS NON-CANCLABLE.
- 3. Excess Images: Customer will submit true and accurate System mater readings to Owner for the System by the end of the second work day of each billing period in any reasonable manner requested by Owner, including an automated collection system. If Customer fails to submit meter reading, Owner may estimate meters and generate invoicing based upon the estimated meter readings.
- 4. Term and Transition Billing: This Agreement is binding upon Customer on the data Customer signs the Agreement. The Agreement is effective on the date Customer signs the Delivery and Acceptance ("Effective Date"). The term of the Agreement begins on date designated by us after receipt of all required documentation and acceptance by us ("Commencement Date") and continues for the number of months designated as "Term" on the first page of this Agreement. Customer agrees to pay an Interim base payment in the amount of the 1/30 of the monthly base payment, for each day from and including the Effective Date until the day preceding the Commencement Date.
- Upgrade and Downgrade Provision: Owner may review your image volume and, in its discretion, propose options for upgrading or downgrading, not exceeding 20% to accommodate your peeds.
- options for upgrading or downgrading, not exceeding 20%, to accommodate your needs.

 6. Taxes and Fees: This is a net agreement. In addition to rent, the Customer agrees to pay all taxes, fees, and filling costs related to the use of the System, even billied after the end of the Agreement. Owner will file property tax returns and bill the Customer as soon as an involce from the local jurisdiction is received. Owner has the option to estimate any taxes due for the year and bill the Customer monthly in advance on othe basis of that estimate. The Customer agrees that if Owner pays any taxes or charges on the Customer's behalf, Customer will relimburse Owner for all such payments and will pay Owner a fee for collecting and administering any taxes, assessments of fees and remitting them to the appropriate authorities. The Customer will indemnify Owner on an after-tax basis against the loss of any tax benefits anticipated at the Commencement Date arising out of the Customer's acts or omissions. Owner may charge Customer a reasonable fee to cover documentation and investigation costs. Any fee charged under this Agreement may include a profit.
- 7. UCC Filling: The Customer authorizes Owner or its assignee to sign any documents in connection with the Uniform Commercial Code ("UCC") on the Customer's behalf. The Customer authorizes Owner to insert the serial number(s) of the System in this Agreement (including any schedules) and in any fillings. In order to protect our rights in the System, Customer grants the Owner a security interest in the System if this Agreement is deemed a secured transaction and Customer authorizes Owner to record a UCC-1 financing statement or similar instrument, and appoint Owner as its attorney-in-fact to execute and deliver such instrument, in order to show Owner's Interest in the System.
- Collateral Protection, Liability and insurance: The Customer is responsible for any damage to or loss of the System and any losses or injury caused by the System. The Customer promises to keep the System fully insured against loss until the Agreement is paid in full and maintain insurance that protects Owner from liability for any damage or injury caused by the System or its use. The Customer promises to provide Own with evidence of the insurance, showing Owner as the loss payee for the full replacement value of the System and additional insured for public liability and third party property insurance, upon request. If Customer fails to provide such evidence within 30 days after the commencement of this Agreement, O ent of this Agreement, O has the option, but not the obligation to do as provided in either (A) or (B) as follows, as determined Owner's discretion: (A) Owner may secure property loss insurance on the System from a carrier of Owner's choosing in such forms and amounts as Owner deems reasonable to protect Owner's interests. If Owner secures insurance on the System, Customer will not be named as an insured party, Customer's interest may not be fully protected, and Customer will reimburse Owner the premium which may be higher than the premium Customer would pay if Customer obtained insurance, and which may result in a profit to Own through an investment in reinsurance. If Customer is current in all of its obligations under the Agree the time of loss, insurance proceeds received relating to insurance Owner obtains pursuant to this subsection (A) will be applied, at Owner's option, to repair or replace the System, or to pay Owner the remaining payments due or to become due under this Agreen ent, discounted at 2% per an Owner may charge Customer a monthly damage surcharge of up to .0035 of the System cost as a result of Owner's credit risk and administrative and other costs, as would be further described on a letter fr Owner to Customer. We may make a profit on this program. NOTHING IN THIS PROVISION WILL RELIEVE CUSTOMER OF THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR LIABILITY INSURANCE ON THE SYSTEM. Owner may file claims and endorse insurance checks on the Customer's behalf.
- 9. Indemnity: After installation, Owner is not responsible for any losses or injuries caused by the use or possession of the System. Except for claims, losses, or damages caused by Owner's gross negligence or willful misconduct, Customer agrees to indemnity Owner and Owner's assignee, if applicable, against any claims, losses, or damages, including attorney fees, in any way related to the System. This indemnity obligation will continue after the termination of this Agreement if the loss or injury occurred during the term of the Agreement. IN NO EVENT SHALL OWNER BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL OR INDIRECT DAMAGES.
- 10. Maintenance and Care of Owner's System: The Customer agrees to install, use and maintain the System in accordance with DOCUmation specifications and use only those supplies supplied or approved by DOCUmation which meet manufacturer specifications. Customer agrees to maintain the System In good working condition, aligible for manufacturer's certification, normal wear and tear excepted. Maintenance, provided by DOCUmation, is included for the listed System. Maintenance includes, and is simited to parts repair or replacement and associated labor for service required as a result of normal wear and tear. Supplies, excluding throughput stocks and staples are included unless otherwise indicated.

- Work associated with Customer's information technologies not listed on this Agreement, including but not limited to software, computers, data files and network is not covered by the Owner, and is billable to Customer. Owner is not responsible for any damage to Customer's information technology systems. Customer is responsible for all software agreements and Owner is not a party to any such licensing, but will include such software as part of the Agreement. Owner does not own any software and cannot transfer any interest in it to Customer. In accordance with this Agreement, Customer will deliver the System to Owner in good condition and repair, except for normal wear and tear.
- 11. Location of System: The Customer will keep the System at the location specified in this Agreement. The Customer must obtain Owner's written permission to move the System. The Customer will allow Owner or its agents to inspect the System at any reasonable time wherever it is located.
- 12. Assignment: THE CUSTOMER HAS NO RIGHT TO SELL, ENCUMBER, SUBLET OR ASSIGN THE SYSTEM OR THIS AGREEMENT. Owner may sell, transfer or assign this Agreement without notice and if Owner does, the assignee will have the same rights and benefits Owner has and will not have to perform any of "Owner's" obligations. Owner will retain those obligations and Customer agrees that the rights of the assignee will not be subject to any claims, defenses or setoffs the Customer may have against the Owner.
- 13. Waitranty Discialmer: OWNER MAKES NO WARRANTY EXPRESS OR IMPUED INCLUDING THAT THE SYSTEM IS FIT FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR THAT THE SYSTEM IS MERCHANTABLE. OWNER TRANSFERS TO CUSTOMER ANY WRITTEN WARRANTIES MADE BY THE VARIOUS MANUFACTURERS REPRESENTED IN THIS AGREEMENT. CUSTOMER HAS SELECTED THE SUPPLIER AND EACH ITEM OF THE SYSTEM AND ASSOCIATED PRODUCTS BASED UPON ITS OWN JUDGMENT AND DISCLAIMS ANY RELIANCE UPON ANY ORAL STATEMENTS OR REPRESENTATION MADE BY OWNER. CUSTOMER WILL CONTINUE TO MAKE ALL PAYMENTS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT REGARDLESS OF ANY CLAIM OR COMPLAINT AGAINST ANY SUPPLIER, LICENSOR OR MANUFACTURER, AND FAILURE OF A SERVICE PROVIDER TO PROVIDE SERVICES WILL NOT EXCUSE CUSTOMER'S OBLIGATIONS TO OWNER UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.
- Default and Remedies: The Customer will be in default if any of the following occurs: (i) Customer does not pay any amount under this Agreement or other sum due to Owner or any other entity, (ii) Customer breaches any other term of this Agreement or any other agreement with Owner or any material agreement with any other entity, (iii) Customer or any guarantor dies, dissolves or terminates existence; (iv) Custo makes or has made false statements or misrepresentations to Owner; (v) there has been a material adverse change in Customer or any guarantor's financial, business or operating condition; (vi) any guarantor defaults er any guaranty for this Agreement; (vii) Customer or any guarantor becomes insolvent or unable to pay its debts when due; Customer stops doing business as a going concern; Customer merges, consolidates, or transfers all or substantially all of its assets; or (viii) Customer makes an assignment for the benefit of its creditors or voluntarily files or has filed against it an action under any bankruptcy proceedings. If the Customer defaults, Owner can take the following remedies: a) terminate this Agreement; b) require Customer to pay 1) all past due amounts hereunder and 2) all remaining payments for the unexpired term discounted to present value at a 2% discount rate; c) require Customer to return the System at the Customer's expense; or d) exercise any other remedy available at law or equity. Renewal and Return of System: After the Minimum Term, as defined by the Agreement and any written extension thereof, this Agreement will automatically renew on a twelve (12) month basis unless 1) the Customer notifies Owner in writing not less than 90 days prior to the expiration of the Minimum Term or extension of its intention to return the System and 2) the Customer returns the System as provided below. Providing the Customer has given such timely notice, it shall return the System, freight and insurance prepaid, to Owner in good repair condition and working order, ordinary wear and tear excepted, in a manner and to a location designated by Owner. The Customer must pay any additional rents due until the System is received in good working condition by Owner or its agents. Customer is responsible for protecting and removing any confidential data/images stored on the System prior to its return for any reason. Customer may not terminate this Agreement early without Owner's consent.
- 17. Other Rights: The Customer agrees that Owner's delay, or failure to exercise any right's does not prevent Owner from exercising them at a later time. If any part of this Agreement is found to be invalid, then it shall not invalidate any of the other parts and the Agreement shall be modified to the minimum extent as permitted by law. The terms of this Agreement supersedes any related Purchase order.
 18. UCC-2A Provisions: Customer walves any and all rights and remedies granted to Customer under Sections
- 2A-508 through 2A-522 of the UCC and agrees that this Agreement, in the hands of Owner's assignee, is, or shall be treated as, an agreement of the type defined in Section 103(1)(g) of Antide 2A of the UCC.
- 19. Entire Agreement: This Agreement is the complete agreement between DOCUmation and Customer regarding the financing of the System, and replace any prior oral or written communications between us. Neither owner nor the Customer will be bound by any amendment, waiver, or other change unless agreed to in writing and signed by both parties.
- 20. MISCELLANEOUS: Any change in any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement must be in writing and signed by Owner. Customer agrees, however, that Owner is authorized, without notice to Customer, to supply missing information or correct obvious errors in this Agreement. By providing a contact telephone number Customer is consenting to Owner contacting Customer regarding this Agreement. The parties agree that the original hereof for enforcement and perfection purposes, and the sole "record" constituting "chattel paper" inder the UCC, is the paper copy hereof bearing (i) the original or a copy of either your manual signature or an electronically applied indication of your Intent to enter into this Agreement, and (ii) our original manual signature. Within 30 days after Owner's request, Customer will deliver all requested information (including tax returns) which Owner deems reasonably necessary to determine Customer's current financial condition and faithful performance of the terms hereof.

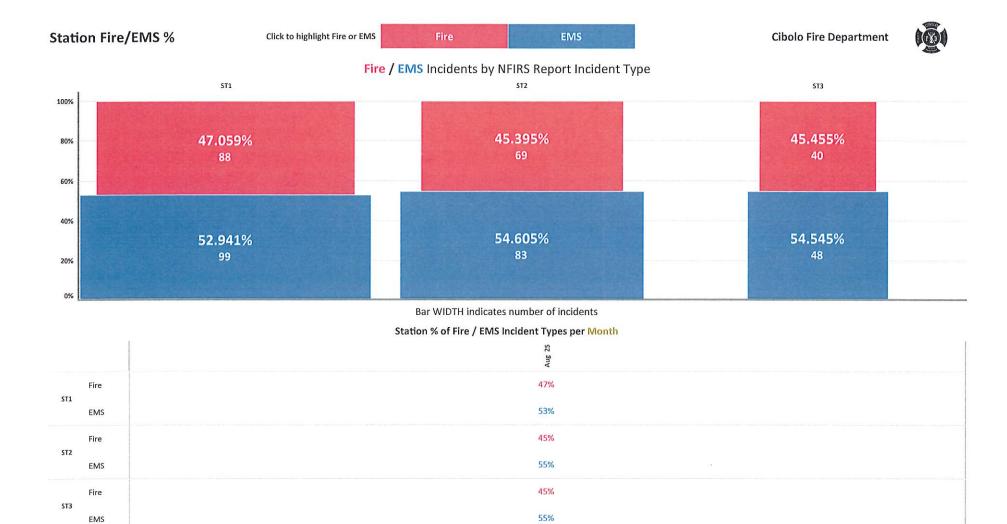






Fire / EMS Incidents by NFIRS Report Incident Type



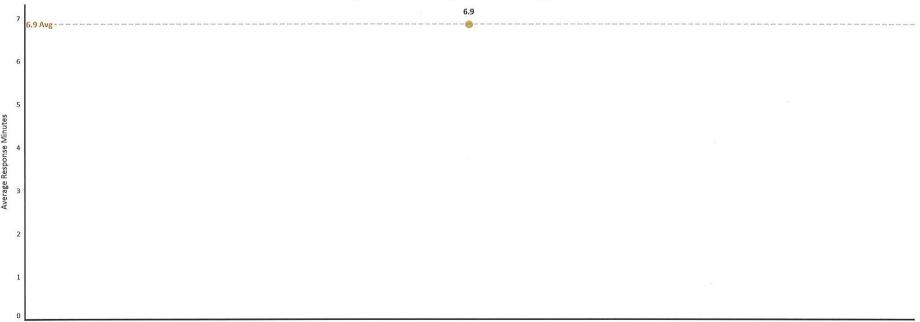

- d. Childcare groups for day care or nursery facilities are prohibited.
- e. Adult entertainment or sexually oriented events are prohibited.
- f. Events or activities causing any unreasonable odors, smoke, dust, gas or vibrations to emanate from the Property or that would constitute a nuisance or would disturb, unreasonably interfere with, or endanger the Property or any other person on the Property
- g. Any activity or event that would void the City's insurance of the Property or increase the insurance risk.
- 7. Alcohol Beverages. Activities which include the serving of alcoholic beverages shall require prior City Approval and compliance with the laws of the State of Texas for the serving, sale, and consumption of alcohol. Responsible Party shall comply with the rules and regulation of the Texas Alcohol Beverage Commission (TABC) including use of TABC certified server(s).

Responsible Party shall be solely responsible for contacting TABC for information regarding applicable rules and regulations for their Activity and for submitting any application and/or payment of fees and costs to obtain a TABC license or permit for the Activities.

If a TABC license or permit is required for the serving of alcoholic beverages for the Activities, then Responsible Party shall provide City a copy of the license or permit to the City at least 48 hours prior to commencement of the Activities.

Responsible Party shall provide proof of liquor liability insurance to the City in the amount of \$1,000,000 naming the City of Cibolo as additionally insured.

Security is required for all events with alcohol service and any other event where the Cibolo Police Department determines that security may be required. The minimum number of security personnel required will be determined by the Cibolo Police Department based on the type of event and number of attendees. Security must be present from the time alcohol service begins until thirty (30) minutes after the event's end time.





- 8. <u>Insurance</u>. Responsible Party must obtain liability insurance for public events and any event with alcohol.
- 9. Waiver and Release. Responsible Party hereby voluntarily signs the Agreement, fully waiving and releasing City, its officers, employees, and representatives from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, suits and causes of action, or potential causes of action, for any compensation or damages by third parties who are invitees or persons from the public related to the Activities conducted by Responsible Party that will take place upon the Property on the dates specified herein above, for liability regarding personal injury, death or property damage that may result for the Property on the dates specified herein. The Responsible Party agrees that this acknowledgement of the Agreement is to be broadly interpreted.

10. Indemnity and Liability.

TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, RESPONSIBLE PARTY AND ANY OFFICER, EMPLOYEE, AGENT, REPRESENTATIVE, AND SUBCONTRACTOR THEREOF, SHALL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS CITY, EACH CITY COUNCIL MEMBER, OFFICER, EMPLOYEE OR AGENT OF EITHER ENTITY (CITY AND ANY SUCH PERSON BEING HEREIN CALLED AN "INDEMNIFIED PARTY"), FOR, FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL LOSSES, CLAIMS, DAMAGES, LIABILITIES, COSTS AND EXPENSES (INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, REASONABLE ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COURT COSTS) TO WHICH ANY SUCH INDEMNIFIED PARTY MAY BECOME SUBJECT, UNDER ANY THEORY OF LIABILITY WHATSOEVER ("CLAIMS"), INSOFAR AS SUCH CLAIMS (OR ACTIONS IN RESPECT THEREOF) RELATE TO, ARISE OUT OF, OR ARE CAUSED BY THE USE OF THE PROPERTY BY RESPONSIBLE PARTY IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THE ACTIVITIES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT. THE AMOUNT AND TYPE OF INSURANCE COVERAGE REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH HEREIN SHALL IN NO WAY BE CONSTRUED AS LIMITING THE SCOPE OF THE INDEMNITY IN THIS SECTION.

City reserves the right to control and manage the Property and to enforce all necessary and proper rules for its management and operation and for its authorized representatives to enter the Property at any time and on any occasion. City also reserves the right, but not the duty, through its duly appointed representatives, to eject any objectionable person(s) from the Property and the Responsible Party waives any claims for damages against City or any of its officers, agents or employees resulting from the exercise of this authority.

- 12. Assignment. Responsible Party shall not assign this Agreement or rent out any part of the Property without prior written consent of City. Any unauthorized assignment shall be cause to cancel and/or terminate this Agreement.
- 13. Cancellation. This Agreement may be cancelled by providing written notice. Cancellation more than two (2) weeks before the reservation date will be refunded in full, minus a \$25 handling fee. Cancellation made less than two (2) weeks prior to the reservation date will not be refunded. City reserves the right to cancel this Agreement if Responsible Party violates any terms of this Agreement.
- 14. In Compliance with Laws and Venue. In connection with its Activities on the Property, Responsible Party agrees to comply with all applicable codes and ordinances of the City of Cibolo and the laws of the State of Texas. Venue of any court action brought directly or indirectly by reason of this Agreement shall be in Guadalupe County, Texas.
- 15. Authority. The undersigned agent is an authorized representative of the Responsible Party with full authority to bind the undersigned to the terms and conditions of this Agreement and has the necessary authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the undersigned party.

PRIOR CITY COUNCIL ACTION:

- March 2016: Executive Order (#2016-0002) signed by the City Manager establishing guidelines for the rental of the Fire Station #2 Training Room.
- May 23, 2023: City Council approved Resolution No. 1645, adopting the Public Meeting Room Policy for the Fire Station #2 Training Room and City Hall Annex Community Room.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Cibolo has historically provided limited public access to meeting spaces. The Fire Station #2 Training Room (capacity 57) and the City Hall Annex Community Room (capacity 46) are the two current facilities governed under Resolution No. 1645. The purpose of the policy has been to outline conditions under which groups and organizations may use City facilities, with priority given to official City business, appointed boards/commissions, and City-sponsored events.

The most frequent outside users of these facilities have been homeowner associations (HOAs) located within the City of Cibolo and the Guadalupe County Elections Office.

With the recent opening of the Cibolo Community Center (capacity to be determined after the renovation is complete), staff is seeking Council direction on updating the Public Meeting Room Policy to expand its applicability. The intent is to maintain consistency across all City-owned community meeting spaces, provide clear guidance to the public, and ensure proper oversight and maintenance of facilities.

The policy does not apply to official City business, public elections, or City-sponsored events, which continue to take priority.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends City Council provide direction on the following questions in order to amend the public meeting room policy and amend the resolution:

- 1. **Availability** Does Council support making the Community Center available to outside organizations after normal business hours?
- 2. Eligible Users What organizations should be eligible to use City facilities?
 - · Local nonprofits and civic organizations located in Cibolo (e.g., HOAs)

- Other governmental entities (County, State, or Federal)
- 3. **Restricted Uses** Should the rooms be prohibited from use by political candidates, parties, or causes, with the exception of voter education on bond or charter elections?
- 4. Rules of Use Does Council support the "Rules Governing Use" as drafted in the proposed policy?
- 5. Reservation Basis Should reservations be handled on a first-come, first-served basis?
- 6. **Hours of Use** Should public access be limited to after normal business hours and closed during City holidays?
- 7. Fees (to be placed in the City's fee schedule) -
 - Should a \$250 refundable deposit be required to ensure cleanup and return of the space in good condition?
 - Should a minimal nonrefundable fee be added?
 - Should exceptions apply for local nonprofits?
 - Should there be a cancellation policy (e.g., no fee if cancelled at least 5 days in advance)?

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The financial impact will be related to staffing resources required for oversight, scheduling, and facility support. Additionally, there will be a revenue stream from deposits and rental fees associated with events held in the Community Center and other public meeting rooms.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CIBOLO, TEXAS:

Section 1. The City of Cibolo City Council has reviewed and hereby approves and adopts the Public Meeting Room Policy for the Training Room at City of Cibolo – Fire Station #2 and City Hall Annex – Community Room.

Section 2. The Public Meeting Room Policy is attached as Exhibit "A" of this Resolution and its terms are incorporated by reference.

Section 2. The Resolution is effective upon its passage by the City Council.

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PUBLIC MEETING ROOM POLICY

I. PURPOSE OF POLICY

The purpose of this policy is to outline the circumstances under which groups, organizations or residents may use the City of Cibolo Public Meeting Rooms and to provide for the Fire Department's Assistant for scheduling and coordinating the use of the public meeting room. Further, it is the intent of this policy to remain easily accessible and give priority for use of these public meeting rooms to the City of Cibolo, appointed Boards, Commissioners, and Committees and other groups and organizations which are directly sponsored by the City or to which the City is a member or to organizations that meet a public purpose for the City.

II. SCOPE:

This policy governs (a) which public meeting room is available for outside use by groups, organizations or residents (b)hours the public meeting room will be available and other policies related to public meeting room use, and (c) fees regarding the reservation and use of public meeting room.

III. POLICY:

This policy provides guidance on use of the designated Training Room at City of Cibolo – Fire Station #2 located at 3864 Cibolo Valley Drive and City Hall Annex – Community Room located at 201 West Loop 539. The public meeting rooms are primarily used to conduct City business, but shall be made available as a community resource to the community and non-profit groups within Cibolo City Limits, governmental agencies, officials and City civic organizations. The Public Meeting Room shall not be used for any political candidates, political parties, political causes, propositions, candidates, or events. The public meeting room may be used for a candidate forum or to provide information on a bond or charter election.

A. ROOMS AVAILABLE FOR USE BY ADAVNCE RESERVATION:

 The following public meeting room may be reserved for the minimum period of time noted:

B. RESERVATIONS PRIORITIES AND LIMITATIONS ON USE:

- Public Meeting Room is available on a first-come, first-serve basis at a specific preapproved time.
- City sponsored programs or meetings take precedence over other groups at all times in 2. scheduling the use of the facility. If available, (a) governmental, and (b) non-profit groups may reserve facilities for civic, cultural or educational programs or meetings.
- All reservations are subject to the City's reserved right to unilaterally cancel a reservation if City operations require use of the reserved room. The City shall incur No liability for such cancellation except the reservation fees, if any, shall be returned.
- No single entity or person may reserve public meeting room more than once a month. 4.

C. RULES GOVERNING USE:

- Meeting room programs must not interfere with City operations or cause a disturbance.
- All meeting and program attendance must comply with public meeting room occupancy 2.
- Any meeting held or information displayed by such organization must be open and available to the general public or be intended, through the various media to provide information to the general public.
- Any meetings and information shall be non-partisan in nature and not for the purpose 4. of candidates seeking appointed or elected positions political in nature.
- Any meetings and information shall be educational in nature and shall avoid advocacy of a particular position in areas of public policy dispute or controversy.
- Any meetings and information shall be non-commercial and not-for-profit in nature. 6.
- Any meetings and information should be reasonable related to public interests of the City of Cibolo and its residents.
- Public meeting room must be cleaned and returned to its original condition. Failure to 8. do so will result in a janitorial fee and possible loss of all or portion of the deposit.
- No smoking inside any City facility or within 15 feet of the entrance to any City building.
- 10. No animals, except service animals are permitted.
- 11. Any and all damage that is caused during the applicant's event, the damage shall be the sole responsibility of the applicant. Depending on the damages, the applicant may lose the entire deposit as well as be held responsible for any costs beyond the deposit.





12. Food:

- Pre-packaged or Pre-cooked Food may be served in any of the reserved meeting rooms. The room must be cleaned and returned to its original condition before leaving. Failure to do so will result in a cleanup fee and possible loss of all or portion of the deposit if the room is not returned to its original condition.
- 13. Alcohol: If an applicant will have alcohol during the rental of the public meeting room, the applicant will be required to notify the City of such use and will be required to retain a peace officer for the duration of the event. If alcohol use is discovered without a peace officer being retained, the City shall immediately terminate the use of the public meeting room and all attendees will be required to leave.

14. Signs:

- The City may post signs in the rooms notifying users of applicable rules and regulations and referring to applicable laws.
- Users may place directional temporary sandwich board signs at the location during the time of which their reservation is effective only.

D. Hours and Days Available for Use:

- Except when otherwise needed for City-related business, rooms are generally available on Mondays through Fridays from 5 PM to 9 PM and on Saturdays and Sundays 8 AM to 9 PM except as follows:
 - New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, Easter Sunday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Juneteenth, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, the Day after Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve and any other day the City is closed, including inclement weather days.
- The City Manager and Fire Chief may authorize modifications to the above dates or times to meet operating needs, allow for special events, holiday observances, weather or other
- 3. The City Manager and Fire Chief may authorize temporary closures of rooms or the entirety of the Facilities for special events, inclement weather, maintenance or repairs, or other purposes as determined by the City Manager and Fire Chief.

E. Fees:

- The fee for use of any public meeting room is \$25.00 that will be due when the application is submitted.
- 2. A refundable \$100 deposit will also be required at the time the application is submitted. Within five (5) business days after the use of the public meeting room, the deposit will be returned upon an approved final inspection by the City.

F. Application:





- In permitting the use of the public meeting room, the City will require the applicant to fill out an application and provide sufficient information which identifies in writing on a City provided form:
 - The sponsor or persons making the request; a.
 - Purpose of the event, program or meeting; b.
 - Anticipated attendance; C.
 - d. Method of advertising the event, if any;
 - e. The day and hours for which the reservation is desired; and
 - Any other information which the City shall find reasonably necessary. f.

G. Cancellations / No-Shows / Refunds:

- The City reserves the right to cancel a reservation as set forth in Section B(3) without any liability, direct or indirect damages.
- Will the City be Charging a Cancellation Fee? (most don't charge a cancellation fee if cancelled at least 5 days in advance. But again, policy decision.)

H. Indemnification and insurance:

By submitting a public meeting room reservation application, the person, persons or organization executing such application agree to hold harmless and indemnify the City for any damages or claims whatsoever related to the use of the room or facility. The City reserves the right to require the person, persons or organization reserving meeting room facilities to provide general liability with the City of Cibolo named as an additional insured, with coverage amounts as deemed necessary by the City Manager.

I. City Discretion to Refuse Entry or Reservation:

The City reserves sole discretion to refuse entry or decline to offer reservations or permit use or occupancy of any meeting room facilities to any person or organization that has: (a) failed to comply with any ordinances, rules, regulations, policy or permit governing use of the meeting rooms and any of its facilities; (b) caused any damage to City property; or (c) abused the meeting room facility reservation system such that it precludes others a fair opportunity to utilize such facilities.

J. Other:

The City Manager and Fire Chief may authorize such other operating and use restrictions deemed necessary to protect meeting and community room and other facilities from damage or misuse.





- The reservations for use of the facility is not transferable to any other organization without City's written consent.
- Parking is not guaranteed. Vehicles are not permitted to park in fire lanes or in any way 3. that restricts the use of emergency equipment.

VI. Exceptions

When deemed in the City's best interest, the City Manager and Fire Chief shall have the authority to authorize waivers, exemptions or exceptions to the policy set forth herein.

V. FUTURE MINOR AMENDMENTS OF POLICY AND ADOPTION OF ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTIVES:

By ratification, the City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to adopt administrative directives consistent with this policy and to adopt updates and minor amendments to this policy not resulting in any decrease to budgetary revenues from operation of the City of Cibolo community and meeting room reservations, which shall become effective without further ratification.

PUBLIC MEETING ROOM POLICY

I. PURPOSE OF POLICY

The purpose of this policy is to outline the circumstances under which groups, organizations or residents may use the City of Cibolo Public Meeting Rooms and to designate the Fire Department's Assistant as the point of contact for scheduling and coordinating the use of the public meeting rooms and the Public Works Department for the Event Center Room as needed. Further, it is the intent of this policy to remain easily accessible and give priority for use of these public meeting rooms to the City of Cibolo, appointed Boards, Commissions, and Committees and other groups and organizations which are directly sponsored by the City or to which the City is a member or to organizations that meet a public purpose for the City.

II. SCOPE:

This policy governs (a) which public meeting room is available for use by groups, organizations, or residents (b) hours public meeting rooms will be available and other policies related to public meeting room use, and (c) fees regarding the reservation and use of public meeting rooms.

III. POLICY:

This policy provides guidance regarding use of the following public meeting rooms:

- Cibolo Fire Station #2 Training Room, located at 3864 Cibolo Valley Drive
- City Hall Annex Community Room, located at 201 West Loop 539
- Event Center Room, located at 203 S. Main Street

The public meeting rooms are primarily used to conduct City business, but shall be made available as a community resource to the community, non-profit groups within Cibolo City Limits, governmental agencies, officials, and City civic organizations, The City of Cibolo, through the City Manager and Fire Department, will consider requests for use of public meeting rooms by persons, organizations, officials, agencies, and groups located outside the Cibolo City Limits on an applicant by applicant basis.





Public meeting rooms shall not be used for any political candidates, political parties, political causes, propositions, candidates, or events. Public meeting rooms may be used for a candidate forum or to provide information on a bond or charter election.

A. ROOMS AVAILABLE FOR USE BY ADVANCE RESERVATION:

The following public meeting rooms may be reserved for the minimum period of time noted:

TABLE 1 Public Meeting Rooms Available for Use / Rent	
Cibolo Fire Station #2 Training Room [Occupancy 56]	4 Hour Minimum
City Hall Annex – Community Room [Occupancy 46]	4 Hour Minimum
Event Center Room [Occupancy 193]	4 Hour Minimum

B. RESERVATIONS, PRIORITIES, AND LIMITATIONS ON USE:

- Public meeting rooms are available on a first-come, first-serve basis at specific pre-approved times.
- City sponsored programs or meetings take precedence over other groups at all times in scheduling the use of facilities. If available, (a) governmental, and (b) non-profit groups may reserve facilities for civic, cultural, or educational programs or meetings.
- 3. All reservations are subject to the City's reserved right to unilaterally cancel a reservation. The City shall incur No liability for such cancellation except the reservation fees, if any, shall be returned.





C. RULES GOVERNING USE:

In addition the following rules governing use of these public meeting rooms, an applicant must complete and submit a rental agreement prior to rental of the Event Center Room:

- Meeting room programs must not interfere with City operations or cause a disturbance.
- 2. All meeting and program attendance must comply with public meeting room occupancy limits.
- Any meeting held or information displayed that is related to the meeting must be open and available to the general public or be intended, through the various media, to provide information to the general public about the meeting or program.
- Meetings and information shall be non-partisan in nature and not for the purpose of candidates seeking appointed or elected positions political in nature.
- Meetings and information shall be educational in nature and shall avoid advocacy of a particular position in areas of public policy dispute or controversy.
- Meetings and information shall be non-commercial and not-for-profit in nature.
- 7. Meetings and information should be reasonably related to the public interests of the City of Cibolo and its residents.
- Public meeting rooms must be cleaned and returned to original condition. Failure to do so will result in a janitorial fee and possible loss of all or portion of the deposit.
- No smoking, vaping, or use of tobacco products is allowed inside or outside any City facility per City ordinance.
- 10. No animals, except service animals are permitted.
- 11. Any and all damage that is caused during the applicant's meeting, program, or event shall be the sole responsibility of the applicant to repair, replace, and return to original condition. Depending on the damages, the applicant may lose the entire deposit as well as be held responsible for any costs beyond the deposit.

12. Food:

Pre-packaged or Pre-cooked Food may be served in any of the reserved meeting rooms. The room must be cleaned and returned to its original condition before leaving. Failure to do so will result in a cleanup fee and possible loss of all or portion of the deposit if the room is not returned to its original condition.





- 13. Alcohol: If an applicant will have alcohol during the rental of the public meeting room, the applicant will be required to notify the City of such use and will be required to retain an off-duty Cibolo peace officer, or in the alternative if or when a Cibolo officer is not available, another Texas licensed peace officer, subject to approval by Cibolo Police Department, for the duration of the event. If alcohol use is discovered without a peace officer being retained and present, the City shall immediately terminate the use of the public meeting room and all attendees will be required to leave.
- 14. Peace Officers may be required to be present at an event at the discretion and advice of the Cibolo Police Department, such determination to be made before approval of a request to reserve a public meeting room.

15. Signs:

- The City may post signs in the rooms notifying users of applicable rules and regulations and referring to applicable laws.
- b. Users may place directional temporary sandwich board signs at the location during the time of which their reservation is effective only.

D. Hours and Days Available for Use:

- Except when otherwise needed for City-related business, public meeting rooms are generally available on Mondays through Fridays from 5 PM to 9 PM and on Saturdays and Sundays 8 AM to 9 PM except as follows:
 - All official City of Cibolo holidays, as approved annually by City Council, including but not limited to ew Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Presidents Day, Easter Sunday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Juneteenth, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, the Day after Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve and any other day the City is closed, including inclement weather days.
- The City Manager and Fire Chief may authorize modifications to the above dates or times to meet operating needs, allow for special events, holiday observances, weather or other reasons.
- The City Manager and Fire Chief may authorize temporary closures of rooms or the entirety of the Facilities for special events, inclement weather, maintenance or repairs, or other purposes as determined by the City Manager and Fire Chief.

E. Fees:

- The fee for use of any public meeting room is provided in the official City of Cibolo 1. Fee Schedule and such fee will be due when the application for reservation is submitted.
- 2. A refundable \$200 deposit will be required at the time the application for reservation is submitted. Within five (5) business days after the use of the public meeting room, the deposit will be returned upon an approved final inspection by the City. If the use of the room requires additional staff time, the City shall deduct the cost for staff from the deposit.
- 3. Holiday Use Fee. Use of a public meeting room on an observed City holiday (See Section D.1.a) shall require an additional Holiday Use Fee of
- Janitorial fee (See Section C.8) if required, shall include a flat fee of \$50, along with a minimum of the present hourly rate as determined and used by the City of Cibolo, for payment of janitorial employees.
- 5. Cleanup fee (See Section C.12) if required, shall include a flat fee of \$50, along with a minimum of the present hourly rate as determined and used by the City of Cibolo, for payment of janitorial employees.

F. Application:

- In permitting the use of the public meeting room, the City will require the applicant to fill out an application and provide sufficient information which identifies in writing on a City provided form:
 - The sponsor or persons making the request;
 - b. Purpose of the event, program or meeting;
 - c. Anticipated attendance;
 - d. Method of advertising the event, if any;
 - The day and hours for which the reservation is desired; and
 - f. Any other information which the City shall find reasonably necessary.

G. Cancellations / No-Shows / Refunds:

- The City reserves the right to cancel a reservation as set forth in Section B(3) without any liability, direct or indirect damages.
- 2. The City will charge a \$25 cancellation fee if notice of cancellation is not provided to the Fire Department's Assistant at least 3 days in advance of the reserved date.





H. Indemnification and insurance:

1. By submitting a public meeting room reservation application, the person, persons or organization executing such application agree to hold harmless and indemnify the City for any damages or claims whatsoever related to the use of the room or facility. The City reserves the right to require the person, persons or organization reserving a public meeting room to provide general liability insurance with the City of Cibolo named as an additional insured, with coverage amounts as deemed necessary by the City Manager. Insurance coverage shall be required by any person, persons, or organization requesting approval of an application to reserve a public meeting room for a meeting, program, or event that will include the availability of alcohol.

I. City Discretion to Refuse Entry or Reservation:

The City reserves sole discretion to refuse entry or decline to offer reservations
or permit use or occupancy of any meeting room facilities to any person or
organization that has: (a) failed to comply with any ordinances, rules, regulations,
policy or permit governing use of the meeting rooms and any of its facilities; (b)
caused any damage to City property; or (c) abused the meeting room facility
reservation system such that it precludes others a fair opportunity to utilize such
facilities.

J. Other:

- The City Manager and Fire Chief may authorize such other operating and use restrictions deemed necessary to protect meeting and community room and other facilities from damage or misuse.
- 2. The reservations for use of the facility is not transferable to any other organization without City's written consent.
- 3. Parking is not guaranteed. Vehicles are not permitted to park in fire lanes or in any way that restricts the use of emergency equipment.

When deemed in the City's best interest, the City Manager and Fire Chief shall have the authority to authorize waivers, exemptions or exceptions to the policy set forth herein.

BACKGROUND:

The Drainage Division of Public Works is responsible for maintaining over 450 acres of drainage channels, easements, ditches, and open spaces throughout the City. Maintenance operations are structured into four zones, with the full cycle taking approximately six weeks to complete. Highly visible areas are maintained on a two-week schedule to ensure community safety and aesthetics.

City Council has supported drainage operations by approving over \$280,000 in equipment upgrades in FY24 and FY25. Looking forward, the Division plans to purchase an additional sweeper in FY26 to expand street sweeping responsibilities.

Not all drainage properties are maintained by the City. In addition to City-maintained property, there are over 375 acres of HOA-maintained open spaces across Cibolo. For example, Saddle Creek Ranch 2A, 7.72 acres designated as park and drainage ROW, is owned by the Saddle Creek Ranch Homeowners Association (SCR HOA) and maintained through their management company.

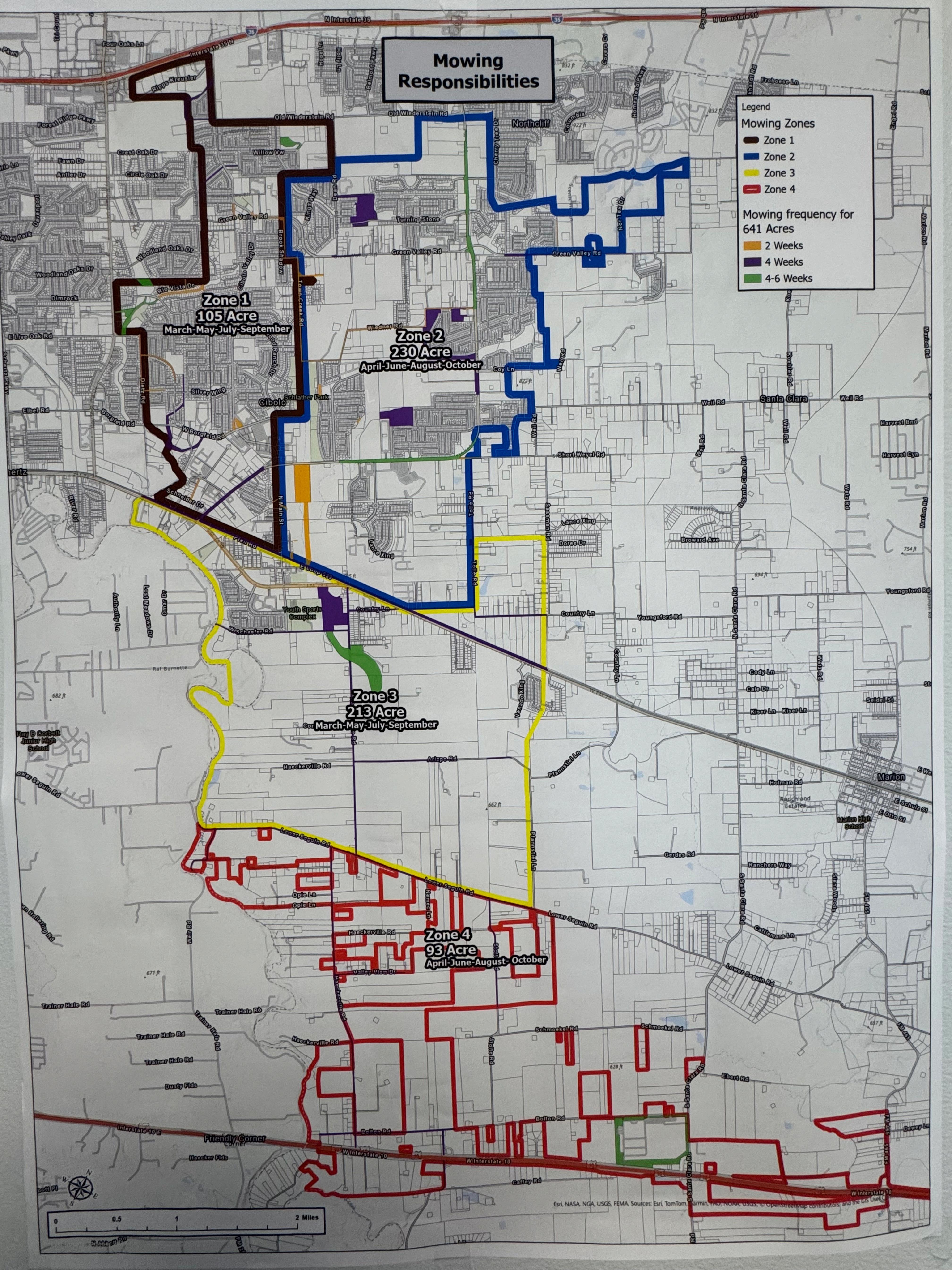
The Saddle Creek Ranch HOA has expressed that they lack the funds to properly maintain this property and are facing a financial hardship. At City Council's request, staff has prepared an estimate for one-time maintenance of this parcel. The Drainage Division currently does not have the capacity to take on additional acreage during normal operation hours, and this work would therefore need to be performed on overtime as a special project.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

If approved, the cost associated with this special project would be funded initially from the Drainage Fund. The City would then recoup the full amount through payment from the Saddle Creek Ranch HOA to the City of Cibolo.

<u>City of Cibolo Drainage Maintenance Map</u> <u>CC Present - Drainage Division Final 2025-09-23</u>





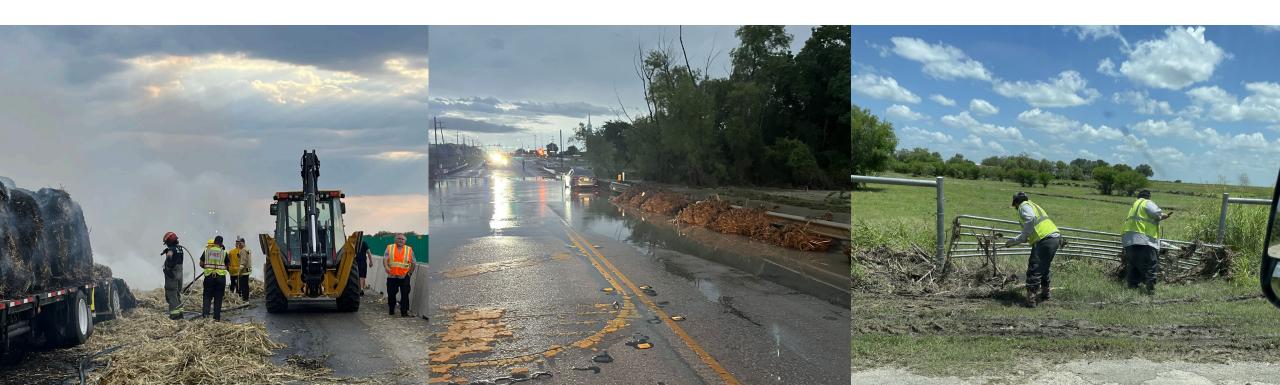

Drainage Division Summary

- Existing staffing levels for Mowing, Clearing, and Maintenance in Public Works means that the rotation of recurring assignments requires staff to maximize their work schedule to maintain the more than 450 acres of drainage channels, easements, ditches & open spaces as well as conduct storm drainage clearing, infrastructure repairs, and SeeClickFix service requests.
- Staff must remain available to respond to inclement weather events, flooding, and emergency situations.

- 1 Sweeper Operator
- 4-Man Maintenance Crew
 - Vector Control once a month

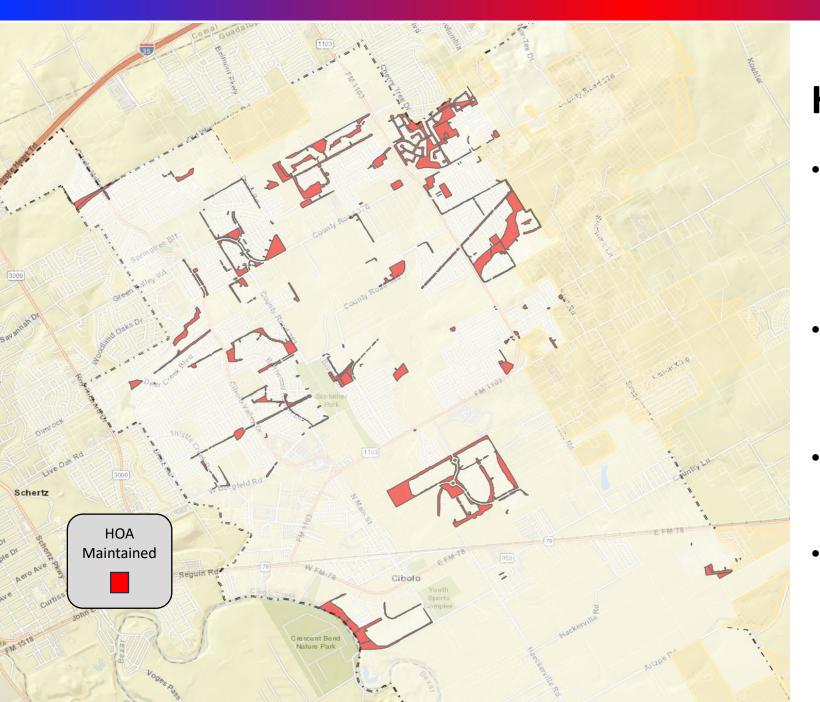

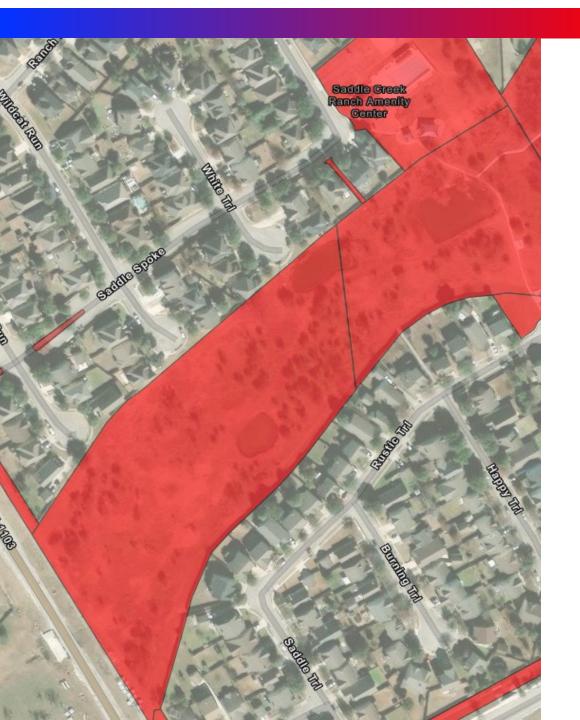

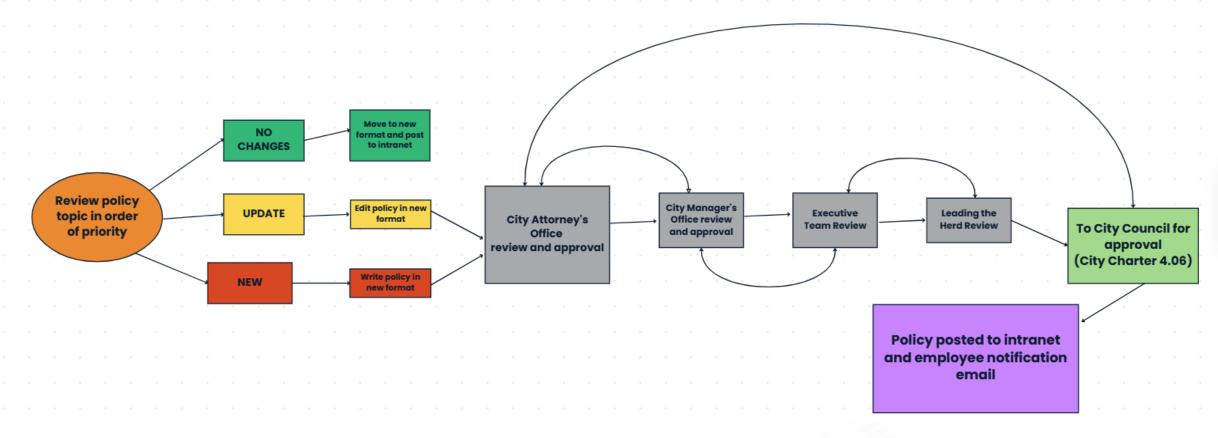
Proposed Process for FY25 Review

Development of Employee Handbook

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

The development, publication, and distribution of staff policies and procedures for the City of Cibolo shall be in accordance with this policy.

- 1. Staff policies and procedures included in the Employee Handbook shall be approved and signed by the City Manager and reviewed and approved by the City of Cibolo City Council to become effective and shall be published.
- 2. After a policy has been approved and signed by the City Manager and approved by the City Council, the People and Performance Department will publish the policy to the Employee Handbook located on the intranet.
- 3. Every employee shall have access to the current Employee Handbook through the Employee Intranet. It is an employee's responsibility to be knowledgeable of policies and procedures located in the Employee Handbook. Being unaware of any human resources policy or procedure is not a defense for a rule violation or grounds for a grievance.
- 4. Policies and procedures will be reviewed and potentially updated as necessary at a minimum every two years. Updated policies, once approved by City Council, will be published to the intranet.
- 5. An entry will be made into the Revisions Tracking document of the Employee Handbook noting the policy number and the date of the revision.

Because of the need to accommodate changes at the City and at the state and federal level, the City Manager reserves the right to update policy and procedures at any time and these policies are subject to change with Council approval. Nothing in this Employee Handbook constitutes the terms of an employment agreement, express or implied. Employees at City of Cibolo are hired on an employment-at-will basis.

Americans With Disabilities Act

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

The City of Cibolo complies with the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act, as amended (ADA). The employment status of such employees shall be determined in a consistent and fair manner without regard to race, color, religion, sex/gender, national origin, age, disability, or genetic information (collectively "protected class"). The City shall not discriminate against a qualified individual due to the individual's disability in regard to recruitment, recruitment advertising, selection, placement, layoff or termination, promotion, demotion, transfer, training, participation in programs, compensation, or other terms and conditions of employment or subject an individual with a disability to retaliation for opposing employment discrimination due to a disability or testifying or assisting in an investigation of such a claim.

The City also shall not discriminate against any person due to the person's association with an individual who is protected by the ADA. The City will consider requests for reasonable accommodations from applicants during the hiring decision process, the interview process, and as part of the offer of employment. Applicants with a disability should request a reasonable accommodation when they know that there is a workplace barrier that is or will prevent them, due to a disability, from effectively competing for a position, performing a job, or gaining equal access to a benefit of employment.

Current employees who are seeking an accommodation request should complete the Accommodation Request Form (Appendix XX). Both the City and an employee making a reasonable accommodation request are expected to participate in an interactive process so that the City can reach a decision on an reasonable accommodation or on a specific request. The City will reasonably accommodate the request of an employee unless the accommodation requested will pose an undue hardship on the City's operations.

It is the employee's responsibility to notify the Director of People and Performance using the Accommodation Request Form that accommodation is required to perform the essential functions of the job because of a disability or to gain access to a benefit of employment.

Once notified of a request, the City reserves the right to work closely with the employee's health care provider using the Americans with Disabilities Act Employee Accommodation Medical Certificate Form (Appendix XX) to receive additional information to assist with making a decision regarding reasonable accommodation.

After paperwork has been received and deemed ready for processing, the City will act expeditiously to schedule an interactive meeting to consider the reasonable accommodation and/or discuss other options that may accommodate the employee. Employees have the right to appeal a decision made through the interactive process using the Employee Form to Appeal Accommodation Determination (Appendix XX) if they do not agree with the City's decision.

If an employee terminates employment with the City before a decision has been made, the request for the accommodation shall be closed with no further action. Additionally, if an employee refuses all reasonable accommodation options offered, the request shall be closed without further action.

Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the Director's authority to terminate an employee at will.

This Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards is intended to promote honest, ethical, and responsible conduct by all employees at City of Cibolo. It establishes standards for professional behavior, accountability, and respect for the public trust inherent in local government service.

Employees must conduct themselves in an ethical, professional, cooperative, and courteous manner while working or representing the City of Cibolo. Employees must conduct themselves to give no occasion for distrust of their integrity, impartiality, or objectivity to the best interests of the City and the City's vision, departments' missions, and the City's core values. Employees should also maintain work areas so that they are suitable for receiving guests. Employees are expected to do their assigned work and to follow the project procedures provided by their supervisor.

The Director of People and Performance serves as the designated Ethics Officer in coordination with the City Attorney's Office. Employees are expected to bring forward any concerns or suspected ethical misconduct directly to the Ethics Officer, who will handle such matters with confidentiality, professionalism, and impartiality. The Ethics Officer will be primarily responsible for responding to non-compliance and taking appropriate action to prevent future violations of this policy. Employees have a duty to report suspected violations of this policy or other unethical conduct. All ethics-related concerns or potential violations must be reported to the Ethics Officer. In the event the ethics complaint is about any employee of the People and Performance Department, the employee shall bring the complaint to the Executive Director.

The Finance Department is responsible for oversight of financial reports and establishing and maintaining an adequate internal control structure with appropriate checks and balances. The Finance Department responds to any suspicions of fraud and investigates appropriately in coordination with the City Attorney's Office. Employees responsible for purchasing on behalf of the City are responsible for communicating to individuals and companies doing business with the City that they must abide by applicable federal, state, and local laws, as well as the City's Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards.

Reports of any ethical concern may be made confidentially and without fear of retaliation.

Prohibition of Gifts

Employees shall not solicit, accept, or receive any gift, gratuity, favor, service, entertainment, loan, or any other item of monetary value from any individual, organization, or business entity that:

- Has or is seeking to obtain business with the City of Cibolo;
- Has interests that may be substantially affected by the employee's official duties;
- Is attempting to influence decisions or actions by the employee in the performance of their duties.

Gifts of nominal value (e.g., promotional items under \$50) may be accepted only if they do not influence, or appear to influence, the employee's judgment or actions.

Personal Financial Interest

Employees shall also not:

- Use their position to obtain financial gain or special treatment for themselves, a family member, or any business with which they are associated;
- Have a financial interest in any contract, purchase, or sale to which the City is a party, unless fully disclosed and managed in accordance with applicable laws and policies.

Employees must disclose any potential or actual financial interest that may conflict with their municipal duties to the Ethics Officer (Director of People and Performance) immediately. The Ethics Officer will immediately notify the Finance Director so that the incident(s) may be investigated.

Conflict of Interest

Employees must avoid actual, potential, or perceived conflicts of interest between their personal interests and their duties as public servants. A conflict of interest arises when an employee's personal, financial, or familial interests may compromise or appear to compromise their objectivity, integrity, or independence in performing their job responsibilities.

Employees shall:

- Not engage in outside employment or business activities that interfere with their municipal duties or create a conflict;
- Not participate in municipal decisions or influence outcomes where they, a family member, or an associate have a direct or indirect financial interest;
- Not use their position, City resources, or confidential information for personal gain or for the benefit of others.

All actual or potential conflicts must be disclosed to the Ethics Officer (Director of People and Performance) as soon as they are identified. The Ethics Officer will review the circumstances and determine appropriate action, which may include recusal, reassignment, or further investigation.

Failure to disclose a conflict may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

Confidentiality

Employees of the City shall not disclose information that could adversely affect the property, government, or affairs of the city; nor directly or indirectly use any information gained solely by reason of their official position or employment for their own personal gain or benefit or for the private interest of others.

Use of City Property

City of Cibolo property, equipment, tools, vehicles, facilities, technology, and supplies are provided for official use in conducting City business. Employees are prohibited from using government property for personal purposes, except as explicitly authorized by policy.

Examples of prohibited use include, but are not limited to:

- Personal errands using a City vehicle or equipment;
- Non-work-related use of City computers, printers, or communication systems. The City
 does allow for de minimus use so long as such use does not distract the employee's work
 or work product;
- Unauthorized removal of City property from City premises;
- Using City-owned electrical outlets or charging infrastructure to charge personal or non-City-owned electric vehicles (EVs) at any City facility or property.

Employees are responsible for the care, security, and proper use of government property assigned to or used by them. Misuse or abuse of municipal property may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

Violations of this Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment. The severity of the discipline will depend on the nature and seriousness of the violation, in accordance with applicable personnel policies and procedures. An employee who violates any applicable federal or state law or rule, or city ordinance, may be subject to civil or criminal penalties in addition to any disciplinary action.

Drug-and Alcohol-Free Workplace

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

The purpose of this policy is to establish and maintain a safe, healthy, and productive work environment for all employees, consistent with our responsibilities as a public employer. In compliance with the Drug-Free Workplace Act and applicable state laws, the City strictly prohibits the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of controlled substances or alcohol in the workplace. The City is committed to providing a workplace that is free from the effects of drug and alcohol abuse. Employees are expected to report to work fit for duty and free from the influence of drugs or alcohol. Substance abuse poses serious safety and health risks to the individual employee, co-workers, and the public.

Prohibited Conduct

Employees are strictly prohibited from engaging in the following activities while on duty, on City property, operating City vehicles or equipment, or representing the City in any capacity:

- Possessing, using, selling, purchasing, distributing, or manufacturing illegal drugs or controlled substances;
- Being under the influence of alcohol, illegal drugs, or misused prescription medication;
- Reporting to work or being on duty while impaired by alcohol or drugs;
- Using prescription or over-the-counter medications in a way that impairs the ability to perform job duties safely and effectively;
- The use of alcohol while on duty and for a sufficient time prior to the performance of duty so that none of the effects of the use of alcohol remain during job performance; and/or
- The misuse of substances and materials available in the workplace that may result in physical or mental impairment.

Employees who are taking legally prescribed or over-the-counter medications that may affect their ability to perform their job safely or effectively must inform their supervisor or the People and Performance Department. Confidentiality will be maintained in accordance with applicable laws.

Mandatory Drug Testing

Mandatory drug testing is required for City employees, as follows:

- Pre-Employment Testing
- Random Testing
 - O All employees in Safety-Sensitive positions are subject to controlled substance and alcohol testing on a random basis. The Department Head or their designee is responsible for scheduling random tests so that Safety-Sensitive employees will have an equal chance of being selected each time a random selection is made.

A position is considered Safety-Sensitive when the risk to Public Safety is substantial and real and where the risk of injury from a momentary lapse of attention can result in disastrous consequences. The following employees are considered in Safety-Sensitive Positions, and may be subject to different physical fitness and drug screening requirements:

- a. Any employee whose duties require driving a vehicle that weighs more than 26,000 pounds and/or requires a commercial driver license (CDL); and/or
- b. a commissioned peace officer who must be armed and whose duties include interdiction of drugs; and/or a commissioned firefighter who must drive the fire engines.
- Post-Accident Testing
 - An employee is required to submit to a controlled substance test after an accident at a testing facility authorized by the City. An "accident" is defined as:
 - 1. An event resulting in a fatality;
 - 2. Any event resulting in an injury to any person requiring treatment beyond first aid (except for injuries incurred from law enforcement use of force);
 - 3. Any unintended event resulting in any damage to another party's property (non-City of Cibolo property); or
 - 4. A City employee operating a City vehicle/trailer/equipment which involves any one of the following:
 - a. Property damage to a vehicle/trailer/equipment rendering it inoperable so that it needs to be towed or hauled away on a trailer;
 - b. property damage estimated to be equal to or greater than \$1,000; or
 - c. a violation of federal or state law, city ordinance, or city policy or procedure.
- Return-to-duty and follow-up testing, after a violation of this policy or as part of a rehabilitation program.

Accidents involving injuries shall require employees involved in the accident to take an alcohol concentration test. Employees who are seriously injured and unable to provide a specimen at the time of the accident, or who are otherwise unable to comply with controlled substance and alcohol concentration testing, shall provide the necessary authorization for the organization to obtain medical records, law enforcement reports, and other documents that may indicate the presence of controlled substances or alcohol concentration.

Removal from Duty

Employees shall be placed on Administrative Leave and/or placed on modified duty (to eliminate operation of heavy machinery and/or vehicles) and/or not be allowed to remain on duty in a Safety-Sensitive position if that employee is found to use, manufacture, distribute, procure, sell, dispense, or possess illegal drugs, is found to use alcohol when its effects will remain during job performance, or has failed to comply with these policies.

Return to Duty

If an employee's test results are found to be negative (the tested substances are found to be in the sample in a quantity less than the cut-off level as recommended by Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration), the employee shall return to duty in their usual capacity in the Safety-Sensitive position when it is determined that this action would not pose a danger to public health or safety.

Testing Based on Reasonable Suspicion

A controlled substance test and/or an alcohol concentration test may be required for any City employee if there is reasonable cause to believe an employee is under the influence of drugs or alcohol. "Reasonable Suspicion" exists when an employee exhibits behavior which suggests impairment from drug or alcohol use or when job performance or safety is affected.

Supervisors and above shall place their observations and any other supporting documents for their reasonable cause in writing and provide it to the Director of People and Performance. The Director of People and Performance will coordinate with Department Directors or their designees to refer employees to an authorized testing facility.

Refusal to Test

Employees who refuse to submit to drug and alcohol testing will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination. A refusal by an employee to submit to a controlled substance and/or alcohol test includes any of the following:

- 1. refusal to take the test:
- 2. inability to provide sufficient quantities of breath or urine to be tested without a valid medical explanation;
- 3. tampering with or attempting to adulterate the specimen or collection procedure;
- 4. not reporting to the collection site in the time allotted; or
- 5. leaving the scene of an accident without a valid reason before being taken to the testing facility to have testing conducted.

Testing Facilities

If an employee is required to submit to drug and alcohol testing, testing will occur at a facility authorized by the City. Departments should contact the People and Performance Department for a list of current testing facilities. Whenever available, the City will accept the results from drug and alcohol tests conducted by law enforcement officers pursuant to the Texas Penal Code and Texas Code of Criminal Procedures.

Arrest and Conviction

Any employee arrested by law enforcement in regard to a violation of a criminal statue relating to illegal drugs or alcohol shall notify the Director of People and Performance no later than two business days after the arrest. The Director of People and Performance will review the information provided by the employee and will work closely with the Department Director to ensure any risks to the City are mitigated. If an employee is convicted of the offense, the employee is subject to termination of their employment.

Outside Agencies

Positive drug and alcohol testing may be reported to outside agencies and licensing authorities as required by law.

Employee Assistance

The City encourages employees who may be struggling with substance abuse to voluntarily seek help. The City may provide procedural referrals to counseling, treatment, or rehabilitation programs. Voluntary disclosure and participation in a rehabilitation program will be handled confidentially and, when possible, without disciplinary action, provided that the disclosure occurs before any policy violation or incident occurs and not in conjunction with the City's drug testing processes.

Disciplinary Action

Violation of this policy may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment. Refusal to submit to required drug or alcohol testing, tampering with a test, or testing positive may also result in discipline.

Employee Responsibilities

Employees are responsible for:

- Complying with this policy at all times;
- Notifying their supervisor or an employee of the People and Performance Department of any impairment that may affect safety or performance;
- Reporting violations of this policy or suspected substance abuse in the workplace;
- Cooperating fully with any required testing or investigation.

Confidentiality

All information related to drug or alcohol testing, medical disclosures, and rehabilitation will be kept confidential and maintained in separate secure files in accordance with applicable privacy laws.

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

The City of Cibolo promotes equal employment opportunity through programs and policies designed to achieve employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex/gender, national origin, age, disability, or genetic information (collectively "protected class"). Equal employment opportunity applies to all terms and conditions of employment, including but not limited to hiring, placement, promotion, termination, layoff, recall, transfer, leave of absence, compensation, and training.

This policy applies to City employees, contractors for the City, citizens, vendors, and other visitors to the workplace.

The City's equal employment opportunity policy consists of the following objectives:

- Provide equal employment and promotional opportunities to all qualified persons, regardless of protected class;
- Provide civil rights information to employees regarding personnel policies, complaint procedures, and other conditions of employment affecting employees:
- Provide an internal complaint procedure for the processing of employment discrimination complaints;
- Prohibit policies, practices, or procedures that adversely impact a particular individual or group of people due to protected class status; and
- Provide training to employees, supervisors, and other individuals on civil rights and equal employment legislation, policies, and procedures.

All of the City's practices will be administered without regard to protected class. Such practices include, but are not limited to, events and activities sponsored by the City, the provision of benefits and compensation, disciplinary actions, grievance intake and responses, evaluations, and training and staff development opportunities. Decisions related to recruiting, hiring, position transfers, evaluations, and promotions will be based solely on an individual's qualifications and ability to perform the essential functions of the position.

The City is committed to ensuring that all applicants, employees, and other individuals are treated fairly and equitably in all areas affecting employees with the City, and is also committed to providing a work environment free of all forms of employment discrimination and maintaining a diverse workforce. The City expressly prohibits any form of unlawful employee harassment or

discrimination based on any of the protected characteristics mentioned above. Improper interference with the ability of other employees to perform their expected job duties is absolutely not tolerated.

Any employees with questions or concerns about equal employment opportunities in the workplace are encouraged to bring these issues to the attention of their Department Director or the Director of People and Performance.

Retaliation means adverse conduct taken because an individual reported an actual or perceived violation of this policy, opposed practices prohibited by this policy, or participated in the reporting and investigation process described below. "Adverse conduct" includes but is not limited to:

- Shunning and avoiding an individual who reports harassment, discrimination or retaliation;
- Express or implied threats or intimidation intended to prevent an individual from reporting harassment, discrimination, or retaliation; or
- Denying employment benefits because an applicant or employee reported harassment, discrimination or retaliation or participated in the reporting and investigation process.
- Termination of or change of work assignment, duties or shift of an individual who reports harassment, discrimination or retaliation, without consulting management or city legal.

The City will not allow any form of retaliation against individuals who raise issues of equal employment opportunity. If an employee feels they have been subjected to any such retaliation, they should bring it to the attention of Director of People and Performance. The City Manager, Department Directors, Managers, and Supervisors must observe and support the City's equal employment opportunity policy to ensure all applicants, employees, and other individuals are treated in a non-discriminatory manner.

The City requires that employees report all perceived incidents of harassment, regardless of the offender's identity or position. Such report need not be in writing, but can be and should be made when possible using the Harassment/Discrimination/Retaliation Complaint Form (Appendix XX). No applicants, employees, or other individuals will be impeded in any manner from filing a complaint of employment discrimination with the City's Director of People and Performance, the Texas Workforce Commission, or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, or be subject to harassment or retaliation for opposing alleged unlawful employment practices.

Complaints about any one or more of the City's elected officials (Mayor or City Council) must be made in writing, addressed to the Mayor and City Council, and filed with the Director of People and Performance and the City Manager. It shall be the City Secretary's duty to provide a sealed copy of the complaint to the City Attorney or other outside legal counsel for the City, and to the Mayor.

Complaints about any one or more of those appointed by the City Council, to include the City Secretary, the Municipal Judge, any employee of the City Attorney's Office, or the City Manager must be made in writing, addressed to the Mayor and City Council, and filed with the Director of People and Performance and the City Manager. It shall be the City Secretary's duty to provide a sealed copy of the complaint to the City Attorney or other outside legal counsel for the City, and to the Mayor.

Employees using the complaint process should utilize the Harassment/Retaliation/Discrimination Complaint Process flowchart (Appendix XX) to better understand the steps in the formal complaint

process.

Investigation of Complaints

All reports of prohibited conduct will be investigated promptly and in as confidential a manner as possible. The investigation may include individual interviews with the parties involved and, where necessary, with individuals who may have other relevant knowledge. All employees are required to cooperate with the investigation and to maintain confidentiality. Failure to cooperate may result in discipline.

In addition, the City encourages employees who believe they are being subjected to conduct prohibited by this policy and who feel comfortable doing so, to promptly advise the offender that his or her behavior is unwelcome and request that it be discontinued. Often this action will resolve the problem.

Training

Employees and other individuals will receive training regarding the City's policies and procedures prohibiting employment discrimination, conducted in accordance with training practices. Employees and other individuals participating in such training will also be informed of the state and federal agencies responsible for enforcing equal employment opportunity laws. Employees will complete this training no later than the 30th day after the date the employee is hired and every two years thereafter.

An employee who violates the provisions of this policy may be subject to disciplinary action, up to
and including separation from employment.

Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA)

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

It is the policy of City of Cibolo to provide eligible employees with unpaid, job-protected leave in accordance with the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 (FMLA), as amended. This policy outlines eligibility, the method for calculating available leave, employee responsibilities, and related provisions.

Employees are eligible for FMLA leave if they:

- Have been employed by City of Cibolo for at least 12 months (not necessarily consecutive), and
- Have worked at least **1,250 hours** during the 12-month period immediately preceding the start of the leave.

Eligibility is reviewed and confirmed by the Human Resources Manager.

Eligible employees may take up to 12 workweeks of unpaid leave during a 12-month period for the following qualifying reasons:

- The birth of a child or to care for a newborn within one year of birth;
- The placement of a child for adoption or foster care and to care for the newly placed child within one year of placement;
- To care for a spouse, child, or parent with a serious health condition;
- A serious health condition that makes the employee unable to perform the essential functions of their job;
- Any qualifying exigency arising out of the fact that the employee's spouse, child, or parent is a covered military member on "covered active duty."

An eligible employee may take up to 26 workweeks of leave during a single 12-month period to care for a covered servicemember with a serious injury or illness.

The City uses the "rolling 12-month lookback period" to determine the amount of FMLA leave available to an employee. Under this method, the available leave is calculated by looking back 12

months from the date the employee intends to start FMLA leave. Any FMLA leave taken during that time is subtracted from the 12-week entitlement to determine the remaining balance.

Unless otherwise approved in writing by the HR Manager, employees are required to use all available paid leave concurrently with FMLA leave, including:

- Accrued Annual Leave
- Sick Leave
- Holiday Leave
- Accrued Comp Time

If an employee exhausts their paid leave while on FMLA, the remaining FMLA time will continue as unpaid. Employees approved for FMLA leave may be eligible to apply for time from the Sick Leave Pool after 30 days of Leave Without Pay subject to the following conditions:

- The employee has exhausted their accrued paid leave balances;
- The absence qualifies under the Sick Leave Pool Policy
- The employee submits the required documentation and application for Sick Leave Pool usage; and
- Approval is granted by the City Manager or their designated authority.

Please refer to the Sick Leave Pool policy (Policy X.XX) for eligibility criteria, application process, and usage limitations.

Medical Certification

Employees requesting FMLA leave due to their own or a covered family member's serious health condition must provide sufficient medical certification from a healthcare provider within 15 calendar days of the request. Failure to provide the required documentation may result in denial or delay of FMLA protection.

Job Protection and Benefits

While on FMLA leave, employees are entitled to:

- Continuation of group health insurance coverage under the same terms and conditions as if they had not taken leave.
- Reinstatement to the same or an equivalent position upon return from FMLA leave, unless the employee is a "key employee" as defined by the FMLA and reinstatement would cause substantial and grievous economic injury to City of Cibolo.

Insurance and Other Benefits

The City will continue to provide the employer portion of insurance benefit premiums while the employee is on approved FMLA, but this will stop if the employee does not return when FMLA is exhausted. If the employee is on unpaid FMLA and there are employee premiums due for benefits, the HR Manager will work with the employee to make arrangements for payment. Employees who need assistance with benefits payments while using FMLA should coordinate leave usage with the HR Manager.

Payment should be made a month in advance unless other arrangements have been coordinated with the HR Manager and pre-approved by the Director of People and Performance in coordination with the Finance Director. Checks can be issued to the "City of Cibolo" and mailed to:

City of Cibolo (Attn: PPD) PO Box 826 Cibolo, TX 78108

If the employee does not return to work from FMLA Leave within one pay period and/or the employee does not stay employed for thirty days after returning from FMLA, the City may require reimbursement of insurance premiums paid for employee coverage while the employee was on FMLA. However, if an employee is unable to return to work due to a serious health condition or circumstances beyond the employee's control, reimbursement will not be required.

Paid Parental Leave

Employees who intend to use FMLA for the birth and/or bonding of a child or foster child should refer to the City's Paid Parental Leave Policy (Policy X.XX) to understand how the Paid Parental Leave benefits coordinate with FMLA.

Telework Privileges

Employees who wish, from time to time, to work from home while using FMLA must receive written approval from their Department Director and the City Manager. This approval must also be submitted to the HR Manager prior to payroll processing each pay period. This approval is separate from the telework approval an employee might have received prior to using FMLA.

Return to Work from FMLA

Employees are required to notify their supervisor and the HR Director of their intent to return to work at least two business days in advance of their expected return date, unless otherwise impracticable. Employees using FMLA for their own serious health condition are required to provide a Return to Work/Fit for Duty certification from a healthcare provider prior to returning to work.

The certification must confirm that the employee is able to resume work and specify any medical restrictions or accommodations required. A copy of the employee's job description may be provided to the healthcare provider to ensure an informed fitness for duty assessment. The HR Director will review the Fit for Duty certification to ensure completeness and determine whether any restrictions or accommodations are needed. If an employee fails to provide the Fit for Duty certification, the employee's return to work may be delayed until certification is received. Continued absence without the certification may be considered unauthorized leave and may be subject to disciplinary action.

Employees who are not fully released but may be able to return to work with restrictions will be engaged in an interactive process in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) to determine if reasonable accommodations can be made. (Policy #.##)

Employee Responsibilities

Employees are responsible for:

- Providing 30 days' advance notice when the need for FMLA leave is foreseeable;
- Notifying HR as soon as practicable when the need for leave is unforeseeable;
- Submitting required forms and certifications in a timely manner; and
- Adhering to all reporting and call-in procedures during leave, unless otherwise instructed.

Any deviation from the requirements of this policy, including exceptions to the concurrent use of leave, must be approved in writing by the City Manager. Exceptions may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

All medical information, including Fit for Duty certifications, will be maintained in a confidential
medical file separate from the employee's personnel file, in compliance with applicable laws.

The program provides a work environment that is supportive of lactating mothers and encourages breastfeeding of their children for up to one year or beyond following their birth. The City provides a multi-purpose area with a locking door that may be reserved for lactating employees. The City provides sinks and refrigerators in each City facility for the cleaning and storage of mothers' breast milk. Employees who are lactating may, after consulting with their supervisors, adjust their work schedules to allow for scheduling breaks and work patterns to provide time for expression of milk.

Sexual Harassment

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

The City of Cibolo has zero tolerance for all forms of sex/gender discrimination, to include sexual harassment, and prohibits discourteous conduct of a sexual nature. Retaliation for opposing or reporting discrimination, or for associating with someone who has opposed or reported discrimination, is prohibited. Allegations of conduct prohibited by this policy will be investigated by the Director of People and Performance. Any employee who violates the provisions of this policy will be subject to disciplinary action, including and up to termination. This policy pertains to work conduct in the office as well as at any work-related event held away from the office.

Action, conduct, or behavior that could be viewed as sexual harassment are unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, or other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature when:

- The conduct is sufficiently pervasive or severe that it has an effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance;
- The conduct creates a work environment that a reasonable person would find intimidating, hostile, or offensive;
- Submission to the conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly as a term or condition of an individual's employment; or
- Submission to or rejection of the conduct by an individual is used as a basis for employment decisions affecting the individual.

Discourteous conduct of a sexual nature is also prohibited. This might include, but is not limited to:

- Physical acts, such as intentional physical conduct that is sexual in nature or which a
 reasonable person would find offensive, such as intentional touching, jabbing, pinching,
 grabbing, rubbing, pressing, or brushing against a person's body;
- Sexual advances, propositions, or comments such as:
 - o Gestures, remarks, or jokes of a sexual nature that are unwelcome or would be offensive to a reasonable person;
 - O Displaying, reading, publicizing, or bringing into the workplace any materials of a sexual nature, such as posters, pictures, calendars, graffiti, objects depicting sexual poses, videos, movies, sound recordings, screen savers, or other materials that a reasonable person would regard as sexual in nature and inappropriate in a professional work environment; or

o Displaying sexually oriented tattoos.

Sexual harassment toward City employees by any external entity will not be tolerated. An employee should immediately report any harassment to a Supervisor, Manager, Department Director, or to the Director of Human Resources. Employees who have reported complaints regarding sexual harassment and are not satisfied with the response they've received should escalate their complaint one reporting level above the leadership of the previous report.

Complaints of harassment, retaliation, or discrimination should be made using the Harassment/Discrimination/Retaliation Complaint Form (Appendix XX). No applicants, employees, or other individuals will be impeded in any manner from filing a complaint of employment discrimination with the City's People and Performance Department, the Texas Workforce Commission, or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, or be subject to harassment or retaliation for opposing alleged unlawful employment practices.

Employees using the complaint process should utilize the Harassment/Retaliation/Discrimination Complaint Process flowchart (Appendix XX) to better understand the steps in the formal complaint process.

Training

Texas Whistleblower Act

This policy guides the operations of the City of Cibolo and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

The City of Cibolo will not suspend, terminate, or take other adverse personnel action against an employee who, in good faith, reports a violation of the law by the City of Cibolo or another public employee to an appropriate law enforcement authority.

This Act covers all reports made in good faith regarding suspected misconduct, including but not limited to:

- Criminal violations (e.g., theft, assault, misuse of public funds).
- Violations of statutes or administrative rules/regulations (federal, state, or local).
- Unlawful official actions by government officials or agencies.

Adverse personnel actions can include but are not limited to: Shift change, denial of overtime, denial of leave, title change, and removal to another department.

To be protected under the Texas Whistleblower Act, the employee must report the violation to an appropriate law enforcement authority.

Any employee who retaliates against a whistleblower will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment.

This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

The Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA) is the federal law intended to ensure that persons are not disadvantaged in their civilian careers because of their current or past service in the U.S. Armed Forces, the U.S. Armed Forces Reserves (Reserves), the National Guard, or other uniformed services. USERRA prohibits an employer from denying initial employment, reemployment, retention in employment, promotion, or any benefit of employment based on an individual's membership, application for membership, performance of service, service, application obligation for service in the uniformed for or services.

The City supports qualifying service members with the following:

- Prompt job reinstatement;
- Accumulation of seniority, including pension plan benefits;

Violence in the Workplace

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

It is the City of Cibolo's policy to promote a safe environment for its employees. Violence, threats, harassment, intimidation, and other like-type disruptive behavior in the City's workplaces will not be tolerated; that is, all reports of incidents will be taken seriously and will be dealt with appropriately.

It is a matter of first priority that law enforcement officials be notified as soon as possible of any situation that has the potential for immediate danger to the safety of an employee or any other person. Any person who threatens, or engages in, violent behavior, either verbal or physical in nature, may be removed from the premises as quickly as safety permits. At the City's discretion, employees and/or the public may be barred from non-public access areas on City premises pending the outcome of an investigation. Any employee determined to have committed such acts may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination. Reports to law enforcement officials will be made as appropriate. Non-employees engaged in violent acts in or affecting the workplace will also be reported to the proper authorities. City employees will cooperate fully with law enforcement authorities during any investigation.

If any City employee observes or experiences such behavior by anyone on City property, whether the perpetrator is a City employee or not, they should report this behavior immediately to any supervisor, manager, assistant director, director, or their executive assistant. Any supervisor, manager, assistant director, or executive assistant receiving such notification shall report it to any director immediately.

The employee observing or experiencing these actions should complete the City of Cibolo Violence in the Workplace Reporting Form (Appendix XX) as soon as is feasibly possible to ensure the information from the event is reported correctly.

The Director receiving a report of such behavior shall contact the Director of People and Performance immediately to conduct an inquiry into the alleged behavior and the Director of People and Performance will document the incident and report the findings to the City Manager.

If the incident involves a City Council member or an elected or appointed City official and the

investigation substantiates the allegation, the Director of People and Performance will forward the report and the investigation findings in a sealed envelope to the Mayor and City Council members.

Employees of the City of Cibolo can report instances of workplace violence or suspicious activity by contacting the Department of Public Safety (DPS) through the iWatch Community Reporting System at www.iwatchtx.org, or by calling 844-643-2251. Employees have the right to make a report to DPS anonymously.

Longevity Pay

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

The City has established Longevity Pay to recognize employees for their continued service with the City. Longevity Pay is awarded annually to all regular, full-time employees in the amount of \$120 per year (minus appropriate payroll taxes and standard deductions), for each full year of continuous employment as of September 30th up to a maximum of 25 years. Payments will be issued between the first and second pay period of November.

Temporary employment with the City will not be credited toward service time. Qualifying employees who terminate their employment with the City between September 30 and the payout date will have their Longevity Pay issued on their final paycheck. Employees who voluntarily terminate their employment with the City but return at a later date forfeit all longevity time previously credited and will commence as a new employee.

Benefits Programs

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

Benefits Programs

The City offers group insurance programs on a voluntary basis to eligible employees and their dependents. While it is expected that benefits will continue, benefits are an annual expenditure, which is subject to approval each budget year by City Council, and the City reserves the right to change the insurance programs or discontinue them at any time.

The effective date for group insurance coverage for newly hired, rehired, and newly eligible regular employees will be the first day of the calendar month following 30 days of full-time employment, provided the enrollment materials have been properly completed and submitted to the People and Performance Department in a timely manner.

The effective date for dependents is:

- the date the employee is eligible for coverage, if he or she has dependents who are eligible for coverage on that date;
- the date the employee's marriage for any dependents acquired on that date;
- the date of birth of the employee's natural born child;
- the date a child is placed for adoption under the employee's legal guardianship;
- the date which the employee incurs legal obligation for total or partial support in anticipation of adoption; or
- the date a covered employee's child is determined to be eligible as an alternate recipient under the terms of a medical child support order.

The coverage will remain in force until the next open enrollment period. Employees may not change their coverage before that time unless their family situation changes by a qualifying event including marriage, divorce, death of a spouse or child, birth, adoption, or change in dependent status of a child, or a change in spousal employment. Consequently, Employees may not add or delete dependents or change insurance coverage except during open enrollment or as outlined above.

Benefits Continuation

The Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA) provides for continuation of medical, vision, and dental coverage for covered participants should a qualifying employee or dependent's covered under the plan become ineligible for coverage as a result of the employee's termination (voluntary, involuntary, and/or retirement) or death, a divorce or legal separation of employee and spouse, or the employee's dependent child ceases to be a dependent child under the applicable requirements of the plan.

Additional Benefits

Employees may enroll in supplemental plans such as Flexible Spending Accounts for healthcare or dependent daycare, Cancer, Short- and Long-Term Disability, and additional Life insurance. These plans are voluntary, and the City only provides payroll deduction and no premium contributions for these plans.

Life Insurance

The City offers life insurance to regular, full-time employees at one-time the employee's salary up to the contracted amount. IRS regulation requires the City to include the cost of life insurance coverage above \$50,000 as taxable income to the Employee. Employees can purchase additional insurance policies through the City. In addition to the City offered life insurance, employees who are enrolled as Cibolo members of the TMRS retirement system will also receive a life insurance benefit. The TMRS benefit is one-time the employee's annual salary if the employee dies while an active City employee.

Fraud or Misrepresentation

Retirement

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

Texas Municipal Retirement System

Effective upon employment, each employee in a regular position is required to become a member of Texas Municipal Retirement System (TMRS), which provides a defined benefit retirement plan established by Texas State Statue and is governed by the City. Employees' tax deferred contribution is 7% of employees' gross salaries. Additionally, the City contributes to TMRS on a monthly basis funds to match, at the time of retirement, employees' contributions plus interest earned, at a rate of 2-to-1 match towards their monthly retirement benefit.

Retirement eligibility is easily established by one of two ways:

- Age 60 with at least 5 years of service; or
- 20 years of service at any age.

Employer contributions can only be accessed at retirement and a monthly annuity has been selected. Upon separation of employment or retirement, the employee has full access to their contributions plus interest earned for withdrawal, transfer to another deferred plan, or if eligible, a monthly annuity. Some penalties and tax deferments may apply. For additional information, please refer to the City's TMRS representative or visit their website at www.tmrs.org.

Additional Retirement Options

The City may additionally offer employees access to one or more supplemental retirement savings programs, including but not limited to:

- 457(b) Deferred Compensation Plans;
- Roth 457 or Roth 403(b) Accounts; or
- Other qualified or non-qualified retirement savings plans as permitted by law

Participation in these programs is voluntary and intended to complement the TMRS retirement program. All contributions are subject to annual IRS limits, which may change annually. The City will inform employees of applicable limits at the beginning of each calendar year.

In accordance with the Texas Unemployment Compensation Act, employees who are separated from employment through no fault of their own (as examples, layoff, reduction in force, position elimination) may be eligible for unemployment benefits as determined by the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC).

Eligibility for unemployment benefits is determined solely by the TWC. Employees terminated for misconduct, who resign voluntarily without good cause, or who fail to meet TWC's requirements may be denied benefits.

The City strictly prohibits retaliation against any employee who applies for or receives unemployment benefits.

Workplace Injury and Workers' Compensation

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

This policy establishes guidelines for workers' compensation leave for City employees who sustain injuries or illnesses while performing their official duties. The goal is to ensure affected employees receive appropriate compensation and leave benefits in compliance with state regulations while maintaining continuity in operations and services. This policy applies to City employees who are injured within the course and scope of their employment. It addresses leave eligibility, compensation, documentation requirements, and administrative procedures.

The City is committed to meeting the obligation under the Texas Workers' Compensation Act to provide medical, rehabilitation, and wage-replacement benefits to employees who sustain work-related injuries or illnesses, and to meet the statutory requirements from Tex. H.B. 471, 88th Leg. (Tex. 2023). The City's workers' compensation insurance provider is responsible for compensability determinations, authorizing medical treatment, rehabilitation, or other actions related to an injured employee's claim, and facilitating resolution of cases. If an employee is unable to perform work in any capacity or an alternate position, their workers' compensation leave will run concurrently with FMLA Leave according to the City's FMLA policy.

When an employee is injured within the course and scope of employment for the City, the employee is eligible for workers' compensation payments as follows pursuant to Title 5 of the Texas Labor Code:

- 1. Reasonably required medical treatment;
- 2. A statutory amount that provides a portion of the employee's average weekly wage while the employee is unable to work because of the injury for up to 104 weeks; and
- 3. Additional monetary benefits for permanent disability suffered because of the on-the-job injury.

Employees are required to notify their supervisor within 24 clock hours of any accidental on-the-job injury, occupational illness or disease, and submit the first report of injury to the HR Manager within 48 clock hours. Paid workers' compensation leave for medical appointments will be limited to two hours per workday, unless documentation provided by the employee indicates the duration of the appointment was longer than two hours. Appointments should be scheduled during regular working hours when possible. Any appointments outside of the employee's regular work hours should be communicated with their supervisor and the HR Manager.

All supervisors are required to report all incidents and accidents to the HR Manager within 48 clock hours of their employee notifying them of the accident or incident.

Employees will be required to submit a release from the treating physician to return to work once ready to return to work. Work modifications in the release will be addressed with the employee's supervisor and the HR Manager.

Employees approved for workers' compensation leave will receive benefits according to the Texas Workers' Compensation Act provisions. Police and Fire employees will receive benefits according to State law.

Compensation may include Temporary Income Benefits (TIBs) until the employee reaches Maximum Medical Improvement (MMI). TIBs will be discontinued if an employee refuses to accept a Bonafide Job Offer to perform a different job with the City that is within the employee's physical capacity, according to their treating physician, for which the employee is qualified or will be trained, and for which the employee will be paid their current rate of pay. Under the Workers' Compensation Program, TIBS do not begin until after the seventh day of absence form work due to an on-the-job injury.

Employees on leave due to Workers' Compensation must obtain a release from their healthcare providers certifying their ability to safely resume work duties. The City will accommodate transitional or modified duties where possible for employees returning to work after recovery. Depending on the nature of the injury and duration off work or on modified duty, employees may need to complete a fitness-for-duty assessment prior to returning to their job, if such assessment is required for hiring.

Under no circumstances may an employee on leave for a work-related injury or illness engage in outside employment during the period of leave unless expressly authorized in writing in advance by the Department Director and the HR Manager.

An employee who fraudulently obtains workers' compensation benefits will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination. Non-compliance with this policy may result in delays or denial of benefits.

Employee Grievance

This policy does not constitute an employment contract or a guarantee of continued employment. The City of Cibolo (City) reserves the right to change the provisions of this policy at any time. Nothing in this policy limits the City Manager's authority to establish or revise internal policies and procedures. This policy guides the operations of the City and does not create a legally enforceable interest for employees or limit the City Manager's authority to terminate an employee at will.

The City of Cibolo promotes equal employment opportunity by responding to employee grievances without regard to race, color, religion, sex/gender, national origin, age, disability, or genetic information (collectively "protected class"). The City has zero tolerance for all forms of employment discrimination in the employee grievance process, and harassment or retaliation is prohibited. No employee will be subjected to retaliation for opposing or reporting employment discrimination in the employee grievance process.

Employees of the City will be treated fairly and equitably. Employees who believe they have not been treated fairly and equitably about employment-related matters may submit a grievance for prompt consideration and equitable decision in accordance with this policy. Employees participating in the grievance process will not be subject to harassment, retaliation, intimidation, or coercion for pursuing a grievance or participating in the grievance process.

Normal day-to-day discussions between an employee and a supervisor regarding working conditions and employment-related matters are the most constructive and expeditious means of developing and enhancing favorable and effective work relationships. The City encourages employees and managers to attempt to resolve matters by using informal problem-solving techniques before filing a formal grievance. However, when a matter is not resolved to the satisfaction of the employee, the employee may seek resolution by submitting a grievance in accordance with this procedure.

If an employee's grievance pertains to another employee, both employees may be required to participate in dispute resolution utilizing the City's Employee Assistance Program.

Submission of a grievance by an employee shall not be construed as reflecting unfavorably on an employee's good standing, performance, or loyalty to the City. Similarly, grievances shall not be construed as reflecting unfavorably on the quality of supervision or on the general management of the City.

Employee grievances must be related to an employment-related matter. Employees may not use the Employee Grievance Procedure for:

- Voluntary resignation;
- Administrative separation, including at-will separations;
- Reduction-in-workforce decisions;

- Reclassification;
- An agreement reached through mediation;
- Issues mandated by law outside of the City's control; or
- An action that has not yet occurred, such as a pending disciplinary action or recommendation for dismissal.

Complaints alleging harassment, retaliation, or discrimination are not appropriate for the Employee Grievance Procedure and should follow the Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) policy. Employees who are not certain if their grievance qualifies as harassment, retaliation, or discrimination can contact the Director of People and Performance for guidance.

All employee grievances should be submitted on the Employee Grievance Form (Appendix XX). A grievance may be submitted by only one employee; a grievance submitted by a group of employees shall not be accepted. Grievances submitted on behalf of another employee shall not be accepted.

The essential elements of the Employee Grievance include the specific complaint, the adverse effect, and the requested relief, which shall be clearly summarized on the Employee Grievance Form. Each grievance is limited to one specific complaint regarding one incident, one individual, or employment- related matter directly affecting the employee. The requested relief shall not include a sanction request against another employee, such as to be disciplined. If the grievance does not follow all of this procedure, the grievance will not be accepted.

The Employee Grievance Form should be submitted no later than 10 business days after the incident occurred or the grievant first became aware of the incident. A grievance related to a continuing condition should be submitted within 10 business days after the date of the last incident.

The grievance shall be submitted to the Director of People and Performance and will be date-stamped upon submission. The Director of People and Performance has 10 business days to review the grievance to determine whether the grievance includes a complaint regarding an EEO-related complaint. If it is determined the complaint qualifies as an EEO-related complaint, the complaint will be rejected, and the grievant will be notified.

If the grievance does not include an EEO-related complaint, the Director of People and Performance shall audit the grievance documentation within 10 business days to verify the grievance meets the requirements of this policy. If the grievance is rejected due to an error, the grievance will be returned, and the grievant will have 10 business days to correct and resubmit the grievance. If the grievance is not accepted for any other reason the Director of People and Performance shall close the grievance with no further action. The Director of People and Performance will notify the employee that the grievance was closed without action.

Grievances made against the Director of People and Performance or any employee of the People and Performance Department will be handled through the City Manager's Office. Grievances related to the Director of People and Performance or any employee of the People and Performance Department should be submitted through the City Manager's Office.

Once accepted, the Director of People and Performance will complete an investigation into the grievance. All employees are expected to fully participate in any portion of the investigation if called upon. Within five business days from the investigation's completion, the Director of People and Performance will present a recommendation for next steps of action to the City

Manager. The City Manager will have 10 business days or as soon as practicable to review the findings and make a final decision on the grievance. The City Manager's decision is final and is not able to be appealed.

Once a final decision by the City Manager has been made, the Director of People and Performance will complete a Grievance Response Report within 10 business days to be placed in the City's Grievance Folder. The grievant and anyone actively involved in the investigation will receive a copy of the Grievance Response Report. No further action is required from the grievant once the report has been issued; however, if the grievant wishes to respond in writing, the grievant has five business days from receipt of the Grievance Response Report to submit a written response that will be included in the Grievance Response Report.

If an employee separates from the City during the Employee Grievance Procedure process, the Director of People and Performance will determine if the Employee Grievance Procedure should continue, based on the requested relief. If the requested relief cannot be granted because of the employee separation, the grievance shall be closed with no action taken.

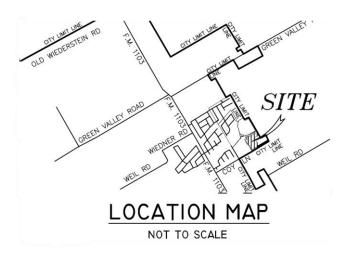

ACCEPTANCE OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS - PRELIMINARY ACCEPTANCE:

<u>Section 20.3.11 of the UDC speaks to Public Improvements Acceptance</u>. It is expressly understood that as a condition to the approval of said subdivision, no Building Permits will be issued until all public infrastructure is installed and other improvements required by this UDC is accepted for the subdivision in which said lot is contained.

Inspection and Acceptance of Public Improvements. The City Engineer, the City's Construction Inspectors, and the Public Works Department have conducted their inspections and walkthroughs. Based upon this walkthrough and any developer's corrections, City staff have found the construction to be in accordance with the approved construction plans. The applicant's engineer has submitted a signed and sealed letter to the City Engineer stating that the development is complete in accordance with the approved construction plans and all known deficiencies ("punch list" items) have been corrected.

Preliminary Acceptance of Public Improvements. The City's Preliminary Acceptance Criteria in the UDC are as follows.

I. When the City Engineer determines that public improvements have been installed in compliance with the approved construction plans, the developer may petition the City for preliminary acceptance of public improvements by completing Part I of the "Developer Petition for Acceptance of Public Improvements" shown in the UDC and forwarding it to the City with required supporting documents.

City Engineer has walked the site and found the public improvements to be in accordance with the approved construction documents and the "Developer Petition for Acceptance of Public Improvements" has been received.

II. After recommendation(s) by the City Engineer, the City shall accept or reject the petition for preliminary acceptance of public improvements and said acceptance or rejection shall be final. The City may provide for conditional acceptance of public improvements provided that the applicant guarantees that all materials and workmanship are to be in accordance with the approved plans and specifications prescribed by the City and to correct any and all deficiencies not in accordance with approved plans and specifications as may be noted until final acceptance by the City in accordance with Final Acceptance.

City Engineer has verified that all punch list items have been addressed and recommends preliminary acceptance of the public improvements.

III. Each public improvement shall be tabulated and quantified into terms of lineal road length, lineal sidewalk length, lineal water line length (per diameter of water line), lineal sanitary sewer line length (per diameter of sanitary sewer line), lineal drainage channel lengths, acreage of storm water pond acreage, and the like, as well as the valuation for each public improvement.

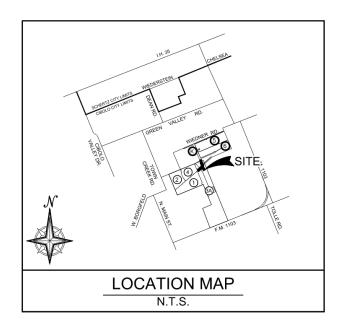

ACCEPTANCE OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS – PRELIMINARY ACCEPTANCE:

<u>Section 20.3.11 of the UDC speaks to Public Improvements Acceptance</u>. It is expressly understood that as a condition to the approval of said subdivision, no Building Permits will be issued until all public infrastructure is

installed and other improvements required by this UDC is accepted for the subdivision in which said lot is contained.

Inspection and Acceptance of Public Improvements. The City Engineer, the City's Construction Inspectors, and the Public Works Department have conducted their inspections and walkthroughs. Based upon this walkthrough and any developer's corrections, City staff have found the construction to be in accordance with the approved construction plans. The applicant's engineer has submitted a signed and sealed letter to the City Engineer stating that the development is complete in accordance with the approved construction plans and all known deficiencies ("punch list" items) have been corrected.

Preliminary Acceptance of Public Improvements. The City's Preliminary Acceptance Criteria in the UDC are as follows.

I. When the City Engineer determines that public improvements have been installed in compliance with the approved construction plans, the developer may petition the City for preliminary acceptance of public improvements by completing Part I of the "Developer Petition for Acceptance of Public Improvements" shown in the UDC and forwarding it to the City with required supporting documents.

City Engineer has walked the site and found the public improvements to be in accordance with the approved construction documents and the "Developer Petition for Acceptance of Public Improvements" has been received.

II. After recommendation(s) by the City Engineer, the City shall accept or reject the petition for preliminary acceptance of public improvements and said acceptance or rejection shall be final. The City may provide for conditional acceptance of public improvements provided that the applicant guarantees that all materials and workmanship are to be in accordance with the approved plans and specifications prescribed by the City and to correct any and all deficiencies not in accordance with approved plans and specifications as may be noted until final acceptance by the City in accordance with Final Acceptance.

City Engineer has verified that all punch list items have been addressed and recommends preliminary acceptance of the public improvements.

III. Each public improvement shall be tabulated and quantified into terms of lineal road length, lineal sidewalk length, lineal water line length (per diameter of water line), lineal sanitary sewer line length (per diameter of sanitary sewer line), lineal drainage channel lengths, acreage of storm water pond acreage, and the like, as well as the valuation for each public improvement.

In conjunction with the submittal of the Preliminary Acceptance instrument, the applicant shall submit the following:

- Electronic copies of the following items: construction plans approved by the City Engineer, As-Built construction plans certified by a registered P.E., field density and material source tests by a recognized testing laboratory and a geotechnical report
- Electronic copy or DVD and complete log of the televised sewer line inspections completed after the mandrel, vacuum and pressure tests
- Acceptance letters from all utility providers
- Itemized Construction Cost report
- Pre-walk Punch list (provided by project Engineer)
- Copy of Final Plat
- Maintenance Bond per UDC Article 20.6; and
- An electronic copy or DVD with AutoCAD and PDF's of all items on the above list.

City Engineer is in receipt of the above items.

CITY ENGINEER RECOMMENDATION: The City Engineer recommends approval of the applicant's request for Preliminary Acceptance of Buffalo Crossing II Knights Crossing Phase 2.

PRIOR CITY COUNCIL ACTION:

May 2008... The City Council amended the sign regulations adopting Ordinance 842, which provided provisions for Kiosk Signs in the public rights-of-way (ROW) to promote directions to subdivisions, home builders, and city facilities, installed and maintained by the City or authorized by an approved contract agreement.

February - March 2011... The City entered into an agreement for services with National Sign Plazas, Inc., (NSP) to provide directions to subdivisions, home builders, and city facilities, installed and maintained by NSP.

BACKGROUND:

The City entered into an agreement with NSP for the specific purpose to provide "directions to subdivisions, home builders, and city facilities." The agreement was effective on March 9, 2011, upon the execution of the agreement by the City. The agreement has an initial term of five (5) years with automatic five (5) year renewals unless either party provides at least sixty (60) day advance notice before the end of the term.

Currently, the City's sign ordinance restricts the purpose of these signs (see Ordinance 842). The City Council may want to discuss other public purposes that it may want kiosk signs to promote.

The current agreement for services between the City and National Sign Plazas provides for the following terms (see attached agreement):

- <u>Scope of Work</u>. Defines NSP's responsibilities to administer the Sign Plaza program and defines the purpose of the signs;
- Specifications of the Signs. There are three types of sign plazas, which are illustrated in Exhibit A.
- Number of Sign Plazas. The City has sole discretion on the placement of signs and must approve the locations.
- Price and Payment Schedule for Signs. The City is to receive \$10 per panel, per month.
- <u>Term and Termination of the Agreement</u>. The initial term was 5 years with automatic renewals for 5 years unless advance notice (60 days) is provided by either party.
- Placement of Sign Panels. The City extends an exclusive right to NSP to place sign plazas in the City's ROW.
- Maintenance of Sign Plazas. NSP is responsible for maintaining the signs.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

No recommendation at this time. However, the standards in the industry have changed over the past 15 years and the City should explore its options regarding sign plazas or kiosk signs along with an amendment to the City's sign regulations.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The City receives minimal revenue from this source. It is dependent on the number of sign plazas and the number of panels per sign. In 2021, there were no sign plazas in the City. NSP restarted the program in late 2022 after the City made contact and sought to provide home builders with a legal means to promote their subdivisions.

MOTION(S):

The City Council may or may not direct staff to return with an approach to recompeting this agreement.

ORDINANCE NO. 842

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CIBOLO, TEXAS AMENDING ORDINANCE NO 583 SIGN ORDINANCE, SECTION VI ALLOWING KIOSK SIGNS; AMENDING SECTION VII ALLOWING KIOSK SIGNS IN THE RIGHT OF WAY; PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILTY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cibolo seeks to provide for the orderly development of land and use of property within its corporate limits and ETJ;

WHEREAS, the City Council seeks to maintain the value of the City of Cibolo's scenic and natural resources, which are the keystones of the City's economic strength and quality of life, through a comprehensive regulatory program that includes ordinances restricting signs;

WHEREAS, the City Council is authorized to regulate signs by virtue of the Texas Constitution, the City of Cibolo's police power, and Texas Local Government Code Chapter 216;

WHEREAS, the City Council previously passed Ordinance Number 583 providing for the regulation of signs;

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to reduce the amount of bandit and billboard signs used by builders, developers and real estate agents by providing a directional kiosk sign program for Cibolo's growing community;

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered the merits of this Ordinance and has determined that this Ordinance is necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the community.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CIBOLO, TEXAS:

SECTION 1 INCORPORATION

That the above and foregoing premises are true and correct and are incorporated herein and made part hereof for all purposes.

SECTION 2 AMENDMENTS

A. That the Section VI of Ordinance 583 (Sign Ordinance) shall be amended to add the following:

"SECTION VI. ALLOWED SIGNS NOT NEEDING PERMITS.

Kiosk Signs: Kiosk signs shall be approved sign plaza structures located within the right-of-way, providing directions to subdivisions, homebuilders, and city facilities, installed and maintained by the City or authorized by an approved contract agreement.

B. That Section VII of Ordinance 583 (Sign Ordinance) shall be amended as follows:

"SECTION VII OFF-PREMISE SIGNS

Portable Sign:

No part of any sign may be located within a public right-of-way or within ten (10') feet of any public street or road, except for Kiosk Signs as defined in Section VI.

SECTION 3 SEVERABILITY

That it is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of Cibolo that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

SECTION 4 SAVINGS

That all rights and privileges of the City of Cibolo are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinance affecting the adoption and amendment of this Ordinance, which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 5 EFFECTIVE DATE

That this Ordinance shall be effective upon the approval of the City Council of the City of Cibolo, Texas.

AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES

This Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the CITY OF CIBOLO ("City") and NATIONAL SIGN PLAZAS, INC., a California corporation ("Contractor") (collectively, the "Parties").

WHEREAS, City Ordinance No. <u>842</u> allows the City to install Sign Plazas within rights-of-way and,

WHEREAS, City desires to initiate a Sign Plaza Program to give direction to subdivisions, developers and homebuilders within the City, and to contract for the installation and maintenance of the Sign Plazas and sign panels; and

WHERAS, Contractor represents that it is a California corporation authorized to do business in the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, Contractor desires to install Sign Plazas as described more fully in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Contractor desires to maintain the Sign Plazas after their installation and to lease space on the Sign Plazas to developers and homebuilders and to bill and collect fees from the developers and homebuilders for itself and for the City; and,

WHEREAS, Contractor submitted a proposal that substantially meets the City's requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE in consideration of these recitals and other good and valuable consideration, the value and receipt of which is acknowledged, City and Contractor agree as follows:

- 1. Recitals. The Recitals above are hereby incorporated into this Agreement by reference.
- 2. <u>Contract Documents</u>. The Contract Documents, which set forth the entire Agreement of the Parties, are named below. In the event of a conflict between the terms of two or more documents, they shall take priority in the order set forth below:
 - A. All applicable laws and regulations of the CITY OF CIBOLO and the STATE of TEXAS.
 - B. This Agreement.



Each party shall comply with all of the terms, conditions and specifications contained in the Contract Documents.

1. <u>Scope of Work</u>. Contractor shall perform the work set forth in the Contract Documents. In general, this work shall consist of the following:

In administrating the Sign Plaza Program, the contractor will:

- A. Construct, install, maintain and repair approved Sign Plazas and sign panels.
- B. Contract with developers and homebuilders for the lease of sign panels.
- C. Assist City in determining appropriate locations for Sign Plazas.
- D. Assist City with identifying off-premise signs not in compliance with City Ordinances.
- E. Attend meetings as necessary with City staff and developers to coordinate project.
- F. Collect all lease payments and remit to City, on a quarterly basis, an administrative fee as specified in Section 4.B of this document.
- 2. <u>Definition</u>, Purpose of Sign Plaza Programs and Specifications of Sign Plazas.
 - A. <u>Definition</u>. For the purposes of this Agreement, a Sign Plaza is a structure placed in the City right of way for the purpose of displaying sign panels. The specifications of the Sign Plaza and sign panels are more fully developed in these Contract Documents.
 - B. <u>Purpose of Sign Plazas</u>. The purpose of Sign Plazas is to provide direction for homebuyers, and the like, to the location of subdivisions, housing developments, homebuilders and public facilities within the CITY OF CIBOLO, TX while discouraging the placement of unsightly and hazardous off-site directional signs.
 - C. <u>Specifications of Sign Plazas and Sign Panels</u>. Contractor agrees to manufacture and install Sign Plaza structures and sign panels in accordance with the specifications in these Contract Documents and the following:
 - 1. Sign Plaza Structures shall not exceed twelve (12) feet above average grade. Structures shall be more completely described in Exhibit A.
 - 2. Sign Plazas shall be constructed of steel and/or aluminum and shall be capable of displaying up to ten (10) sign panels, doubled-sided, if necessary.
 - A City topper panel will be designed for the CITY OF CIBOLO, TX and shall be prominently displayed at the top of any and every Sign Plaza within the jurisdictional limits of



Cibolo and shall be visible on any side of a Sign Plaza which displays directional sign panels.

 The color of all Sign Plaza Structures shall be determined by the City All sign panels shall conform to Section 4.C.11 below.

The Contractor shall submit final design plans to the City for approval prior to installation of any Sign Plaza.

 No additions, tag sign streamers, attention-getting devices or other appurtenances shall be attached to any Sign Plaza or sign panel.

7. Sign Plaza locations shall be designated, permitted and approved by the City's authorized staff and with the assistance of the Contractor. No sign plaza shall be installed without the prior authorization of and proper permitting by the City. City agrees that Contractor will not be charged or liable for fees associated with obtaining said permits.

8. At the City's request and direction, the Contractor shall remove and relocate any Sign Plazas within thirty (30) days of the receipt of written notice at no cost to the City/County.

9. Contractor shall guarantee and provide, at no cost to the City, the equivalent of not less then ten percent (10%) of all permitted Sign Plazas to the City. Said sign panels shall be provided on a space available basis, secondary to sign panels to be displayed for developers, homebuilders, and residential communities, and shall be installed with no more than two (2) such sign panels per plaza. Nothing in this section shall be construed to allow the Contractor to remove a City's directional sign without the express written consent of the City.

10. Contractor shall provide to the City eight (8) sign plazas to be used solely by the City for directional destinations of their choosing. The locations of these signs will be determined by the City. Additional signage may be requested at a later date. Upon request Contractor will submit a cost of said signage to the City for approval.

11. Contractor shall provide to the City a semi-annual inventory report of existing installed sign panels.

12. Sign panels shall contain only the name of a residential community, subdivision, homebuilder, public facility, City and logo, the builder or developer's name and/or logo, the builder or developer's recognized color scheme, and directional information or the name of the builder/developer and logo and an appropriate directional arrow. Directional arrows will be of a uniform size; a line of text at the bottom of the sign panel with directional information is permissible if circumstances warrant it. Fluorescent colors are not allowed. Reflective colors and text are permissible. Unless so authorized by City, the sign



panels shall not appear to replicate the commonly accepted color schemes of motorist signs.

13. Contractor shall, at its own cost, maintain, repair, replace and repaint each sign panel as necessary or deemed necessary by the City. Upon notice by the City, Contractor agrees to undertake necessary repairs or replacement of any sign panel within seventy-two (72) hours of receipt of notice.

14. Contractor shall not install or maintain any Sign Plazas or sign panels within the City, which are not in compliance with the

terms of this Agreement.

15. Sign Panels shall be constructed on Alpolic 360. The panels shall be vinyl coated with a material comparable to 3M Engineering Grade Retro-reflective.

- 16. Individual sign panels on the Primary Structures shall not exceed fifty (50) inches in horizontal length by twelve (12) inches in height. Individual sign panels on the Community Structures shall not exceed fifty (50) inches in horizontal length by twelve (12) inches in height. Individual sign panels on the Neighborhood Structures shall not exceed thirty (30) inches in horizontal length by thirty (30) inches in height.
- 3. Number of Sign Plaza Structures. The City has sole discretion to determine the number and placement of the Sign Plazas in its right-of-way. The City shall agree to allow the signage to direct homebuyers to each new housing community. Said signage shall be defined as one Sign Plaza at each location where homebuyers require information regarding a change of direction and likewise where homebuyers would need reassurance to continue in a certain direction. One or more structures, located at least one hundred (100) feet apart, shall be allowed to accommodate directional sign panels. Contractor may submit to City at any time during the term of the Agreement subsequent requests for the timely approval of additional Sign Plaza locations, as may be expressed by homebuilders, developers, and residential communities over time.
- 4. Price and Payment Schedule for the Purchase of the Sign Plazas and Sign Panels. Subject to the provisions in Paragraph 6 below, the price and payment schedule for Sign Plazas shall be as follows:
 - A. Contractor will install, maintain and repair the Sign Plazas and rotate City panels at no cost to the City.
 - B. Contractor will collect, and remit to the City, an amount of \$10.00 per panel, per month. Said fees shall be remitted within sixty (60) days of the end of each fiscal quarter. Fiscal quarters will be based on the Contractor's fiscal cycle, beginning October 1 and ending September 30.
- 5. Term of Agreement and Termination of Agreement
 - A. Term. The term of this Agreement is five (5) years.



- B. <u>Renewal</u>. At the end of the initial five-year term, this contract will automatically renew for two additional (5) five year terms unless either party provides at least sixty (60) days advanced notice before the end of the initial term, of their intention(s) to terminate this Agreement.
- C. Termination. This Agreement may be not be terminated by either party, except for breach as provided for in this Agreement:
 - 1. Termination by City. If Contractor breaches and fails to remedy said breach as provided for in this Agreement, the City may terminate this contract. At the City's request Contractor shall remove the Sign Plazas within thirty (30) days after receiving a written termination letter from the City. The City shall retain the right to require Contractor to promptly transfer all information related to the placement of the sign panels to the City, including, but not limited to, the original sign service documents, an accounting of all open accounts, and all other relevant documents. After the transfer of all information, this Agreement shall be of no further effect.
 - 2) Termination by Contractor. If Contractor terminates this Agreement before the end of the term as stated in subsection A immediately above, Contractor agrees that the Sign Plazas shall remain in place and that the sign panels and all receivables from the placement of the sign panels shall become the property of the City. Further, Contractor agrees to promptly transfer all information related to the placement of the sign panels to the City, including, but not limited to, the original sign service documents, an accounting of all open accounts, and all other relevant documents. After the transfer of all information, this Agreement shall be of no further effect.
- 6. <u>Placement of Sign Panels</u>. After the City's written approval and acceptance of the installed Sign Plazas, the City agrees to extend to Contractor an exclusive right to use the Sign Plazas for sign panel placements and to maintain the Sign Plazas and sign panels subject to the terms of this Agreement.
 - A. Contractor agrees to offer and place sign panels for homebuilders, developers and residential communities. Contractor further agrees to use Contractor's best efforts to place all available sign panels.
 - B. Contractor agrees that the placement fees for the sign panels will be set at market rate. Contractor shall be allowed an annual cost of living increase for the fees as determined by the Consumer Price Index.



- C. Contractor agrees that within twelve (12) months after execution of this agreement at least two sign plazas shall be erected within the jurisdictional limits of the City.
- D. Contractor agrees to maintain all aspects of the placement of the sign panels, including entering into sign placement service agreements, billing, collecting fees, and paying any applicable taxes and fees.
- E. Contractor will remit to the City on a quarterly basis the amount of the City's Administrative Fee as specified in Section 4.B of this document.
- F. Contractor agrees to provide an annual report to the City pertaining to the number of sign panels installed within the City, the amount billed and the collection of the City's amount Administrative Fees.
- G. Contractor agrees that in no event will the City be liable for any fee payment or other fees related to the placement of the sign panels.
- H. Contractor agrees to include in all sign service agreements an assignment clause which will assign Contractor's rights to fee payment to the City in the event Contractor elects to terminate this Agreement pursuant to Paragraph 5.C.1 and 5 C 2 above.
- I. Homebuilders, developers, and residential communities with sites located within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City, present and soon-to-be-annexed, shall at all times be allowed to participate in the Sign Plaza program.
- G. City and Contractor agree that no sign panels other than those Manufactured and installed by Contractor shall be allowed on the Sign Plaza

7. Maintenance of Sign Plazas:

- A. Contractor agrees to maintain the Sign Plazas and sign panels for the term of this Agreement.
- B. Contractor agrees to replace damaged Sign Plazas and sign panels, as it deems necessary or as requested by the City.
- C. Contractor agrees to provide to the City a telephone number and a contact person allowing the City to contact Contractor requesting maintenance on the Sign Plazas or sign panels 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
- D. Contractor agrees to repair all Sign Plazas within five (5) business days of the receipt of the City written request for repair. Contractor further agrees to remove for repair all sign panels within seventy-two (72) hours of written notification of the need of repair by the City. Sign panel will be replaced within five (5) business days of the written notification.



- E. Contractor agrees to maintain a regular maintenance schedule to check each Sign Plaza and sign panel for all necessary repairs and to complete those repairs promptly.
- F. Contractor agrees to maintain all Sign Plazas and sign panels in conformity with all terms of this Agreement.
- 8. <u>Indemnification.</u> Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, its officials, officers, officers, agents, and employees from: a) liability for damages resulting from injury, death, property damage, and economic loss suffered by any person as a result of the negligent or willful act or omission of the Contractor or the Contractor's officer, agent, employee, or subcontractor; and b) reasonable attorney fees, court costs, settlement expenses and litigation expenses related to liability described in subsection a) immediately above and/or relating to any claim or action asserting such liability against the City, its officials, officers, agents, and employees, unless said claim or action is the result of the negligent or willful act or omission of the City or the City's officer, agent, employee, or subcontractor.
- 9. <u>Insurance</u>. Contractor shall maintain in full force and effect throughout the entire term of this Agreement insurance with an insurance company authorized to conduct business in Cibolo, TX with the following policy limits.
 - A. Comprehensive General Liability \$2,000,000 combined aggregate
 - B. Automobile Liability \$1,000,000
 - C. Workers Compensation
 - 1. Bodily Injury by Accident \$1,000,000
 - 2. Bodily Injury by Disease \$500,000

Upon written request, Contractor shall present a Certificate of Insurance in a form satisfactory to the City Attorney which shall name the City as an additional insured party on Contractor's Comprehensive General and Automobile Liability policies. If during the term of this Agreement, any such insurance is canceled, or if Contractor fails to renew same, or if the policy limits are reduced below the limits required above, such event shall constitute a default of this Agreement. Contractor shall immediately notify the City in writing if such an event occurs. Contractor shall have Five (5) business days to cure any such default.

- 10. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Contractor shall, at all times herein, be an independent contractor and not an employee of the City.
- 11. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice required to be given pursuant to this Agreement may be personally served upon the parties or may be served by certified mail, return receipt required, to:

- 12. <u>Assignment and Subcontracting</u>. Contractor may not delegate, assign or subcontract all or any part of the work except the fabrication and installation of the Sign Plaza structures and production of the sign panels, which require equipment, materials and expertise which the Contractor reasonably may not be expected to possess, without the City's prior written consent.
- 13. Miscellaneous. The Contract Documents represent the entire and integrated Agreement between the City and Contractor and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations of Agreements, whether written or oral, except as where noted. The Contract Documents may be modified only by a written document signed by both parties and approved by the City of Cibolo's council at a public meeting. This Agreement shall be governed under Texas State law, and any action relating to the Agreement shall be brought only in the City of Cibolo.
- 14. <u>Mutual Drafting</u>. The City and the Contractor each has had opportunity to consult legal counsel regarding the drafting of this Agreement and the provisions of this Agreement shall not be construed against or in favor of either party.
- 15. <u>Default and Remedies</u>. If any Party fails to perform any of its obligations under the Contract Documents, such failure shall constitute a default. The non-defaulting Party shall give the defaulting Party written notice of the default. The defaulting Party shall have ten (10) business days after the receipt of such notice in which to cure the default. Failure to cure the default shall constitute a breach of this Agreement. In the event of a breach, the non-breaching party may terminate this Agreement and may obtain any reasonable remedy provided by law.

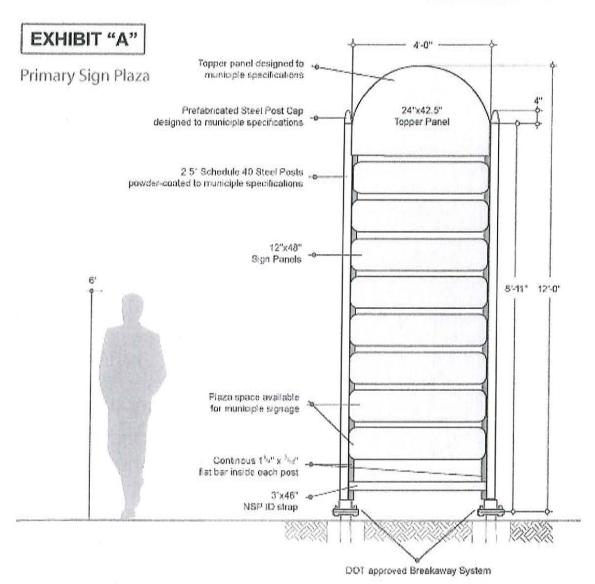

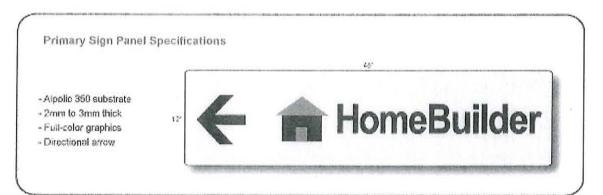
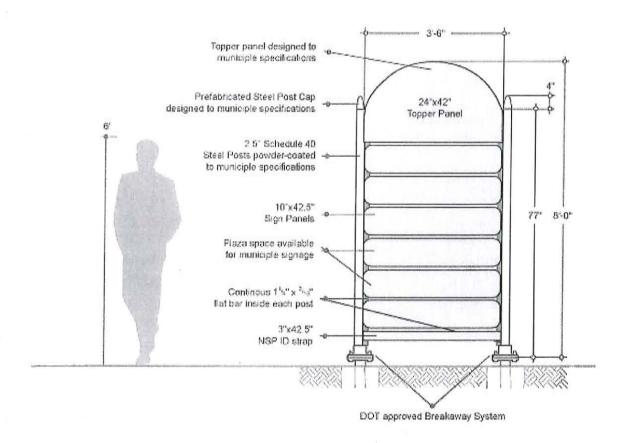

Community Sign Plaza



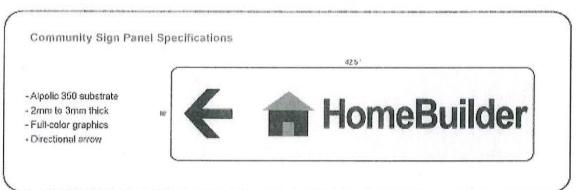
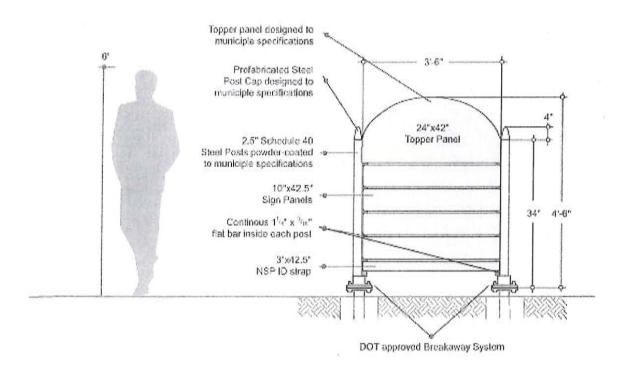
