SPRINKLING OF THE COFFIN

PLACING OF THE PALL | Carmel Heagney & Eileen Efstathis

Joe was baptized a child of God. The white pall is placed on the coffin as a symbol of his Baptism, his belonging to God. Through this we are reminded that we are all brothers and sisters in Christ and that our life begins and continues with Him, through Him and in Him.

PLACING OF SYMBOLS | The Bible | Mary Balam

We place the Bible on the coffin because the Word of God was the foundation of Joe's life. He read scripture daily and he knew its power.

The Cross and Rosary Beads | Maureen Locke

The Cross has been placed on the coffin because Joe recognised Jesus as his personal Saviour and Lord.

The Rosary Beads symbolize his prayer life: the Rosary being a prayer he and Marie often recited together over many years.

The Veterinary Certificate and Graduation Sash | Rosalie Hoffmann

The Veterinary Certificate symbolizes Joe's calling in life, his expertise, interests and his profession, a career he chose to alleviate cruelty to animals that was prevalent 75 years ago.

The gold and purple Graduation Sash represents the 6 years he completed at Sydney University on a Commonwealth Scholarship.

The Harmonica | Julie Chircop

Music is one of God's special gifts to us. The harmonica is being placed on the coffin because Joe had a great love of music. He knew that music could both entertain and bless others because it could carry the anointing of the Holy Spirit. He learnt to play the harmonica as a teenager and enjoyed playing it to his grandchildren and great grandchildren.

The Cap | Colleen Ducat

Joe loved wearing this cap which was given to him by his eldest daughter, Colleen. He wore it everywhere and it became part of his wardrobe, regardless of the season.
