- Pass the test? Don't care
- Resume? Not important.

- 2. Practice live with live stakes
- 3. Work with real-world consequences to failure
- 4. Act as if it was a deadline in the real world.
- 5. Do it every single day.

Best way to get a client = do the work in advance
