## 400 get jobs in first 3 days of campus placement drive

**VARANASI:** As many as 400 students have received job offers from 71 national and international companies in the first three days of the campus placement drive held at IIT-BHU. So far, the highest package offered to a student is Rs 1.4 crore per annum. The drive will continue till December 20.

On the first day of placement on Saturday, 44 companies offered jobs to 265 students while 27 companies gave 111 job offers on the second day. On Monday, the companies gave offer letters to 66 students. The highest offer on Monday was an annual package of Rs 25.91 lakh while the lowest was Rs 8 lakh per annum.

Tesco, TCS, Citrix, SRIN, Mynta BDA, Morgan Stanley, Paypal, Fidelity Investments, Oyo Rooms, Flipkart, Times Internet, Edgeverve Servicenow, Bosch among several other companies visited the campus.

On the second day of the campus placement, 13 companies offered jobs to 45 students. The annual packages were between Rs 9 lakh and Rs 32 lakh.

On the first day of the campus placement on Saturday, a US company gave an annual job offer of Rs 1.4 crore to a student.

Besides, 266 other students got job offers with an annual package between Rs 12 lakh and Rs 47 lakh.

Before the campus placement, 150 students had already been offered a job. As many as 87 companies visited the institute for campus placement which saw registration by 1,151 students.

In the first phase on Monday, Reliance Jio, Synopsis, Elastic Run, BNY Mellon, Sapient, Veritas, Tata Steel, Citi Pune, Fire Eye, Reliance Jio (SDE), Euler, Mykaarma, Samsung Delhi, Maruti, i3 Network, Mathworks were among the companies that came for placements.

Prof PK Mishra, head of the department of chemical engineering at IIT-BHU, said several national and multinational companies visited the campus and interviewed the students in campus placement. They gave job offers to as many as 400 students.
