IIT-BHU team to monitor Ganga pollution during Kumbh

VARANASI: Uttar Pradesh Pollution Control Board (UPPCB) has entrusted IIT-BHU the task of monitoring pollution standard of the water coming out of the industries of Kanpur in addition to common effluent treatment and sewage treatment plants during Kumbh Mela.

Prof PK Mishra, head of chemical engineering department and project In-charge of the investigation team, said IIT-BHU had been asked to monitor the effluent discharge of grossly polluting industries (GPIs) in addition to combined effluent treatment plant at Jajmau and STPs of Kanpur.

"In this regard, we have received a letter from the member secretary of Uttar Pradesh Pollution Control Board," he said. Dye, bleaching, textile and

"Inspection and test will be done by a team of IIT-BHU in three phases. The first phase will be between December 23 and December 30, the second phase between January 23 to 27 and third phase from February 5 to February 10," he added.

In the beginning, there will be

investigation and monitoring of 34 industries.

He said those industries, which do not discharge water in accordance with the standard, will be recommended for closure during the Kumbh Mela.

Four other institutes have also been given similar responsibilities of investigating other industries.
