





Compared with all other high-income countries, Australia is performing **close to average** when we look across the rights for which we have data (this comparison is calculated using the 'Income adjusted' benchmark).

How well is Australia's government respecting each right?



Australia's Safety from the State score of **6.5 out of 10** suggests that a significant number of people are not safe from one or more of the following: arbitrary arrest, torture and ill-treatment, forced disappearance, execution or extrajudicial killing.

Compared with the small group of 5 high-income OECD countries we have civil and political rights data for, Australia is performing **close to average** on the right to be safe from the state.

How well is Australia's government respecting each right?



Australia's Empowerment score of **7.3 out of 10** suggests that while many people are enjoying their civil liberties and political freedoms (freedom of speech, assembly and association, and democratic rights), a significant number are not.
