




## **Quality of Life**

Economic and Social Rights (2022)

How well is Nepal doing compared to what is possible at its level of income?

Summary score 83.6%



Nepal scores 83.6% on Quality of Life when scored against the 'Income adjusted' benchmark.

Compared with the other countries in South Asia, Nepal is performing **better than average** on Quality of Life rights (this comparison is calculated using the 'Income adjusted' benchmark).

## Safety from the State

Civil and Political Rights (2024)

Summary score 7.4 /10


How well is Nepal's government respecting each right?





Nepal's Safety from the State score of **7.4 out of 10** suggests that **a significant number of people are not** safe from one or more of the following: arbitrary arrest, torture and ill-treatment, forced disappearance, execution, or extrajudicial killing.

For civil and political rights, we don't have sufficient data across South Asia countries to allow for a regional comparison. However, when compared to the other countries in our sample, Nepal is performing **better than average** on the right to be safe from the state.



Nepal's Empowerment score of **6.8 out of 10** suggests that **a significant number of people are not** enjoying their civil liberties and political freedoms (freedom of speech, assembly and association, democratic rights, and religion and belief).

For civil and political rights, we don't have sufficient data across South Asia countries to allow for a regional comparison. However, when compared to the other countries in our sample, Nepal is performing **better than average** on empowerment rights.
