








How well is the United States' government respecting each right?





The United States' Safety from the State score of **5.9 out of 10** suggests that **many people are not** safe from one or more of the following: arbitrary arrest, torture and ill-treatment, forced disappearance, execution, or extrajudicial killing.

Compared with the small group of 5 high-income OECD countries we have civil and political rights data for, the United States is performing **lower than average** on the right to be safe from the state.



The United States' Empowerment score of **6.4 out of 10** suggests that **a significant number of people are not** enjoying their civil liberties and political freedoms (freedom of speech, assembly and association, democratic rights, and religion and belief).

Compared with the small group of 5 high-income OECD countries we have civil and political rights data for, the United States is performing **close to average** on empowerment rights.
