How well is Hong Kong's government respecting each right?





Hong Kong's Safety from the State score of **7.4 out of 10** suggests that **a significant number of people are not** safe from one or more of the following: arbitrary arrest, torture and ill-treatment, forced disappearance, execution, or extrajudicial killing.

For civil and political rights, we don't have sufficient data across East Asia and Pacific countries to allow for a regional comparison. However, when compared to the other countries in our sample, Hong Kong is performing **better than average** on the right to be safe from the state.



Hong Kong's Empowerment score of **2.4 out of 10** suggests that **many people are not** enjoying their civil liberties and political freedoms (freedom of speech, assembly and association, democratic rights, and religion and belief).
