Brothers & Sisters,

I hope this newsletter finds you and your family safe and healthy.

To say this has been a crazy and strange year would be an understatement. Our personal lives and our lives as Operating Engineers have been disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic. We have had to cancel Union meetings, the Labor Day parades, and our Labor Day picnics. We can only hope that by the time you receive this newsletter the virus is letting up so that we can get back to a somewhat normal way of life.

We were fortunate that the number of COVID cases declined enough in late June and early July, that the restrictions were lifted in St. Louis County, which allowed us to hold two Union meetings. This gave us the opportunity to meet as Brothers and Sisters to vote on and ratify the Collective Bargaining Agreements that had been extended due to the virus. The AGC St. Louis Region, SITE Improvement and Bituminous State Highway agreements are three-year agreements. We did not give up any language, in fact we added language that does benefit our membership and the wage increase is \$1.85 each year. The AGC Outstate Heavy Highway is a four-year agreement, \$1.70 each year wage increase and again, we added additional language to benefit the

As everyone knows, we have a General Election coming up, Tuesday, November 3, 2020. We have the opportunity to elect a Governor that will actually work for the working class people of Missouri, Nicole Galloway. Nicole has always been a friend of labor. Her great grandfather, two uncles and three cousins are members of Local 513. She knows the value of belonging to an organization like ours. Nicole knows that Right-to-Work is Wrong for Missouri, and she believes in the Prevailing Wage law. It is time for us, the working class people of Missouri, to elect a Governor that will work with us and not against us.

Nicole is not the only candidate we need to elect; keep in mind that we need to elect labor/worker friendly candidates across the board this November. Candidates that think the working person should make a decent wage, have benefits like health insurance and a pension so that someday they can retire with dignity. Vote for the candidate that knows the working-class people are the backbone of this country, we always have been and always will be. It's time to change the balance at the state and federal level. Greetings Brothers and Sisters. I hope this article finds you

and your family doing well! This year has been one for the record books. But that said, I hope everyone is staying safe and taking all the necessary precautions. Summer is ending, but work is showing no signs of slowing down in Southeast Missouri.

Here are some of the jobs we have going on.

R&K has a new subdivision project in Farmington where they are doing all the clearing, site work, storm sewers, roads, and curbs. This first phase is 65 acres and there are at least three phases to this subdivision.

Artisan is doing maintenance work at Mississippi Lime. They are also still working at NMPH pouring concrete for the new Fly Ash Conveyor System.

Bloomsdale Excavating is moving right along on the Diversion Channel Rip-Rap job outside of Delta. They have an estimated total of 170,000 tons to lay down. They also started a stripping job at Cane Creek Quarry in Poplar Bluff this

ers week.

Penzel – the 55-bridge project at Center Junction is moving along; the southbound bridge is scheduled to be done by the first of the year, then they will start on the north side bridge demo and rebuild.

Penzel is the General on the Cape City Hall expansion and remodel; about a \$12M project. They also just picked up a seven-bridge design/build package that totals just a little over \$7M.

EOI is moving along with the remediation of the Cobalt Mines site clean-up. This looks to be going well into next year.

3P Utilities was awarded a job in Neelyville to replace about 20,000 feet of gas main and around 100 services that will be starting the end of September.

Pace is paving 36 miles on Highway 142 outside of Doniphan in Ripley County. Next, they will be paving 20 miles on Highway 160 near Alton in

Oregon County, then they will be moving outside of Moody to pave ten miles on Highway 142 in Howell County.

Day & Zimmerman started the new Fly Ash System upgrade and conversion project at NMPH. This will be about a six-month project that will be tying into the next outage.

ASI picked up a conveyor project at NMPH. They will be reworking several old conveyors and installing new ones for the new Fly Ash System.

Lico Steel will be setting the steel for the new conveyor stands along with setting all conveyors for the upgrade at NMPH.

AIRCO picked up an outage job at NMPH starting in the middle of September thru the middle of October, on the turbin floor replacing valves.

I want to remind everyone to keep your certifications up. It seems I am always shorthanded on MSHA, CCO, and HAZMAT operators in Southeast Missouri.

Let's remember this is an election year. We all know elections have consequences. So, I am asking all our

I would like to Thank the Officers and Agents in negotiating the contracts; AGC of St. Louis and 5 Surrounding Counties, SITE, Bituminous, Outstate Building and Outstate Heavy Highway Negotiators, for a great job in negotiating the agreements.

I would also like to Congratulate Rob Duffy, Bill Suddarth and Rick Hickerson on a long, healthy and prosperous retirement.

As we move closer to the General Election, we need to be vigilant in making sure our families and friends are registered and ready to vote November 3 and to be sure to vote for labor friendly candidates.

The work in my area is very busy and I hope everyone is as well. If not, hopefully it is not because of your skills. If it is, please get up to the Training School to sharpen your skills.

Here are some of the jobs in my area:

KAI Design and Build – the first project on the old Pruitt-Igoe site of 74 acres. It is a 7 million-dollar, 4 bed hospital. **Castle** is there now doing the SITE remediation work, storm, sewer, and footing.

There is going to be an additional 16 buildings and a medical university, included on the 74-acre site. Alberici has been mentioned as one of the General Contractors.

McCarthy – 600-million-dollar

project for Washington University in the **Cortex-Neuroscience Research facility** and parking garage.

Tarlton – 15-million-dollar job at the old Post-Dispatch building, Front Page lofts.

Brinkmann - working on a 91-million-dollar project - Pearl at DeBaliviere. This will be two 8-story apartment buildings, two below the surface parking garage and retail space.

Brinkmann - also working on a-million-dollar project at the Lindell Apartments. New and part renovation.

KCI Construction has a-milliondollar project at the MLS Soccer Stadium at I-64 for improvements on the entrance and exit ramps.

H.B.D. is working on a-million-dollar project at the Old YMCA building to renovate it into a Museum Hotel.

National Geospatial Intelligence Agency (NGA): McCarthy has given us the link to be vetted for background checks. So please, if you are interested in working on this project, you will have to go through this process. It is a 4-year project. McCarthy said they will need Pickers and Lull operators and that right now they have very low participation from the Operators. It is a 4-week waiting period, which is why we would like to have a list of Operators vetted and ready to go. The link for this will be on our app. After passing the vetting, please contact Phil Nicolay and he will add you to a list.

M.C. Hotel - Marriott - 40-milliondollar project by Chase Park Plaza. This will include 8 stories, 192 rooms and parking garage.

McCarthy - working on a 400-million-dollar project at Barnes Jewish & Children's (BJC) Queeny Tower.

Ahrens will be tearing down the old building and McCarthy will be building a new high rise and parking garage.

Mortenson-Alberici-Keeley (MAK) Ioint Venture – the 400-million-dollar project at the MLS Soccer Stadium is still going.

Walsh has a 225-million-dollor project, building a new railroad bridge at Merchants Bridge.

The City of St. Louis is in the running for a new Space Command Center, which is about 1,400 jobs with salaries averaging \$100,000 a year. St. Louis has advanced to the final round of competing cities. They will choose the finalist next year, August of 2021. This project will take 5 years to build this facility.

In closing, it is very imperative that we continue to practice social distancing, hand washing, sanitizing and wear our mask as we go out and return to work and visit public spaces. We need to work safe and work smart and we will get through this together.

The new hospital at Fort Leonard Wood is starting, **Bloomsdale Excavating** has the site work on the project and has started requesting operators from the list. The next big project I have beginning is the Refuel Outage at the Callaway Energy Center. This refuel we will be dispatching over 30 members to BHI Energy to complete the maintenance cycle work.

With the COVID-19 pandemic I hope all members and their families remain safe and healthy. Work in my area has been good this year. Some of the projects have been **Erlinger Crane** at the Fulton Community Center. Dunklin Street bridge, where **Don Schnieders Excavating** and **Scott's Crane Rental** completed the work in Jefferson City. **JS Excavating**, demo and site work for Riley's Chevrolet in Jefferson City. We got some of the Phillips 66 pipeline when **Michels Pipeline** was awarded 6 miles in Osage County. **TJ Ahrens Excavating**

on High Street in Jefferson City removing a building that had partially collapsed. **Don Schnieders** bridge replacement on Highway A in Gasconade County. The Uncle Ray's Potato Chip factory in Montgomery City has been a great project for my area. **Kuesel Excavating Co**, **Johnson Earthworks**, **Concrete Strategies**, **Erlinger Crane** and **Guarantee Electrical Construction** have all been on the project. This project should give us enough hours to set a prevailing wage rate for Montgomery County in 2021.

I have a lot more work going on in my area and too much to list in this newsletter but I wanted to touch on two of the longest running projects. The stone replacement at the State Capitol is still going. We currently have **Apache Industrial United**, **GWH** and **Scott's Crane Rental** on the project. At the Jefferson City Waterworks, **Goodwin Bros.** is still working towards completion of the second phase of that project.

In closing, I want to stress to our membership the importance of this

upcoming election. We have the opportunity to elect people like Nicole Galloway as our first female Governor and who has direct family ties to this organization, Doug Beck, who is President of

the Missouri State Building Trades and running for State Senate in the 1st District and finally and maybe the most important, Joe Biden, who is on record saying, "American workers should build American infrastructure and manufacture all the materials that go into it, and all of these workers must have the option to join a union and collectively bargain." We as Union members in 2020 can elect people who will go to work everyday and stand up for our interest and our issues.

As Walter Reuther said in 1970, "There's a direct relationship between the ballot box and the bread box, and what the union fights for and wins at the bargaining table can be taken away in the legislative balls," and yet, fifty years later, we are still fighting those fights because we cannot get the right people seated in those legislative halls Mr. Ruether spoke of.

The next 2 tilt-ups are getting started in the Hazelwood Tradeport Business Park totaling around 60 Million Dollars. The general contractor has not been selected yet but **Kamadulski Excavating and Grading** has been selected by the owner to do the building pads.

McCarthy is coming out of the ground with the new Forsyth Pointe office building and retail center in Clayton. It is a 16-story building and parking garage with 150 Million Dollar price tag. **Castle Contracting, Subsurface and Custom Service Crane** have been on site.

The Safety National Insurance Headquarters expansion is coming along pretty good and is scheduled to be completed sometime next year. **Paric Corporation** is the general contractor for the 150,000 square foot expansion and so far on site there has been **Plattin Creek Excavating, CK Crane, Ben-Hur**, to name a few.

Gershenson Construction is moving on the Ashby Road bridge after a long delay due to engineering changes. It is a good little project that is keeping a couple guys busy and I know the residents will be happy to see it back open.

Lastly, I am sure that anyone that drives the 270 North Corridor is aware of **Millstone Weber's** 4 year, 270 Million Dollar highway project. This project will keep quite a few members working throughout and is a much-needed infrastructure rehab for the area.

Shortly after you receive this newsletter we will be heading back to the polls for the General elections, I am hopeful the momentum from the primaries will work favorably for working class families in this state and across the nation. The Cope-endorsed list of candidates will be in this issue and on the Local 513 APP; if needed take it with you to the polls in November. If you do not currently attend your local labor club but are interested, you can call the union hall to find the meeting place and time or

the information is on Local 513's website. I encourage everyone to get informed and involved in your labor club as it is a good source for information and a good opportunity for firsthand experience on helping your community, helping labor friendly candidates get the support they need to win elections and keep the voice of labor relevant in today's society.

Amendment 3 will be on the ballot in November as well, I ask that you VOTE NO on this amendment as it repeals all the hard work put in by the citizens that collected signatures and overturns the will of the voters that was expressed in 2018. Do not let the politicians tell us what "WE THE PEOPLE" want for our state and turning down this amendment will be a huge step in reminding them who they work for!

When contract books become available please get a copy and read through it, so you have the information to stand up for your negotiated conditions and the work Operating Engineers are supposed to perform.

already the first week of September. The work is really going out of here. It has been non-stop. My biggest problem is finding qualified Operators.

Some of the operators who are good, are getting on the list and the next day going right back out for another Contractor. With all the work that we have going on right now it is very important that we send qualified Operators to work. When I send out Operators that are not qualified, they just send them right back the same day. I've had a few Operators not show up because they got on the list and I dispatched them to a different Contractor and then they turn around and go back to the Contractor they were working for and not to the one I dispatched them to, that leaves that Contractor without an Operator. If you get on the list and I dispatch you, it is very important that you go where I send you to!

So, with all that being said, the dirt work has been crazy all Summer. It has left us no choice but to send out some permit hands to fill some of these dirt jobs that I cannot fill with our Members. We know it's not popular but if I don't fill the jobs with qualified Operators, the Contractors will put Laborers or some other craft on the equipment and then that will just make things worse than they already are.

Our Agents are out there everyday

fighting with some of these Contractors about that very issue. It is a problem and we know it is a problem because some of our Operators are letting it go on because all they care about is themselves and not the Organization as a whole. We cannot fight this alone. We need your help, so call the hall and let us know if you see other crafts on our equipment, or other Operators letting it go on. We will do our best to fix the problem and I promise it won't be good if they have to come down here in front of the Executive Board, which has been giving out some pretty heavy fines lately.

So, if there is anything I can do to help, please call me.

Vacation Fund 2020 Annual Distribution Direct Deposit Authorization

The Vacation Fund 2020 Annual Distribution is scheduled to take place on November 20, 2020. Direct deposit is available for eligible Participants. Direct Deposit Authorizations have been sent to all members who currently have a Vacation balance. This form should be completed and returned to the Benefit Office no later than October 12, 2020 for new direct deposit authorizations and for updates to your account information. If you have previously provided your account information your vacation benefit will be direct deposited into that account unless new information is received. Please ensure your account and address information is up to date with the Benefit Office. Failure to do so may impact your timely receipt of benefits.

Local Union 513 Pension Fund Annual Funding Notice

The Local Union 513 Pension Fund Annual Funding Notice and Status Notice was recently mailed to all Pension Fund Participants. These notices are required to be sent every year under the Pension Protection Act of 2006.

If you have any questions regarding these notices, or would like to request a copy, please contact the Benefit Office.

Appointments for Retirement

The Benefit Office is doing it's best to keep the members and employees as safe as possible during this unpredictable and unfamiliar experience while continuing to provide uninterrupted service to all members. The Benefit Office is taking appropriate precautions to prevent spreading of the COVID-19 virus. Per CDC Social Separation Guidelines, our location will be open for appointments only. There will be common benefit forms located at the Union Hall door and a drop box for your convenience.

Shingles Vaccine

Shingles vaccines are covered at no cost to eligible Active members, Non-Medicare Retirees and eligible Non-Medicare dependents over the age of 60 who are covered under the Welfare Fund. If you meet the criteria, and your vaccine is obtained through your local pharmacy or supermarket, your receipt can be submitted to the Benefits Office for reimbursement or you may obtain your vaccine through your primary physician. Medicare Retirees and their Medicare eligible dependents should contact Medicare for coverage information.

Flu / COVID-19 Information

Screening and testing for COVID-19 as well as Flu and respiratory illness related to COVID-19 symptoms will be paid at 100% with no pre-approval necessary for eligible Active Participants, Non-Medicare Retirees and their eligible dependents. This is effective for dates of service from February 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020. Flu vaccines are covered at no cost to eligible Active members, Non-Medicare Retirees and eligible Non-Medicare dependents covered under the Welfare Fund. You can obtain your vaccine from your primary physician or you may be able to obtain it at your local pharmacy if they are in-network with Medimpact.

Outpatient Substance Abuse Benefit

Effective January 1, 2020, outpatient treatment of alcoholism, chemical dependency or drug addiction in a nonresidential treatment facility licensed by the State of Missouri will be a covered service whether or not it is a requirement to maintain employment.
