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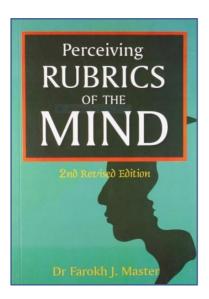

The Cross References has been mentioned after rubrics wherever applicable and it should be seen from the Repertory whose code letter is written next to the rubric. Master has also provided explanation and meaning of rubrics wherever he found necessary. He also stresses that the mental symptoms should be co-related with various psychological conditions, and attempt to write important psychiatric disease has been made by him. The author expands on the concept of the rubric, using it to describe the patterns and essence of emotion and behaviour that appear in human psychological behaviour in different psychiatric diseases.

Master has collected information from a wide range of sources, including philosophy, psychology, and homeopathy which can be seen throughout the book. He has also included the explanation of rubrics to illustrate his view, making the book a practical guide.

There is only one lacuna that one may find in this book, and that is a lack of concrete, real-world examples to highlight the concepts that can offer a much better understanding.

One of the key strengths of this book is its emphasis on the importance of perception in understanding human behavior. The belief of author is that perception is an active process and not passive one because it combines sensory, emotional and cognitive processes.
